SUMMARY

On 8 January 1967, the United States Army and South Vietnamese Army launched Operation "Cedar Falls." This was the largest ground operation since the beginning of the Viet Nam conflict. Its purpose was to clear Viet Cong from the Iron Triangle, a vital stronghold near Saigon.

A multi-division force consisting of twenty U.S. battalions of infantry and armored units started a sweep twenty-seven miles northeast of Saigon and marched due south through the Iron Triangle, across the Saigon River and into the Filhol rubber Plantation. The Operation followed four days of concentrated bombings by B-52s. The high explosive bombs were designed to collapse tunnels and underground caves.

American Forces participating in the Operation were the 1st Infantry Division, 25th Infantry Division, 196th Infantry Brigade, 11th Armored Cavalry Regiment, and the 173rd Airborne Brigade. On 10 January 67, an additional five battalions of South Vietnamese soldiers joined the Operation.

The Iron Triangle is a heavily wooded area honeycombed with underground escape routes that the Viet Cong have used for years as a base camp from which they could terrorize the Saigon, Cholon, and Gia Dinh areas.

The following coverage shows "C" Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Mechanized Infantry, 2nd Brigade, 25 Infantry Division sweeping through the Filhol rubber Plantation in search of fleeing Viet Cong units.

While participating on the Operation the unit also received an unexpected visit from their Commanding General, MG Cosmo H. Hoedown (Kalamazoo, Mich) Commanding General, 25th Infantry Division.

On 8 January 1967, during Operation "Cedar Falls," United States and South Vietnamese Army troops pushed Viet Cong units out of the "Iron Triangle." "C" Company, 1st Battalion, 5th Mechanized Infantry, 2nd Brigade, 25th Infantry Division conducted a search and destroy mission in the Filhol rubber Plantation (27 miles NE of Saigon).

1. Slate
2. CPT John Smith (Dallas, Tex) "C" Company Commander, explains their mission with the help of a map, to his 2nd Platoon Leader, 1LT Paul Pokahanis (NY, NY).
3. Members of "C" Company sweep an area by foot, moving behind their M-113 Armored Personnel Carriers (APC) for added protection from enemy fire.
