INITIAL I.P.W. REPORT

(Infiltrator - Control #0185)

I. BIOGRAPHICAL DATA:

Name: Trần Xuân Vỹ alias Thạch Tân (given by the Party)

Lên Văn Ngộ (after infiltration into RVN)

D&POB: 1918 Tan Dong Hoi village, Chau Thanh district, Vinh Long province.

Parents' name: Meo (d) and Vo Thi Si (d)

Political tendency: A member of the Communist Party since 1958.

Marital status: Married - 6 children

VC function: Assistant Chief (Sr.Capt.) of the Political Bureau of

"K" (COSVN) in charge of Troop Proselyting Section.

CIRCUMSTANCE OF CAPTURE:

On 26 Dec 63, Subject was instructed by Lâm, (C.56) Regiment Political Commissar to proceed to Bau Bac to contact local agencies and units to make arrangement for the reception of various delegations from provinces to attend a conference and at the same time to receive 4 Americans who were captured at Hiep Hoa (Long An) and accompany them to "R" POW camp.

Subject was captured by Trang Sup Special Forces in an ambush at Bau Bac on 29 Dec 63 with 1 P.38 Pistol and an amount of important documents while proceeding to Bau Bac from Bau Co. Subject was wounded at his left leg before capture.

II. SUMMARY OF PRIOR ACTIVITY:

21. From 1945 to 1954:

-1945: Joined the Vanguard Youths of Tan Dong Hoi village, Vinh Long province. was later transferred to Ben Tre (Kien Hoa) province to work as a surety agent.

-1946: Transferred as a member of the staff section to Detachment 19 (later changed to 99th Regiment) operating in Tra Vinh - Ben Tre [Vinh Binh - Kien Hoa]

-1949: Promoted to Company Executive Officer and assigned to the 99th Regiment as a member of the Military Intelligence Sub-section of the Regiment Staff Section.

-1950: Transferred to Cuu Long Regiment and took over the Military Intelligence Section (Cuu Long Regiment) operating in Tra Vinh - Vinh Long - Sa Dec.

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In early August 1962, during a Convention, "R" Troop Proselyting Agency decided to take over the handling of PW's. So, from then on Subject was no longer responsible for this mission.

The total number of PW's in that Camp up to 29 Dec 63 is unknown to Subject but he knows some PW's captured in following circumstances:

-In early 1963, guerrillas in Ka Tum area captured and sent to the camp 3 Commando personnel (2 Officers and 1 EM).

-In Feb 63, the 1st Bn of C.56 Regiment attacked Nam Ngon Strategic Hamlet, Cau-Khoi district and captured 1 Aspirant named Thanh, from the 7th Co., 2nd Bn., 9th Regt., 5th Division.

-In addition, in Dec 63, "R" Troop Proselyting Agency asked 1 Reconnaissance Squad of C.56 Regiment to go to Long An and escort 4 US military personnel (ranks unknown) captured in Hiep Hoa (?), back to the Camp after a stop over at the Convention [?]

It was during his trip to greet the Convention Delegates and these PW's that Subject was wounded and captured.

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-1952: Transferred to Headquarters Vinh Binh Province Military Forces and assigned as Section Chief to the Enemy Proselyting Section.

22. From 1954 to 1963:

-1954: Joined the Main Force Battalion of Vinh Binh province in its regroupment to DiKv.

-1955: Assigned as a staff cadre to the 3rd Regiment, Western Nam-Bo and studied land reform (policies)

-1956: Assigned to the 330th Division as a propaganda and training cadre of the political section.

-1958: Promoted to Captain and assigned as a propaganda and Training cadre to the 330th Division.

-1960: Transferred to Lam Son Agricultural Camp in Thanh Hoa and in charge of Planning Section for planting.

-May 1961: Ordered to proceed to Xuan Mai (Ha Dong) to participate in preparatory training for infiltration into RVN.

-Jun 61: Assigned to the 4th (Infiltration) Group and arrived in War Zone "D" in early October 1961.

-Nov 61: Assigned to the Political Bureau of "R" and in charge of (farm) production.

-Jan 62: Assigned as Asst. Chief Polit. Bureau and in charge of the Enemy Troop Proselyting Section of "R" Political Bureau.

Subject was also responsible for the handling of US prisoners during this period.

-May 63: Attached to the Political Section of C.56 Regiment and took charge of the Enemy Troop Proselyting Section until capture.

