If there now -even to this day- I believe I could negotiate my way back to where the base camp (Camp Ranier) used to be (unless it is all under water now).



I always did like the area around Dau Tieng. It always had a rustic, countrified appearance to it with lush vegetation. The area around Cu Chi wasn't like that; it was more barren and wide open. As a base camp, Dau Tieng was rather primitive for living conditions, but more like what you'd expect in a combat zone. Cu Chi was more stateside, but that place sure did used to get clobbered with mortars and rockets. Be glad you weren't there for Tet of '68!
