MINISTRY OF ENERGY, TOLD AN EMPLOYEE OF THE U.S. OFFICE FOR POW/MIA AFFAIRS IN HANOI, THAT ONE OF MR. CAO'S RELATIVES ((MR. LE QUANG DAO)) HAD INFORMATION ABOUT AN AMERICAN WHO BECAME MISSING DURING THE VIETNAM WAR. THE EMPLOYEE SUGGESTED MR. CAO OR HIS RELATIVE COULD VISIT THE U.S. POW/MIA OFFICES. ON 6 SEPTEMBER 1991, A PERSON WHO IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS MR. LE QUANG DAO ((LE QUANG DAOJ)) VISITED THE U.S. OFFICE. MR. DAO SUPPLIED PHOTOGRAPHS AND FILM NEGATIVES DEPICTING DOCUMENTS THAT BELONGED TO CAPTAIN JOHN E. BAILEY, USAF ((CASE# 0335)). ((FIELD COMMENT: CAPT BAILEY IS STILL UNACCOUNTED-FOR. FIS FILE# WENT DOWN VIC 171350N/1064257E, 7824000; ON 1 MAY 66, IN LE THUY DISTRICT, QUANG BINH PROVINCE.)) MR. DAO SAID HIS RELATIVES RECOVERED CAPT BAILEY'S DOCUMENTS AND REMAINS IN DECEMBER 1990 WHEN THEY DUG UP CAPT BAILEY'S AIRCRAFT FROM A SWAMP NEAR THE BORDERS OF BO TRACH ((BOO TRACHJ)) DISTRICT, QUANG BINH PROVINCE, AND HUONG KHE ((HUONG KHEE)) DISTRICT, HA TINH PROVINCE ((FIELD COMMENT: BO TRACH DOES NOT ADJOIN THE PROVINCE BORDER OR HUONG KHE DISTRICT)). MR. DAO SAID HIS RELATIVES ARE SAFEGUARDING CAPT BAILEY'S REMAINS IN PUON KHE DISTRICT TOWN ((VIC 1814N/10542E, 787416)). INTERVIEWER ASKED MR. DAO TO NOT DIVIDE OR MOVE THE REMAINS. INTERVIEWER TOLD MR. DAO WE WANT TO SEND SPECIALISTS FROM THE U.S. OFFICE AND THE VIETNAM OFFICE FOR SEARCHING FOR MISSING PERSONS (VNOSMP) TO HUONG KHE TO EXAMINE THE REMAINS AND VERIFY IDENTIFICATION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, AND ASKED MR. DAO TO HELP. MR. DAO WAS EVASIVE AND PRESSED INTERVIEWER TO EXPRESS A COMMITMENT TO REIMBURSE MR. DAO'S RELATIVES FOR LABOR AND TIME THEY ALLEGEDLY SPENT TO DIG UP CAPT BAILEY'S AIRCRAFT AND TO RECOVER AND SAFEGUARD HIS REMAINS AND DOCUMENTS. MR. DAO ALSO SUGGESTED THE U.S. OFFICE SHOULD NOT INFORM SRV OFFICIALS ABOUT THIS MATTER. THE INTERVIEWER TOLD MR. DAO THE U.S. OFFICE WOULD FULLY INFORM THE VNOSMP. INTERVIEWER EXPLAINED THE U.S. DOES NOT GRANT REWARDS OR SPECIAL FAVORS FOR REMAINS OR INFORMATION. INTERVIEWER REMINDED MR. DAO THAT IN VIETNAM IT IS ILLEGAL TO SELL HUMAN REMAINS. INTERVIEWER REMINDED MR. DAO OF HIS HUMANITARIAN AND PATRIOTIC OBLIGATIONS TO CONTRIBUTE TO HIS GOVERNMENT'S EFFORTS TO FIND AND RETURN U.S. REMAINS E. DAO REMAINED EVASIVE. HE SAID HE WOULD CONTACT THE U.S. OFFICE BEFORE 13 SEPTEMBER 1991, WITH A FULL RESOLUTION OF THIS CASE. ON 9 SEPTEMBER 1991, MR. PHAN CAO VISITED THE U.S. OFFICE AND SAID MR. DAO WOULD VISIT

(C) ON SUNDAY, 1 SEPTEMBER 1991, A MAN WHO INTRODUCED HIMSELF AS MR. PHAN GAO, THE DIRECTOR OF THE INSTITUTE FOR ELECTRICAL TECHNOLOGY RESEARCH, SRV MINISTRY OF ENERGY ((VIENJ TRUONG, VIENJ NGHIEEN, CUVUS NY THUAATJ DIENJ, HOJ NAYNG LUOWNGJ)), CAME TO THE HOME OF THE LOCALLY-HIRED SECRETARY FOR THE U.S. OFFICE FOR POW/MIA AFFAIRS IN HANOI. MR. GAO SAID HE HAD BEEN ACQUAINTED WITH THE SECRETARY'S UNCLE BEFORE HER UNCLE RETIRED FROM THE CENTRAL PARTY ECONOMIC COMMITTEE ((PAN KINH TE TRUNG HONG PANG)). MR. GAO SAID ONE OF HIS RELATIVES ((MR. LE QUANG DAO)) HAD INFORMATION ABOUT AN AMERICAN WHO BECAME MISSING DURING THE VIETNAM WAR. MR. GAO ASKED HOW TO REPORT THE INFORMATION DIRECTLY TO THE U.S. OFFICE FOR POW/MIA AFFAIRS IN HANOI. THE SECRETARY EXPLAINED THAT THE U.S. OFFICE CONDUCTS ITS BUSINESS PUBLICLY AND ONLY IN COOPERATION WITH THE VIETNAMESE OFFICE FOR SEEKING MISSING PERSONS (VNOSMP). SHE INVITED MR. GAO ON HIS RELATIVE TO VISIT THE U.S. OFFICE AT 0930 HOURS, FRIDAY, 6 SEPTEMBER 1991. AT THE SCHEDULED TIME, A PERSON WHO IDENTIFIED HIMSELF AS MR. LE QUANG DAO ((LE QUANG DAO)) VISITED THE U.S. OFFICE AND SUPPLIED SIX BLACK AND WHITE PHOTOGRAPHS (ENCLOSURES 1-6) THAT DEPICTED DOCUMENTS THAT BELONGED TO CAPT JOHN E. BAILEY, USAF ((CASE #135)). EACH PHOTOGRAPH ORIGINALLY HAD BEEN PRINTED ON APPROXIMATELY 9 X 13 CM PAPER; HOWEVER, SOMEONE HAD CUT AWAY PORTIONS OF THREE OF THE PHOTOS BEFORE MR. DAO BROUGHT THEM TO THE U.S. OFFICE. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION, MR. DAO AGREED TO RETURN LATER IN THE DAY WITH THE ORIGINAL FILM NEGATIVES ((SEE ENCLOSURE 7)) THE FOLLOWING SUB-PARAGRAPHS DESCRIBE THE PHOTOGRAPHS:

