

Secret. Vientiane message 6546 by Godley stating the name "Coady" was mentioned by Rumble.

Oct 3 1969 - DIA's debriefing of September 26 1969 which states the name "Bill Coady".

State Department letter to Vientiane again stating the name "Bill Coady".

September 27 1991 - Debriefing extract sent stating the name was "Cote/Cody". Why do the above three documents state "Coady" instead of "Cote/Cody" which are more common ways of spelling the name? Why in the extract is the name never spelled "Coady"?

January 5 1992 - Talked with Rumble regarding why the debriefing was from Andrews AFB dated August 7 when the documents stated Vientiane August 5 and DIA's debriefing was on September 26 (all in 1969). Rumble could not answer but stated that he was not debriefed at Andrews.

May 11 1992 - Meeting with Charles W. Gittens at Special Office for POW/MIA in Washington. I asked why we received a debriefing from Andrews when Rumble said he had never been debriefed there. Gittens stated that it was an analyst's interpretation.

July 1992 - I have requested Senator Shelby, Heflin and Mack to request the original Vientiane debriefing and the letter which discussed the consideration of a status change.

I am still trying to find out what the actual debriefing states. This search has been going on from July 1991 to present -this is ridiculous.

## Appendix 2 Debriefing

June 18 1991 - DIA document received which states that Rumble was passed the name "Bill Coady".

July 1991 - Air Force put me in touch with Rumble. After talking with Rumble, I requested Air Force to send his debriefing to me. Frampton informed me that would be an invasion of privacy and that I was not allowed to get the debriefing. I then requested him to send the debriefing to Rumble to help him remember anything about the name. I was told by Frampton that it would be sent. (Debriefing was not sent).

July 12 1991 - Air Force memo from Frampton which states "request copy of Rumble's debriefing to be sent to him to refresh his memory."

July 25 1991 - Same memo - Frampton writes "Rumble debriefing sent a week ago." Please note debriefing is crossed out and replaced with letter.

August 9 1991 - Air Force memo discussing the debriefing. Frampton writes "I thought that Rumble's letter was what Mrs. Rainey and Major Rumble wanted sent to him." Also statement made that no debriefing would be sent to anyone according to DIA and George Atkinson due to "pact" made with all POW's.

Sept 24 1991 - Frampton's memo relayed story about Carolyn Boswell who had received a POW's debriefing which mentioned her father. Frampton speaks with Mr. Horn and they discuss the name "Coady" in Rumble's debriefing.

July 31 1991 - Congressman Cramer's response from Lt. Col. Washabaugh. Washabaugh states that a copy of the debriefing report has been sent to Rumble. At this point the debriefing had not been sent. Washabaugh states that Major Coady's wife waived her rights to attend the hearing. Washabaugh did not mention that Coady's wife did this because the Air Force had told her that there was no information on her husband. A letter was sent in 1974 to her and Coady's parents which makes the same statement regarding information received on Coady. (The documents received from DIA, CIA and JPRC/JCRC are all dated prior to 1974.) I informed Congressman Cramer that the debriefing had not been sent and I also went to Senator Heflin for assistance.

Sept 12 1991 - Congressman Cramer's response from Robert Sheetz which states that extracts of the debriefing had been sent to Mrs. Rainey and that the name was "Cote/Cody".

Oct 11 1991 - Senator Heflin's response from Washabaugh again
