

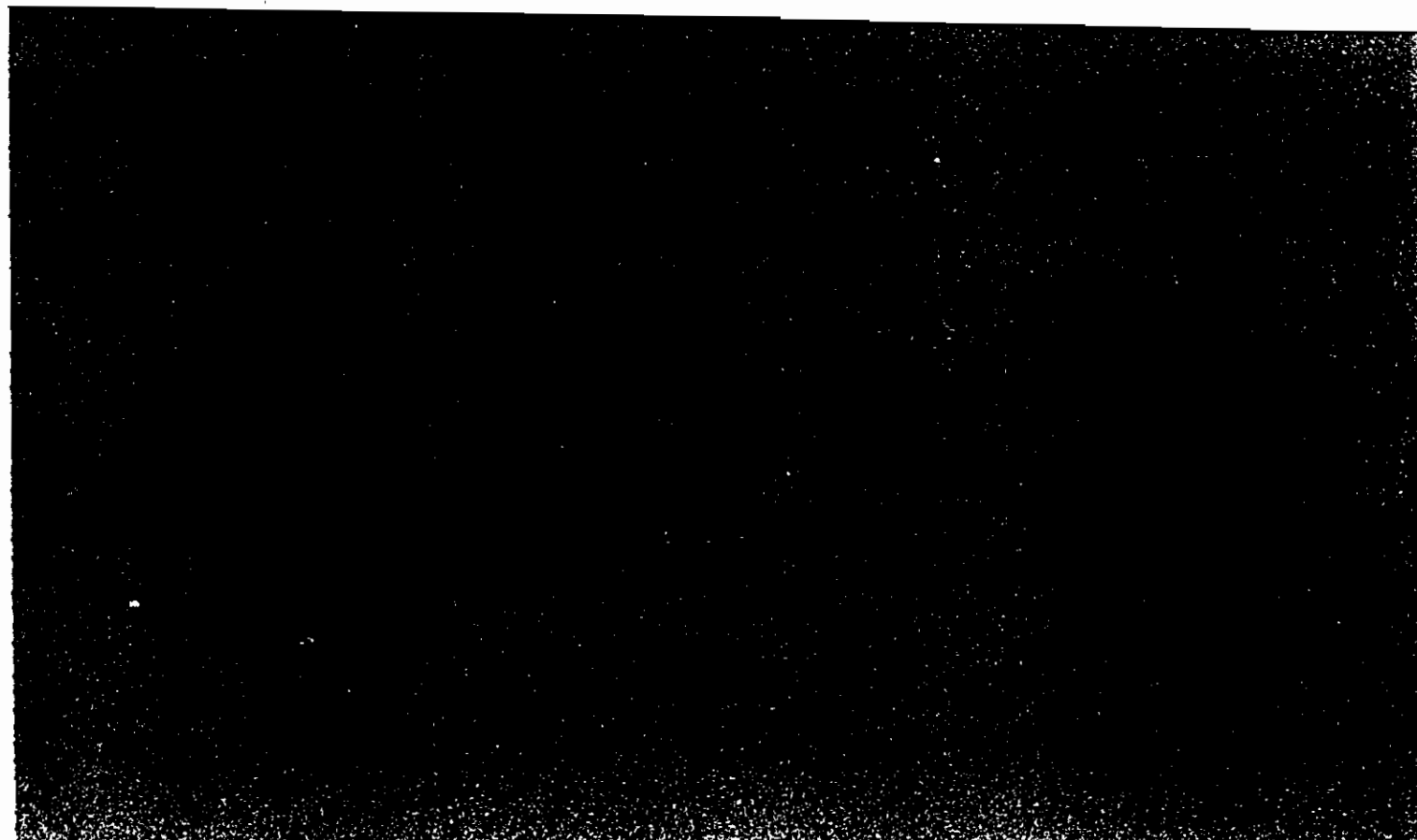

2. Information Obtained. The following information was related by Source to JCRC interviewer as fact. In the summer of 1978, while a team member on a soccer team, Source traveled with the team to play a game in Tan Bien (H), Tan Hung (V), Tay Ninh (P). After the game, team members and local villagers were drinking beer together in the market when a man named Sau Chau, a local resident, told them there were "many" U.S. soldiers who had been killed and were buried in the area. He then escorted 4-5 team members to the location shown on the sketch and showed them two separate graves, one containing the body of a VC and the other containing two bodies of U.S. servicemen. The graves are located on the land belonging to a man named Quan (LNU) who is also the proprietor of the tailor shop also shown on the sketch. The grave of the Americans was flat, level with the surrounding earth, and had no headstone or marker. The grave of the VC is approximately one meter high and does not have a headstone or marker. Sau Chau told the group that the two Americans were killed (date not related) during a VC attack on a former U.S. base which was located approximately 500M from the village. That former U.S. base is now being used for a re-education camp. (NFI). The two Americans were buried by VC soldiers. (Poss 0032)

Source left Viet Nam in April 1981. His last address in Viet Nam was 203 Nguyen Kim St, Ward 19, District 10, HCMC. He has no family still residing in Viet Nam as all have been resettled to Canada.

Interviewer Comments: Interviewer estimated the location of the present Tan Hung Village at vic XT281684 at an intersection formed by the old TL4 and the new "strategic road" reported in M79-016.
