1. CLINICAL DIAGNOSES

Dog killed by enemy sniper fire in Bon Son area.

2. NECROPSY DIAGNOSES

Death resulting from two gun shot wounds.

3. CLINICAL ABSTRACT

20 July 66 - Pneumonia with lung complications following. 3 Oct 66 - Right upper molar, right lower molar, right lower lateral incisor removed. 21 Dec 66 - Pungi stick wound in right pectoral region.

GROSS FINDINGS

4. GENERAL (Weight, condition of cadaver, hair coat, body orifices, scars, wounds, superficial tumors, etc.)

Dog slightly bloated. Gunshot wounds in left and right side of neck, also gunshot wound in left thoracic area. Wounds in neck region re interconnected, apparently caused by the same bullet. Wound in left thoracic region enters into chest cavity.

5. PRIMARY DISSECTION (Subcutaneous fat, muscles, peritoneum, position of viscera, body lymph nodes, etc.)

Hemorrhage in cervical area at level of wound.

6. RESPIRATORY SYSTEM (Larynx trachea, bronchi, lymph nodes, lung pleura)

Lower 1/3 of trachea torn by bullet, four inches anterior to thoracic inlet. Gross hemorrhage in chest cavity.
