Frances Zwenig joined the Trade Council in November 1994 as Vice President and Counsel and directs the New York office. Prior to joining the Council, Ms. Zwenig had an extensive public service career.

Executive Assistant to Ambassador Madeleine Albright, the U.S. Permanent Representative to the United Nations, member of President Clinton's cabinet and a principal advisor and member of President Clinton's National Security Council. Coordinated Ambassador Albright's many responsibilities to President Clinton, her colleagues in the Cabinet, the State Department, and the National Security Council, as well as to the U.S. Congress and her counterparts at the United Nations. March 1993 to November 1994.

Transition Representative, Economic Development Administration, U.S. Department of Commerce. Managed the transition team effort for EDA by advising on the budget submission, developing the defense conversion proposals from EDA, and facilitating coordination with the rest of the bureaus in Commerce. Late January to mid-March 1993.

Staff Director, Select Committee on POW/MIA Affairs, United States Senate. The Committee, with a 20 person staff, conducted an exhaustive study of the question whether any of the American military classified as missing during the Indochina War were alive after 1973 and whether any remained alive. The twelve member Select Committee reached the unanimous conclusion in the final report that there was "no compelling evidence" any remained alive. The committee ended upon issuance of this report. October 1991 to January 1993.
