My story from this operation is more about a photograph, a ballpoint pen, and a small wallet sized calendar. On February 28th 1969 the Viet Cong had done the almost unthinkable...made a daylight attack against the sprawling American combat base at Long Binh. Our team OIC, Capt. Dick Richards, to see what there was to photograph, dispatched Sp6 Lee Swain and me. We were given a lift on a LOH (Light Observation Helicopter) out into the field.

By the time Lee and I made contact with B Company, 1st BN, 18th Inf., 1st Infantry Division, our host unit in the field, all fighting had ceased. As we walked up to where the second platoon had settled into a blocking position against further possible enemy activity, I noticed a radio operator who was slumped against a tree. He looked exhausted and I decided to take a picture. I was carrying two cameras that day. My 35mm Pentax Spotmatic and my Army issue Hassleblad. I shot the picture with my personal camera and as a result this image is a part of my portfolio. It is one of maybe a dozen pictures I shot during my time in Vietnam that I still consider worth keeping.

We shook hands with members of the platoon I couldn't help but notice that Lee and I out-ranked everyone who was there. Nearby several men were engaged in burning bits and pieces of what looked like a uniform. I soon learned that it had belonged to an enemy soldier who had been killed during the recent firefight. Some of the man's belongings were being divided up amongst the men as souvenirs. I don't know why but I was offered two items that are part of the enclosed selection of materials. A Bic ballpoint pen and a small wallet-sized calendar for the year 1968. The pen also included a delicately woven string cord with a safety pin on the end. The man had apparently used the string to secure the pen to his uniform. I was told that the presence of the ballpoint pen indicated that the man had been an officer. Years ago I unfortunately removed most of the string and the safety pin.

We weren't there for long. Within an hour or so they were ordered to move out and catch a helicopter ride back to their base camp, which was located inside the perimeter of a nearby water processing plant. As some members of the platoon stood waiting for their ride back to base I made a picture of them standing next to a building that was pock marked with bullet holes. It reminded me of a picture from World War Two.

COVERAGE OBJECTIVE

TO DOCUMENT A COMBAT MISSION WHILE WORKING WITH UNCONTROLLED ACTION AS THE SUBJECT. IN THIS PARTICULAR ASSIGNMENT I WAS CONFRONTED WITH A GREAT DEAL OF INACTIVITY AS WELL AS ACTION, AND SO WAS, IN SOME CASES, FORCED TO POSE MY SUBJECTS AND CONCENTRATE ON THE DULLNESS AND WAITING THAT CAN OCCURE EVEN IN A COMBAT SITUATION.

SUMMARY

ON 28 FEBRUARY 1969, "B" CO., 1st BN, 18th INF., 1st INF. DIV., WHILE CONDUCTING A SWEEP OF THEIR AREA OF OPERATION (AO), LOCATED APPROX 12 KILOMETERS EAST OF THE CITY OF SAIGON, REPUBLIC OF VIETNAM, ENCOUNTERED A ESTIMATED, WELL ENTRENCHED FORCE, FORCE OF 20 VIET CONG.(THIS ESTIMATE WAS LATER RAISED TO 30). DURING THE SPURATIC FIGHTING THAT ENSUED DURING THE EARLY MORNING HOURS OF THAT DAY, "C" CO., 1st BN., 18th INF., 1st INF. DIV., JOINED IN THE FIGHT. LATER IN THE MORNING "B" CO., 2nd BN., 18th INF., ~~1st~~ 1st INF. DIV., WAS SET UP AS A BLOCKING FORCE TO TRY AND PREVENT THE ENEMY FROM GETTING AWAY.

BY EARLY AFTERNOON ALL CONTACT HAD CEASED ALTHOUGH FRIENDLY UNITS CONTINUED TO SWEEP THE AREA AND RECON BY FIRE.

BY LATE AFTERNOON ALL FRIENDLY UNITS WERE AIR-LIFTED, BY HUEY HELICOPTER, BACK TO THEIR BASE CAMP, AS THE AREA WAS CONSIDERED SECURE.

BY LATE AFTERNOON, ENEMY LOSSES WERE COUNTED AT 6 KIA, 6 INDIVIDUAL ENEMY WEAPONS APPTURED, ALONG WITH SEVERAL LOADED AND ARMED RPG ROUNDS (ROCKET PROPELLED GRENADE), PLUS SEVERAL RPG ROUNDS IN VARIOUS NON-OPERATIVE STAGES OF CONDITION. ALSO CAPTURED WERE PAPERS AND MAPS TAKEN OFF THE BODIES OF ENEMY DEAD.

MASTER CAPTION:

ON 28 FEBRUARY 1969, "B" CO., 2nd BN., 18th INF., 1st INF. DIV., TOOK PART IN A SWEEP OF THEIR UNITS AREA OF OPERATION(AO), LOCATED APPROX 12 KILOMETERS EAST OF THE CITY OF SAIGON, RVN. ACTING AS A "BLOCKING FORCE", THE COMPANY ATTEMPTED TO PREVENT THE ENEMY FORCES ENCOUNTERED EARLIER IN THE DAY FROM GETTING AWAY. DURING THE OPERATION CAPTURED ENEMY PERSONNEL EFFECTS, INCLUDING MAPS AND PAPERS WERE EXAMINED AND NON-ESSENTIAL INTELLIGENCE ITEMS WERE DESTROYED. WHEN THE AREA WAS CONSIDERED SECURE "B" COMPANY WAS AIR-LIFTED, VIA HUEY HELICOPTER, FROM THE AO AND FLOWN BACK TO THEIR BASE CAMP FOR "HOT CHOW".
