

I. IN ACCORDANCE WITH MACV AND III MAF DIRECTIVES, INTERVIEWS ARE ERCOURAGED TO BE GIVEN TO THE PRESS UPON REQUEST AND THUS SENIOR OFFICERS HAVE NO ALTERNATIVE BUT TO GRANT INTERVIEWS. THE SUBJECT INTERVIEW WAS GIVEN TO TOM CHEATHAM, UPI, BY GEN METZGER OR THE SENIOR MARINE IN THE AREA AT DONG HA AT APPROXIMATELY 1030, 23 SEPTEMBER 1967, AT CHEATHAM'S REQUEST. THE INTERVIEW WAS RECORDED AND A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE 3D MARINE DIVISION PIO WAS PRESENT. IT WAS ALSO STRESSED BY GENERAL METZGER THAT ALL HE WOULD DISCUSS WAS THE SPECIFIC AREA IMMEDIATELY SOUTH OF THE DWZ, THAT HE MAS THE ASSISTANT DIVISION COMMANDER WITH NO COMMAND FUNCTIONS, THAT HE DESIRED NO PERSONAL PUBLICITY, AND MANY STATEMENTS WEFE OFF THE MECORD.

WE CAN KNOCK SOME OF IT OUT WITH OUR ARTILLERY AND PLANES, BUT A LOT OF IT WE CAN 'T, SOME OF THEIR GUNS APE IN CAVES OR UNDERGROUND. THE ONLY WAY WE COULD KNOCK THEM ALL. OUT IS TO OCCUPY THE AREA." FROM THE TAPE THE SUBJECT QUOTE WAS CLEARLY STATED AS BEING OFF THE RECORD "WE ARE DELUDING OURSELVES IF WE THINK THAT BECAUSE WE ARE FIRING 5, 240 RCUNDS OR PUTTING MASSIVE AIRSTRIKES IN THAT WE ARE DESTROYING EVERYTHING."

B. IN THE MIDDLE OF THE SUBJECT ARTICLE THERE IS A QUOTE FROM U.S. COMMAND IN SAIGON WHICH DISCUSSES CURRENT U.S. ARTILLERY

COMMENT: THERE IS NO OTHER REASONALLE WAY TO EAPLAIN THE ENEMY FORCES WHICH ARE FACING US SOUTH OF THE RIVER AND WHICH CHEATHAM KNEW OF HAVING BEEN BACK-CROUND BRIEFED BY MIGHER MEADQUARTERS, AND FROM HIS OWN EXPERIENCE. IT IS NOTED AN ALMOST IDENTICAL STATEMENT IS IN THE STARS AND STRIPES OF 25 SEPTEMBER 1967.

D. THE ARTICLE MISSTATED THAT GENERAL WETZGER HINTED THE NVA COULD BE EXPECTED TO ATTACK CON THIEN. THE ANSWER IN RESPONSE TO THE QUESTION WAS THAT IT WAS POSSIBLE IF THEY WERE WILLING TO PAY THE PRICE. COMMENT: THE FOREGOING HAVE BEEN REPEATEDLY STATED AT EVERY LEVEL OF COMMAND AND ARE COMMON KNOWLEDGE. THERE IS NO OTHER WAY TO EXPLAIN THE ENEMY'S ODJECTIVES IN THE AREA. A, IN SUMMARY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH CURRENT DIRECTIVES, A PRESS INTERVIEW WAS HELD. THREE MAIN QUESTIONS WERE ADDRESSED BY THE REPORTER AND THE ANSWERS GIVEN IN BRIEF WERE: WE CANNOT DESTROY EVERYTHING IN THE AREA NORTH OF THE DMZ BY ARTILLERY AND AIR. 2. REF A DESIGNATED ABCCC HILLSBORO AS THE CONTROLLING AGENCY FOR THE OPERATION. THE ABCCC IS APPARENTLY CHECKING FIRE NORTH OF THE DMZ WHENEVER OPN NEUTRALIZE ACFT ARE IN THE GENERAL VICINITY. THIS BLANKET RESTRICTION IS WHOLLY UNNECESSARY FROM THE STANDPOINT OF EFFECTIVE FIRE COORDINATION.

3. RECOMMEND YOU REEVALUATE PRESENT CONCEPT. AS A MINIMUM RECOMMEND 7 AF PERSONNEL WITH NECESSARY AUTHORITY AND ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT BE COLOCATED WITH MY FACILITIES AT DONG HA. KNOWLEDGE OF FLIGHT PATH AND TARGET ASSIGNMENT OF A/C SHOULD NECESSITATE CHECK FIRES ONLY IN AFFECTED AREAS.
4. REQUEST SENIOR 7TH AF REP ESTABLISH LIAISON ASAP. WARM REGARDS

I. AS YOU KNOW, THE ENEMY THREAT IN ICTZ, AND PARTICULARLY IN THE DMZ, CONTINUES UNABATED. DURING THE PAST WEEK TWO THINGS HAVE OCCURRED WHICH ARE OF REAL CONCERN AND WHICH HAVE CAUSED ME TO REASSESS THE ENEMY'S CAPABILITIES. FIRST, THE ENEMY HAS CONVINCINGLY DEMONSTRATED THAT HE CAN MASS HIS SUPPORTING FIRES. ON OCCASION HE FIRED OVER 200 ROUNDS OF ARTILLERY IN A VERY FEW MINUTES, COORDINATED WITH HEAVY MORTAR FIRE MOT ONLY AGAINST OUR STRONG POINTS BUT AGAINST MOBILE FORCES AS WELL. SECONDLY THE EARLY AND TORRENTIAL RAINS HAVE DECREASED THE EFFECTIVENESS OF AIR SUPPORT AND COUNTER-BATTERY FIRE AS WELL AS MAKING RESUPPLY AND REINFORCEMENT DISTURBINGLY SLOW AND DIFFICULT. THE EFFECTS OF THESE FACTORS ON INSURING AN ADEQUATE AND ACTIVE DEFENSE ARE EVIDENT.