III. INFORMATION:

31. Organization of a VC General Conference:

311. Purposes:

- To recapitulate combat experience (obtained) during 1963.
- To exchange experience with friendly units.
- To motivate troop morale to launch a combat movement for 1964.

312. Organizing unit:

-2-

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After participating in the attack of Bau Co post (Tay Ninh) Subject proceeded to Chau Thanh District Commissariat of Tay Ninh province to "solve" some prisoners and surrender, then returned to the Regiment. On 18 Nov 63, Subject was notified by Senior Captain Thuong, Chief Political Division of C.56 Regiment that the Regiment planned to conduct a general conference with purposes mentioned above. Later on, Subject was introduced to the conference Organizing Committee by Sr. Capt. Thuong to take charge of an exhibition of (VC) war booty captured during 1963.

313. Participating Units and Agencies:

According to the VC plan (for the conference) participants amount to approximately 1000 men (including soldiers of the C.56 Regiment and delegates from various provinces.)

Subject was responsible for the invitation of a number of province delegates including:

314. Schedule of the general conference:

The conference was scheduled to open on 5 Jan 64 and according to Subject's estimate it would probably adjourn around 20 Jan 64.

The conference agenda was very detailed and the Subject does not remember them. He only knows that the C.56 Regiment would transfer a number of model soldiers from its various subordinate units to the 1st Bn., C.56 so that delegates might visit them to encourage or motivate their combat spirit for the coming phase. Moreover, the VC also planned to bring 4 US military personnel captured at Hiep Hoa (Hau Nghia) to the conference.

315. Location of the general conference:

In accordance with the proposal of the Organizing Committee, the conference

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might be held at the following 2 locations:

3151. Main location:

4Kms East of Katum route, near Tha La river vic XT.380920.
Subject heard that in the North of this location there was an open terrain near one civilian's house who made a living by collecting tree sap (to make oil).

3152. Alternate location:

If the above location becomes compromised at the last moment, the Organizing Committee would move the conference to the alternate location in Ta-Bath area, 4kms East of Katum vic XT.280980.

32. Location of VC units and agencies:

"R" Troop Proselyting Section, cover designation C.72 was located at Bau Ra vic.XT180860 (?)

("R") Political Bureau, cover designation C.632 was located at 6Kms North-East of Ba Chien river vic XT535730.

("R") General Staff was located in the vicinity of XT465737 or vic XT480720(?)

The [56th] Regiment Headquarters and the 1st Bn. C.56 were located in Day stream area vic XT340730.

The 2nd Bn. C.56 was located in Boi loi area vic.XT.520320.

The 3rd Bn. C.56 was located 2Kms South of Ong (Mr) Tay Stream vic XT.370550.

Headquarters of the C.58 Regiment were located in War Zone Long Nguyen (location cannot be confirmed). About Jul 63 Subject went there to discuss the attack of Co Trach post (Vinh Duong)

"R" Prisoner and Surrendered Camp was located in the vicinity of XT.590850,

(Other agencies and units are not known)

343. Operational Policies of the C 56 Regiment:

The general operation of C.56 Regiment in the future is not known to Subject. However, according to the Proposal for the last 6 months of 1963, subordinate units (of C.56) would be assigned to coordinate with local forces to attack various Strategic Hamlets. Among these Strategic Hamlets the following is known.

-Dat Set Strategic Hamlet	vic XT.370424
-Cay Cay	"- 365430
-Nam Ngon	"- 360435
-Phan	"- 320540

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-Suoi Da post vic XT.335578

In conjunction with the attack of Strategic Hamlets VC Political Cadre conduct propaganda to urge the populace to return to live and work in their former places.

The future projects of "R" as well as of C.56 Regiment are not known to Subject.

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INITIAL INTERROGATION*

POW Tran Xuan Vy, Senior Captain. Assistant Chief of Political Bureau Central Office SVN in charge of Troop Proselyting Section.

(In May 1963, Subject was temporarily appointed Chief, Troop Proselyting Section, Political Division, 56th Regiment but remained a member of the COSVN Political Bureau.)

I. INFORMATION OBTAINED:

11. VC General Conference:

A VC general conference was organized by the C.56 Regiment with the following purposes:

-Discuss various combat experiences learned during the past year in order to give the provincial and other unit delegates better understanding about combat tactics.

