a. Artillery: Artillery support was characterized by daily movement of the firing batteries to support the airmobile operations of 2-14 Inf. Fire support bases used were:

- (1) FSB WAINWRIGHT II (XT 285 509)
- (2) FSB BOWIE (XT 239 427)
- (3) FSB HULL (XT 260 380)
- (4) FSB LOGAN I (XT 316 552)
- (5) FSB LOGAN II (XT 231 581)

A total of 6,951 HE, 131 WP, and 147 illumination rounds were expended. Artillery fire accounted for 4 enemy KIA (BC) and 6 enemy KIA (POSS). GS units were used for firing TOTs, preparations of landing zones, large tactical targets, and the H&I program.

b. Tactical Air: Tactical Air Support was provided by the 7th USAF. The missions were controlled by the 1st Brigade TACP. The following summarizes USAF activities in support of Operation SARATOGA.

(3) Bomb Damage Assessment: 189 bunkers destroyed, 23 bunkers damaged, 762 meters of trench destroyed, 1310 meters of trench uncovered, 8 spider holes destroyed, 100 spider holes uncovered, 100 meters of tunnel uncovered, 1 tunnel entrance exposed, 3 boxes of supplies destroyed, 3 boxes of supplies damaged, 3 automatic weapons destroyed (possible), 4 enemy killed (BC).

8. (C) INTELLIGENCE: Intelligence studies and experiences prior to the start of Operation SARATOGA indicated the presence of the D14 Local Force Battalion and 4-16 Local Force Companies in the 1st Brigade area of operations. D-16 Local Force Battalion which normally operated in the AO had departed in late January to take part in the TET Offensive. Also located in or on the boundaries of the AO were the 680th Training and Rear Service Regiment, and elements of the 83d Rear Service Group. The local force elements were thought to be dispersed down to platoon level in order to avoid contact, while continuing limited attacks against RF-PF outposts, and conducting resupply and propaganda activities.

D-14 was known to be understrength following attacks on TAY NINH City during mid-February. Their location was thought to be somewhere east of TAY NINH. C-40 Local Force company was located in the "STRAIGHT EDGE WOODS" vic (XT 1637) and generally conducted platoon sized operations in areas to the south and southwest of TAY NINH City. There had been no recent contact with this unit. In the MICHELIEN PLANTATION the C-64 Local Force Co with several guerrilla units had been conducting usual propaganda and harassing activities. Little was known of the 680th Regiment except that it generally operated along the CAMBODIAN Border vic XT 0065. The 83d Rear Service Group was located in the TRAPEZOID conducting resupply and administrative activities.

Special Agent reports indicated the bulk of activity in the AO was centered in the northern TRAPEZOID (83d Rear Service) and north of KATUM on the CAMBODIAN Border (COSVN HQ). VR's, Red Haze and SLARs indicated possible resupply routes coming east from CAMBODIA on the ORIENTAL RIVER and through the STRAIGHT EDGE, and north from CAMBODIA through BO TUC toward the SAIGON RIVER.

Vegetation varied from triple canopy jungle to large areas of open rice paddies. The terrain was generally flat and the central and Southern portion of the AO were well populated. Major rivers in the area were the SAIGON and CRIDENTAL. Weather did not hamper or prohibit friendly troop movements. Roads in the area were in good condition and were used for resupply and movement of infantry and artillery. The ground was firm enough to enable the utilization of mechanized infantry.

The overall evaluation of the intelligence information from ARVN HQs and other local sources is considered B-3 (usually reliable, possibly true). On several occasions US troops responded to local agent reports with good results. Overall operational security was considered good.

9. (C) MISSION:

- a. Within capability, conduct offensive operations in TAY NINH and BINH DUONG Provinces to locate and destroy enemy forces.
- b. Provide engineer security for repair of MSR between BAU CO and TAY NINH, TAY NINH and DAU TIENG, TAY NINH and GO DAU HA.
- c. Secure FSB ST. BARBARA at BAU CO and LOC between BAU CO and TAY NINH.
- d. React to VC initiatives in TAOL.
- e. Assume responsibility for defense of DAU TIENG Base Camp.
- f. Conduct combined operation with 25th ARVN DIV to drive VC forces from AP TAN HOA (XT 4405).
- g. Suspend Route Flow operations and return LCT to TAY NINH.
- h. Secure any LCT operations required for support of II FTV Arty at FSB ST BARBARA.
- i. Establish water-borne blocks on SAIGON RIVER and other canal systems to prevent enemy resupply and movement.
- j. Relieved of mission to provide engineer security for repair of MSR, and daily route security and sweeps from TAY NINH to GO DAU HA effective 070700 March 1968.

10. (C) CONCEPT OF OPERATION: The operation was to employ D troop 3-17 Cav and one infantry battalion to clear and secure the MSR daily, either by sweep or outposting. The infantry battalion would then conduct combat assault and recon in force operations in the area adjoining the MSR. The remaining infan-

try assets of the brigade would be employed in daily airmobile assault, combat assault, recon in force, cordon and search, and bushmaster operations. Artillery would be moved over land to forward fire support bases to support infantry operations.

11. (C) EXECUTION: (C)

a. Mission order received 240040 February 1968.

b. Conduct of the Operation:

25 February 1968

2-14 Inf: Conducted cordon operation in conjunction with National Police around villages vic. XT 173534, XT 175528, XT 178429 and XT 176536. Cordon netted 21 suspects, negative contact. MEDCAP's were conducted at scene of operation, and 30 patients were treated. Battalion returned to TAY NINH to provide security during hours of darkness.

2-22 Inf (M): A Co (-) cleared Rt 22 to GO DAU HA. A platoon of Co A moved to BAU CO to secure the fire support base. B & C Co secured DAU TIENG and cleared and swept road from DAU TIENG to TAY NINH. B Co conducted recon in force in area XT 340450, XT 448420 and XT 460449, with negative contact. C Co conducted recon in force in area XT 344452, XT 354470 and XT 375456, with negative contact. Battalion returned to DAU TIENG to provide security during hours of darkness.

D Trp, 3-IV Cav. Swept Rt4 to BAU CO. Secured Rome Flow effort at BAU CO, and escorted Rome Flow convoy to TAY NINH.

26 February 1968

2-14 Inf: Battalion conducted a 3 Company combat assault to LZ vic XT 325526. D Co remained at TAY NINH as ready reaction force. Battalion then conducted recon in force to vic XT 329502, negative contact. A MEDCAP was conducted at HELP NEMIA, 137 patients were treated, and 100 bars of soap distributed. Battalion Chaplain distributed 40lbs of candy to children. Battalion closed TAY NINH to secure it during hours of darkness.

2-22 Inf (M): Platoon of Co A swept Rt 4 to TAY NINH, and secured an artillery convoy to BAU CO from TAY NINH. B & C Co swept road from DAU TIENG to TAY NINH, and escorted convoy; another convoy was escorted from TAY NINH to DAU TIENG. B & C Co then conducted a recon in force along axis XT 375440, to XT 375480 to XT 358475. B Co located 3 bicycles, 2 Chicom grenades, vic XT 372484, and destroyed 2 hooches vic XT 379476, negative contact. B & C Co closed DAU TIENG to secure during hours of darkness.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Two platoons swept road to GO DAU HA. One platoon secured PSB WAINWRIGHT.

27 February 1968

2-14 Inf: B, C & D Cos conducted combat assaults to LZ via XT 355545. A Co(-) acted as blocking force via XT 375524. B, C & D Co recon in force to via XT 368533. A Co (-) located 6 bunkers, 75 ft of trench, and 3 spider holes, negative contact. A MEDCAP was conducted at HIEP TROUNG (XT 215485), treating 229 patients. Bn returned to TAY NINH to secure during hours of darkness.

2-22 Inf (M): A Co (-) conducted sweep of Rt 4, and secured convoy to PAU CO from TAY NINH, and return convoy to TAY NINH. B & C Cos conducted cordon operations assisted by CRIP and National Police in villages via XT 511185, XT 520499 and XT 520496. C Co then conducted recon in force to via XT 520415. All companies closed DAU TIENG to secure during hours of darkness.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Two platoons swept road to GO DAU HA, one platoon secured artillery batteries at PSB WAINWRIGHT.

28 February 1968

2-14 Inf: A, C & D Cos conducted combat assault to via XT 117576. All Cos were in position and began recon in force at 0923 hours to via XT 109564, negative contact. Companies closed TAY NINH to secure during hours of darkness at 1615 hours. Gunships, 1 VC KIA (BC), XT 119483. B Co moved to Bushmaster positions via XT 113566, XT 116559, and XT 122666 to remain overnight.

2-22 Inf (M): Platoon of A Co swept Rt 4 and conducted convoys between BAU CO and TAY NINH. Recon platoon conducted sweep mission to TAY NINH. B & C Cos conducted recon in force from via XT 4744 to XT 4743. B Co was diverted to assist recon in clearing numerous barricades. C Co continued recon in force to via XT 470415 then set up ambush position via XT 496456.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted sweep of Rt 22 to GO DAU HA.

29 February 1968

2-14 Inf: Conducted combat assault with three companies via XT 202393 and XT 203413 and conducted recon in force to PZ via XT 18042 for extraction. B Co returned from overnight Bushmaster location, and remained at TAY NINH as ready reaction force. B Co departed for Bushmaster via XT 170460 at 1600. Co A, 2-22 Inf now OPCON 2-14 Inf, secured laterite pit with one platoon. Co A (-) secured artillery in support of 2-14 and conducted road sweep and convoy security from BAU CO to TAY NINH with one

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platoon. At 0845 light fire team engaged 4 VC with AN, resulting in 2 VC KIA (BC). Co's closed TAY NINH to secure during hours of darkness. At 2333 TAY NINH Base Camp received 10-20 rnds, 82mm mortar. Results 2 WIA (slight), 10 vehicles damaged.

