



1. It has been brought to my attention that on or about 1 April 1968 you were disrespectful and insubordinate in manner and speech to 1Lt Robert W. Hill, who is your superior and who was acting in the capacity of officer in charge of a detail to which you were assigned.
2. Your personal qualities are such that you have the capacity to be a leader of men and an asset to your company, the service, and the nation. You, however, lack the self discipline required to direct your talents into a meaningful and productive execution of your duty. Through your own short coming you have brought great personal discredit upon yourself.
3. You have been counseled about your failures and it seems have disregarded the advice and counsel rendered. You are hereby reprimanded for your conduct.
4. A copy of this letter will be placed in your 201 file where it will remain until your departure from this command. Your conduct will be re-evaluated at that time and determination will be made, based on that re-evaluation, whether this letter will be made a permanent part of your 201 file.

Awarded: Distinguished Flying Cross (First Oak Leaf Cluster)

Date action: 27 August 1967

Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For heroism while participating in aerial flight evidenced by voluntary actions above and beyond the call of duty: Warrant Officer Scott distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous actions while flying in a light fire team in support of ground operations. The fire team was positioned so as to provide coverage for a flight of lift helicopters that were inbound into the landing zone. As the flight pulled pitch, Warrant Officer Scott was in position to cover their departure from the landing zone and was in the lead position at that time. He had descended to provide coverage and draw ~~fire that might have~~ been intended for the slicks. Before he had a chance to return to his wing position, he received heavy automatic weapons fire. As the rounds struck his side of the cockpit, shrapnel, including a rivet, struck his right leg. He banked his aircraft and brought deadly accurate rocket fire on the enemy and neutralized the enemy. He then took up the wing position and continued to fly until the mission was over. Upon returning to rearm and refuel he was notified of another urgent mission. He took off and continued to fly the wing position for an additional one and a half hours until the subsequent missions were completed. Warrant Officer Scott's determination and devotion to duty are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit and the United States Army.


Theater: Republic of Vietnam

Reason: For heroism while participating in aerial flight evidenced by voluntary actions above and beyond the call of duty: Warrant Officer Scott distinguished himself by exceptionally valorous actions while piloting a spider gunship south of Saigon in support of the 9th Infantry Division. While supporting this unit, his gunship received heavy automatic weapons fire which disabled the controls of the aircraft commander. Warrant Officer Scott instantly recovered the aircraft out of a near fatal dive and ~~although the aircraft~~ was severely damaged, he was able to land it near a friendly position without additional damage or injury to his ship or crew. Warrant Officer Scott's professionalism and outstanding flying ability are in keeping with the highest traditions of the military service and reflect great credit upon himself, his unit and the United States Army.

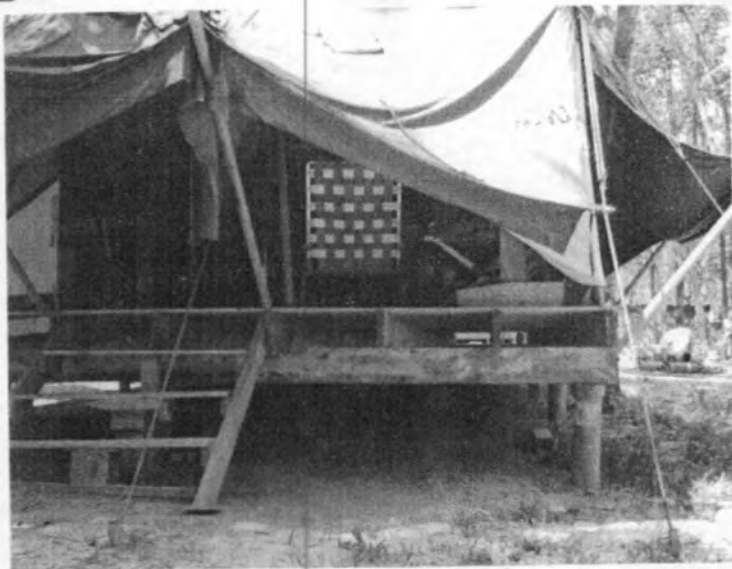
### Awarded Distinguished Flying Cross In Vietnam