-Promote the enthusiasm and confidence of the entire unit in order to initiate a "fighting movement" for 1964.

-Give each Branch an opportunity to present its ideas so that other delegates may benefit from its experiences.

12. Conference agenda:

In accordance with the Organizing Committee, the conference was scheduled to open on 5 Jan 1964 and adjourn on 20 Jan 1964.

The conference also included the following activities:

-A party to welcome the delegates to the conference.

-Election of the most outstanding man.

-Presentation of rewards and citations. (Gifts or letter of commendation)

In addition, it was learned that about 1,000 selected troops and cadre from the C.56 Regiment would be there to welcome the delegates to the conference and the delegates in turn would visit the troops and pay tribute to their fighting spirit and bravery.

Afterwards, the troops would demonstrate the operation of the following weapons for the delegates:

-81mm Mortar

-Anti-aircraft Machinegun, Cal.30

-Bayonet trust.

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Finally, the troops would have a party and an entertainment show.

13. Cadre attending the conference:

In accordance with the Organizing Committee, this conference would gather about 200 delegates (military and civilian included).

Subject thinks the following persons would attend the conference:

131. Central Office, South Vietnam:

- Tran Chi Thanh, member of SVN - NLF Executive Committee.
- Mai Hau, Political Commissar, COSVN Military Section
- 1 delegate from COSVN Ordnance Branch.
- 1 "- Signal Branch
- 1 "- Engineer Branch
- 1 "- Medical Branch.

132. Region Commissariat level:

- 3 Military cadre from I.6 (6th VC Region)
- 3 "Ap Bac" soldiers from I.2 (Central Nam-Bo)
- 1 delegate from I.4 (at the invitation of Dat, a I.4 Military cadre)
 [TN. I.4= Saigon, Cholon, Gia Dinh Special Zone]
- 1 delegate from the C.58 Regiment.

133. Provincial Military and civilian cadre:

Subject was charged with inviting the following delegates to the conference:

-Binh Duong Province:

- 1 delegate from the Military Section
- 1 "- Main Force Unit.

-Binh Long Province:

- 1 delegate from the Military Section
- 1 "- Main Force Unit.

-Tay Ninh Province:

- 1 delegate from the Military Section
- 1 "- Main Force Unit.
- 1 "- Military section, Duong Minh Chau district.
- 1 "- Main Force Unit [TN. of Duong Minh Chau ?]

14. Location of the conference:

-7-

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In a meeting on 20 Dec 63, Tam Chi (Senior Captain, Chief, Propaganda and Training Section, Political Bureau, C.56 Regiment) stated that the conference would be held in an area with an adequate water supply and an open space large enough to hold 1,000 men so that the troops could make a demonstration of arms. As a result, he selected the following two sites:

141. Principal site:

East of Katum post, near Tha la river, where a torch factory used to be. Based on this information, we [RVNAF interrogator?] can guess this site is located within the quadrangular area formed by the following map coordinates: XT.360920 - 300950 - 390950 - 390920.

142. Alternate site:

If, at the last minute, the principal site is compromised, the conference may be held at Ta Bath. Also, according to Tam Chi, this site lies West of and is about 40-minute march from Ka Tum post. After crossing a narrow stretch of rice-land, you will come upon the edge of a dense forest, chosen for the conference site.

Based on the information furnished by Subject, we [RVNAF Interrogator?] guess that the conference site is located within the quadrangular area formed by the following map coordinates: XT.250800 - 250890 - 280890 - 280800.

15. Temporary Quarters for the delegates:

Subject was ordered by Chi, to go to Bau Bac, in the vicinity of XT280648 to meet 12 delegates from Binh Duong, Binh Long, Tay Ninh provinces, C.58 Regiment and I.4 and bring them to the permanent communication and liaison station in Ka Tum area in the vicinity of XT.332899 so that the latter can provide them food and lodgings. Subject did not know the exact location of these temporary quarters but guessed they are situated near Ka Tum river, between XT.350895 and XT380920.

Subject's guess was based on the following details disclosed by the Organizing Committee:

-H.113 APC's, will have much difficulty moving on the Ka Tum road because it had been badly damaged.

-Motorized equipment cannot move on this road because it is flanked by big trees and thick forests.

-The Bo Tuc post has been abandoned, leaving a good withdrawal route in case of necessity.