2-22 Inf (M)(-): Conducted recon in force from vic DAU TIENG to vic XT 425475 and XT 445475 and returned to DAU TIENG. At 1520 DAU TIENG Base Camp received 15 rnds 82mm mortar; results: 2 friendly WIA (slight); returned fire with counter-mortar program. At 1736 DAU TIENG Base Camp received 7 rnds 82mm mortar; results: 2 US WIA (slight), 1 commo bunker damaged, 1 mess hall damaged.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: CRIP conducted over-night ambush patrol vic XT 186467. Conducted road recon of Route 22 from TAY NINH to GO DAU HA and out-posted the road for convoy from CU CHI to TAY NINH.

1 March 1968

2-14 Inf: Conducted Eagle Flights into LZ's vic XT 3054222, XT 306440, XT 300472, and XT 365465 with 3 companies. D Co found VC base camp at XT 355492, with one fresh grave; result: 1 VC (BC). A Co 2-22 (M)(-) cleared road from BAU CO to TAY NINH and secured convoy from TAY NINH to BAU CO. Secured laterite pit and artillery in support of Eagle Flight. Bn closed TAY NINH to secure during hours of darkness.

2-22 Inf (M)(-): Conducted recon in force West from DAU TIENG to vic XT 417443. B Co lead personnel carrier hit a mine vic XT 471468. Results: 7 US WIA, 1 APC destroyed, 2 mine detectors destroyed. At 1050 hours DAU TIENG Base Camp received 10 rounds 60mm mortar, neg casualties, neg damage. At vic XT 457415 B Co received 150 rounds of automatic weapons fire, and one claymore fired; returned fire with organic weapons, mortars and artillery, negative casualties, negative results. Bn remained at DAU TIENG to secure during hours of darkness.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted road sweep and AVLB security to loc vic XT 440228. One platoon remained at bridge site OPCON 4-23 for overnight security of AVLB.

2 March 1968

2-14 Inf (-): A Co was OPCON to 2-22, returned to TAY NINH 1500 hours, and was placed on alert to assist D, 3-17th. B, C & D Co's combat assaulted to LZ located vic XT 106451 and XT 110448 and then conducted recon in force along three axis to XT 111460, XT 132455, and XT 142453. Negative contact. Companies closed TAY NINH to secure during hours of darkness.

2-22 Inf (M)(-): B Co departed to secure LZ vic XT 520478. A & C

Co 2-14 arrived LZ 0730. B Co then conducted recon in force to XT 517414 to XT 452416 to XT 464411. P Co located a large quantity of drugs and 3 bunkers with 8-12 inch overhead cover vic XT 464411. A, 2-14, and C Co searched village vic XT 534481; 5 bunkers were found and destroyed. C Co located and destroyed 17 bunkers vic XT 468453. Recon platoon secured engineer efforts on MSR vic XT 503483. One element securing vic XT 471468. Bn returned to DAU TIENG to secure during hours of darkness.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted sweep Rt 22 to GO DAU HA. Established contact vic XT 450225 at 1345 hours. Negative casualties. Enemy loses 4 VC KIA (BC). Contact was broken at 1520 hours. Village vic XT 4522 was declared not secure, and convoy returned to TAY NINH at 1830.

3 March 1968

2-14 Inf (-): A Co (-), A Co (-) 2-22 Inf (M) and artillery moved to positions at FSB vic XT 260380 at 0715. C Co moved to FSB at 0741 hours, then to LZ vic XT 296287 at 0908 hours. B Co conducted a combat assault to LZ vic XT 2631. Companies then conducted recons in force to XT 288296, XT 293308 and XT 288304; negative contact. Companies then conducted recons in force to XT 288296, XT 293308, and XT 288304; negative contact. Battalion returned to TAY NINH to secure during hours of darkness.

2-22 Inf (M)(-): Recon platoon conducted sweep of MSR to TAY NINH and provided convoy security. B Co conducted MSR sweep from vic XT 415445 to XT 371424 then moved to a lager position vic XT 371424. When convoy to DAU TIENG passed XT 352420 it received RRT and claymore fire resulting in 3 US WIA (dusted off), and 1 US WIA (ambulatory). Enemy results, 1 KIA (BC). At 1445 hours APC of B Co hit mine vic XT 453421 resulting in 2 WIA. C Co departed DAU TIENG to lager position vic XT 497456 and AP vic XT 506447. Conducted MEDCAP, BIN GUI (XT 463450), treated 182 patients.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted sweep of Rt 22, provided convoy security from TAY NINH to GO DAU HA and secured engineer effort on bridge located vic XT 440229.

4 March 1968

2-14 Inf: B, C & D Co's conducted combat assault to LZ vic XT 264327, then recon in force along 2 axis to vic XT 285390. At XT 275372 received sniper fire, returned with SA weapons; negative casualties; VC casualties unknown. All elements of Bn and A Co, 2-22 closed TAY NINH 1715 hours. Conducted MEDCAP at HIEP DINH (XT 220490) and treated 247 patients.

2-22 Inf (M)(-): Conducted road sweep with C Co vic XT 415443. C Co conducted recon in force, established temporary lager position at XT 465438, XT 494421 and XT 491400 and cloverleafed from those positions. At

XT 487423 an APC struck a pressure type mine. Results, 4 US WIA; all were dusted off. Damage to A/C, 3 road wheels blown off, and TC hatch blown off. B Co conducted recon in force to temporary lager positions at XT 454431 and XT 452419 and conducted cloverleaf operations around those locations. Recon swept the road from DAU TIENG to TAY NINH and secured the convoy there and back. All units closed DAU TIENG to secure during hours of darkness.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted road sweep and bridge security. Swept road from TAY NINH to vic XT 440228. Secured AVLB at XT 440228. Troop closed TAY NINH at 1907.

5 March 1968

2-14 Inf: At 0220 hours 4 Co's departed base camp to cordon village vic XT 190435 in conjunction with National Police. Due to VC mortaring of MACV and B-32 Special Forces, vic XT 204511, the National Police were diverted from cordon operation. Battalion then conducted recon in force to vic XT 120270 with 4 companies conducting cloverleaf search vic XT 140478, XT 144471, XT 150464 and XT 156456. One platoon of A Co conducted a sweep of Rt 4 and secured convoy to TAY NINH, and return to BAU CO. Another platoon of A Co secured engineer effort vic XT 113513. Supervised bunker and Dispensary, Self Help projects at HEIP LONG (XT 233480). Bn returned TAY NINH to secure during hours of darkness.

2-22 Inf (M)(-): B Co swept MSR from vic XT 414442 to west until over-taken by recon platoon. C Co conducted sweep of MSR to vic XT 414442. Recon conducted sweep of MSR and provided convoy security to TAY NINH and return. B & C Co conducted recon in force in the area of operations. C Co located and destroyed a pressure type mine of 30, 1/2 pound blocks of Chicom TNT, vic XT 415443. Recon platoon APC hit mine at 1110 hours vic XT 522449, blowing off three road wheels, 4 US WIA. Dust off complete 1115 hours. Recon platoon hit another mine at 1700 hours vic XT 338458. Moderate damage, no casualties. All units closed DAU TIENG to secure during hours of darkness.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted sweep of Rt 22, providing convoy security between TAY NINH and GO DAU HA, and secured engineer effort at bridge vic XT 440228.

6 March 1968

2-14 Inf: During early morning hours TAY NINH Base Camp received 22 rnds 82mm mortar, impacting vic XT 147518, resulting in 1 KIA, 35 WIA and 8 buildings damaged. At 0600 2-14 began combat assault with the advance element departing enroute to FSB LOGAN I. C Co and B (-) secured FSB. A Co combat assaulted to LZ vic XT 411533 at 0919 hours. Contact was established immediately. A Co, 2-22 conducted recon in force along axis XT 3252 to XT

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted sweep of Rt 22 to GO DAU HA and provided convoy security.

7 March 1968

2-14 Inf: Bn continued recon in force from previous day with Bn forming RON position vic XT 415527 at 1140 hours. 2-22 Inf (M)(-) ready reaction force was in position vic XT 415515 at 0905. 2-14 conducted recon in force to vic XT 416535. 2-22 conducted recon in force to vic XT 417422. At 1500 hours 2-14 began extraction from PZ vic XT 417529 with 2-22 securing LZ and A, 2-22 conducting recon in force to FSB vic XT 315545. B Co, 2-14, A & C Btry, 7-11 Arty and A Co, 2-22 moved back to TAY NINH in convoy. All 2-14 and A Co 2-22 closed DAU TIENG. Friendly losses: 4 US WIA, enemy losses 5 KIA (BC), 3 60mm mortar tubes, 1 base plate, 2 AK-47, 1 AK-50, and 1 Chicom assault weapon. 2-14 supervised dispensary construction, SELF HELP Project, HIEP LONG, XT 233480.

2-22 Inf (M)(-): Operated with 2-14 as above.

D Trp, 3-17 Cav: Conducted sweep Rt 22 to GO DAU HA and secured convoy. One platoon secured engineer effort at laterite pit.

8 March 1968

2-14 Inf: Conducted a combat assault with 3 companies to LZ vic 075553 and conducted recon in force to vic XT 072538 for extraction. C Co provided a platoon for security of the laterite pit, and the remainder of the company supported 2 platoons at XT 115510. One platoon of A Co, 2-22 swept and cleared Route 4 and provided convoy security back to BAU CO. Bn conducted MEDCAP, HIEP TRUONG (XT 212475), treated 182 patients.

