

## Huey 66-16779

This former 'C' Company, 101<sup>st</sup> Aviation Battalion, 101<sup>st</sup> Airborne Division Huey, is now part of the Pacific Coast Air Museum. They are located at 2330 Airport Blvd., Santa Rosa, California 95403, telephone PCAM-707-575-7900. It is the only Black Widow Huey known to exist at any air museum. Today, for the museum, it has been configured as a Medevac ship. In April 1969 through March of 1970, this Huey was assigned to the C/101<sup>st</sup> Black Widows, stationed at Phu Bai in the northern I Corps area of operations. When the unit returned to the states in February of 1972, a number of the remaining Hueys were assigned to National Guard units until being phased out of the U.S. Army inventory.

The 188<sup>th</sup>/C101st Black Widow Association with a membership of 375 holds annual reunions at all Vietnam Helicopter Pilots Association reunions, along with an annual newsletter.
