

SUBJECT: "Dog Tag" Information on Captain Anthony C. Shine, USAF

1. On 30 October 1990, this office was contacted by a man claiming to be an attorney in southern California. He said that one of his clients, whom he refused to identify, had given him information pertaining to Anthony C. Shine, missing in Laos. The information was "dog tag" type in nature and consisted only of the number 10032329. Shine's actual service number is 100-32-0329. The caller provided no further information at the time.
2. Obviously, follow-up on this information will be impeded unless the attorney becomes more forthcoming and we are able to contact his client. We will keep you advised of any additional information we receive pertaining to this case.