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7. Supporting Forces:

a. Air Support:

General: Tactical air-craft from the 7th Tactical Air Force were used to support 2d Brigade operations. The 510th, 90th, 531st, 416th, 309th, 308th, 614th, 612th and the 615th tactical fighter squadrons and the 8th and 18th tactical fighter-bombers flew a total of 203 preplanned missions throughout the Brigade area of operations. 221 immediate and 20 diverted airstrikes were delivered to suppress VC in contact with US forces.

b. Army Aviation

The four (4) organic CH23's were used on a daily basis by the Battalions for command and control, liaison and reconnaissance missions. During the period the four aircraft flew a total of 1,122 hours consisting of 2209 tasks, 3509 sorties with 3756 passengers carried.

The 25th Aviation Battalion provided a UH1D command and control helicopter to the Brigade commander on a daily basis. The Brigade Commander used the C&C extensively for controlling multi-battalion combat assaults, making command visits, and observing tactical operations.

The Bde utilized one or more assault helicopter companies on 76 of 94 days duration of operation SARATOGA. The helicopter Companies, normally furnished by the 269th Combat Aviation Battalion, were used primarily to conduct combat assaults and eagle flights.

CH47's, allocated daily by II Field Force, resupplied the battalions during Operation SARATOGA. An average of 21 sorties were used to move more than 168,000 lbs of Class I, II, IV and V supplies daily. Personnel and mail were moved to forward areas by CH47's daily. Increased activity and contact with the enemy brought more emergency resupplies than normally experienced. These were accomplished rapidly and on a timely basis by UH1D aircraft. Resupply for two units OPCON to the Brigade during a portion of Operation SARATOGA was accomplished by moving unit trains to forward locations and drawing supplies from Division FSE established at Tan Son Nhut. Resupply for Operation SARATOGA was performed without significant problems.

8. Intelligence:

a. The terrain of the area of Operation for Operation SARATOGA, was of varied types. This terrain ranged from the dry, hard rice paddies of Central Hau Nghia Province to the wet lowland groves and tidal flats of the Saigon and Oriental Rivers. Operations were also conducted in the thick transition jungle of the Iron Triangle and Ho Bo woods as well as the Rom-Flowed entanglements of the Filhol, Ho Bo, and Upper Triangle areas and the rubber plantations of Tay Ninh Province. During this period, the weather was hot and dry and imposed no operational difficulties on combat operations in the area.

Sources of intelligence information varied throughout the quarter, ranging from such sophisticated means of collection as People Sniffer and SLAR, to the utilization of infiltrated agents, incidental sources, Hoi Chanhs, POW's and various other indigenous sources. Fit Carson Scouts were attached to each rifle company and proved to be useful in exploration of tunnels and base camp areas as well as obtaining information from the Vietnamese. National Police were utilized in areas of high civilian concentration and also were valuable in dealing with the civilian population.

During the initial stages of Operation SARATOGA, the enemy order of battle was much the same as it had been for several months previously. Enemy elements within the TAOI were primarily local force units, operating with little deviation from already established AOs.

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The 7th Cu Chi Local Force Battalion ranged the area north of National Route 1 from Trang Bang to Tan Phu Trung while elements of the 1st MR-4 Battalion generally worked the areas to the north of the 7th Cu Chi Battalion (lower Boi Loi, Ho Bo, Filhol). To the east of Cu Chi, along the western banks of the Saigon, could be found the 2d Local Force Battalion (Go Mon District). All these elements mentioned above drew their indirect fire support, in part, from the 8th Artillery Battalion MR-4. The northwestern portions of the TAOI were the operational areas of the D-14 Battalion (lower Tay Ninh - Boi Loi) and the D-16 Battalion (Straight Edge Woods-lower Tay Ninh). In southern Hau Nghia and northern Long An (the Fincapple) were located the 269th, 267th and the 506th VC Battalions. There were occasional sorties of Main Forces and NVA units both through and into the area from the north, but there had not been any extensive NVA-MF contacts prior to Operation SARATOGA. Enemy offensive activity for several weeks prior to the initiation of Operation SARATOGA was principally of a harassing nature. Stand off attacks were initiated on several provincial towns as well as Cu Chi Base Camp. Occasional attacks on RF/TF Outposts, primarily along Route 1, made up the bulk of the enemy-initiated action. The probable locations and strength of units within the TAOI upon initiation of SARATOGA are shown below:

(b) Enemy Contact During Operations:

The first significant enemy contact of the operation occurred on the night of 12 December 1967 when elements of the 101st NVA Regiment conducted a coordinated attack on the night location of the 1-27 INF. In this contact, the first by 2d Brigade units against NVA troops in Hau Nghia, the VC suffered 39 KIA (BC). The VC withdrew north into the Ho Bo and were next located on 21 December when 2 Co's of the 2-27 INF ran headlong into one of the 101st Regiment's base areas. The day-long action cost the VC 43 KIA (BC) and gave a hint of the defensive tenacity that could be expected in future operations against similar units. This action added weight to various agent reports that indicated a build up of NVA units and the addition of NVA soldiers to MF and LF units already situated in the area of operations.

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On 4 January, the 1-27 INF and 2-27 INF contacted elements of the 2d Go Mon in their base areas in the 'p Nha Vieu-Trung An complexes on the western banks of the Saigon River. During the 2 day fight in this area the VC lost 89 KIA (BC). The build-up of NVA soldiers with LF units was made dramatically evident when on the night of 10 January, the 1-27 INF night location was attacked by a battalion size element, later identified as the 7th Cu Chi Battalion. A prisoner captured during this battle stated the 50% of his and other units were made up of NVA soldiers. The addition of NVA soldiers to MF and LF units markedly increased their combat effectiveness, a fact that would become increasingly evident in the days to come. 108 VC were killed in this hasty wave attack. In the middle of January, 4-23 INF (M) engaged elements of the 1st Battalion MR-4 in a 2 day action in the lower Ho Bo. The 4-23 INF (M) never penetrated the base area completely, but inflicted heavy losses (49 KIA (BC)) on the entrenched enemy. The build-up of MF units within the TAOI was indicated again when the 2-27 INF engaged the Reconnaissance Company of the 272nd Regiment in an all night battle just south of the Saigon River in the Mushroom. A prisoner taken by the 2-27 indicated that the 272nd was to move into the Cu Chi area and conduct operations beginning in early February. The extent and importance of their mission became dramatically evident in the next several days.

The night of 31 January saw the initiation of the VC TET offensive throughout the III CTZ. Within the 2nd Brigade TAOI, the offensive was initiated with stand off rocket and mortar attacks against Cu Chi, Duc Hoa, Bao Trai and Trang Rang. This attack signalled the first utilization of 122MM rockets against Cu Chi. The main emphasis was directed against Tan Son Nhut and Saigon although there were several artillery ground attacks in the TAOI. The following day, the intent of the enemy in the Cu Chi area became apparent as National Route 1 was interdicted at Tan Thu Trung by a VC Battalion of the 272nd Regiment, the battle to push the 272nd out of the Tan Thu Trung - An Cho area lasted 10 days (6-16 February) and cost the VC 219 dead. The apparent intent of the enemy to remain in the area, no matter what the consequences, pointed out the importance of this interdiction to the overall success of the VC master plan in and around Saigon. The enemy consisted of the 271st and 272nd Regiments as well as the 2nd Go Mon and 1st MR-4 Battalions and assorted artillery elements of the 56th and 58th Battalions of the 69th artillery Groups and portions of the 8th Artillery. Contact was made daily in most portions of the area with well armed, and disciplined VC soldiers.

The extent of the enemy build-up became obvious as large caches of food, ammunition and equipment to include rockets, were discovered. Contact with 2nd Brigade in the Saigon area cost the VC 692 KIA (BC), 184 KIA (FGSS), and 211 weapons captured.

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CONCLUSIONS: The losses sustained by enemy forces, both local force and main force, during Operation SARATOGA has greatly reduced their combat effectiveness. The large quantities of arms, ammunition and other supplies captured by 2nd Brigade units, have rendered sustained enemy offensive operations in the area extremely difficult without a major resupply effort. In addition, much knowledge of VC main force and NVA organization, equipment and operation tendencies has been gained by 2nd Brigade units. This information can be effectively utilized in future operations against similar units. Large tunnel complexes and caches areas in the Ho Bo, Filhol, and Trung An have been rendered unusable. Rome Flow operations in the Ho Bo and Iron Triangle have destroyed valuable, previously secure base areas.

9. MISSION

2nd Brigade conducts offensive operations commencing 8 December 1967 in TAOI to:

- a. Destroy VC/NVA forces and installations.
- b. Provide security for Rome Flow operations, in Iron Triangle.
- c. Support GVN RD programs
- d. Deny the use of the Oriental River as a VC/NVA LOC.
- e. Assist GVN forces in controlling food resources.
- f. Reinforce friendly forces in TAOI as required.

10. Concept of Operation:

Chronological Summary:

(1) OPLAN 25-67 (Operation SARATOGA) HQ 2d Brigade, 25th Infantry Division was issued to participating units.

(2) 8 December 67 - 23 December 67 : TF 4-23 Infantry (M) (REINF) conducted Rome Flow clearing operations. A total of 5,250 acres comprised the area designated to be cleared. Clearing operations were conducted for 16 days. At the end of the period unit returned to Cu Chi Base Camp.

(3) 11 December 1967 1-27 Infantry combat assaulted into area west of Trung Lap to establish a night location and conduct operations North of Route 1. On 12 December, unit made contact with 101st NVA Battalion. This was the first engagement with an NVA unit in the 2nd Brigade TAOI.

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(4) 17-31 December 1967, 2nd Brigade conducted Tank - Infantry operations in Ho Bo, Boi Loi Woods.