(1) ONLY PHOTO (ENCLOSURE 1) MR. DAO DELIVERED ON THE MORNING OF 6 SEPTEMBER 1991 DEPICTED TWO DOCUMENTS: A CALENDAR PAGE FOR FRIDAY, 22 MARCH 1991, AND THE FRONT SIDE OF A U.S. ARMED FORCES IDENTIFICATION CARD. ALTHOUGH THE PRE-PRINTED INFORMATION AND DESIGN ON THE CARD WERE COMPLETELY FADED, THE CARD WAS RECOGNIZABLE FROM ITS SHAPE, THE LOCATION AND CONTENT OF TYPEWRITTEN ENTRIES ON THE CARD, AND THE FADED ID PHOTO THAT DEPICTED A CAUCASIAN MAN WITH CROPPED HAIR AND A NAME BOARD FOR JOHN E. BAILEY. THE ID CARD CONTAINED THE FOLLOWING LEGIBLE TYPEWRITTEN ENTRIES: GRADE: CAPTAIN; EXPIRATION DATE: INDEFINITE; SERVICE NUMBER: A03115917. THE CARD HAD BEEN CRUMPLED. ((BEGIN FIELD COMMENTS:

((AA)) IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE TO MAKE DEFINITIVE JUDGEMENT, BASED SOLELY ON THE PHOTOS, WHETHER THE ID CARD HAD SUFFERED DAMAGE FROM HIGH IMPACT TRAUMA OR FIRE; HOWEVER, THE ID CARD AND TWO OTHER DOCUMENTS ((BEVERAGE RATION CARD, SEE PARAS 3A(3), 3A(4), BELOW;

AND IMMUNIZATION CERTIFICATE, PARA 3A(5), BELOW)) AS DEPICTED IN THE PHOTOS APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN PIERCED AT THE SAME POINT BY THE SAME SHARP OBJECT. IT APPEARS AS IF A SHARP METAL OBJECT PASSED THROUGH THE CARDS WHILE THEY WERE STACKED TOGETHER, PERHAPS IN THE POCKET OF A FOLIO. THE GENERAL APPEARANCE OF THE ID CARD AND THE OTHER DOCUMENTS DEPICTED IN THE PHOTOS ASSOCIATED WITH CAPT BAILEY SUGGESTS THE DOCUMENTS HAD NOT BEEN SUBMERGED IN A SWAMP FOR MORE THAN 24 YEARS AS CLAIMED BY MR. DAO.

((BB)) THE LOWER RIGHT QUADRANT OF THIS PHOTO (ENCLOSURE 2) HAD BEEN CUT AWAY WITH SCISSORS. THE REPORTING OFFICER (RO) ASKED MR. DAO TO DESCRIBE THE ITEMS OR INFORMATION THAT HAD BEEN DEPICTED IN THE MISSING QUADRANT. MR. DAO ASSERTED IT WAS NOT IMPORTANT AND NOT NECESSARY FOR THE RO TO KNOW ABOUT IT. RO INSISTED THAT MR. DAO SHOULD ALLOW ANALYSTS WHO HAVE COMPLETE FACTS ABOUT UNACCOUNTED-FOR AMERICANS TO DETERMINE WHETHER THE MISSING INFORMATION WAS IMPORTANT. RO ALSO EXPLAINED THE U.S. HAS RECEIVED A LARGE VOLUME OF FALSE REPORTING IN THE PAST; THEREFORE, IT WOULD BE IMPORTANT THAT MR. DAO DEMONSTRATE HE WAS NOT CONCEALING ANY INFORMATION. AFTER SOME DISCUSSION, MR. DAO AGREED TO RETURN TO THE U.S. OFFICE LATER ON 6 SEPTEMBER 1991

AND FURNISH TO THE COMPLETE ROLZ OF FILM FOR THE PHOTOGRAPHS IN QUESTION. WHEN MR. DAO RETURNED TO TWO SHORT STRIPS OF BLACK AND WHITE 35MM FILM, EACH WITH FOUR EXPOSED FRAMES, AND TWO PIECES OF 35MM FILM, EACH WITH A SINGLE EXPOSED FRAME. SEE NEGATIVES AT ENCLOSURE 7.

