The following information was related by Source to interviewer as fact. On 23 October 1984, Source met her neighbor (address unknown, but living next door to Source at _____, HCMC). The neighbor's name is Ms Nam Tuan (full name unknown) and she was accompanied by her brother (name, address unknown) who was visiting from his home in Vung Tau City. Nam Tuan's brother is a former VNAF major.

The former major told Source that he had discovered an aircraft crash site (NFI) where he found the remains of three Americans, all of whom were clad in flak jackets which had name tags on them. The names of the three were not divulged to Source. The major buried the three at the crash site, from where they have never been moved. The major claimed to bring the dog tags from the site and currently has them hidden (NFI).

The major asked Source to bring out with her rubbings of the three dog tags, but Source was too frightened and refused. Source never personally observed any remains or dog tags, but claims to have recorded the dog tag information (unrecalled) and currently has it hidden at her home in HCMC.

Source offered to write back to Vietnam in an attempt to obtain further details. If received, she offered to pass them to the USG in the RPC in the Philippines.