(5) 3 January 1968 - 05 February 1968 with 28 Rome Flows moved into Filhol Plantation area and began cutting operations cutting continued until terminated by TET offensive. Flows were returned to Cu Chi Base Camp and released from OFCON, 2nd Brigade.

(6) 4 January 1968 1-27 Infantry moved to FSB CROCKETT and attacked the VC strong holds of Trung An and Ap Nha Viec. 2-27 Infantry Combat assaulted into LZ's along Saigon River vicinity Binh My. Unit later moved into N/L at Trung An. Battalions continued operations through area to the Saigon River.

(7) 29 January 1968 2-27 Infantry conducted night combat assaults into Northern Ho Bo Woods to reinforce Aero Rifles of Troop D, 3rd Squadron 4th ACR. Contact continued throughout the night. All units were extracted the following morning.

(8) 3 February 1968 - 3-22 Infantry attacked Tan Hoa 4-23 Infantry (N) engaged enemy force in Tan Thu Trung - Ap Cho area. Contact in these areas continued until on 14 February when Tan Hoa was taken and, 16 February when Tan Thu Trung and Ap Cho were taken.

(9) 20 February 1968 2nd Brigade Headquarters moved to Hoc Mon where unit remained until 4 March 1968. Brigade elements conducted operations North and East of Hoc Mon until 9 March when all units moved into Hau Nghia Province or were released 2nd Brigade OFCON.

13. Supply and Civil Affairs:

a. Supply:

(1) The CH-47 has proven to be the most effective and efficient vehicle available for providing logistical support to forward units. Its inherent ability to respond quickly to changing tactical situations, rapid delivery speed, and relatively greater allowable weight, has made it an invaluable asset in situations prohibiting the use of over land resupply techniques.

(2) When tactical situations permitted, replacement and evacuation of vehicles and material was accomplished, by the CH-47 A helicopter, CH-54 flying cranes, and river rafts.

(3) Treatment of casualties, evacuation and hospitalization of WIA's and KIA's to Cu Chi and Long Binh hospital was accomplished rapidly and efficiently by helicopters.

(4) A total of 1,974 CH-47 A sorties were used on operation S/RAFOGA to move more than 168,000 tons of class I, II, IV, V TLL, mail and personnel from Cu Chi Base Camp to forward areas.

b. Civil Affairs/Psycops

(1) Medcaps: A total of 206 Medcaps (Medical Civic Action Program) were conducted throughout the Brigade TAOI. A total of 27,472 patients were treated.

D. ISYOPS

(1) During this period there were 141 missions flown dropping a total of 23,718,000 leaflets.

(2) There were 147 loud speaker mission flown totaling 136 hours and 40 minutes of tape time.

Completion of Projects:

(1) The Bao Trai High School was dedicated on 16 December 1967. The 2nd Brigade supplied 2 teachers desk, 16 chairs, 6 blackboards, and 6 world globes.

(2) On 16 December 1967 the 2nd Brigade S-5 arranged for the division veterinarian and his assistant to be flown to the 1-27 Infantry's location to treat an ox who had been wounded by a 1-27 Infantry soldier. The animal had been wounded in the lower hind leg partially severing the tendon. The veterinarian injected 60cc's of tranquilizer in the animal then cleaned and sewed up the wound. 10cc's of penicillin was left with the owner to fight the infection. There were approximately 19 Vietnamese who watched the operation and was kept informed on what was going on by an interpreter. The Vietnamese expressed their thanks.

(3) On 5 January 68 the project to convert the market place at Duc Huo vic XT443064 to a 2 room school was completed.

14. Special Equipment and Techniques:

On three (3) occasions the Brigade utilized CH-47's to fly 38' 4" dry spans, lumber and engineer personnel to build crossing sites within the Brigade Operational area. The crossing sites facilitated the movement of a tank Co OPCON to the 2-27 Infantry. Construction time was normally about four (4) hours. And on 24 December 1967 two (2) crossing sites were constructed, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. As the last tank crossed the first 38' dry span, the span, material and personnel were extracted by CH-47 and landed at the second crossing site approximately three (3) kilometers away.

c. At 2045 hours on 29 January 68, D 26 sprung an ambush on 4 VC at XT744155. The VC body count was unknown at that time. At 2210 hours on the same night, D 26 spotted a VC battalion estimated 300-400 strong moving from north to south along the road (XT744155). They were carrying numerous recoilless rifles and 82mm mortar tubes plus small arms. D 26 requested artillery and adjusted the fire. The VC element was dispersed. It could be assumed that this unit was moving south to take part in the TET offensive which was planned to start shortly after that. A sweep of the area the following day disclosed 1 VC (BC).

d. On 31 Jan 68, the battalion was moved into Cu Chi Base Camp. Intelligence reports indicated that all major US installations would be hit at 0300 (US C-3). Cu Chi came under mortar attack at 0300 hours, however damage was not extensive and there was no ground attack.

e. During the first few days of Feb 68, intelligence reports indicated the presence of large numbers of VC in the area south and east of Cu Chi. There were also reports of the VC capturing villagers and using them for slave labor. From these intelligence reports and from the actions of the enemy it was assumed that his objective was to try and stop convoy movement on NSR 1. The biggest VC resistance was in the village of AP Cho (XT699090) where the enemy were in bunkers made of concrete and reinforced with railroad ties. These bunkers were also connected by a trench and tunnel complex. Fighting in the village was characterized by the enemy staying in position and fighting, contrary to encounters fought in the past.

f. During the last few weeks in Operation Serrano, the battalion was located north of the Saigon region. Here the operation was characterized by lighter enemy contact, none of the type encountered in AP Cho. Numerous bunker complexes were found containing anywhere from 10 to 100 bunkers. Also numerous craters of the new 122mm rocket and its component parts were uncovered. It is believed that these rockets were being used on the Tan Son Nhut Airfield during and after the TET offensive. The enemy also utilized sampans very frequently as a mode of transportation.

9. (C) MISSION: 3-22 Infantry (-) convoyed from Dau Tieng Base Camp to FSB SCARLET, via NSR 2, to conduct reconnaissance in force operations to locate, fix and destroy VC/NVA forces between Cu Chi and Saigon.

10. (C) CONCEPT OF OPERATION: The 3-22 Infantry (-) to move and secure FSB SCARLET. Initiate action with reconnaissance in force (RIF) to locate, fix and destroy VC/NVA forces along the NSR. The battalion, Company, and Platoon size units will be prepared to reinforce other units under attack, provide security for designated areas and routes.

(a) Through out the duration of this operation the battalion "Regulars Club" was able to provide an adequate supply of cold refreshments. f. Communications:

(1) The proximity of the Battalion to Dien Bien Phu Camp did not permit the use of direct radio communications without the use of a retrans station, located at Cu Chi.

(2) Land line communications were established to FSB SCARLET and were highly effective, however, there were occasional breaks caused by vehicles. This problem was solved by burying the cables. Land lines were also used at Cu Chi Base Camp to allow the forward TOC communications with Dien Bien Phu Camp. When the Battalion moved to Tan Son Nhut it was not necessary to lay land lines.

(3) In general, communications were excellent. Terrain occasionally interfered with radio transmission, however, long antennas nearly always eliminated the problem.

P. Medical:

In the last two months we recognized that the enemy has many advantages over daytime reconnaissance in force operations by Free World Forces. However, since daylight operations are essential, we sought a method of engaging the VC under conditions most advantageous to ourselves which would capitalize on our daylight operations and influence future operations. The purpose of this presentation is to discuss the techniques that evolved for the conduct of night time ambushes of enemy waterway lines of communications.

In late February, the 3d Battalion, 22D Infantry was operating in an area 10 kilometers north of Saigon. The mission of the battalion was to stop enemy rocket attacks on the Saigon area and to destroy enemy forces in the area of operations. Our mission required us to operate in the daytime initially. Utilizing accurate intelligence provided by the local population and the local Popular Force, we located the center of the rocket activity. There ensued a period of extensive daytime offensive operations during which we destroyed a large VC force, uncovered a complete rocket launcher with accessories, and 16 complete rockets. After this fight we pretty well dominated our area of operations. More importantly to subsequent operations, we began to know the terrain as well as, or better than, the enemy. This knowledge was largely attributed to the use of local PF's as guides. Our daytime operations diminished as we turned more to company sized night ambushes as a means of maintaining control of the terrain taken during daylight operations. Once the enemy was under control on the ground we looked to the waterways as the probable routes of enemy movement and rocket supply in our area.

Soon after our arrival in the area, we received an additional mission to secure an Engineer Construction Project in our area of operation. We were given two 27' Engineer Bridge Construction Boats to assist in the security operations and to patrol the Saigon River. These boats were so efficient that we requested and received six additional "Breston Whirlers" to move larger forces within the area and to react quickly. We mounted .50 caliber machine guns on the 27 footers to increase the fire power of our waterborne force.

Since we could not indiscriminately take sampans under fire during the daytime, we ambushed the waterways at night. This was also the most logical time for the enemy to attempt to move his men and material. To illustrate these techniques, I have selected two examples of our operations. The first, presented in some detail, is an ambush conducted by A Company during the night of 29 Feb thru 1 Mar 68. It was characterized by the use of boats for insertion and extraction of the ambush force. The ambush site was the intersection of the Hoc Mon Canal and the Saigon River - the most likely looking spot in our area of operations. The objective was the destruction of VC amphen traffic. A Company was inserted at 0900 hours at a point about 1000 meters east of the ambush site.

