SUBJECT : SUMMIT ACTIVITIES FOR SUNDAY (OCTOBER 23) AND MONDAY (OCTOBER 24)

## SUNDAY, OCTOBER 23, 1966

Item No. 1 - The different delegates (Chiefs of States and Heads of Governments) to the Summit Conference will arrive at the Manila International Airport under the following timetable:

2:00 p.m. - Republic of Vietnam

2:30 p.m. - Republic of Korea

3:00 p.m. - United States of America

3:30 p.m. - Australia and New Zealand

4:30 p.m. - Kingdom of Thailand

Item No. 2 - All delegations will be received by a welcome committee headed by President and Mrs. Marcos. Full military honors will be rendered, after which the delegates will motor to Luneta for floral offering at the Rizal Monument.

Item No. 3 - To transport media men to and from the airport and for other destinations afterwards throughout the duration of the summit, the following number and kinds of vehicles will be allocated on the same day:

U.S.A. (In charge - Capt. Ken Wade, U.S. Embassy) ..... 10 taxicabs

Korea (In charge - Mr. Chin, Korean Embassy) ..... 7 taxicabs

Vietnam (In charge - Mr. Tu, Vietnam Embassy) ..... 7 taxicabs

Australia (In charge - Mr. Argall, Australian Embassy) ..... 7 taxicabs

Philippines, etc. (In charge - Malacañang Press Office) ..... 2 buses

MONDAY, October 24, 1966

Item No. 1 - The following activities will take place:

9:00 a.m. - Opening ceremonies at the Session Hall, House of Representatives, Congress of the Philippines:  
(a) Temporary Chairman (Prime Minister Thanom Kittikachorn) opens conference; (b) One-minute silent prayer; (c) Election of Chairman; (d) Welcome address by the President of the Philippines; (e) Response in behalf Chiefs of State and Heads of Government - His Excellency Nguyen Van Thieu, Chairman, National Leadership Committee; (f) Recess.

10:00 a.m. - Session of the Chiefs of State and Heads of Government at Malacañang Palace.

1:00 p.m. - Luncheon conference - Malacañang Palace.

3:00 p.m. - Session of the Chiefs of State and Heads of Government at Malacañang Palace.

8:00 p.m. - Private dinner.

Item No. 2 - Because of space limitations for media coverage at the Congress Session Hall, only those with Opening Session Press Passes (colored red) will be admitted. However there will be wide TV screen coverage at the Session Hall.

Item No. 3 - Press buses with Philippine Navy escort officers will be parked in front of all newsmen's billets (hotels) at 7:30 a.m. These buses will leave for the Congress Session Hall at exactly 8:00 a.m. The same buses will take the newsmen back to their billets immediately after the close of the opening ceremonies. Press cabs will be available at their hotels for those desiring to file stories.

Item No. 4 - Two buses will be provided for local media men at the close of the opening ceremonies at Congress building. Taxi service will be available at all times upon call at the Summit Vehicles Center at the
