The following information was related by Source to interviewer as fact. Sometime in October 1984, Source met his friend, Tu Quoc Binh, and an U/I acquaintance of Binh's at Binh's house at 629 Cach Mang Thang Tam St., Ward 25, District 10, HCMC. Binh's friend told Source the following:

Binh's friend's family, who live in the Hue area (NFI), had gone to the Quang Tri area and had discovered an American aircraft crash site, and amongst the wreckage, had found the remains and associated dog tags of four Americans. They brought the remains back to their home in Hue and hid them in the local area, where they are still hidden. The U/I man then came to HCMC and contacted Binh for assistance in finding a means to get the remains or at least information out of Vietnam. As Source was soon to depart from Vietnam under the ODP, Binh contacted him and asked Source to report the dog tag identity information to the US ODP interviewers in Thu Duc. Source, at that time, saw a piece of paper which had the information recorded on it, but does not remember any of it. Source never personally saw the dog tags or any remains. Source refused to attempt to turn over the information, due to tight communist security. No other information was related to Source.