(C) AN EXAMINATION OF THE FILM NEGATIVE ((FRAME 14-15, ENCLOSURE 7)) MR. DAO DELIVERED REVEALED THAT THE MISSING QUADRANT OF THIS PHOTO DEPICTED A PEOPLE'S ARMY OF VIETNAM (PAVN) OFFICER'S IDENTIFICATION CARD, DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 3A(2), BELOW

(2) THE SECOND PHOTO (ENCLOSURE 2, PHOTO A) MR. DAO DELIVERED ON THE MORNING OF 6 SEPTEMBER DEPICTED AN ENLARGEMENT OF A SEPARATE PHOTO OF CAPT BAILEY'S ID CARD, DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 3A(1), ABOVE. ONE HALF OF THE PHOTO HAD BEEN CUT AWAY. DURING HIS FIRST VISIT TO THE U.S. POW/MIA OFFICE, MR. DAO DID NOT EXPLAIN WHAT, IF ANY, DOCUMENTS WERE DEPICTED IN THE MISSING PART OF THE PHOTO. DURING HIS SECOND VISIT IN THE AFTERNOON OF 6 SEPTEMBER, MR. DAO DELIVERED THE MISSING HALF OF THIS PHOTO (ENCLOSURE 2, PHOTO B) AND THE FILM NEGATIVE FROM WHICH IT WAS MADE ((FRAME 8-9, ENCLOSURE 7)). THE MISSING PART OF THE PHOTO DEPICTED A PAVN OFFICER'S IDENTIFICATION CARD THAT APPEARED TO BE IN EXCELLENT CONDITION AND CONTAINED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

AN ID PHOTO OF A MAN, PRESUMABLY BACH NGOC TY, APPEARED IN THE LOWER LEFT CORNER OF THE PAVN ID CARD. THE ID CARD APPEARED TO HAVE A LAMINATED PLASTIC COVER. ((FIELD COMMENT: DURING HIS FIRST VISIT, MR. DAO INSISTED ONLY FOUR PERSONS HAD ANY KNOWLEDGE OF CAPTAIN BAILEY'S REMAINS AND DOCUMENTS: MESSRS DAO AND CAO, ABOVE; MR. DAO'S BROTHER-IN-LAW, NGUYEN VAN BINH ((NGUYEN VAN BINH)); AND A MALE FRIEND OF NGUYEN VAN BINH, WHO MR. DAO KNEW ONLY BY THE GIVEN NAME "AN". MR. DAO CLAIMED BINH AND AN LIVED IN HUONG KHE DISTRICT TOWN, NGHE AN PROVINCE. MR. DAO ASKED MR. DAO TO EXPLAIN WHY, IF ONLY FOUR PEOPLE KNEW ABOUT CAPT BAILEY'S REMAINS AND DOCUMENTS, THE MISSING PORTION OF THE PHOTO DEPICTED THE ID CARD OF A FIFTH PERSON--BACH NGOC TY. MR. DAO SAID BACH NGOC TY WAS A PROFESSIONAL PHOTOGRAPHER AND THAT BINH AND AN HAD ASKED BACH NGOC TY TO PHOTOGRAPH THE DOCUMENTS THEY HAD

FOUND WITH CAPT BAILEY'S REMAINS. MR. DAO SAID BACH NGOC TY HAD INCLUDED HIS OWN PAVN OFFICER'S ID CARD IN SOME OF THE PHOTOS SIMPLY TO MAKE SOUVENIR COPIES OF HIS ID CARD FOR HIS PERSONAL USE. MR. DAO CLAIMED BACH NGOC TY HAD CUT OUT AND KEPT THE MISSING PARTS OF THE PHOTOS MR. DAO DELIVERED DURING HIS FIRST VISIT. MR. DAO ALSO STATED THAT BACH NGOC TY PRESENTLY IS LIVING IN HUONG KHE DISTRICT, NGHE AN PROVINCE. MR. DAO DID NOT ASK MR. DAO TO EXPLAIN HOW HE COULD HAVE OBTAINED THE MISSING HALF OF THIS PHOTO IN A MATTER OF A FEW HOURS, IF BACH NGOC TY HAD KEPT IT AND WAS LIVING IN HUONG KHE DISTRICT.))

(3) ((U)) THE THIRD PHOTO (ENCLOSURE 3) DEPICTED PORTIONS OF FOUR DOCUMENTS. ONE DOCUMENT WAS THE LOWER RIGHT CORNER OF THE CALENDAR PAGE DESCRIBED IN PARAGRAPH 3A(1), ABOVE. THE SECOND DOCUMENT IN THIS PHOTO APPEARS TO BE THE REVERSE SIDE OF ONE HALF OF A RATION CARD FOR RETAIL PURCHASES OF BEER, LIQUOR, DISTILLED BEVERAGES, WINE, ETC. FROM THE U.S. ARMED FORCES EXCHANGE SYSTEM. THE THIRD DOCUMENT APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN THE OTHER HALF OF THE RATION CARD. THE ONLY LEGIBLE INFORMATION ON THE THIRD DOCUMENT, WHICH IS SEVERELY FADED, IS THE WORD "EXCHANGE" NEAR THE TOP CENTER OF THE CARD AND JOHN E. BAILEY'S SIGNATURE IN THE

LOWER RIGHT QUADRANT OF THE DOCUMENT. THE FOURTH DOCUMENT IN THIS PHOTO APPEARS TO BE THE EDGE OF A PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION DOCUMENT WITH A PLASTIC LAMINATE COVER. THE APPROXIMATELY ONE THIRD OF THE ORIGINAL PHOTO THAT DEPICTED THE FOURTH DOCUMENT HAD BEEN CUT AWAY BEFORE MR. DAO GAVE THE PHOTO TO RO. MR. DAO DELIVERED THE FILM NEGATIVE FOR THIS PHOTO ((FRAME 78-79, ENCLOSURE 7)) IN THE AFTERNOON OF 6 SEPTEMBER. THE NEGATIVE REVEALED THE FOURTH DOCUMENT, WHICH HAD BEEN CUT OUT OF THE ORIGINAL PHOTO, DEPICTED BACH NGOC TY'S PAVN OFFICER'S ID CARD, DESCRIBED ABOVE. ((FIELD COMMENTS: IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE TO MAKE A DEFINITIVE JUDGEMENT WHETHER THE RATION CARDS HAD BEEN EXPOSED TO HIGH IMPACT TRAUMA OR FIRE. THE GENERAL APPEARANCE OF THE CARDS AND THE OTHER DOCUMENTS DEPICTED IN THE PHOTOS ASSOCIATED WITH CAPT BAILEY SUGGESTS THE DOCUMENTS HAD NOT BEEN EMERGED MORE THAN 24 YEARS IN A SWAMP AS MR. DAO CLAIMED.