We paid a great deal of attention to the insertion and extraction of our ambush forces. Frequently we inserted one company at the same place as, or near, the force to be extracted. Sometimes we inserted overland and extracted by boat or inserted by boat and extracted overland. Hopefully we deceived the VC as to the exact location, and even the existence of an operation. In all cases we planned artillery and mortar fires along the route of insertion and extraction and in the vicinity of the ambush sites.

The plan called for the daylight hours to be spent first in searching and securing the area adjacent to the ambush site and then hiding for the balance of the day. This permitted rest and careful planning for occupation of the ambush site at dusk. I emphasize that rest is essential since the ambush must maintain a 100% alert throughout the night. In this case, during the initial search A Company captured one sleeping VC and made contact with a second who chose to engage the company with AK-47 fire. The sniper was located and subsequently killed. The POW was evacuated by water, interrogated and disclosed that he was a replacement who saw the Saigon River the preceding night. A Company killed three more of these infiltrators during the night as they crawled out of the river after their swim.

At dusk the company occupied the east bank of the Hoc Mon Canal utilizing three positions. One platoon was positioned to the north and one platoon to the south of the main body to serve as lookouts. The killer force consisted of one platoon along the bank of the canal while one platoon provided security to the rear.

Several specialized techniques were employed to increase the efficiency of the ambush force. The team travelled light, carrying only weapons, ammunition, food and water. At night holsters were discarded to enhance the sense of horror. Sterlight scopes were substituted within the company to bolster the capability of the killer force. In addition, the platoon leader of the killer force was armed with an M-14 rifle with sterlight mounted. He fired the first rounds-tracers and thus directed the fires of the other members of the platoon. When required, illumination was provided by positioning the light several thousand meters away from the ambush site - primarily to assist the sterlights while not illuminating the team.

The primary kill weapons were claymore mines set on the bank at high water level, LAWs to sink the sampans, M-79s used on the banks, and M-60 machine guns with tracer rounds to kill the personnel. Later we began to lay external detonated satchel charges on the bottom of the shallow canals primarily in an attempt to take prisoners by stunning the occupants of the sampans.

The ambush was conducted by the lookout elements alerting the killer force when a sampan entered the kill zone. This early warning afforded us maximum effective fire by the killer force.

We learned quite a bit about river ambushes during this night. First of all, there were four separate engagements during the night all conducted from the same ambush positions. We concluded that there was no communication between sampans. By striking and then maintaining strict noise discipline, another one to two hours would see another target using the same route. This was later proven to be an unwarranted conclusion when we discovered the use of a "Traffic Cop". He would tap out a signal on the side of a sampan. About 30 minutes later a sampan would appear. We used him until he got wise and fired some warning shots. Secondly confinement of sampan traffic to the observed waterways, plus the early warning, enhances the effectiveness of the ambush. Finally we found that after striking a sampan, patient and quiet observation with sterlights and "ears" gave us an opportunity to hit survivors as they tried to escape. In this situation, the American soldier is far more patient than the VC.

This ambush, one of the most successful, produced four sunken sampans and at least 22 VC killed, including the morning kill and three survivors.

The next morning, waterborne extraction was preceded by a visual recon by a light fire team at first light and a sweep of the immediate area by the company. The return boat ride to the battalion base was also covered by the light fire team.

The second brief example was chosen because it illustrates the insertion and extraction of an ambush without the use of boat transportation.

This was a two company operation which took place to the west where the Ho Lien Canal splits to form a triangle as shown here. In this case, Company A was employed on the western triangular island and Company C occupied the eastern island position. Both companies moved overland and concealed their intentions by scorching an adjacent area to the south of their ambush sites. They hid at lunch time and then proceeded to their ambush sites at dusk. Each company carried a 5 ton Engineer Hoe maintenance raft and lengths of nylon rope. The rope was tied to the raft, fore and aft, and a fairly rapid water crossing was accomplished.

Company A had no contact on this night, but Company C found a propaganda center complete with printing press on their island and subsequently engaged 10 VC moving toward the north bank of the Ho Lien Canal. The early morning scorch of the north bank and adjacent areas disclosed 5 VC bodies. Again extraction from the island was covered by visual reconnaissance provided by a light fire team. Both companies returned to the battalion base by sweeping an area not previously covered. It was during one of these follow up scorch operations the C Company found 18 mortar rockets in one cache.

As an example of the effectiveness of this technique, Company A alone has averaged 6 + kills per ambush for 7 ambushes. While this is not a large kill, it is consistent, and we believe that the VC movement into our area was disrupted. MOST IMPORTANTLY the enemy was deprived of freedom of movement at night. We have observed that the VC are extremely vulnerable at night. They talk, use trails, reportedly use the same water routes and generally present easy marks for our ambushes. As a result, our normal method of operations now is to employ two companies on a 24 hour operation at all times. All of these operations include a daylight scorch of Company A or of operations, a night ambush, and a sweep back to the battalion base.

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The psychological benefits accrued by these night ambushes are great. First of all we have suffered only two casualties in the entire battalion when operating at night. This is an obvious selling point for the men. Secondly the results are tangible and the units have become highly competitive and inventive about ambushing. And finally, the ultimate has happened. We now have companies and platoons looking for ambush sites during daylight operations and actually requesting night ambush missions. As a direct result we believe that the enemy - who formerly owned the night has now lost his sanctuary.

a. Air Support: Tactical air was provided when required. Troop D (Air) provided light fire teams for close-in support; while UH-1D's and OH-23's provided command and control, resupply, and lift helicopters as required.

8. Intelligence:

9. Mission: 3d Squadron, 4th Cavalry performed reconnaissance in force vic Trung Lap (XT5820). Reacted to attack on Tan Son Nhut Air Base vic (XS8196), conducted search and destroy, reconnaissance in force missions vic Tan Son Nhut and Hoc Mon (XT7403).

10. Concept of Operation: The Squadron moved vic Trung Lap to conduct reconnaissance in force to locate, destroy, and prevent VC/NVA infiltration in/through that area subsequently terminating this operation 29 January. The Squadron secured major areas along MSR, characterized by ambush patrols, listening posts, and radar. 31 January the Squadron (-) reacted to Tan Son Nhut Air Base initially with one ground troop (-), which was ambushed. Subsequently reinforcing with one air troop and one ground troop (+). The Squadron (-) became OPCON to the 2d Bde, 1st Infantry Division to conduct search and destroy missions vic Tan Son Nhut to locate and destroy all VC/NVA forces in area. Operations terminated 7 February. The Squadron (-) became OPCON 3d Bde, 25th Infantry Division to conduct reconnaissance in force to locate and destroy VC/NVA forces rocket sites, and VC/NVA Base Camps.

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11. Execution:

21-27 January

The Squadron conducted road march to vic Trung Lap. GP was maintained near same area. The Squadron conducted reconnaissance in force utilizing three ground troops with the air troop screening to their flanks. On 24 January Troop A tripped a booby trap 105mm round resulting in 3 US KIA and one VC PW with web gear. On 25 January a tank from Troop C hit a mine resulting in 2 US KIA. The Troop later was ambushed receiving 3 RPG-2, 300 small arms rounds. Return fire with organic weapons resulting in 2 US KIA. On 26 January Troop C picked up 1 VC PW and 1 detainee with carbine, 1 RPG-2 round, notebook and paper, 1 M60 machine-gun and 1 aircraft radio. Troop A engaged 1 VC, XT572284, with three hand grenades and 5-10 rounds small arms, resulting in 1 VC KIA (IC) and capturing 1 AK 47 with magazine, 2 batteries and 1 reel of wire, 6sa 2 1/2 lb bags of rice, 4 cans of condensed milk, 2 pair brown and 1 pair of black trousers. On 28 January 3 VC jumped out of spider holes XT567262 and threw grenades at C troop. The troop took under fire resulting in 4 US KIA, 7 VC KIA (IC), 5 VC PW, and 3 detainees. On 29 January Troop D received fire from 4 VC, XT595304, returned fire resulting in 4 VC KIA (IC), then inserted Mörtils which made heavy contact with unknown number VC. The 2d Bn, 27 Inf reacted to them. Results of action 5 US KIA, 6 US KIA, 46 VC KIA (IC), 4 VC KIA (POSS), 8 VC PW and 6 detainees. There was 15 pounds of food, condensed milk, numerous documents and clothing captured.

30 January-10 March

The Squadron secured major areas along MSR. On 31 January Troop C (-) reacted to Trn Son Nhut Air Base. The Troop was ambushed outside gate 051. The Squadron reacted with Troop D and Troop B (+). The results of action was 3 APC completely lost, 1 Tank completely lost, 7 APC damaged, 14 US KIA, 64 US KIA, 309 VC KIA (IC), 24 VC PW, 1 Chicom radio, numerous weapons and equipment. On 1 February Troop B and C began search and destroy mission vic Trn Son Nhut to destroy the remainder of VC/NVA forces in area. The Squadron was OPCON 2d Bde 1st Infantry Division until the termination of operations 7 February which results were 3 VC KIA (IC) and 1 VC KIA (POSS). The Squadron (-) then went OPCON to the 3d Bde 25th Infantry Division. The Squadron(-) and Co A, 1/27 Inf began search and destroy operations vic Hoc Non (XT7404). Troop B and Co A 1/27 Inf, were on line moving through area with Troop C as reaction force when Co A 1/27 Inf made

