L2 Sally incident:

Larry had just returned from flying a 12 hour day. He carried his M-16 locked loaded and ready for use. Just in case his M-16 jammed during use. He had his '16 slung and was carrying a M-60 in each hand. He headed to the armament hutch to clean his M-60s. Burst out from flying all day. On arriving to the armament hutch Larry set his M-16 against the wall. Shortly after this the weapon slid a few inches and discharged through the ceiling. (Tent) He had made sgt. in the April promotions and the mail chopper brought in his orders 2 weeks later. The 1st lieutenant (Cherry) jumped all over Larry and threatened him with a court martial for the offense. He couldn't court martial Larry and he ended up with a \$25 fine. So after being abused by the lieutenant after 12 hrs flying he told him to get fucked.

In June of 68 with 10 days left in country Larry was put in charge of Perimeter guard (9 bunkers) for one Company. Larry was sacked out inside the command bunker. The officer in charge ordered Larry to give up his spot and so he sacked out on top of the bunker. There was a loud scream from within and Larry responded finding out that the LT had been bitten by a large rat. He then was taken to the 154th Medical Detachment for treatment.

L2 Sally guard duty

Out to the front of our perimeter was an old cemetery. directly behind it was a depression that was the richest spot for the NVA sappers to hide. Larry and another set fired 12 rounds from a M-79 in quick succession. The impacting actually sounded like a mortar attack incoming. The incident set off the Base Counter Mortar ^{artillery} Battery and scrambled our Spider LFT on counter mortar. Nothing was said except we were receiving fire (a catch all for firing without clearance from BOC (Base Operations Center)) John Moore and others did similar crazy shit.

The units next to us at Sally were the Navy Sea Bees and the 1/321st Artillery 1st Airborne.

During June we were ordered by a Marine General to remove all names from our hats. I felt broke our heads, those names meant more than you can imagine to the flight crews.
