1. Personnel: Due to averages in personnel assignments made by CMC for certain operational billets (i.e. linguists) shortages exist in support billets filled by CG FMFPAC (i.e. automotive mechanics: rate 7 have 3). In addition, CMC 052305Z Mar 62 restated the mission of the composite Radio Companies to include Electronic Intelligence (ELINT) collection without a compensating increase in billets, necessitating a shift of billets from other functions to provide this capability. This is offset, however, by the availability of augmentation personnel upon deployment for combat operations.

2. Training: Personnel are adequately trained for immediate combat deployment.

3. Material: Sufficient material is available for immediate combat deployment although some major items of equipment currently lack running spare parts. One of the two rated ELINT vans is presently deadlined awaiting parts, resulting in a 50% reduction in ELINT collection capability. The status of class II replenishment allowances is adequate for combat deployment.

(a) A special personnel action form has been submitted to CG FMFPAC on 9 July 1962. (b) This will be regraded to category A upon receipt of sufficient mechanics.



1. a. Personnel:

(1) The on board officer strength of Support Battalion as of 30 June 1962 is 22. This includes 4 Officers joined on the rolls of the 5th Atomic Ordnance Platoon (See Report Form-5). The present officer strength of 22 is 8 short of the manning level.

(2) The on board enlisted strength is 447. This includes 18 enlisted joined on the rolls of the 5th Atomic Ordnance Platoon (See Report Form-5). Since the enlisted manning level is 425, the total number of enlisted Marines on board is considered satisfactory, although there is a shortage of trained Marines in the following skills:



Task organized detachments do, however, participate in field exercises and problems in support of participating Force Troops, FMF, units. These groups are capable of providing the logistical support required. In addition, this Battalion is able to: Provide the nucleus of a supply unit capable of deploying and operating a Fleet Stock Account; provide the personnel for a Force Service Regiment Truck Platoon; provide other individual personnel trained in their military occupational specialities and prepared for deployment as augmentation for other Fleet Marine Force units.

c. Materiel:

(1) This Battalion received its approved Table of Equipment from Headquarters, Marine Corps, effective 13 April 1962. Authorized line items, not on hand, are either on requisition or will be placed on requisition as monetary funds become available.

(2) At present sufficient T/E line items are on hand to deploy maintenance platoons, or elements thereof, in support of FMF units.

(3) See report of readiness to conduct Atomic Warfare, Form-5 of this report, as applies to paragraphs 3 and 4, for Materiel Status of 5th Atomic Ordnance Platoon.

1. a. Personnel: This unit is two officers under the authorized manning level strength of eleven officers and is six over the authorized manning level strength of one hundred fifty-two enlisted personnel. There are no major deficiencies in officer or enlisted rank structure with only minor variances from the table of organization in MOS distribution.

b. Training: The unit conducted basic and advanced unit training during this quarter. This training, combined with the individual and basic unit training conducted during third quarter FY 62, qualifies the unit for combat operations except for the lack of amphibious training and combined arms training.

c. Materiel: This unit has sufficient combat essential items of equipment in serviceable condition on hand required to accomplish its primary mission except for one AN/MMQ-1B Wind Measuring Set and two M329 Trailer Rocket Transporters.
