1. Enclosed is a copy of four photographs, and associated "dog tag" type data, on Captain Anthony C. Shine, USAF, provided through a Lao resident of the United States. The source did not indicate to whom the photographed remains allegedly relate. It is also noted that only two of the five names provided correlate to missing men. The remaining men were not war casualties.

2. We are attempting to contact the source for interview and will keep you advised of any additional information we receive pertaining to this case.

Art Kruaprasert, a Thai correspondent for PHAIRATH who is currently in Los Angeles, was allegedly contacted by a Thai citizen who recently returned from Laos. The man informed him that he knew where several remains were buried in Laos, had the dogtags, and could get the remains if a reward was provided. The man further told Art that he had seen a live elderly American living with a Hmong family, but did not have specific information. The following information was provided:
