e. Parents' Names: Father, LE MINH SANG (LEE, MINH SANG), living; Mother, NGUYEN THI TAM (NGUYEENX, THIV TAMS), living

f. Circumstances of Return. Source had come to the conclusion that the VC could not be victorious, and, in the course of his duties, he was often separated from his family. For these reasons, source met with the AN XUYEN Prov Chief on 29 Oct 69. On 3 Nov 69, source returned to the CHIEU HOI Center in AN XUYEN City, AN XUYEN Prov, RVN.

g. Significant Activities:

(1) 1950 to 1961. Source worked as a farmer at his POB until he joined the VC in Jan 55. From 1950 to 1953, source attended the Popular Advance School, a school for adults at his POB. Upon joining the VC, source was put in charge of organizing the youth labor group of TAN THUAN Vil. In Jan 57, source joined the Labor Party (redesignated the People's Revolutionary Party in 1960), as a probationary member, and was awarded official membership in May 57. At the time, source was also made a member of the DAM DOI Dist Group Committee. From Jan to Mar 60, source attended, by order of the CA MAU Prov Committee, a political indoctrination course in the MUI ONG LUC Jungle Area, CAI NUOC Dist, AN XUYEN Prov. Upon completion of this course, source was assigned to the Underground Subsection (KC-5), Military Proselyting Section, MR-3.

(2) 1962 to 1970. From Jan to May 62, source attended a political indoctrination course in the CAY THO Jungle Area, unk dist, CA MAU (VC) Prov. In early 1965, source was released from his duties in order to travel to WAR ZONE D, III CTZ, for a Military Proselyting Conference organized by COSVN. The conference was held from May to Jul 65. Source returned to KC-5 in Dec 65, and, in Jan 66, was transferred to the Underground Subsection (KC-3), Military Proselyting Section, MR-3. He was made Asst Party Secretary of the KC-3 Party Chapter. In Apr 69, source was promoted to Chief of the Administration Subsection (KC-1), Military Proselyting Section, MR-3. He held this position until his return on 3 Nov 69. After his return, source led raids on KC-1, on 6 Nov 69 and 9 Nov 69, and on KC-3, on 29 Jan 70. as TN-1020, was subordinate to both the Regional Party Committee, MR-3 (C-112), and the Military Proselyting Section, COSVN. Orders from COSVN, the higher level, had priority. The Military Proselyting Section was divided into five subsections, and each of these was superior to the military proselyting sections of the provinces of MR-3. Orders to the latter, when TN-1020 was involved, usually went directly from the chief of TN-1020; however, they were sometimes channeled through one of its subsections. The subsections initiated orders to the provincial proselyting sections when they needed additional personnel to effect a mission.

(2) Reorganization of the Subsections. Prior to Apr 69, the subsections were organized as party chapters. However, due to the need to avoid US/ARVN forces, and due to the fact that commanding such a unit was rather difficult, the subsections were organized into elements in Apr/May 69. All of the members of TN-1020 were party members, and they knew each other by their party names. (For organizational charts of the Military Proselyting Section see pages 11 and 12.)

(3) Knowledgeability on Units Other Than TN-1020. With regard to the sections of the Regional Party Committee, other than TN-1020, source knew only the names of the sections. He did not know personalities in these sections or specific missions of these sections. Source knew that each provincial party committee had a military proselyting section subordinate to it, but did not know personalities or missions of these units. His knowledgeability was limited to the structure of TN-1020.

b. Mission. The primary mission of TN-1020 was to urge ARVN soldiers to desert their units. It was also in charge of penetration elements within various ARVN units and installations. It also had the mission of interrogating PWs.

c. Location. Each subsection of TN-1020 was located in a different area; for locations, see paragraphs 3e(3), 3f(3), and 3g(3). Source did not know the location of the headquarters of TN-1020, because it was frequently changed to avoid detection by Allied forces.

d. Personalities of the Military Proselyting Section HQ:

Chief: SAU TAM (SAUS, TAMM); 45 years old, 1.60m tall, 50kg in weight, light complexion

services were to consist of security, medical, printing, finance, and liaison activities.

(2) Strength. KC-1 consisted of 28 persons, 13 males and 15 females.

(3) Location. The last known location of KC-1 was BA VIEN Vil, DAM DOI Dist, AN XUYEN Prov.

(4) Weapons and Equipment:

(a) Weapons. KC-1 was equipped with the following weapons:

Six P-38 and Colt 12 pistols

Two K-44 carbines

One MAS-36 rifle

Three K-2 (sic) SMGs

(b) Equipment. KC-1 possessed the following equipment:

Two PS-9 motorized sampans

Two Cole-6 motorized sampans

Two typewriters

One hand-operated reproduction machine

Medicines worth 400,000\$ RVN

(6) Security Element:

(a) Mission. The mission of the security element of KC-1 was to collect biographical data on the members of TN-1020, and to make security checks on these individuals.

(b) Personalities:

Chief: NAM BEE (NEAM, BEE); 36 years old, 1.62m tall, 55kg in weight, medium complexion

Member: SAU LONG (SAUS, LONG); 34 years old, 1.60m tall, 57kg in weight, light complexion

Member: SAU QUANG (SAUS, QANGR); female, 35 years old, 1.55m tall, 50kg in weight, light complexion

(c) Method of Operation. Members of the security element traveled to the other subsections of TN-1020 in order to gather information, which they kept on file. They each carried a pistol while traveling.

(7) Civil Health Element:

(a) Mission. The primary mission of this element was to care for the sick of TN-1020. Its secondary mission was to print the propaganda leaflets drawn up by the other subsections.

(b) Personalities:

Chief: NAM TRUC (NEAM, TRUCV); concurrently a medical technician; 40 years old, 1.60m tall, 53kg in weight, light complexion, scar on right temple

Medic: TU NUONG (TUW, NUOWNG); female, 28 years old, 1.50m tall, 45kg in weight, medium complexion

Medic: TU HIEN (TUW, HIEENL); female, 39 years old, 1.63m tall, 55kg in weight, medium complexion

Medic: UT QUAN (UTS, QAANV); female, 38 years old, 1.67m tall, 56kg in weight, medium complexion

Medic: UT TRUNG (UTS, TRUNG); 25 years old, 1.58m tall, 50kg in weight, medium complexion

Aidman: HAI NGOAN (HAI, NGOANS); 26 years old, 1.55m tall, 52kg in weight, medium complexion

Aidman: NAM HOANG (NEAM, HOANGL); 35 years old, 1.62m tall, 56kg in weight, light complexion, scar on left cheek

Aidman: UT CAN (UTS, CAANR); 32 years old, 1.62m tall, 50kg in weight, medium complexion

(c) Method of Operation. The Civil Health Element only took care of the sick of TN-1020. If TN-1020 had any wounded personnel who required hospitalization, they were treated at a provincial hospital. All of the ill had to be brought to this element, since it was not a mobile element. This element also maintained a building in which the medical supplies of KC-1 were stored. Part of the medicines were obtained from the Civil Health Section, MR-3, and part were bought with funds given to KC-1. This element also had a reproduction machine, which it used to print the propaganda leaflets of TN-1020.

(8) Finance Element:

(a) Mission. This element was to acquire the funds necessary for the operation of TN-1020, and, to disburse the money to the different subsections of TN-1020.

(b) Personalities:

Chief: HOANG NAM (HOANGL, NAM); 45 years old, 1.63m tall, 57kg in weight, medium complexion, balding with white hair

HAI DIET (HAI, DIEETV); 26 years old, 1.60m tall, 55kg in weight, medium complexion

(c) Method of Operation. The Finance Element traveled to the Finance Section, MR-3, to obtain its funds. Source said that it received 400,000\$ RVN, just before he took over KC-1, and that it received no further funds while he was there. The element also disbursed funds to the other subsections when ordered to by the chief of TN-1020. It was also charged with the procurement of food and clothing for KC-1.

(9) Legal Liaison Element:

(a) Mission. The Legal Liaison Element had the mission to deliver messages between the different subsections and between TN-1020 and other units.

(b) Personalities (all female, unless otherwise noted):

Chief: UT TRONG (UTS, TRONGV); 32 years old, 1.55m tall, 47kg in weight, medium complexion, cross-eyed

HAI CHANH (HAI, CHANHS); male, 70 years old, 1.58m tall, 50kg in weight, dark complexion, white hair, partially bald

HAI CHLEN (HAI, CHIEENS); 40 years old, 1.55m tall, 60kg in weight, medium complexion

NAM KIET (NEAM, KIEETS), aka NAM VAN (NEAM, VAANV); 47 years old, 1.51m tall, 47kg in weight, dark complexion, white hair (not to be mistaken for NAM KIET, a male, in the HQ of TN-1020)

(Interrogator's Note: Source was able to give the names of several other personnel in this element, but he could provide no additional information about these personnel. Other personalities in the Legal Liaison Element were: BA PHAN (BA, FANL), TAM THU (TAMS, THU), UT MANH (UTS, MANHL), TU SON (TUW, SOWN), MY NHAN (MY, NHAAN), UT XINH (UTS, XINH), BA HUONG A (BA, HUONG A), and BA HUONG B (BA, HUONG B).

