Jim Donahue was my roommate all though flight school, a period made even more enjoyable than usual by the fun we had with our names. We used the similarity of our names, James T. Donahue Jr. and James A. Donoghue Jr., to drive the cadre nuts. In formation a tac officer would call "Donahue," to which we would reply in unison, "which one," which led to "James," to which we would reply "which one, " and so on until he hit the middle initial. Our classmates called us "brothers," and I thought that funny, although I think it annoyed him a bit. We were friends, however, and got along well.

Jim was a generous, careful guy. He was the steady one, and, with at least three years of age over my 18, was the one everyone trusted. He was very proud of his achievements in flight school, something we wanted to do very much to prove to his parents that, after bombing out of college, he could be successful. And he was. While at Fort Wolters he got a late model Olds convertible, lipstick red with a bright white top and interior, a great car. He let his brother borrow it during one leave to his Chicago suburb home only to have the brother spill milk on the rear carpet and not clean it up. Jim fumed for months over the stench of spoiled milk that would not leave the car.

His death was noted by all of our classmates who read the Army Times. Since they never could keep straight which Donahue was which, they naturally assumed that the crazy one got it. This created a number of uncomfortable meetings when classmates would see me going through their area and say, "I thought you were dead," leaving us both sad with the memory of a very good guy who wasn't with us any more. I missed not being able to get in touch with Jim after my tour and talk to him about his experiences, and tell him about mine. That would have been nice.

PROPOSED CITATION FOR THE AIR MEDAL FOR HEROISM

BY DIRECTION OF THE PRESIDENT, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF EXECUTIVE ORDER 9158, 11 MAY 1942, AS AMENDED BY EXECUTIVE ORDER 9242-A, 11 SEPTEMBER 1942, AN AIR MEDAL FOR HEROISM WHILE PARTICIPATING IN AERIAL FLIGHT IS AWARDED TO:

SPECIALIST FOURTH CLASS NEAL R. HABER, RA11484712, UNITED STATES ARMY, WHO DISTINGUISHED HIMSELF BY EXCEPTIONALLY VALOROUS ACTIONS ON 22 SEPTEMBER 1967 WHILE SERVING AS CREWCHIEF OF A UH-1H TROOP CARRYING HELICOPTER IN SUPPORT OF THE 25TH INFANTRY DIVISION, FIVE MILES NORTH OF CU CHI, REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM ON A COMBAT ASSAULT. AT APPROXIMATELY 1530 HOURS, AFTER SUPPORTING THE 25TH INFANTRY DIVISION ON PREVIOUS LIFTS, SPECIALIST HABER'S SHIP, BLACK WIDOW 122, WAS ON SHORT FINAL APPROACHING THE LANDING ZONE, WHEN THE AIRCRAFT STARTED RECEIVING AUTOMATIC WEAPONS FIRE. THE FIRST BULLET OF BULLETS HIT BLACK WIDOW 122, CRITICALLY WOUNDING THE PILOT, HITTING AN INFANTRYMAN IN THE SHOULDER AND ONE BULLET CAME WITHIN INCHES OF SPECIALIST HABER'S HEAD, HITTING THE TRANSMISSION BULKHEAD AND SEVERING A HYDRAULIC LINE. WITH UNPARALLELED SKILL, SPECIALIST FOURTH CLASS HABER BEGAN PROVIDING PROTECTIVE AND SUPPRESSIVE FIRE FOR THE AIRCRAFT. THE QUICK ACTION OF SPECIALIST HABER ENABLED THE AIRCRAFT COMMANDER TO SUCCESSFULLY DEPART THE LZ WITHOUT FURTHER CASUALTIES OR DAMAGE TO THE AIRCRAFT. UPON BECOMING AIRBORNE SPECIALIST HABER DEPARTED HIS SEAT AND ASSISTED THE WOUNDED INFANTRYMAN AND THE CRITICALLY WOUNDED PILOT FROM THE AIRCRAFT. THE INCOMPARABLE PROFICIENCY, DARING AND COURAGE DISPLAYED BY SPECIALIST HABER THROUGHOUT THE ODEAL PROVED TO HIS SUPERIORS THAT HE HAS THE EXCEP-

TIONAL ABILITY AND DEDICATION TO DUTY THAT SETS HIM ABOVE HIS FELLOW SOLDIERS. SPECIALIST FOURTH CLASS HABER'S HEROIC ACTIONS WERE IN KEEPING WITH THE HIGHEST TRADITIONS OF THE MILITARY SERVICE AND REFLECT GREAT CREDIT UPON HIMSELF, HIS UNIT, AND THE UNITED STATES ARMY.

18. NARRATIVE DESCRIPTION: (For all awards describe in detail what individual did to warrant decoration. For valor award describe in detail the mission, terrain and weather, enemy conditions and friendly casualties. (Use plain bond paper for continuation sheet if necessary).

On 22 September 1967, specialist fourth class Earl K. Haber, 541148471, United States Army, distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous actions while serving as crewchief of a UH-1H troop carrying helicopter in support of the 15th Infantry Division five miles north of Cu Chi, Republic of Vietnam. Specialist Haber's ship, Black Icaw 122, was on short final approaching the landing zone with a full load of troops aboard, when the aircraft started receiving automatic weapons fire. The first burst of bullets hit Black Icaw 122, critically wounding the pilot, hitting an infantryman in the shoulder and one bullet came within inches of Specialist Haber's head, hitting the transmission bulkhead and severing a hydraulic line. With unparalleled skill, Specialist Haber began providing protective and suppressive fire for the aircraft. The quick action of Specialist Haber enabled the aircraft commander to successfully depart the LZ without further casualties or damage to the aircraft. Upon becoming airborne specialist Haber departed his seat and assisted the wounded. Once the aircraft was safely on the ground at Cu Chi airfield, specialist Haber, with the assistance of his gunner, removed the wounded infantryman and the critically wounded pilot from the aircraft. The incomparable proficiency, daring and courage displayed by specialist Haber throughout the ordeal proved to his superiors that he has the exceptional ability and dedication to duty that sets him above his fellow soldiers. specialist fourth class Haber's heroic actions were in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.





This concerns your son Warrant Officer James T. Donahue, Jr. The Army will return your loved one to a port in the United States by first available military airlift. At the port remains will be placed in a metal casket and delivered (accompanied by a military escort) by most expeditious means to any funeral director designated by the next of kin or to any national cemetery in which there is available grave space. You will be advised by the United States port concerning the movement and arrival time at destination.

Forms on which to claim authorized interment allowance will accompany remains. This allowance may not exceed \$75 if consignment is made directly to the superintendent of a national cemetery. When consignment is made to a funeral director prior to interment in a national cemetery, the maximum allowance is \$150; if burial takes place in a civilian cemetery, the maximum allowance is \$300.

Request next of kin advise by collect telegram addressed: Disposition Branch, Memorial Division, Department of the Army WUX MB, Washington, D. C., name and address of funeral director or name of national cemetery selected.

If additional information concerning return of remains is desired you may include your inquiry in the reply to this message. Please do not set date of funeral until port authorities notify you date and scheduled time of arrival destination.
