SUMMARY

Since Edward L.T. Harris was commissioned the first HALE HARRIS in the U.S. Army on Oct. 6, 1955 the validity of the nursing paper has never been true. I bear my paper in silence before then, as I ask for courage each day that I be worthy of the sacred pledge of my profession and the lives of those entrusted to my care. Help us to offer hope and cheer in the hearts of men and my country for their faith inspires us to give the world and nursing my best. Until in us the understanding and compassion of those who led the way for I am thankful to you for giving us this life to live. : : :

Through this short history of the Army Hale Harris the training of the paper is no where as valid as that in the perplexing war being waged in Viet Nam, not only in the war fought for the material and physical welfare of the Vietnamese, but also for the minds and hearts of the people living in a country long denegated by war.

At our base, South Viet Nam the 5th Evacuation Hospital currently has 14 male nurses on its staff. Apart from their routine duties, the male nurses participate in various ways towards the removal of causing Viet Nam free of disease.

Hale nurses participate in the HARRIS program to bring the distance hospitals and villages of Viet Nam back out of the dark ages, where superstition, witchcraft and ancient cures are used. Free medical help in the form of simple soap and water to relieve skin disease and internal medicines to chase away demons of the past. These medical supplies are provided to the VIET HARRIS people to help them form better hygienic habits and further our H-O program.

In addition to the HARRIS program, male nurses visit the true witches of a few centuries ago-- The Unlucky Lepers as they were known. The Old Man Leprosarium is located a few miles outside of Qui Nhon on a remote mountain side overlooking the South China Sea. Here the rejected Vietnamese Lepers gather and provide for themselves what the world cut side denies them. Hale nurses visit the Leprosarium once a week to attend to the ill and medical problems of the rejected society.

Quelting the enemy of the U.S. Fighting Men, lay in his hospital bed at a POW ward at the 5th Evacuation Hospital getting equal attention as the American patient. Rare captured VC and North Vietnamese are brought for medical
