



DAU TIENG, VIET NAM -- For his outstanding heroism during a Viet Cong mortar attack, Spec. LeRoy J. Lamb, (left), Dilworth, Minn., received an Army Commendation Medal during July 3 ceremonies at Dau Tieng, Viet Nam.

Congratulating the 19-year-old specialist is Major General George P. Seneff Jr., commanding general of the 1st Aviation Brigade.

Spec. Lamb earned the award June 24 when his base camp came under a VC mortar attack just before midnight. He was wounded as he attempted to reach his aircraft, where he was a door-gunner.

In spite of this, he attempted to make his way through the still exploding mortar rounds. Only when ordered back from the flight line to medical facilities, did he allow himself to be treated for his wounds.

Spec. Lamb is assigned to the 188th Aviation Company. He entered the Army in February 1966 and was stationed at Ft. Campbell, Ky., before arriving overseas in April 1967.

Spec. Lamb is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Floyd J. Lamb, Dilworth, Minn.


