(U) Source is a 35 year old Vietnamese refugee who provided information pertaining to the grave of a male caucasian in Song Be Province.

Information:

[REDACTED] In April 1985, source attended a funeral in Lai Thieu Cemetery 6, in Song Be Province. While there, he saw a well-kept grave which had a highly polished, one meter high headstone. The headstone was engraved with a foreign name which source believes could be American. It also contained a black and white photograph of a caucasian male. This person appeared to be 35-40 years of age, wearing a light colored shirt with dark shoulder boards.

[REDACTED] Source claimed that the cemetery was 5 to 6 km from Thu Duc, was a former Chinese cemetery, and is the same place where Ngo Dinh Diem is buried. Additionally, he stated that the graves therein had only recently been moved to the location (NFI).
