LIEUTENANT GENERAL RICHARD T. KNOWLES
DEPUTY COMMANDING GENERAL
EIGHTH UNITED STATES ARMY

Born in Chicago, Illinois on 20 December 1916, General Knowles entered military service in 1942 as a Second Lieutenant, Field Artillery. During World War II he served with the 16th Tank Destroyer Group in the Central Europe and Rhineland offensives. He returned to the United States in 1945 serving as Battalion Executive Officer, 692nd Tank Destroyer Group, and later as Battalion Commander. He remained in that position until reassigned to the 37th Field Artillery Battalion in February 1946. The next three years were spent with Eighth US Army in the Far East.

Returning to Fort Sill in 1949, he became Executive Officer, 1st Field Artillery Observation Battalion, and subsequently he attended the Artillery Advanced Course.

At the outbreak of the Korean War he served as Executive Officer and later as Battalion Commander, 96th Field Artillery Battalion. As Executive Officer he earned the nation's third highest combat award, the Silver Star, for personally leading a counterattack that routed 75 North Koreans from inside his battalion's perimeter.

Following three years at SHAPE headquarters in France he returned to Fort Bragg to assume command of the 3rd US Army Missile Command. A highlight in the General's military career was his assignment as the first Division Artillery Commander of the prototype 11th Air Assault Division while it was undergoing testing at Fort Benning, Georgia. When the unit was redesignated the 1st Cavalry Division (Airmobile) and committed to Vietnam, General Knowles accompanied it into combat as Assistant Division Commander. In February 1966 he became Chief of Staff, II Field Force Vietnam. He assumed command of the 196th Light Infantry Brigade (Separate) in November 1966 serving in that capacity until June 1967 when he was named Commanding General, Task Force Oregon (Provisional).

Upon his return from Vietnam in November 1967 General Knowles became the Assistant Deputy and later Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations, Department of the Army, serving in this position until 1970 when he was appointed Assistant to the Chairman, Joint Chiefs of Staff. On 1 August 1972 General Knowles returned to Korea and assumed command of the combined headquarters, I Corps (ROK/US) Group, a position he held until 16 July 1973 when he was appointed to his current assignment as Deputy Commanding General, Eighth United States Army.
