The NATIONAL ALLIANCE OF FAMILIES (NAF) for the Return of America's Missing Servicemen was incorporated on June 7, 1990 in Seattle, Washington. We are of 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status.

We are an all-volunteer organization whose Board of Directors is made up of Americans who have suffered the personal loss of a loved one to POW/MIA status during a past war. Our membership represents family members and former Prisoners of War from not only the Vietnam War, but also includes WWII, the Korean War and the Cold War which number close to five thousand. We have over one hundred Veteran and POW/MIA activist organizations, who grace our membership list. Also, to be included are over four thousand concerned citizens. We have a small membership fee of five dollars which is paid by the organizations and concerned citizens only.

The purpose of the National Alliance of Families is to educate communities, (including public and civic organizations, schools, colleges and the general public) by giving lectures/speeches, perform workshops, distribute printed educational materials with information relating to the status and recovery of American military members believed to be either "PRISONERS OF WAR" or "MISSING IN ACTION" from all past wars and conflicts.

We have held five National Forums on the "POW/MIA Question" in Washington, D.C. in the month of July since 1990. These forums have always been open at no charge to the general public. Our "experts" who have sat on these panels, volunteered their services in support of our quest for the truth of the "POW/MIA Question". Several smaller forums have been held here in Washington State.

United, The National Alliance of Families strives for the truth regarding our Prisoners of War, the reunification with their families of those still living, and the return of remains of those who have made the supreme sacrifice.