(c) Method of Operation. The liaison element operated overtly and carried no weapons. They attempted to remain as inconspicuous as possible while traveling. This element operated the four motorized sampans of KC-1.

(10) Base Camp Element:

(a) General. This element consisted of one person; his job was

to scout for, and to provide secure locations for, the meetings between persons of the different subsections. He was also charged with the physical security of KC-1.

(b) Personalities:

Element's only member: TU VE (TUV, VEEV); 50 years old, 1.7 meters tall, 62kg in weight, medium complexion, white hair

(11) Bodyguard for Source. HOANG HAI (HOANGL, HAI); 27 years old, 1.60m tall, 60kg in weight, dark complexion

f. Propaganda Subsection (aka PW and Surrenders Subsection, aka KC-2):

(1) Mission. The primary mission of this subsection was to plan and execute military proselyting drives. Its secondary mission was to interrogate and politically indoctrinate prisoners of war.

(2) Strength:

(a) General. KC-2 was composed of approximately 30 persons; source just knew the chief.

(b) Personalities:

Chief: HAI DUONG (HAI, DUONG); 46 years old, 1.70m tall, 60kg in weight, medium complexion, moustache

(3) Location. Just before source returned, KC-2 was located in VINH THUAN Dist, RACH GIA (VC) Prov, RVN.

(4) Weapons and Equipment. Source did not know what types of weapons KC-2 was equipped with; however, he said that they had a few loudspeakers, a tape recorder, a camera, and some motorized sampans.

(5) Political Element. The missions of this element were to plan the propaganda campaigns, interrogate PWs, and politically indoctrinate the PWs. Source did not know what facilities this section had for the detention or interrogation of PWs.

(6) Assault Propaganda Element. The mission of this element was to execute the proselyting campaign plans drawn up by the political element. It usually worked in conjunction with the provincial military proselyting units.

(7) Finance Element. This element obtained funds from the KC-1 Finance Element for the operation of KC-2, and disbursed the funds, as ordered to, by the chief of KC-2.

(8) Base Camp Element. The mission of this element was to provide a secure location for KC-2.

(1) General. These three subsections are treated under one heading in this IR, because their organization and missions were the same. When source was in KC-3 and KC-5, his job was to aid in the preparation of proselyting plans. He was in these subsections before the Apr 69 reorganization of TN-1020.

(2) Mission. The missions of these subsections were to work inside enemy installations gathering information and organizing VC sympathizers, to operate an urban propaganda element, and to proselyte families who had sons in the ARVN.

(3) Strength. Approx 30 personnel comprised each of these three subsections.

(4) Personalities:

(a) KC-3:

Chief: BAY THACH (BAYR, THACHV); 46 years old, 1.68m tall, 60kg in weight, dark complexion, moustache and beard, ethnic Vietnamese-Cambodian

Secretary of KC-3 Party Chapter: TU TINH (TUV, TINH); 40 years old, 1.60m tall, 56kg in weight, light complexion

TU NGUYEN (TUV, NGUYEENX); 44 years old, 1.60m tall, 56kg in weight, dark complexion, appeared much older than his actual age

TU XUONG (TUV, XUOWNG); 42 years old, 1.55m tall, 53kg in weight, light complexion, bald

(Interrogator's Note: Source was able to give the names of several other personnel in the KC-3 Subsect, but he could provide no additional information about these personnel. (4) Locations:

(a) KC-3. This subsection was last known to be at LONG KIEN TAY Vil, GIA RAI Dist, BAC LIEU Prov, RVN. It was at this location that source led a raid on KC-3, on 29 Jan 70, in which five VC were captured.

(b) KC-4. Source stated that KC-4 was operating in VINH LONG (VC) Prov and in TRA VINH (VC) Prov.

(c) KC-5. Source said that KC-5 was operating somewhere in CAN THO (VC) Prov.

(5) Penetration Element. The mission of the penetration element was to send cadre into various enemy units and installations in its AO. Once inside, the cadre would gather information and seek out and organize VC sympathizers. Source could provide neither the names of these cadre nor what information they collected, because he had no contact with this mission. However, he had heard that the following units and installations had been infiltrated: 9th ARVN Div, 21st ARVN Div, the CAN THO radio station, and several airfields in IV CTZ.

