- 1 Left PFC Patrick Wesson. Right Me with a coke
 2. Patrick Wesson with a helicopter flying by.
 - 3 Patrick Wesson with members of second platoon.
 - 4 L to R unknown, unknown, Song (Big Cowboy), Chuck Danzer, Cambodian known only as Papa san or Old Man. I know that this picture is labeled Walt Handwerk, but the American is definitely Sgt Chuck Danzer one of the non performers in the unit.
 - 5 Me playing TOC guard at Phuoc Vinh.
 - 6 Cambodian members of the recon platoon A-362. Note the helicopter in the background. Rapid Fire IV was busy with someone coming or going all of the time.
 - 7 Cambodian from second platoon with Pat Wesson enjoying Pat's favorite beverage. Note the red ribbon laced in the cambodian's hat to designate second platoon.
 - 8 The man with his back to the camera is Bob Cole an SF SFC who later went to CandC North. He seems to be watching a recon team going out.
 - 1 through 8 were all taken at Phuoc Vinh by PFC Bill Miller.
 - 9 Cambodes practicing assault at Tay Ninh East during Rapid Fire V
 - 10 Pete Stark going on mission Rapid Fire V. Left side of picture shows shoulder of SF nco who must be CandC man on mission.. The man to the right of the picture was killed in April, but I don't know his name off hand. Note Pete's M-16 with the experimental XM-148 grenade Launcher attachment. This was later standardized with modifications as the M-203, and is still in use. Pete also has a canister of serum albumin blood expander taped to his right harness suspender. I don't know if you can identify the crew member in the background, but have fun trying.
 - 11 Cambodian medic profiling for the camera. I don't know him.
 - 12 You'd know more about this shot than I do.
- 9 through 12 were all taken by Pete Stark at Tay Ninh East during Rapid Fire V. When he was wounded his camera with the partially used film was sent home to his parents. It sat there for almost twenty five years before he had it developed.