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from three sides, followed by ground attack, returned fire with organic weapons, air and artillery resulting in 1 US KIA, 4 US KIA, and 2 VC KIA (EC). On 27 February Troops A and B on search and destroy captured one detainee, and 1/2 lbs documents, while destroying 30 bunkers. On 28 February Troop A and C received fire with organic weapons, and RPG fire XT742015, returning fire with organic weapons, artillery, LFT and Tactical air, resulting in 1 US KIA, 13 US KIA, 1 APC damaged, 1 tank heavy damaged, 7 VC KIA (EC). On 4 March Troop C and Co D2/12 Inf on search and destroy via XT760052 captured one AK 47 one set ammunition. Took 3 lbs of documents, one TPG-7 sight, destroying 11 Chicom granades, 135 bunkers, 9 rounds of R G-2 and 7, 5 RBS boosters, 600 meters com wire, 1 M-17 protective mask, 300 lbs chicom C-4, and 200 rounds of AK 47. On 6 March, 3d Squadron, 4th Cavalry received SA, AN, and RPG fire from unknown size VC force, returned fire with all organic weapons, LFT, arty and Tactical Air, resulting in 1 US KIA, 19 US KIA, 1 APC combat loss, 1 APC damaged, 2 tanks damaged, 2 VC KIA (EC), and 15 bunkers destroyed. 3d Squadron 4th Cavalry and D 2-12 Inf while on search and destroy mission via XT7500 located 2 VC KIA (EC) in graves also destroying 215 bunkers, 4 anti-aircraft positions, 1 CKC granade, 1 carbino stock and 5 helmets. On 8 March Troop B and B Co. 2-12 Inf. captured 8 detainees and destroyed 10 bunkers and 10 soldier holes while on search and destroy via XT7312. CP located at XT73052 received 5 rounds (COM) mortar returned fire with AT and arty, resulting in 3 US KIA. On 9 March Troop A and B Co. 2-12 Inf captured 1 AK 47, documents and a motor bike, they also destroyed 12 rocket positions via XT736789. On 10 March Troop A and B Co. 2-12 Inf on search and destroy via XT7399 captured 4 detainees and destroyed 1 individual firing positions, also destroyed were 3 bunkers and 10 sleeping positions. Operations S, R, A, T, C, G, terminated on 10 March 1968. The Squadron remained in area OPCON to the 3d Bde 25th Infantry Division



When the 3d Squadron, 17th Cavalry was committed to Operation Saratoga, elements of the 9th VC Division and 7th VC Division, as well as Local Force Battalions, were conducting offensive operations in and around the Saigon complex. During this period the VC/VA had the capability to conduct coordinated battalion size attacks on installations or US Fire Support Bases and harass friendly units with rocket and mortar attacks.

b. Terrain and Weather:

(1) General: The TAO was bounded generally by the Saigon River on the East, Highway #1 on the West, District of Co Vap on the South and the Michelin Plantation on the North. (Annex A Operations Overlay)

(2) Terrain:

(a) Observation and fields of fire ranged from limited in the Filhol and Ho Bo areas to excellent in the rice paddies near the Hoc Mon Canal.

(b) Obstacles - Throughout the TAO there were no natural or artificial obstacles which impeded the reconnaissance or movement of the Squadron.

(c) Concealment - The hours of darkness and early morning fog provide the VC/WVA with natural concealment from air activity. Once the fog lifted the enemy had to remain in his bunker complexes and huts to remain undetected.

(d) Key Terrain - Highway #1 was selected as key terrain since this is the route by which convoys move to resupply the 25th Infantry Division units.

(e) Avenues of Approach - Michelin Plantation - Trapezoid - Ho Bo - Filhol - Saigon.

(3) Weather:

(a) Visibility - During early morning hours visibility was restricted to 3 miles or less due to fog. At approximately 0900 hours the fog would lift enabling the aeroscots to conduct armed visual reconnaissance.

(b) Temperature - The temperature averaged in the high eighties throughout the operation.

c. Intelligence During the Operation: (Annex B Intelligence Overlay)

(1) Enemy Units - The VC/WVA units that were identified within the Squadron's TAO were the 271st, 272d, 101st and 88th Regiments.

(2) Rocket sites which the enemy used were in the vicinity of XT8104 and XT8204, all east of Hoc Mon.

(3) Lines of communication for the VC/WVA extended from the Michelin Plantation - Trapezoid - Hoc Mon.

(4) Logistical Bases: Several large bunker complexes were discovered vicinity XT5930 and XT6P22, consisting of over 75 bunkers in each complex. The small complexes consisted of approximately 10 bunkers each. All of the complexes were located along the Saigon River in Binh Duong and Hau Nghia Province.

10. CONCEPT OF OPERATION:

3d Squadron, 17th Cavalry (-) will provide continuous reconnaissance in force north and west of Tan Son Nhut to locate and destroy all enemy rocket positions. Squadron will receive OPCON of D Troop, 3d Squadron, 4th Cavalry and 25th Aviation Battalion (-). Maximum effort will be maintained in AO both day and night.

11. EXECUTION:

a. Movement:

On 1 February 1968, the squadron was given the mission to provide continuous reconnaissance and surveillance in the Tan Son Nhut rocket belt. To accomplish this, the Squadron Tactical Operations Center had to move a jump command post to Cu Chi by air. The jump command post was composed of elements of S3, S2, Communications, Artillery Liaison Team and an Air Force Forward Air Control Team. All elements were operational by 1700 hours at Cu Chi. Troop and squadron field trains remained at Tay Ninh while limited organizational maintenance support was sent to Cu Chi. D Troop remained at Tay Ninh.

b. 19 February 1968 - 23 February 1968:

Operations during this period were characterized by intense armed aerial reconnaissance during the day and intense armed aerial surveillance at night. Both air cavalry troops maintained reconnaissance teams in their assigned sectors during the day performing detailed aerial reconnaissance, searching for enemy rocket positions, suspected enemy storage areas, and any signs of enemy movement. Enemy activity was very evident throughout the area which led the aeroscouts to pinpointing not only enemy locations but also rocket storage areas and launching sites. Night activities required several aeroweapons teams to be airborne throughout the night, prepared to bring fire on any sites launching rockets within the division area of responsibility. Controlling those teams was an airborne command and control helicopter, with flares aboard, as well as a fixed wing spotter plane, with an artillery forward observer. When targets were spotted at night, the aeroweapons teams would engage immediately, followed by an artillery saturation of the area. Flares were dropped as needed to illuminate the target area. On 19 February 1968, B Troop located a rocket site at XT852054, composed of twelve launching positions. Reconnaissance of the area showed several signs of recent enemy activity, however, no enemy were sighted. Firing from the site had been conducted at some previous time, as evidenced by the back-blast areas clearly evident on the ground. Necessary photographs were taken and sketches made for intelligence purposes. (Annex C: Sketch Rocket Launching Site). Upon completion of these activities, artillery fires were placed on the site destroying several positions and heavily damaging the rest. Enemy bunkers in the area of the site were also destroyed or damaged by artillery. On 21 February 1968, an element of the 3d Squadron, 4th Cavalry was engaged in heavy

contact at XT571922. An attacking team of C Troop, 3d Squadron, 14th Cav was sent to support the Saber element in contact. The team received heavy automatic weapons fire and one UH1H was shot down, landing just south of the contact. Shortly afterwards, the 3d Brigade Commander was shot down at the same location. C Troop immediately dispatched a scout team, a weapons team and one UH1H to the area to provide security for both aircraft until ground forces arrived. One of the WSA immediately landed at the site and extracted the Brigade Commander, despite heavy enemy fire in the area. C Troop's aeroweapons team, combined with Saber elements, soon suppressed the enemy fire enabling the UH1H to extract the crew of the other downed aircraft. The following day both C Troop and the 3d Squadron, 14th Cavalry went back into the same area. C Troop located an estimated VC company, directed Saber to the enemy, supported him, and was credited with 30 VC KIA (VC). On 19 February 1968, D Troop received a report from 1st Battalion, 27th Infantry, of rockets being fired from XT017021. A scout team was immediately sent to that location and spotted the launching site. The scouts then proceeded to lead elements of the battalion to that location. While enroute, the element came in contact with an unknown number of VC, which D Troop immediately took under fire. Upon termination of the contact, a ground search was made of the launching site and all positions were destroyed. This combined technique, in both contacts, proved very valuable. In one instance, a complete search of the site was conducted as well as complete destruction, while the scout team provided the security for the completion of the above task. In the other, the scouts pinpointed the enemy and directed friendly troops to the point of contact, enabling the troops to maneuver and route the enemy. During this period D Troop had one platoon in Di An, packing organizational equipment for movement to Tay Ninh. One platoon was airlifted to Cu Chi each day to act as ready reaction force for the squadron.

c. 24 February 1968

D Troop, 3d Squadron, 14th Cavalry was inserted at YS693363 to exploit intelligence information gathered by C Troop. Recent activity had been noted around bunkers in the area and VC had been spotted in the general area on several occasions. D Troop was inserted at 1020 hours, methodically searched the area surrounding the IZ, and then proceeded toward the bunker complex. With air cover provided by C Troop, "Blue Tiger" assaulted the area and searched the bunkers. Many signs of the enemy were found, including clothing and two CHICOM Gas Masks, however, no enemy personnel were encountered. Extraction was completed at 1215 hours vicinity YS706971.

d. 25 February 1968 thru 7 March 1968

During this period the enemy became either bolder in his actions or more desperate in his attempt to destroy US Forces. The VC were not using their normal tactics of trying to hide during the day but rather engaged our aircraft on almost every mission. On 27 February 1968, an OH6A from B Troop was on a low level reconnaissance when he received automatic weapons fire at XT843043. The aircraft took four hits but the aviator was able to land safely at Cu Chi. On 28 February 1968, a light fire team from A Company, 25th Aviation Battalion, on a night surveillance mission, spotted a rocket site launching rockets toward Ton Son Nhut Air Base. The Diamond Heads

