Arthur Krim called to say he had been getting calls from Roy Reed of the New York Times wanting to interview him on politics. Mr. Krim's judgment was to call Punch Sulzberger and tell him that he did not give interviews except on his business matters. Mr. Krim feels his effectiveness would be destroyed if he ever gets into major stories about his political activities.

I agree and so told Mr. Krim. Therefore, Mr. Krim will continue to refer political inquiries to the National Committee.
