Dear Friends,

I need your help to raise about \$10,000 to send a private humanitarian team of 4 U.S. Doctors to Hanoi in February 1995 to meet with Vietnamese, Lao, and Cambodian Doctors, who are in charge of the Province Hospitals. It is my just assumption that these S.E. Asian Doctors, who took an oath to fix and repair all of mankind, have knowledge and records of live U.S. prisoners, they would have treated or are still providing medical treatment to.

You have contributed in the past to our efforts to send search teams into S.E. Asia to find out what happened to the Americans who were captured alive but not released. We have sent 14 teams of researchers to S.E. Asia since March 1993 to see if we could locate the missing individuals or learn of their fate. We tested this medical approach in March 1994 and found a Lao Doctor who had treated a live American in 1974, one year after the war ended. One of our teams found a monk who was in prison with 3 live Americans from 1973 until 1989 when he, himself was released. Another team was approached by a lady who told of an American she had seen on a mountain (about a mile away). He had a mustache, just like theirs, she said.

With this medical team of U.S. Doctors, we hope to trade medical knowledge and cures with S.E. Asian Doctors in exchange for their knowledge and records of live U.S. prisoners, who they have treated or still might be providing medical care to.

The medical conference will be held in Hanoi in February 1995. We need to raise the money to pay these U.S. Doctors' airline tickets and hotel expenses. The U.S. Doctors have volunteered their time and expertise for this humanitarian mission to try to find out what happened to the American prisoners who were captured alive but never released or accounted for.

Officials of the Clinton administration have been presented this medical plan, to gain access to medical records, but have rejected or refused to seek this knowledge, so the private sector will have to step in to fund this project.

You have all contributed your time, energy and effort to help push for a full accounting of our POW / MIAs in the past. I would welcome your help and support for this medical project.