2. I HAD HOPED THAT WE WOULD BE ABLE TO HANDLE THE ENEMY WITH

AS YOU ARE AWARE, I HAVE A VERY LIMITED CAPABILITY TO REINFORCE IN THE DMZ AREA WITHOUT UNCOVERING IN VARYING DEGREES OTHER VITAL AREAS. AND WHILE I AM CERTAIN WE WILL EXTRACT A SUBSTANTIAL TOLL IF THE ENEMY CHOOSES A MORE AGRESSIVE COURSE OF ACTION, I FEEL WE RUN TOO HIGH A RISK IF PLANS TO SHIFT US ELEMENTS FROM ICTZ TO TACTICAL AREAS FURTHER SOUTH ARE EXECUTED. IN FACT, I STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT WE AT LEAST CONTINUE THE PRESENT FORCE LEVEL THROUGH THE MONTHS IMMEDIATELY AHEAD . :

4. SPECIFICALLY, I PROPOSE THE FOLLOWING GENERAL DISPOSITION OF

A. THE AMERICAL DIVISION, WITH 3 BRIGADES (1987H, 1967H, 3/47H),

C. THE 1ST MARINE DIVISION, WITH 2 AND 1/3 REGTS WOULD CONTINUE TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR QUANG NAM, LESS THAT SMALL PORTION ASSUMED BY THE AMERICAL DIV.

D. THE 3D MARDIV WOULD CONTINUE TO HOLD RESPONSIBILITY FOR THUA THIEN AND QUANG TRIS BUT TO THEIR PRESENT FORCE OF 10 BNS (INCLUDING THE OKI ROTATIONAL BN) WOULD BE ADDED THE COMMAND GROUP AND 2 BNS OF THE 5TH MARINES. THESE ADDITIONS, PLUS THE CONTINUING AVAILABILITY OF THE 2 SLF'S WOULD PROVIZE THE MINIMUM FORCE TO COUNTER A SERIOUS ENEMY ATTACK IN THE DMZ AREA AND TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF OPPORTUNITIES TO DESTROY ENEMY BATTALIONS PIECEMEAL SOUTH OF THE BEN HAI AS THEY OPEN THEMSELVES TO ATTACK.

I. AN SURE YOU HAVE NOTICED THAT THE USE OF MARIJUANA IS MENTIONED IN FAR TOO MANY ADMINISTRATIVE AND DISCIPLINARY REPORTS ORIGINATING IN MANINE UNITS IN VIETNAM. THIS HAS BEEN OF CONCERN TO ME. AND WANT YOU TO BE APPRISED OF THE MEASURES THIS COMMAND HAS ALREADY TAKEN TO COUNTER IT.

2. THERE HAS BEEN A SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN MARIJUANA TRAFFIC IN I CORPS THIS YEAR. ALTHOUGH IT IS NOT GROWN LOCALLY, IT IS SOLD LEGALLY BOTH IN BULK AND IN MACHINE-ROLLED CIGARETTES. MAJOR CID EFFORT HAS BEEN DEVOTED TO LOCATING THE SOURCE. IT IS CLEARLY A VIETNAMESE OPERATION, AND THE MOST PROBABLE MEANS OF ENTRY IS BY SVN COMMERCIAL OR MILITARY AIR. THE NUMBER OF PERSUNS PROCESSED FOR DISCHARGE BY ADMINISTRATIVE MEANS IS UNKNOWN. BUT AT LEAST 4 ARE PENDING.

5. THE SUBJECT WAS A JCC AGENDA ITEM IN JULY AND SEPTEMBER. THE MAYOR OF DAMANG ATTENDED THE JULY MEETING. 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ANALYSIS OF PATROL ACTIONS BY REGULAR RIFLE UNITS - FIRE TEAM AND SQUAD HAS CONVINCED ME THAT REFRESHER INSTRUCTION IS REQUIRED IN THIS ART. TOO MANY PATROLS HAVE BECOME PERFUNCTORY HIKES, WITH EXCESSIVE CASUALTIES FROM INATTENTION AND LACK OF SKILL, AND RESULTANT FAILURE TO OBTAIN INFORMATION AND FOR INFLICT CASUALTIES, DEPENDING UPON MISSION. I WOULD LIKE APPROPRIATE SCHOOL AND TRAINING TO BE HELD ON CHAP 8, PATROLLING, OF ENFM 6-5, THE MARINE RIFLE SQUAD. I FARTICULARLY COMMEND TO THE ATTENTION OF ALL CONCERNED PARA 3102, FARA A (2) (A) AND (B). IF WE DO NOTHING ELSE BUT ENGRAVE THAT