(4) THE FOURTH PHOTO (ENCLOSURE 4) MR. DAO DELIVERED ON THE MORNING OF 6 SEPTEMBER DEPICTED AN ENLARGEMENT OF THE BEVERAGE RATION CARD DESCRIBED IN PAU 3A(3), ABOVE. ((FIELD COMMENT: AS NOTED ABOVE, THE TWO HALVES OF THE BEVERAGE RATION CARD, AN IMMUNIZATION CERTIFICATE ((PARA 3A(5), BELOW)), AND CAPT BAILEY'S ID CARD ((PARA 3A(1) AND 3A(2), ABOVE)) APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN PIERCED AT THE SAME POINT BY THE SAME SHARP OBJECT. IT APPEARS AS IF A SHARP METAL OBJECT COULD HAVE PASSED THROUGH THE CARDS WHILE THEY WERE STACKED TOGETHER, PERHAPS IN THE POCKET OF A HILLFOLD. THE GENERAL APPEARANCE OF THE RATION CARD AND THE OTHER DOCUMENTS DEPICTED IN THE PHOTOS ASSOCIATED WITH CAPT BAILEY SUGGESTS THE DOCUMENTS HAD NOT BEEN SUBMERGED IN A SWAMP FOR MORE THAN 24 YEARS AS CLAIMED BY MR. (5) THE FIFTH PHOTOGRAPH (ENCLOSURE 5) MR. DAO DELIVERED ON THE MORNING OF 6 SEPTEMBER DEPICTED THE INSIDE PAGE OF A UNITED STATES OF AMERICA DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE IMMUNIZATION CERTIFICATE, DD FORM 737, PRINTED BY THE U.S. GOVERNMENT PRINTING OFFICE IN 1956. THE PHOTO DID NOT DEPICT THE FACE OF THE CARD, WHICH NORMALLY IDENTIFIES THE CERTIFICATE HOLDER BY NAME, SERVICE NUMBER, ETC. THE FOLLOWING ENTRIES MIGHT HELP ANALYSTS CONFIRM WHETHER THIS CERTIFICATE IS ASSOCIATED WITH CAPT BAILEY:

- SMALLPOX VACCINATION ADMINISTERED 7 SEP 65, BY R.E. MC CLAIN, LTCOL, USAF, MC (MEDICAL CORPS).
- CHOLERA SERIES COMPLETED IN MAR 62. DATE OF BOOSTER DOSE NOT COMPLETELY LEGIBLE, BUT APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN JUL 62. BOOSTER ADMINISTERED BY R.E. MC CLAIN, LTCOL, USAF, MC.
- TYPHOID SERIES COMPLETED DEC 59. BOOSTER DOSE ADMINISTERED 7 SEP 65, BY R.E. MC CLAIN, LTCOL, USAF, MC.
- TETANUS SERIES COMPLETED NOV 57. BOOSTER DOSE ADMINISTERED JAN 63. NAME OF ADMINISTERING PHYSICIAN NOT COMPLETELY LEGIBLE, BUT APPEARS TO BE C.J. BEAUCHAMP, CAPT.

- YELLOW FEVER IMMUNIZATION ADMINISTERED 21 JAN 62, AT APO 349, BY R.E. MC CLAIN, LTCOL, USAF, MC. ((FIELD COMMENT: AS NOTED ABOVE, THE IMMUNIZATION CERTIFICATE, RATION CARD ((PARAS 3A(3) AND 3A(4), ABOVE)), AND CAPT BAILEY'S ID CARD ((PARAS 3A(1) AND 3A(2), ABOVE)), APPEARED TO HAVE BEEN PIERCED AT THE SAME POINT BY THE SAME SHARP OBJECT. THE CARD APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN CRUMPLED AND SOILED; HOWEVER, IT IS NOT POSSIBLE TO MAKE ANY DEFINITIVE JUDGEMENT AS TO WHETHER IT HAS BEEN EXPOSED TO HIGH IMPACT OR FIRE.

(1) THE EDGE OF THE STRIPS AND PIECES OF FILM CONTAIN PRE-PRINTED FRAME NUMBERS AT HALF-FRAME INTERVALS. THUS, ONE STRIP OF FOUR FULL-FRAME EXPOSURES BEGINS AT HALF-FRAME NUMBER 8 AND RUNS THROUGH 15. ONE PIECE OF FILM WITH A SINGLE FULL-FRAME EXPOSURE BEGINS A HALF-FRAME NUMBER 16; THE SECOND HALF-FRAME NUMBER ON THIS PIECE OF FILM HAS BEEN WORN AWAY--APPARENTLY FROM AGE. DAO DELIVERED TO THE U.S. OFFICE COULD NOT HAVE BEEN PRINTED FROM ANY OF THE THREE NEGATIVES HE DELIVERED THAT DEPICTED THE RATION CARD. THE PHOTO MR. DAO DELIVERED WAS PRINTED FROM AN UNDAMAGED NEGATIVE AND THE RATION CARD HAS NOT OVERLAPPED BY OTHER DOCUMENTS. A PORTION OF THE EMULSION HAS ERODED FROM FRAME 74-75. FRAME 76-77 IS SEVERELY OVEREXPOSED AND A WIDE STRIP OF EMULSION HAS BEEN SCRATCHED FROM THE CENTER OF THE FRAME. DOCUMENTS. THE TWO PREVIOUS REPORTS WERE RECEIVED IN 1985 AND 1986, RESPECTIVELY.