Army Warrant Officer Ross R. Scott, son of retired Major and Mrs. Ross Scott, Tacoma, Washington, formerly of Tell City, and grandson of Mr. and Mrs. Irvin Scott of Tell City, was recently awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross

in ceremonies at Dau Tieng, Vietnam. Scott received the DFC and the Purple Heart for heroism while flying helicopter missions in Vietnam. He was wounded in the leg while in flight.

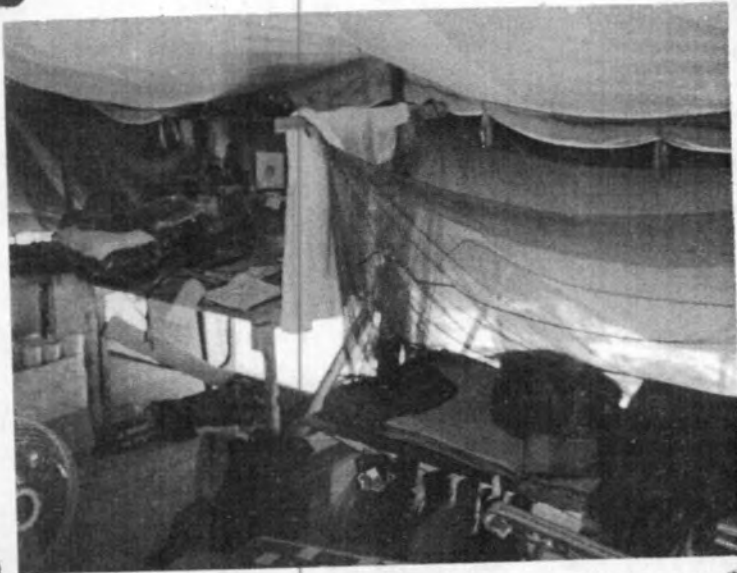
The citation read in part: "You are awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for heroism while serving as a helicopter pilot in Vietnam. While you were wounded in the right leg providing cover for combat troops landing in a battle area, you continued firing on enemy positions until forced to return to your base to refuel, then took off again on another urgent mission."

This all happened in early October. Since that time Scott's wife Anna, who also resides in Tacoma, joined him for a short rest and recreation leave in Hawaii. Scott then returned to his unit in Vietnam.



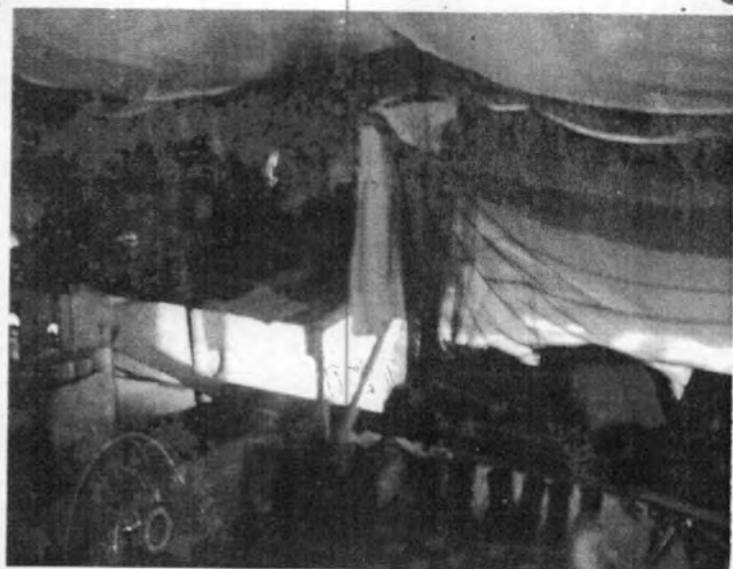