(6) Liaison Element. Since the cadre in the penetration element did not have direct contact with the chief of their subsection, it was the duty of the liaison element to carry instructions and information between the penetration element personnel and the cadre at the subsection base camp.

(7) Family Contact Element. The mission of this element was to contact families who had sons in the ARVN, and to induce these people to encourage their sons to desert. They would politically indoctrinate the families, and, if the families were having problems (such as financial), the element would attempt to aid them.

(8) City Element. The mission of the city element was to operate propaganda networks in the cities. The cadre of this element would first contact all families in VC-controlled zones that had relatives or families in the cities. They would then contact those city-dwellers, and induce them to become their agents. These agents were then organized into party chapters. Once the VC had these agents, they employed them to form a propaganda network which worked on ARVN personnel in the cities.

(9) Finance Element. The mission of this element was to collect funds from the finance element of KC-1, and distribute these funds for the operation of the subsection.

(10) Base Camp Element. The duty of this element was to provide a secure location for the subsection it belonged to.

(C) COMMENTS: Although he did not freely volunteer information, source was cooperative throughout the interrogation. Toward the end of the interrogation, he became restless and asked to be permitted to return home to his pregnant wife. Source appeared to be telling the truth; control questions resulted in no discrepancies. Source's knowledgeability of KC-2 and KC-4 was rather limited, due to the fact that he was never a member of these subsections. Source was of average intelligence and in good health.