H. IT APPEARS THAT OTHER PERSONS HAVE MISLED AND TAKEN ADVANTAGE OF MR. DAO, OR MR. DAO HAS TRIED TO MISLEAD US CONCERNING AT LEAST THE DATE AND CIRCUMSTANCE OF THE ALLEGED RECOVERY OF CAPT BAILEY'S DOCUMENTS. THE DOCUMENTS DEPICTED IN THE PHOTOS MR. DAO DELIVERED DO NOT APPEAR TO HAVE BEEN SUBMERGED FOR OVER 24 YEARS IN A SWAMP. THE FACT THAT OTHER PERSONS REPORTED INFORMATION ABOUT CAPT BAILEY'S DOCUMENTS IN 1985 AND 1986, SUGGESTS THE DOCUMENTS WERE RECOVERED AT LEAST AS EARLY AS 1985--NOT IN DECEMBER 1988 AS MR. DAO CLAIMED. THE FACT THAT PREVIOUS REPORTS WERE RECEIVED IN GERMANY AND THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES (RP) SUGGESTS THAT INFORMATION ABOUT CAPT BAILEY'S DOCUMENTS HAS BEEN AVAILABLE TO MORE PERSONS THAN MR. DAO CLAIMS ((MR. DAO SAID NONE OF HIS RELATIVES OR FRIENDS HAVE BEEN TO GERMANY OR THE RP)). THIS CONCLUSION IS REINFORCED BY THE FACT THAT MUCH OF THE ROLE OF 35MM FILM NEGATIVES MR. DAO DELIVERED IS MISSING, APPARENTLY INCLUDING THE NEGATIVE FOR ONE OF THE PHOTOS HE DELIVERED TO THE U.S. OFFICE ((PARA 3B(4), ABOVE)).

G. CAPT BAILEY'S AIRCRAFT WENT DOWN IN A POPULATED AREA AND IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO PAVN TROOP POSITIONS. HE WAS THE LEADER OF A FLIGHT OF THREE AIRCRAFT ON A COMBAT MISSION OVER NORTH VIETNAM. SHORTLY AFTER HE EXPENDED HIS ORDNANCE HIS AIRCRAFT LURCHED TO THE RIGHT AND CAPT BAILEY JETTISONED HIS EXTERNAL FUEL TANKS. HIS FIGHT AIRCRAFT THEN TUMBLED END OVER END AND CRASHED AT ABOUT 2000 HOURS, 10 MAY 1968, IN THE VICINITY OF 172800N/104000E, 470700E/2400W. THE OTHER PILOTS IN HIS FLIGHT DID NOT SEE CAPT BAILEY EJECT FROM THE AIRCRAFT. THEY DID NOT SEE ANY PARACHUTE OR HEAR ANY EMERGENCY RADIO SIGNALS. THEY DID NOT SEE ANY EXPLOSION, FIRE, OR SMOKE AFTER THE AIRCRAFT HIT THE GROUND. SEARCH AND RESCUE EFFORTS WERE NOT SUCCESSFUL.

F. IN VIEW OF THE FACTS RECORDED IN U.S. FILE ON THIS INCIDENT AND KNOWN PAVN POLICY AND PRACTICE TO LOCATE AND INSPECT AIRCRAFT WRECKAGE AND TO CAPTURE OR CONFIRM THE DEATH OF U.S. AVIATORS, WE CANNOT CONFIDENTLY RULE OUT THE POSSIBILITY THAT LOCAL AUTHORITIES OR PAVN AUTHORITIES COLLECTED AND PRESERVED CAPT BAILEY'S DOCUMENTS SINCE SHORTLY AFTER THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT.

E. IN RO'S JUDGEMENT, THIS CASE IS AN EXCELLENT EXAMPLE OF THE TYPE OF CASE FOR WHICH THE SRV SHOULD HAVE HAD RECORDS AND THE ABILITY TO UNILATERALLY RECOVER THE REMAINS. THE MOST LIKELY SCENARIO IS AS FOLLOWS. AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT, LOCAL MILITARY AUTHORITY SHOULD HAVE SEARCHED THE AIRCRAFT WRECKAGE AND COLLECTED ANY EQUIPMENT AND DOCUMENTS OF INTELLIGENCE VALUE. AT THE SAME TIME, THEY SHOULD HAVE EJECTED THE PILOT OR HIS REMAINS. IF THE PILOT DIED, THE CORRECT AND NORMAL PRACTICE WAS TO PHOTOGRAPH AND BURIAL THE REMAINS AND PREPARE A REPORT THAT RECORDED THE DATE,

LOCATION, AND CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE PILOT'S DEATH AND BURIAL. A COPY OF THIS REPORT, THE PHOTOGRAPHS, PERSONAL DOCUMENTS TAKEN FROM THE PILOT, AND ANY EQUIPMENT AND DOCUMENTS OF INTELLIGENCE VALUE TAKEN FROM THE AIRCRAFT SHOULD HAVE BEEN FORWARDED TO REGIONAL AND CENTRAL AUTHORITIES. SHORTLY AFTER THE INCIDENT, GROUP 875, GENERAL POLITICAL DIRECTORATE, SRV MINISTRY OF DEFENSE, SHOULD HAVE RECEIVED A REPORT CONFIRMING THE DATE, LOCATION, AND CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE INCIDENT. THE REPORT ALSO SHOULD HAVE INCLUDED PHOTOGRAPHS OF THE BODY AND SOME PERSONAL DOCUMENTS, SUCH AS THE DOCUMENTS DEPICTED IN THE PHOTOS MR. DAO FURNISHED TO THE U.S. OFFICE ON 6 SEPTEMBER 1991, THAT CONFIRMED THE IDENTITY OF THE PILOT INVOLVED IN THE INCIDENT. SOMETIME BETWEEN 1970 AND ABOUT 1974, GROUP 875 OR SOME OTHER ELEMENT OF THE GENERAL POLITICAL DIRECTORATE SHOULD HAVE COOPERATED WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO RECOVER THE REMAINS AND SAFEGUARD THEM UNTIL CENTRAL AUTHORITIES RETURNED THEM TO THE UNITED STATES.

