## GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

Maximum baggage allowance is 66 pounds. Civilian personnel and military personnel in a leave status are responsible for obtaining required passport and visa. The carrying of any kind of dangerous article (hand grenades, tear gas grenades, signal kits, etc) firearms, ammunition, explosive or incendiary ammunition, or any kind of explosive device in accompanied or unaccompanied personal baggage aboard military and R&R aircraft is prohibited.

## SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS-HEADQUARTERS, USMACV

At any time you report to the out processing center you are required to have a minimum of \$200 MPC for conversion to US currency, current Armed Forces ID card, and immunization record. One copy of orders should be inserted in all bags. Two copies of orders should be kept on your person at all times.

Travel will be performed in military uniform (except civilian personnel). Civilian clothing will be worn on R&R, except in Hawaii where uniform may be worn.

Upon arrival at destination individual on R&R or leave will report to OIC, R&R Center. All personnel must report in time for return flight. Personnel missing return flight will be reported to their unit and may be required to return to Vietnam at their own expense.

Customs regulations prohibit the following on aircraft: Narcotics, marijuana, fireworks, knives, Vietnamese currency in excess of 500 piastres, gold or silver bullion, articles produced in Communist China, North Vietnam, or North Korea, obscene or pornographic articles or literature, items in excess of demonstrable needs, more than one bottle of alcoholic beverage, and more than one carton of cigarettes. Airline regulations forbid intoxicated persons from boarding aircraft.

Personnel traveling to Hawaii on R&R are not permitted to leave Hawaii for Conus. Travel under the authority of this order for the purpose of R&R is not authorized in connection with PCS, TDY, or leave except as provided by MACV Directive 28-2. Pass, leave, or R&R in Saigon/Cholon/Tan Son Nhut area is not authorized. Expenses involved in the execution of these permissive orders are borne by the individual and not reimbursed by the US government.

Applicable to Australia: Individuals must have on their person prior to boarding and while traveling to Australia a certificate from a medical officer accomplished within 24 hours of departure from Vietnam stating that the traveler is free of any demonstrable infectious disease. No tobacco products may be introduced into Australia. Cameras are subject to inspection by customs authorities; therefore, it is advisable not to have film in the camera until all customs checks have been completed.
