RECOMMENDATIONS

A. For Haiphong

1. Keep the 2 Nurses at present on duty at the Ngo-Quyen school until all immunizations are complete. Supply them with adequate drugs and biologicals. Then leave one on duty there with drugs and equipment to serve as a dispensary. There are 1200 refugees quartered there.
2. Supply the unit at Hai-an with 200 refugees with a First Aid Kit and First Aider.
3. Request the nurse at Ngo-Quyen to go over to Hai-an one morning to immunize the 200 refugees there.
4. Approve a request from Dr. Thin for sufficient biologicals to immunize the population of Haiphong living in proximity to the refugee camps.
5. Approve a request from Dr. Thin for additional drugs and supplies to the dispensaries and consultation units in Haiphong.

B. For the Maritime area outside of Haiphong - especially the Kien-An province of 316,811 permanent residents and 16,675 registered refugees concentrated in the 3 areas of An-Duong (6,300); Kien-Thuy (3,875) and Thuy-Nguyen (6,500).

1. Supply 2 fulltime doctors to this Maritime Zone. Provide these doctors with transportation and other provisions so that they can supervise the whole area.
2. Supply each area of heavy refugee concentration with nurses or immunizers at the rate of 1 for every 2,000 refugees until the small pox, TAB and cholera immunization are complete. Request that the nurse in the Gamo team assist in the immunization.
3. Upon the completion of the immunization assign one nurse with equipment and supply of an emergency dispensary to each area of refugee concentration at the ratio of one nurse to 2,000 refugees. Request good records and frequent inspection of these units by weekly visits of one of the doctors to each unit.
4. Approve Dr. Thin request for material to immunize all residents in areas of refugee concentrations and request that the nurse in the Gamo team direct this immunization.
5. Supply each small unit of concentration of refugees with a first aid unit and First Aider in charge. The First Aiders may be taken from personnel formerly used for the intestinal parasite team after one week of special training.

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6. Assign at least 2 DDT Spray team to the Maritime Zone with a program of systematic house spraying and labeling of houses. Suggest that Mr. Stage take a few days to get this going.
7. Begin now to select more suitable sites for relocation of present refugees and for future refugees. There should be no delay in this recommendation.
8. Use vehicles previously assigned to trachoma, DDT and prospection team in amounts sufficient to execute the present emergency program.