F. (C) WITH THE EXCEPTION OF PARA 4F, BELOW, THE CONTENTS OF THIS REPORT HAVE BEEN SHARED WITH THE VNOSMP

G. (C) RO CONSIDERS IT LIKELY THAT MR. CAO AND MR

TAO, AND POSSIBLY PERSONS ASSOCIATED WITH SOME EARLIER REPORTS ABOUT CAPT BAILEY, HAVE BEEN IN CONTACT WITH SRV AUTHORITIES REGARDING CAPT BAILEY'S IDENTIFICATION MEDALS AND REMAINS. IT IS PROBABLY NOT A COINCIDENCE THAT MR. CAO AND MR. DAO DID NOT ASK FOR A REWARD, BUT INSTEAD ASKED TO BE REIMBURSED FOR EXPENSES ASSOCIATED WITH THEIR REPORTED RECOVERY. THEIR REQUEST CORRESPONDS WITH STATEMENTS MADE RECENTLY TO SENATOR JOHN KERRY BY AMBASSADOR DANG NGHIEM PAI, CONCERNING A PROPOSAL BY THE VNOSMP TO AUTHORIZE REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES IN ORDER TO RECOVER U.S. REMAINS FROM PRIVATE CITIZENS IN VIETNAM.

H. ALTHOUGH MR. DAO REPEATEDLY SAID HIS MOTIVES WERE HUMANITARIAN, IT BECAME INCREASINGLY CLEAR THAT HE WANTED TO EXCHANGE INFORMATION AND POSSIBLY REMAINS FOR MONEY. RO TRIED SEVERAL TIMES TO PERSUADE MR. DAO TO SUPPLY INFORMATION THAT COULD PERMIT SPECIALISTS FROM THE U.S. OFFICE AND THE VNOSMP TO GO TO HUONG KHE TO EXAMINE THE REMAINS AND VERIFY IDENTIFICATION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. HOWEVER, MR. DAO WAS EVASIVE. HE REPEATEDLY FAILED TO ANSWER DIRECT QUESTIONS ABOUT THE SPECIFIC LOCATION OF THE REMAINS AND WHEN, WHERE, AND HOW U.S. AND VNOSMP SPECIALISTS COULD EXAMINE THE REMAINS. MR. DAO REPEATEDLY RESPONDED TO QUESTIONS BY INSISTING THAT RO MUST UNDERSTAND THAT MR. DAO'S RELATIVES HAD EXPENDED A GREAT AMOUNT OF LABOR, TIME AND SOME EXPENSES TO DIG UP CAPT BAILEY'S AIRCRAFT AND TO RECOVER AND SAFEGUARD HIS REMAINS AND DOCUMENTS. RO NOTED HE HAD EVIDENCE THAT MR. DAO'S RELATIVES COULD NOT HAVE DUG UP CAPT BAILEY'S AIRCRAFT OR RECOVERED HIS DOCUMENTS AT THE LOCATION OR AT THE TIME MR. DAO DESCRIBED; THEREFORE, IT WAS CLEAR THAT EITHER SOMEONE HAD RECEIVED MR. DAO OR MR. DAO WAS TRYING TO DECEIVE US. RO EXPLAINED THAT, BASED ON AVAILABLE EVIDENCE, RO WAS COMPELLED TO BE SKEPTICAL THAT MR. DAO'S RELATIVES HAD EXPENDED ANY EFFORT OR EXPENSE TO RECOVER CAPT BAILEY'S REMAINS AND DOCUMENTS OR THAT THEY EVER POSSESSED THEM.

I. MR. DAO REPEATEDLY DENIED HE WAS SEEKING MONEY. MR. DAO ALSO PERSISTENTLY REFUSED TO PROVIDE SPECIFIC INFORMATION THAT WOULD PERMIT U.S. AND VNOSMP SPECIALISTS TO EXAMINE THE REMAINS. MR. DAO REPEATEDLY INSISTED ON LECTURING RO ON THE NEED TO REIMBURSE MR. CAO'S RELATIVES FOR ALLEGED LABOR AND EXPENSES. RO TOLD MR. DAO THAT HIS ACTIONS COMPELLED RO TO CONCLUDE THAT MR. DAO WAS SIMPLY TRYING TO EXCHANGE INFORMATION AND POSSIBLY REMAINS FOR MONEY. RO EXPLAINED U.S. POLICY TO NOT GRANT REWARDS OR SPECIAL FAVORS FOR INFORMATION OR REMAINS.

J. MR. DAO REPEATEDLY INSISTED THAT RO MUST UNDERSTAND THAT MR. DAO'S RELATIVES AND OTHERS IN THE CENTRAL REGION WERE UNSOPHISTICATED AND UNEDUCATED PEASANTS WHO ARE SUFFERING THROUGH HARD ECONOMIC TIMES. MR. DAO CLAIMED RURAL PEOPLE IN THAT REGION HAD RECOVERED REMAINS OF MORE THAN ONE AMERICAN. MR. DAO CLAIMED THE LOCAL PEOPLE HAD RECOVERED AND SAFEGUARDED THE REMAINS BECAUSE OF THE VIETNAMESE PEOPLE'S TRADITIONAL SENSE OF

RESPECT FOR THE DEAD AND HUMANITARIAN CONCERN FOR FAMILIES OF THE DEAD AMERICAN SERVICEMEN. HOWEVER, MR. CAO ASSURED RO THAT THE RURAL PEOPLE WHO RECOVERED THE REMAINS WOULD NOT TURN THEM OVER UNLESS THEY RECEIVED COMPENSATION FOR THEIR LABOR AND EXPENSES. HE ALSO SAID THE RURAL PEOPLE DID NOT WANT TO DEAL DIRECTLY WITH THE SRV GOVERNMENT, BECAUSE THEY WOULD RECEIVE MUCH LESS MONEY THAN IF THEY COULD DEAL DIRECTLY WITH AMERICANS. RO REMINDED MR. DAO THAT THE PEOPLE OF VIETNAM TRADITIONALLY SHOW GREAT RESPECT FOR THE DEAD AND WOULD CONSIDER IT OFFENSIVE TO TRY TO SELL HUMAN REMAINS. RO SUGGESTED THAT IF MR. DAO AND HIS ASSOCIATES WISHED TO ACT IN A HUMANITARIAN MANNER AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH VIETNAMESE CULTURAL TRADITIONS, THEY WOULD DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO HELP THE U.S. OFFICE AND THE VNOSMP RECOVER CAPT BAILEY'S REMAINS AND DOCUMENTS AND RETURN THEM TO HIS FAMILY AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE. RO SUGGESTED THAT MR. CAO SHOULD THINK TO THE LONG RANGE BENEFIT OF HIS PEOPLE AND NATION--NOT SHORT TERM PERSONAL GAIN FOR HIMSELF OR HIS FRIENDS AND RELATIVES.

