March 12, 1968

When the unit moved north, a number of personnel were left at Dau Tieng to load up the last of our equipment. John was one of those guys. The E.M. Klub had a young shiny teenage Vietnamese boy working with Lamb. He assumed that the unit was headed back to the USA and stowed away on board the C-130 on the run way. During the flight one of our guys spotted him and told him we were in fact headed for Hue. He was in complete shock after getting this information. He was our club boy. He must have been picked up by the MPs at Hue/Phu Bai when the C-130 landed. You can't blame those who tried to get out of that hell hole.

March 68

We left 3 hanger queens at Dau Tieng and 12 personnel when the unit left. They were flown north after parts were obtained and the ships were flyable. C-130 were loaded up with unit equipment etc. They were so heavy that the airforce guys commented on it.

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
