I was recently asked by one of our field posts to list the resources available on our position in Viet-Nam. The list was impressive and I thought that you might like to see it. Specifically, we have:

1. Twenty documentary films.
2. We are currently preparing to provide each week a television news clip service consisting of one-to-three-minute film clips on selected subjects.
3. Special interview type films with important U.S. officials are sent periodically -- two interviews with Secretary Rusk have been released within the past four months; an interview with Vice President Humphrey and with you are now being prepared.
4. We regularly feature articles by important U.S. spokesmen, scholars such as Professor Scalapino, Asian leaders such as Prime Minister Lee of Singapore.
5. Analyses of Viet Cong captured documents and defector interviews are released regularly.
6. A variety of other printed materials includes photo features, picture magazines, discussion pamphlets and similar written media.
7. The VOA regularly programs commentaries in English and other languages on the issues currently under discussion; it carries interviews with personalities from various parts of the world and extensively reports news events.

8. U.S. officials returning from Viet-Nam are available as speakers and have appeared in many forums, particularly in Europe.
9. The Agency facilitates the travel of journalists from third countries to Viet-Nam and the preparation of films and news reels by these sources.
