07-1362-70	<p><u>SUBJ: (U) Political Indoctrination by Element of Strategic Intelligence Office, Military Staff Department, Headquarters, SVNLA.</u></p> <p>(C) (40 pages, handwritten; B-3) Record, undated, classified ((VC)) "TOP SECRET", originated ((possibly by an element of the Strategic Intelligence Office, Military Staff Department, Headquarters, SVNLA)), provides details on the enemy ((FWMAP/RVNAF)) political, military, diplomatic, and economic situation during 1969 and 1970.</p> <p>Document first states that after suffering repeated setbacks, especially in the wake of the General Offensives and Uprisings since 1968, the Nixon and Puppet ((GVN)) Administrations continued to pursue the VN war regardless of increasing criticism and protests by ((progressive)) Americans and the world. They intensified military activities in an attempt to wear down friendly ((VC/NVA)) forces and cut infiltration routes and lines of communication running from the border areas of central and southern Laos and K ((possibly Cambodian)) territory to friendly units' assembly areas in various provinces north of ((RVANF)) III CTZ, and in Châu Đốc, An Giang, and Kon-Tum Provinces, the lowlands of Military Region 5, the mountainous areas of Tri-Thien Military Region, and coastal areas of T3 ((possibly Military Region 3)).</p> <p>In conjunction with the military activities described above, the enemy placed emphasis on political struggles, espionage, psywar, and Chiêu Hồi activities. In ((VC)) liberated areas, the enemy resorted to acts of sabotage, terrorism, and even bribery.
