

QUANG BINH PRISON(AKA: T-5), QUANG BINH(P)

Source stated that T-5 was located northwest of Quang Binh City, (unk distance) and believed that it was in Vinh Linh(D).

The camp was surrounded by a two meter wooden fence. All toilet facilities were located outside the camp. A large number of trees were located within the confines of the camp.

Source's billet held 40-50 prisoners. There were about 200 inmates in the camp, all of whom were military and were transferred to K-4 in May 73.

There were about 20-30 cadre and guards in the camp. The camp commander was a military man named LINH who source heard was a captain.

The American's quarters consisted of a small hut placed over a one meter deep hole.

The Vietnamese inmates often left the camp to cut and gather wood. Due to his wound, the American stayed in the camp. Source stated that while the other inmates were out, the American would boil drinking water for the prisoners. The American's diet was much the same as that of the other inmates', with the exception that he was given noodles.