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immediately struck and silenced the target with machine and rocket fire. The following morning a reconnaissance of the area credited them with 2 VC NVA (PC) and the rocket position vertically destroyed. D Troop conducted a route sweep from Tay Ninh to Go Dau Ha. They encountered three roadblocks, all unguarded, and were ordered to XTH58216, site of a blown bridge. A dismounted patrol checking the bridge site received automatic weapons fire. Fire was returned resulting in 1 VC NVA (PC) and 1 VC I (Possible). On 2 March 1968, B Troop was in support of C Company, 1st Battalion, 9th Infantry, at XTH47035, who was in heavy contact. Both aircraft were engaged with heavy enemy automatic weapons fire resulting in one aircraft receiving four hits and the other ship five. The team was credited with 5 VC NVA (PC). On 4 March 1968, D Troop conducted a route sweep from Tay Ninh to XTH58216, south of Go Dau Ha. They proceeded to secure the engineer team rebuilding the bridge previously mentioned. A mounted patrol engaged 1 squad of VC at XTH7226 resulting in 1 VC NVA (PC) with no friendly casualties or damage. At 1800 hours the squadron command post closed out at Cu Chi and returned to Tay Ninh. During the course of the operation, initially, no movement had been sighted departing the Saigon area. All indications showed the enemy remaining in place with some indications of resupplying moving toward the Saigon area by sampans and foot traffic. Toward the end of this period, however, indications started to show some movement away from the Saigon area toward the northwest. Small groups of enemy were spotted moving north and engaged. Sampans were spotted, at night, by flare illumination, moving north and destroyed. Activity the last few days became less than at any previous time. On 7 March 1968, C Troop was placed OCON to the 9th Infantry Division and D Troop was placed OCON to 1st Battalion, 23d Infantry.

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a. Supply

(1) Class I

(a) Difficulties were experienced in providing B and C Troops with hot meals. The problem was partially solved by locating a unit at Cu Chi that agreed to feed B Troop. It became necessary to move a mess hall from Tay Ninh to Cu Chi for C Troop and Squadron headquarters personnel.

(b) It is suggested that a sponsoring unit be designated, in the operations order, to coordinate the supply and preparation of rations when it is necessary for a troop to operate away from its base camp facilities.

(2) Class II

The absence of critical radios, i.e. MRC-41, M/VRC-24, and the remote control GRA-74, imposed additional and unnecessary command and control problems. This unit is also short the KA-64 cameras.

(3) Class III

Without problems, generally outstanding support.

(4) Class IV

Barrier materials are increasingly harder to obtain. Personnel bunkers had to be constructed from make shift materials with questionable safety standards. The situation did not improve until OROD 4-67 was used to justify this essential construction. Standard engineer plans for different size personnel anti-mortar/rocket bunkers should be made available to units, to include complete bill of materials. If materials on plan are not available for issue, a substitute issue should be made.

b. During this operation the squadron operated the Tay Ninh area rearming point without any outside help. This rearming point is actually the responsibility of DISCOM 25th Infantry Division. By utilizing all squadron assets (1 Ammo Specialists and 2 Ammo Handlers, as well as the Support Platoon leader) no flexibility remained to the squadron to shift rearming points as required by tactical situation. In addition, work details of 2 to 6 men had to be provided by the combat elements of this organization.

c. Maintenance:

During the portion of the operation requiring 24 hour operation of armed UH1C helicopters, the availability was reduced by 50% or more. Aeroresponse teams, flown at night, were required to be down for maintenance during the day. The result being that the troops could provide one aeroresponse team, with no back up during the day. It was also noted that night maintenance for aircraft was hampered due to light discipline requirements at the troop's location at Cu Chi. Direct support maintenance at Cu Chi was also hampered as they were unable to perform maintenance at night. For the elements located at Tay Ninh, normal night maintenance was performed.

14. SPECIAL EQUIPMENT AND TECHNIQUES

In more than one instance, an aeroscout team led a ground maneuver unit to an enemy position, enabling the commander to make a complete exploitation of the area. The scout team made a detailed reconnaissance of the objective area, informing the commander of known enemy locations and suspected locations. A route to the objective was specified including best avenues of approach as well as fording sites over streams. Advance, flank and rear security were provided the unit during the move. At the objective the scouts relayed information on the enemy's activities to the commander and when the enemy broke and ran, the scout team engaged and killed them. This maneuver - air cavalry team proved very effective and should be considered and used on future operations.

15. COMBAT UNIT'S ANALYSIS

ITEM: Timely Release of Tactical Units.

DISCUSSION: At 0700 hours, 7 March 1968, C Troop became OPCOM to the 1st Brigade, 9th Infantry Division, located at Dong Tam. The Troop Command Post had to be moved to that location, make coordination with 1st Brigade, and issue an operation ordered by 0700 hours, 7 March 1968. C Troop was not released from tactical operations by the 25th Division until approximately

1230 hours, 6 March 1968. Utilizing a tactical unit until almost the last moment before assignment, unless a tactical emergency exists, creates an undue hardship, not only upon that unit but also reduce its effectiveness to the receiving unit.

OBSERVATION: The losing organization should be directed to release CPCON at least 24 hours in advance. The G3 of the 9th Infantry Division stated that this was normal procedure, however, the 25th Division though the opposite was true. A set procedure should be established. It is impossible for an Air Cavalry Troop to move its entire operation at night and be able to function with the expected degree of effectiveness at first light.

ITEM: Aeronautical Teams in Close Support of Ground Units

DISCUSSION: Many times commanders would call for aeronautical support to scramble in support of a contact. When the team arrived on station, the commander was not ready to utilize it because he was employing artillery or did not know the disposition of his ground elements.

OBSERVATION: When commanders request aeronautical support they should plan for their use prior to arrival. On many occasions it appears that some commanders cry "Wolf" and give no thought to the tactical plan. This prevents the aeronautical team from being utilized on a mission where it might truly be needed.

ITEM: Employment of OH6A with UH1C

DISCUSSION: Many variations in the employment of OH6A's and UH1C's have been tried in the past.

OBSERVATION: The best general employment is one OH6A with one UH1C. This variation provides the ability to recon with the scout and strike with the weapons ship when a target is spotted. The weapons ship also helps to maintain air to ground communications as well as give instantaneous cover to the scout if he receives enemy fire.

ITEM: Employment of Light Fire Team

DISCUSSION: The squadron has frequently been detailed to provide light fire teams to support ground units. The missions of an air cavalry squadron are reconnaissance, surveillance, security and economy of forces; not light fire team support. When this type mission is forced upon the squadron, it greatly reduces combat effectiveness and ability to accomplish the primary missions. Therefore, the ground commander may not receive the intelligence and information which he may need to properly employ his command.

OBSERVATION: The ground commander must be informed of the Air Cavalry's primary missions and made to realize that misutilization of air cavalry assets is denying him intelligence and information which he may need to command his tactical units.

ITEM: Engaging Rocket Sites at Night

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DEMO STRY: Up to this time the Squadron had little and infrequent occasion to employ enemy weapons position at night. It was decided that additional training was needed in this type of mission. Since the conditions could not be simulated during daylight hours, it was further decided that the training had to be conducted concurrently with the primary mission. An artillery observer was on station with gun teams at night. By calling for a single round of 105mm, the rocket backblast was simulated. The gunship crews were required to detect and immediately engage the target. Since the artillery observer, in an O-1, was able to keep the target area in sight he could also judge the accuracy of the fires.

OBSERVATION: The above procedure proved beneficial to the unit's accomplishment of its mission by increasing the confidence of the gunners to engage such targets at night.

