COVERAGE OBJECTIVE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS COVERAGE WAS TO DOCUMENT THE COMBINED EFFORTS OF MARINE AND ARMY CIVIC ACTION PROGRAMS IN RVN. UNFORTUNATELY, MOST OF THE VISIBLE RESULTS OF THIS PROGRAM MAKE FOR STATIC TYPE SHOTS. ALSO, THE PRESENCE OF ARMY PERSONNEL IN THIS AREA HAD BEEN TEMPORARILY INTERRUPTED. THIS PROJECT WAS ORIGINALLY REQUESTED BY THE MARINE CORPS, AND WE INTENDED TO TIE IT IN WITH THE ARMY. AS THE RESULTS SHOW, THIS WAS NOT POSSIBLE. THERE WERE ALSO SOME PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED, DUE TO MISUNDERSTANDINGS BETWEEN THE TEAM AND THE HOST UNIT ON HOW THE JOB WAS TO BE SHOT. SOME OF THE FOOTAGE REFLECTS THIS.

SUMMARY

ON 11-14 AUGUST 1969, THE U.S. MARINE CORPS MARINE AIR GROUP NUMBER 36, (MAG-36) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE A CIVIC ACTION PROGRAM FOR THE VIETNAMESE LIVING IN THE HUE-PHU BAI AREA, LOCATED APPROX 625 KM, NNE OF THE CITY OF SAIGON, RVN. MAG-36 HAS PROVIDED THE MATERIALS, OVER A PERIOD OF TIME, FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF 5 ORPHANAGES, 8 SCHOOLS, AND 2 DISPENSARIES, BUILT BY THE VILLAGERS AND AIDED BY GI'S. THE WHOLE MAG-36 CIVIC ACTION PROGRAM IS BASED ON INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP PARTICIPATION FROM THE PEOPLE, THEY BEING THE ONES WHO CONSTRUCT AND MAINTAIN THE BUILDINGS AND PROJECTS STARTED THERE. MAG-36 PERSONNEL PROVIDE MATERIALS, ADVICE, AND BY THEIR DAILY PRESENCE GIVE THE PEOPLE ASSURANCE OF AMERICAN PROTECTION AND THE SELF DETERMINATION TO DEFEND THEMSELVES. (SUMMARY CON)

MASTER CAPTION

ON 11-14 AUGUST 1969, OBVIOUS VISIBLE RESULTS OF THE MAG-36 CIVIC ACTION PROGRAM COULD BE SEEN IN AND AROUND THE VILLAGE OF THUY PHU, LOCATED APPROX 5 KM SOUTH OF THE PHU BAI COMBAT BASE, WHICH IN TURN IS LOCATED APPROX 600 KM NNE OF THE CITY OF SAIGON, RVN. THUY PHU, CONSIDERED A MODEL VILLAGE, IS A PROUD EXAMPLE OF COOPERATION BETWEEN AMERICANS AND VIETNAMESE. ALL THE DIFFERENT PROJECTS WERE BUILT WITH AMERICAN MATERIALS BUT THE ACTUALLY LABOR WAS PERFORMED BY THE VILLAGERS, HELPING TO DEVELOP A SENSE OF PRIDE IN THE FINISHED PRODUCTS RATHER THAN THINKING OF THEM AS GIFTS.

MASTER CAPTION

ON 11-14 AUGUST 1969, MEMBERS OF MAG-36 CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SUPPORT TO THE NAZARETH ORPHANAGE AT HUE, LOCATED APPROX 625 KM NNE OF THE CITY OF SAIGON, RVN. THE CHILDREN HOUSED HERE WERE LEFT HOMELESS AFTER THE COMMUNIST TET OFFENSIVE AGAINST HUE IN 1968.

THE ORPHANAGE CONSISTS OF A CHURCH, SCHOOL, AND SLEEPING QUARTERS FOR THE CHILDREN. MORE ROOMS ARE CURRENTLY BEING ADDED ON TO THE SLEEPING QUARTERS.