-The C.56 Regiment forces will organize a defense perimeter on both sides of the road and in various open terrain to fight the APC's and airborne troops. (details of the set up unknown).

16. Information concerning the delegates:

-8-

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-It was learned that a number of cadre had already arrived at the C.56 Regiment Headquarters at Day Stream, in the vicinity of XT.340730.

-3 soldiers of the I.2 Main Force Battalion who had participated in the Ap-Bac battle. These soldiers presented an amount of war booty to the Regiment Headquarters late in November 1963.

-3 Military cadre of 1.6 on TDY at COSVN who requested to attend this conference.

-2 Cadre from minority Group in Lam Dong province, in the area for cultural training.

In addition, according a decision of the Organizing Committee, delegates from other agencies and organizations must be present at Ka Tum on 2 Jan 64 at the latest.

17. Locations of VC agencies and units:

" The former cover designation of the Political Bureau [COSVN] is C.602. It now changed to C.632 or C.362.

Around October 1963, the bureau was located at a point North East of and 6Kms from Ba Chien river, in the vicinity of XT.535730.

-The General Staff Bureau [COSVN] was secretly designated as C.401. Around the end of October 1963 this Bureau was located at two points in the vicinity of XT.465737 and XT.480720 (?) Co Trach post.

-The C.56 has cover designation Q.761. On 20 Dec 63, this unit was located at Day Stream in the vicinity of XT340730.

-The 1st Battalion of the C.56 Regiment has cover designation of J.10. It is located in the vicinity of XT.340730 and is responsible for the protection of the C.56 Regiment Headquarters.

-The cover designation for the COSVN Troop Proselyting Section in C.72. In November 1963, it was located at Bau Ra in the vicinity of XT.180860 (?)

-The C.58 Regiment has cover designation of Q.762. Around July 63, this unit was located at Kien An in the vicinity of XT.600420. Subject learned this information during a conference discussing the forces to be used in the attack against the post of Co Trach in Kien An in the vicinity of XT.600420.

-The 2nd Bn. of the C.56 Regt. has cover designation of J.15. In December 1963, it was located in Boi Loi area, in the vicinity of XT.520320.

-3rd Battalion of C.56, cover designation J.20 was located vic XT.370550 in about Dec 63.

-Protection Battalion for Duong Minh Chau base, (old) cover designation C.810 now changed to U.70, was located in Ky Stream vic XT.170770 in Nov 63.

-208th Company of U.70 Battalion, blocking the communication axis 22 vic XT100790

-9-

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A Platoon of this Company is presently located in Ka Tum area vic.XT.334.903 to protect the Convention.

-Main Force Company of Duong Minh Chau district, located in Phuoc Hoi area, vic XT.360530.

-Main Force Company of Tay Ninh province, located in Trang Co area vic. XT.510310.

II. ACTIVITIES OF FRONT'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE:

In the political field, the Front's Central Committee is presently worrying that, the (RVN) Revolutionary Government may re-arm the Cao Dai Army (or hand over Tay Ninh province to Cao Dai control ?)

If the above information is accurate , the VC Duong Minh Chau War Zone will face serious problems in the strategic and economic fields:

21. Strategically:

VC forces in Duong Minh Chau War Zone rely on the source of supply from the areas South of Ba Den Mountain, namely the villages of Khiem Hanh, Hieu Thien and Phuoc-Ninh districts.

If the Cao Dai Army is re-armed, Duong Minh Chau War Zone will be completely isolated because following roads will be controlled by the Cao Dai forces:

- a. National Highway 22, from Xa Mac, Trai Bi to Tay Ninh (?)
- b. The road from Katum to Khedol will be re-established (?)
- c. Village road 13 from Loc Ninh, Suoi Da to Tay Ninh (?)
- d. Village road 26 from Cha La, Cau Khoi, Truong Mit, Bau Don [to Ben Suc.

In such circumstances, the [VC] movements and supply will be largely hampered and Duong Minh Chau War Zone will no longer have its former importance.

22. Economically:

As mentioned above, 90% of Tay Ninh population are Cao Dai followers. Most financial and material resources are directly or indirectly contributed by Cao Dai followers to "feed" Duong Minh Chau Base. These contributions will end once the Cao Dai followers have legitimate representatives in control.