K. MR. DAO SAID HIS FAMILY AND MANY FAMILIES IN THE CENTRAL REGION SUFFERED SEVERELY DURING THE WAR BECAUSE OF U.S. AIR OPERATIONS. HE SAID HE BELIEVED THE

8. S. HAD A RESPONSIBILITY TO PERSUADE THE LOCAL PEOPLE IN THAT REGION THAT THEY SHOULD FORGET THE PAST AND HELP THE U.S. RECOVER THE REMAINS OF MISSING AMERICANS. RO REMINDED MR. DAO THAT VIETNAMESE FAMILIES ON BOTH SIDES IN THE VIETNAM CONFLICT HAD SUFFERED. RO SUGGESTED IT SERVED NO USEFUL PURPOSE TO FOCUS ON THE PAST. RO SUGGESTED MR. DAO SHOULD FOCUS ON PRESENT OPPORTUNITIES TO CONTRIBUTE TO BUILDING A BRIGHT FUTURE FOR HIS PEOPLE AND NATION. RO REMINDED MR. DAO THAT HE COULD HELP HIS PEOPLE BY HELPING RESOLVE AN IMPORTANT ISSUE THAT IS AN OBSTACLE THAT DIVIDES THE U.S. AND SRV. RO SUGGESTED MR. DAO SHOULD FOLLOW THE ADVICE OF THE LATE U.S. PRESIDENT JOHN F. KENNEDY.

9. L. MR. DAO SUGGESTED WE SHOULD NOT INFORM SRV OFFICIALS ABOUT THIS MATTER. THE INTERVIEWER TOLD MR. DAO THE U.S. OFFICE WOULD FULLY INFORM THE VNOSMP. THE INTERVIEWER EXPLAINED THE U.S. DOES NOT GRANT REWARDS OR SPECIAL FAVORS FOR REMAINS OR INFORMATION. INTERVIEWER REMINDED MR. DAO THAT IN VIETNAM IT IS ILLEGAL TO SELL HUMAN REMAINS. INTERVIEWER REMINDED MR. DAO OF HIS HUMANITARIAN AND PATRIOTIC OBLIGATIONS TO CONTRIBUTE TO HIS GOVERNMENT'S EFFORTS TO FIND AND RETURN U.S. REMAINS. MR. DAO REMAINED EVASIVE.

10. M. BEFORE HE DEPARTED THE U.S. OFFICE ON 6 SEPTEMBER, MR. DAO SAID HE WOULD RETURN BEFORE 13 SEPTEMBER 1991 WITH A FULL RESOLUTION OF THIS CASE. ON 10 SEPTEMBER 1991, MR. PHAN CAO VISITED THE U.S. OFFICE AND SAID MR. DAO WOULD VISIT THE OFFICE AT ABOUT 0830 10 SEPTEMBER WITH ADDITIONAL INFORMATION. AT ABOUT 0900 10 SEPTEMBER, MR. PHAN CAO TELEPHONED THE OFFICE AND SAID MR. DAO HAD DEPARTED FOR HUONG KHE DISTRICT TO CONFIRM THE INFORMATION ABOUT CAPTAIN BAILEY'S REMAINS.

11. N. THE SOURCE OF THIS INFORMATION, MR. LE LUANG DAO, NEVER RETURNED TO REPORT THE RESULTS OF HIS TRIP, IF ANY, TO HUONG KHE DISTRICT. MR. PHAN CAO WAS INTERVIEWED IN THE PRESENCE OF SRV VNOSMP OFFICIALS WHO INDICATED THAT THEY WOULD FOLLOW UP WITH ONE OR BOTH OF THESE SOURCES. THE U.S. HANOI OFFICE REQUESTED FURTHER INFORMATION DIRECTLY FROM MR. PHAN CAO ON 10 SEPTEMBER. ON 14 NOVEMBER 1991 THE HANOI OFFICE SENT A FORMAL REQUEST TO THE VIETNAMESE GOVERNMENT INQUIRING INTO THE PROGRESS, IF ANY, ON THIS CASE WITH EITHER OF THOSE SOURCES. DECL: OADR

