TRENDS, ISSUES, AND TECHNIQUES IN GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION IN VIETNAM: self help:

Giup Do Dong Bao Tu Giup Do Lay (Helping People to Help Themselves), a guide to self-help, is available in English and in Vietnamese from the Office of Rural Affairs, USAID, Saigon. The Vietnamese edition is being distributed to all Vietnamese civil servants whose work includes responsibilities for self-help projects.

The contents include: how to make compost, how to make barnyard manure, how to grow kenaf fiber, how to grow sweet potatoes, how to multiply sweet potato vine cuttings, good practices for all gardens, tips for farmers concerning growing avocados, bananas, cacao, black pepper, fermentation of cacao beans, fishing, rabbit raising, smoking meat, fish and poultry, dry salting fish, preparing shark hides for market, a model house, jet well drilling, windmills for irrigation, and notes on self help project procedures.

Answer: I was taught the Front's draft policy in political matters....

A. The instructor told us that we were being oppressed, that our lives were miserable, and that we had better follow the Front to fight for the liberation of our country and to build the South into a socialist country.

Q. Why did you have to liberate the country?

A. I do not know.

Q. What does the phrase "to build the South into a socialist country" mean?

A. They said so, and I repeated it to you. How could I know what it means?....