23. [VC] Countering measures:

- a. Strive to recruit more Cao Dai dignitaries into Province and District Front Committees and employ them to propagandize against Re-Armament and to cause internal dissension within Cao Dai ranks because the dignitaries have a considerable

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influence on the followers.

b. Employ the armed forces of the Cao Dai group which advocates "Peace and Neutrality" under Major Mung to propagandize against the Policy of Re-Armament of Brigadier General Tât (exiled Cao Dai).

c. Lure the Cao Dai followers in the liberated areas by giving them more lands and more freedom to do business as well as to make contributions to the Front.

d. Make VC armed forces study and implement properly the policy of "Cao Dai Proselyting", respect the religious belief of Cao Dai followers and help them in their daily life.

III. PLAN OF ACTION OF C.56 REGIMENT:

According to the Proposed Plan in late 1963, the C.56 Regiment Command Section is preparing to switch to the offensive phase against following main objectives:

31. On village road 13:

The main objective in Suoi Da post, vic XT.337576. If this post is destroyed, the Loc Ninh and Don Thuan areas are considered by the VC as completely liberated and they (the VC) will be able to extend the Boi Loi base.

At present, the 3rd Battalion of C.56 Regiment and the "Duong Minh Chau" Main Force Company are assigned as blocking forces to pin down Suoi Da post and to secure the "corridor of activity" for friendly (VC) units.

32. On village road 26:

The VC do not plan to secure any objective because RVNAF forces in Cau Khoi district are too powerful. So the VC have the 2nd Bn. of C.56 Regt. and Tay Ninh Province Main Force Company exert a strong pressure on Dat Sat (XT370424), Cay Cay (XT.365430), Nam Ngan (XT.360435) and Xom Phau (XT320540) Strategic Hamlets.

In addition, these 2 forces have the mission to limit the activities of Bau-Don post and prevent its deep thrusts into Boi Loi area. If conditions permit the elimination of Bau Don post, the VC activities between Boi Loi area and Duong Minh Chau War Zone would no longer be hindered.

33. On National Highway 22:

The main objective is Trai Bi post, vic XT.115710. If this post is removed, C.56 Regt. will extend its control to Xom Vinh vic XT.065594, a densely populated area with abundant economic resources to provide human, material and financial resources to Duong Minh Chau War Zone.

IV. MEASURES AGAINST AIRCRAFT, AIRBORNE AND HELIBORNE OPERATIONS:

(by the 56th Regiment)

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41. Counterbattery:

Before attacking a post, the Command Section of C.56 Regt. studies to see which Howitzer [position Artillery] provides fire support for that post.

Then, 2 81mm Mortars and 1 Protection Platoon are sent to a position 2 or 3Km from that Howitzer. A 3-man cell with an AN/PHC.6 is also posted a few hundred meters from the Howitzer to observe and adjust the mortar fire.

When the post attack begins, the mortars start shelling the position of the Howitzer to destroy it or prevent its crew from firing accurately in support of the post.

42. Methods against heliborne operations:

In bivouac, the Command Section must reconnoiter possible landing zones for helicopters around (VC) unit location. For this reason all the open areas around unit locations are planted with long and sharp spikes to prevent helicopter landing - In addition, anti-personnel spikes are planted between these long spikes to prevent the (RVNAF) troops from jumping down from the hovering helicopters. Spiked trenches are also scattered in the area against those troops who succeed in landing from helicopters.

421. Firing at helicopters:

When unit location is detected and the helicopters are preparing to land, all the (VC) troops must employ the weapons on hand to down them.

This method has obtained good results and now, in all VC guerrilla and regular units, the troops are very fond of firing at helicopters.

43. Measures against strafings by fighter aircraft:

Subject confirms that so far, [the VC have] no effective measure against this type aircraft. The only thing they can do is to preserve the secrecy of their locations and to carefully camouflage houses, equipment, etc...

Each location is also provided with trenches for defense against air strikes.

44. Measures against airborne troops:

Same as measures against heliborne troops. No new method has been found.

V. PRISONER CAMP OF "R", COVER DESIGNATION B.47:

Built in mid-May 1962 near the source of Tonle river, about 2Km from the Cambodian frontier, this camp is located vic XT580880. At that time due to the lack of personnel in charge, Colonel Lê Chàn, Chief of Political Bureau, also assumed the function of PW Camp Commandant. There was only 1 US Sergeant named Farizette captured by I.4 in Lai Thieu (?) and sent to this Camp. But after his interrogation, the PW was released in July 1962.