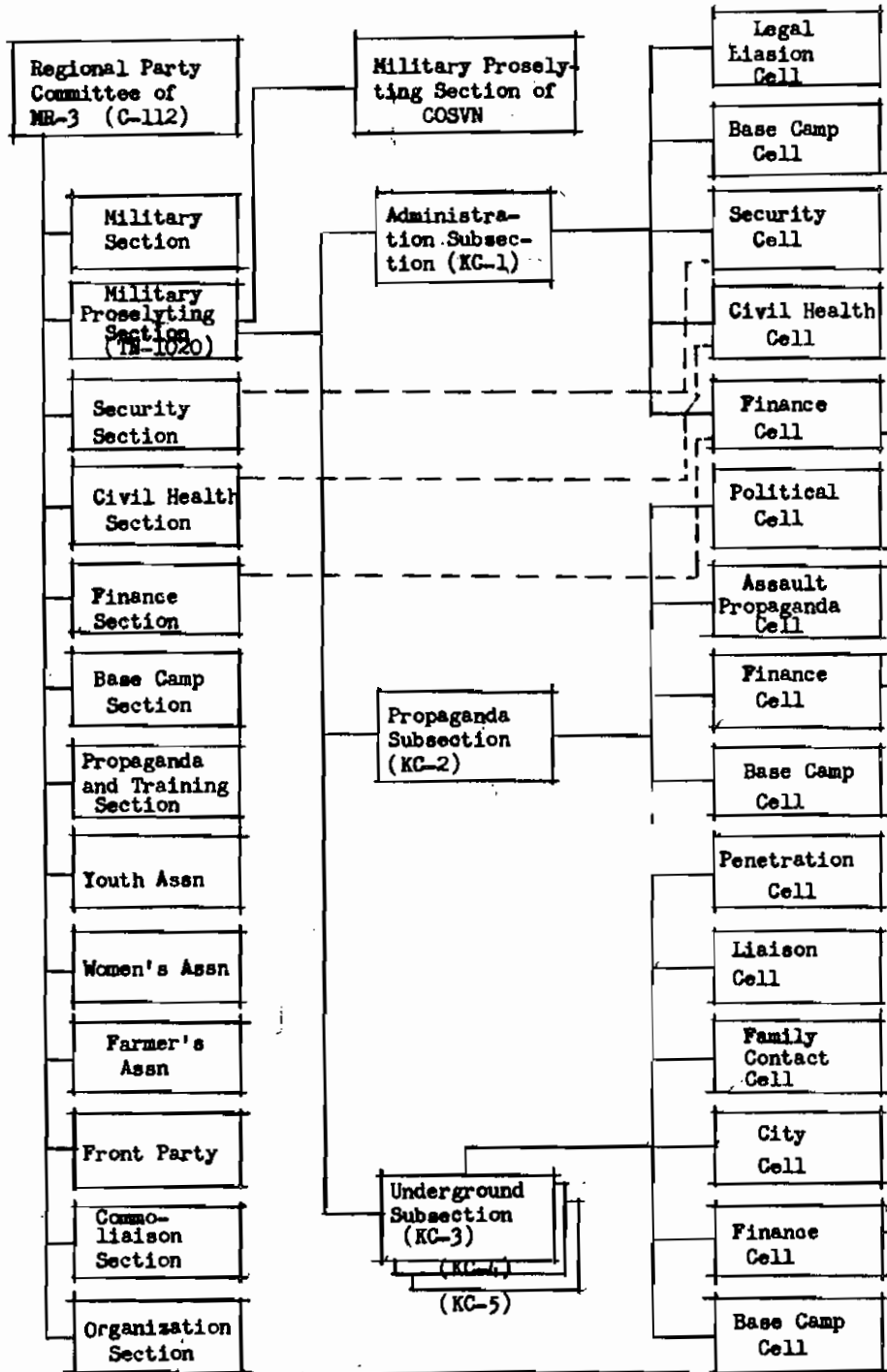

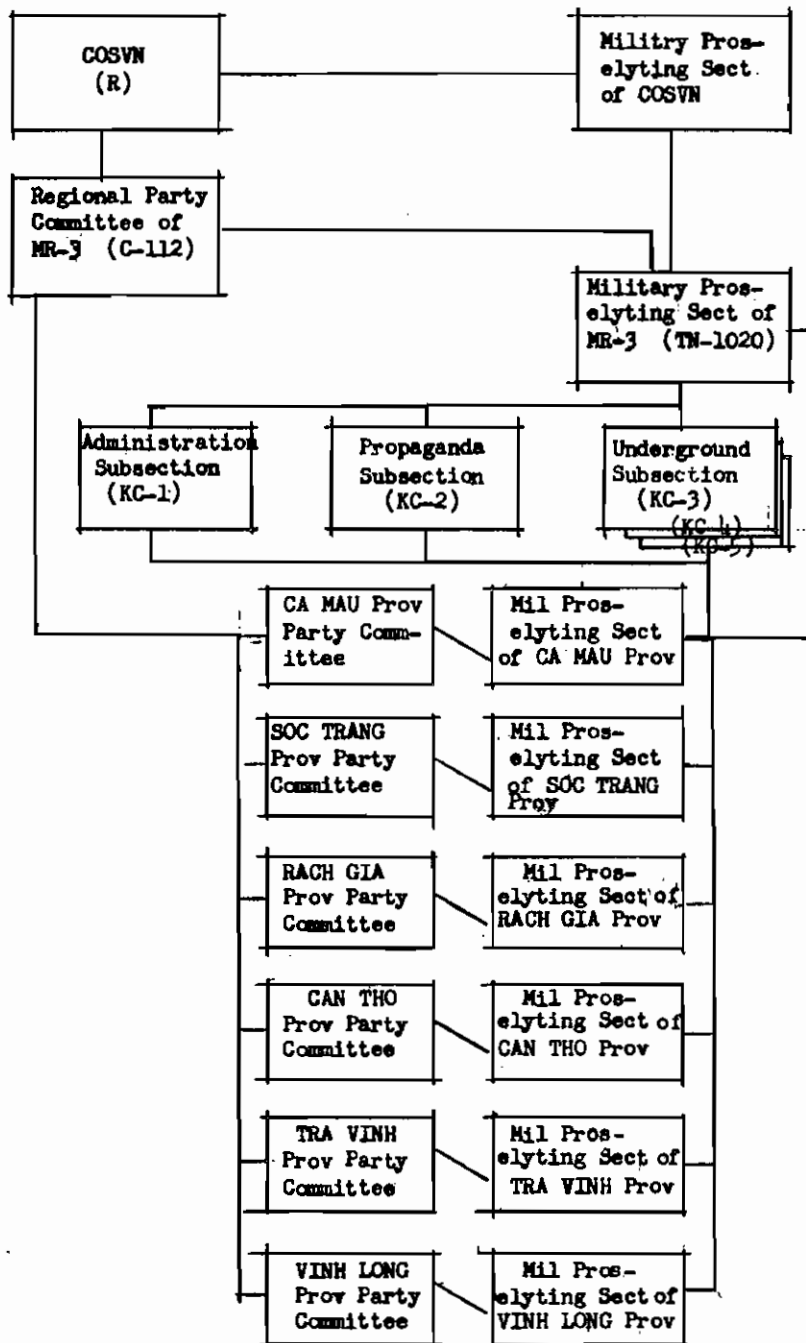