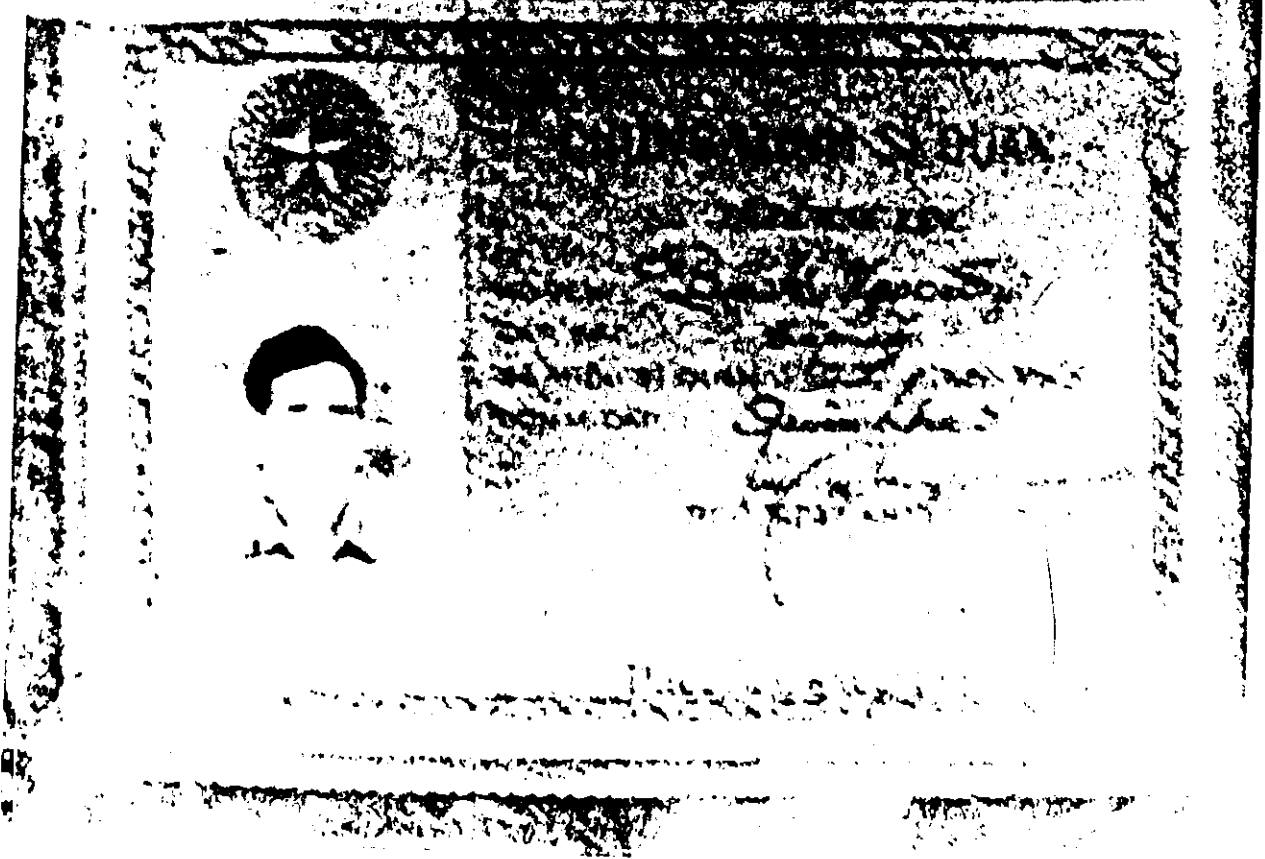
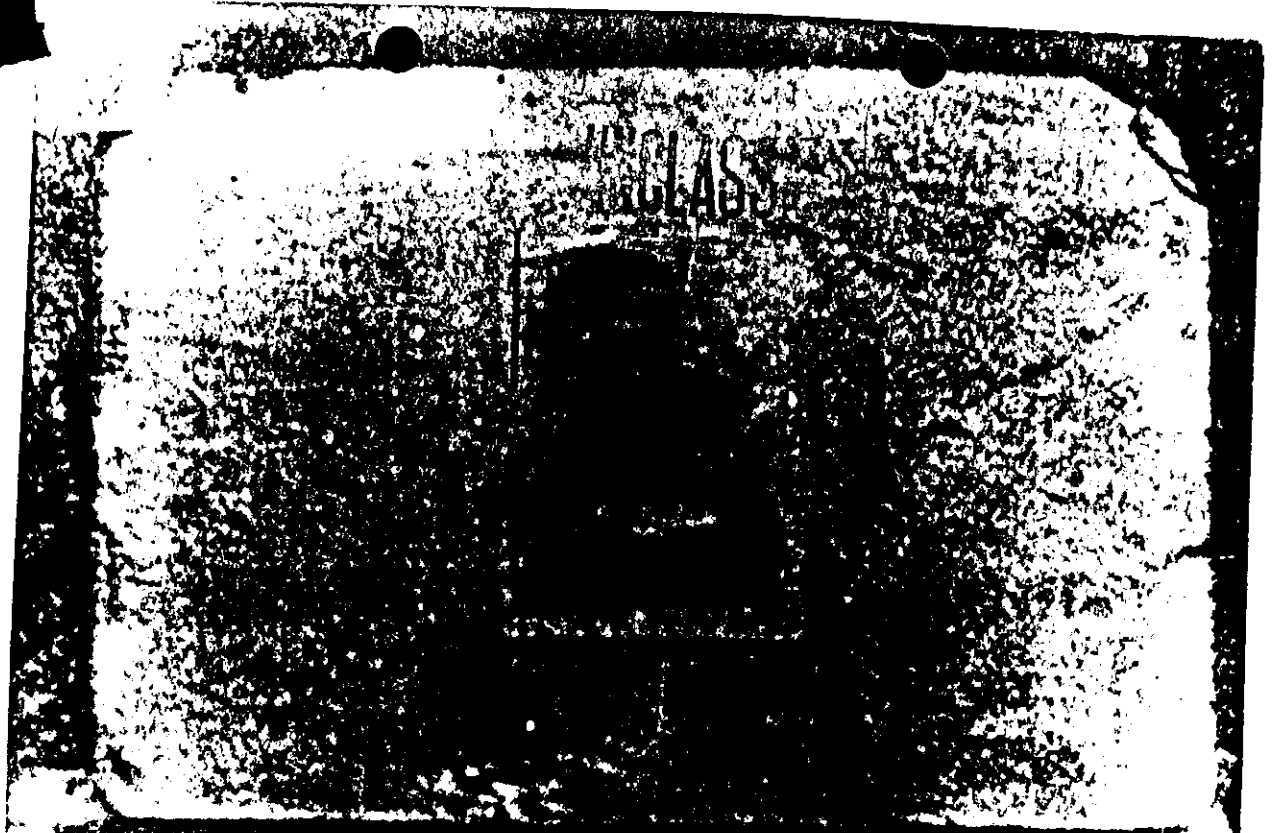
