

3. [REDACTED] Information: Source stated that in late 1985 while visiting his friend, Mr. Giang Thanh Thuan, at his home in Thu Duc district (XS9094), Ho Chi Minh City (HCMC), he observed two sets of US remains. Mr. Thuan, a former ARVN captain, showed Source the remains, which were recovered somewhere near Binh Long district (XT88), Song Be province, and requested help carrying the remains to a place where they could be hidden. According to Source, the remains consisted of two nearly complete skeletal sets that were grayish-white in color. The remains were kept in two wooden boxes which Source helped carry a short distance from Mr. Thuan's home. Source did not know where Mr. Thuan ultimately hid the remains.

Mr. Thuan also told Source that he possessed a dog tag that corresponded to one set of remains, however, Source did not know any information concerning that dog tag.

4. [REDACTED] During a later visit to Mr. Thuan's home for the lunar new year celebration in early 1986, Source saw the remains a second time in Mr. Thuan's home. After visiting a short time, Mr. Thuan went out to buy some food while Source stayed in Mr. Thuan's home. After several hours, Mr. Thuan still had not returned, so Source went home. Several days later, Source was informed by Mr. Thuan's family that Mr. Thuan had been arrested and the remains and dog tag confiscated by public security officials of Thu Duc district, (HCMC). Source later went to visit Mr. Thuan in jail in Thu Duc district and was told by Mr. Thuan that in addition to himself, approximately 20 other people with whom he had been working to recover remains were arrested and imprisoned, and a total of over 20 sets of remains confiscated. Among those arrested was Source's cousin, Mr. Truong Quang Toan, son of Source's aunt, Mrs. Do Thi Cam Nhun. According to Source, of the approximately 20 people imprisoned in Thu Duc, 15 were released after about one month. Three, including Mr. Thuan, were transferred to Cat Lai village (XS9590), Dong Nai province, and two were transferred to Tuy Hoa city (CQ1847), Phu Khanh province, where they were held for about one year before being released. Source had no knowledge of the locations where the other sets of remains were recovered or the nature of those remains.

5. [REDACTED] Comments: Source did not know Mr. Thuan's current address, but believes that he now lives somewhere in Ward 1, HCMC. Information provided by Source has been included in previous JCRC reports (See T88-144, T88-260, and T88-553).