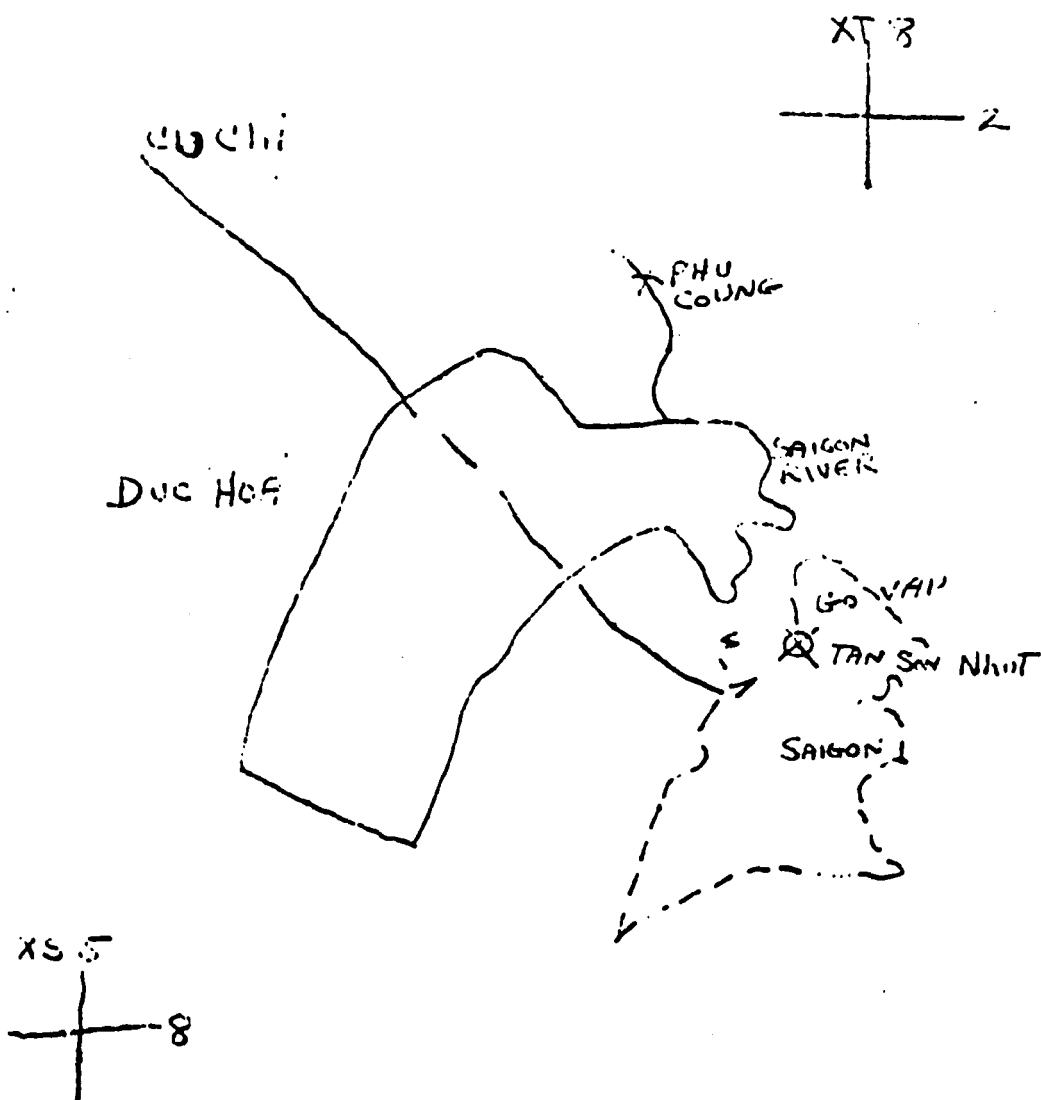

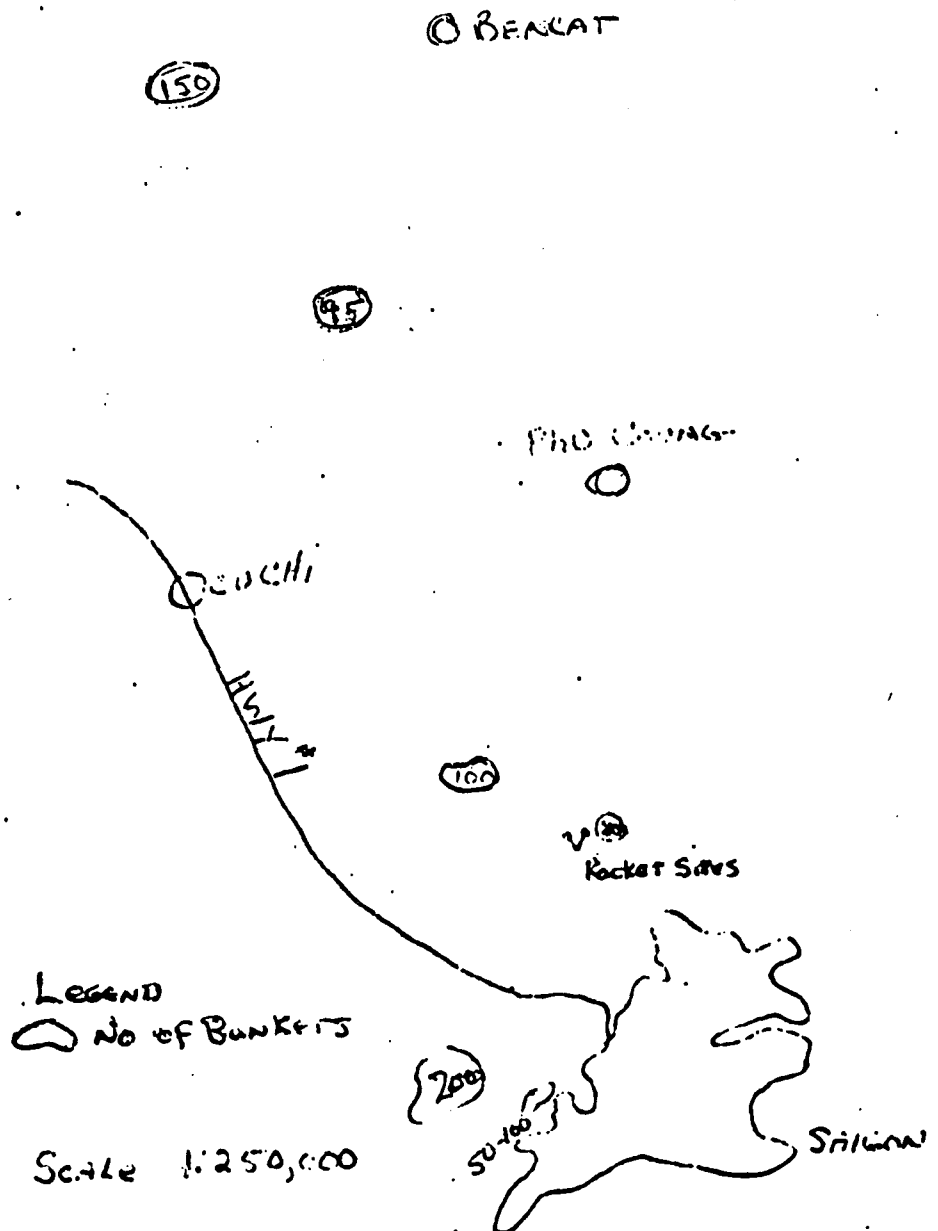

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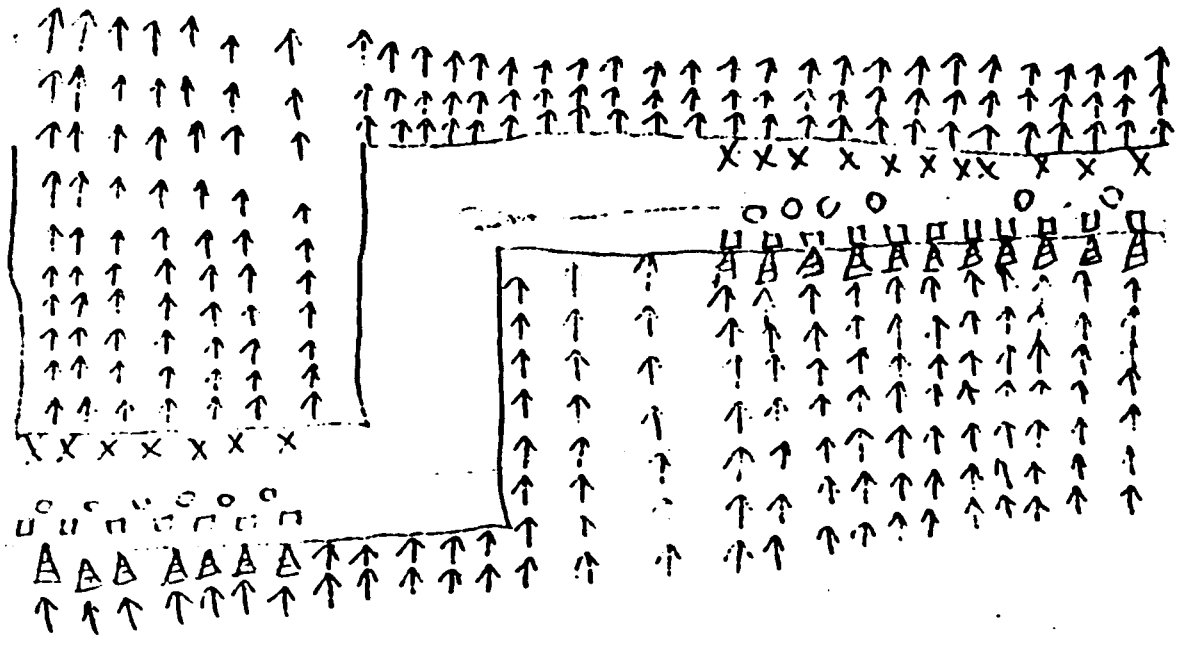

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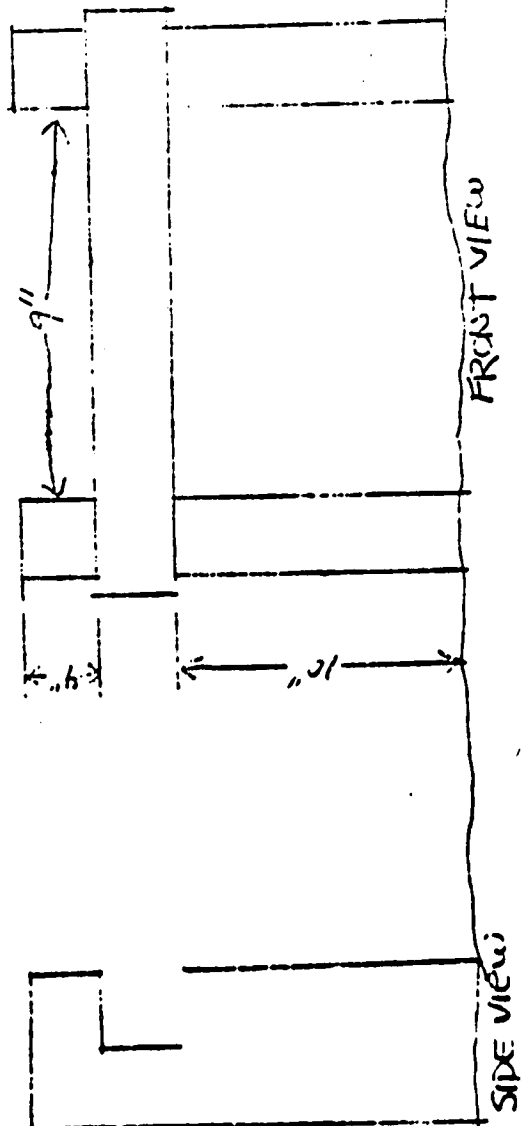
