

CILHI 0008-93 CASE REVIEW


I received and reviewed the analyses and documentation for CILHI 0008-93. I also received and reviewed the original medical, dental, and incident reports for Captain Harley H. HALL, , USN.

Dental Remains: The match of the restorations and anatomy of teeth 5 and 6 in the antemortem radiographs and records with the recovered remains is clear and convincing. I concur with Schmidt's opinion that within reasonable scientific certainty that the remains (CILHI 0008-93) should be identified as those of Hall, Harley H., , CAPT, USN.

Anthropology Summary: The paucity and fragmentation of the skeletal remains preclude any definitive conclusions concerning identification. The size of the teeth does suggest an adult male and the apparent lack of lingual shoveling of the incisor would suggest a non-Asian ancestry.

Recovery Reports: Both the interviews with local informants and excavation of the presumed burial site are congruent and well documented. The results and recommendations are reasonable under the circumstances.

Recommendation: In addition to the location and circumstances of the incident, the favorable comparison between the relevant features of the dentition designated CILHI 0008-93 and the antemortem dental radiographs and records of CAPT Hall, lead me to concur that, within reasonable scientific certainty, the remains represent Captain Harley H. Hall, , USN.
