PARK TO OFFER WESTMORELAND SCHOLARSHIP

Colonel Roger H.C. Donlon, U.S. Army (retired,) executive director of The Westmoreland Scholar Foundation, and Congressional Medal of Honor recipient for service in Vietnam, toured the Parkville campus of Park College Tue., Jan. 14, 1997. Donlon visited to complete plans with the college for a full tuition, four-year scholarship, including on-campus room and board, to be provided to a selected Vietnamese American applicant.

Funding for the scholarship, which will be renewed annually, will be provided through a matching funds partnership between the foundation and the college.

To qualify for consideration, applicants must enroll as full-time students at Park, be active in the

Vietnamese-American community, be a United States citizen or permanent resident, and born after April 30, 1975.

Arrangements for establishing the scholarship at Park College were made by Dr. Don Breckon, president, and Col. John Sutton, U.S. Army (retired) and director of grants and special projects for the college.

The Foundation, named in honor of General and Mrs. William C. Westmoreland, is a non-profit organization. Its mission is to use education as a bridge for reconciliation and har-
