

1. GENERAL ENEMY SITUATION. Enemy activity during the reporting period was significantly reduced throughout the ICTZ. Significant highlights continued to be the employment of rockets against vital areas, and a continuing increase in mortar fire.

a. QUANG TRI (P). Enemy initiated activity in QUANG TRI (P) continued at a relatively low level during the reporting period. On 13 January at 1150, an estimated reinforced NVA platoon ambushed a 3d Battalion, 9th Marines convoy at (XD 991494) on Route #9 between CA LU and the Rock File. The enemy utilized command detonated explosives and demolitions along the road, supported by mortar, SA/AW fire to effect the ambush. Enemy casualties as a result of this engagement were 10 NVA KIA, one soldier and several individual and crew served weapons were captured.

b. THUA THIEN (P). The enemy continued to interdict major routes of friendly movement in a continuation of his effort to sever the northern two provinces from SVN. The PHU LOC District was the center of enemy activity as the enemy, waiting until poor weather moved into the PHU LOC District on 7 January, initiated a series of coordinated attacks against CAPS 5, 6, and 7, the Subsector HQ, and the 1st Battalion, 5th Marines CP. Supported by very accurate mortar and 75mm RR fire, the enemy attacked at 0400H and succeeded in overrunning CAPS 6 and 7, destroying most of the Subsector HQ and effectively pinning down reaction forces. Although his attacks were largely successful, the enemy suffered 84 KIA. Enemy units involved were tentatively identified as the 1st Battalion, 9th NVA Regt, and K-4B MF Battalion. Elements of the 4th Regt continued to sporadically attack the Subsector HQ and CAP units with harassing mortar and SA/AW fire during the period 7-14 January. The enemy interdicted the roads and major bridges both east and west of PHU LOC in an effort to keep Route #1 closed. On 11 January at 1130, CAP A-2 engaged a VC force estimated to be 50-100 men approximately 3,000 meters southeast of the PHU BAI airfield (YD 9315). Following linkup with a reaction force, the enemy permitted a relatively free withdrawal, thus indicating the probable presence of other enemy units in the general area and the enemy's desire not to initiate a major engagement at that time and place.

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c. QUANG NAM (P). The enemy's employment of 122MM rockets continued, as he followed up his 3 January rocket attack against DANANG Air Field with a 42 rocket attack against the FLC at 2200 on 7 January. These attacks follow the pattern referred to by a rallier from the 368B Rocket Regt, who stated that current strategy directs that during the period one 122MM rocket battalion is executing an attack by fire, the other 122MM rocket battalion utilizes this diversion to move to, and occupy, another attack position against a different target. This latter attack is generally conducted after a 3-5 day waiting period. The rallier further stated that the 1st Battalion, formerly armed with 140MM rockets, has reverted to a support unit status due to the unserviceability of their launchers. There was a significant reduction in enemy activity during the reporting period. Contact with the enemy was generally the result of friendly initiated action in the southern part of the DANANG TAOR and the QUANG NAM - QUANG TIN border area. Although he continued to harass isolated outposts, CAP units, RD teams and district headquarters, the enemy attempted to avoid major contacts with U. S. forces. American units killed 266 enemy along the QUANG NAM - QUANG TIN border area (AT 9526) as a result of combined air and artillery strikes and small unit contacts. Significant contact with the enemy occurred during the week from 8-10 January. On 8 January, B/4/31 and D/3/21 engaged an unknown enemy force at (AT 956268) killing 28 VC, while at (AT 999349) on 10 January, B/1/1 Cav and the 2/12, 5km northwest of NUI LOC SON, were attacked by an NVA battalion. The enemy suffered 38 KIA in the attack.

d. QUANG TIN (P). Enemy activity continued at the same level as in QUANG NAM (P). C/6/17 at (BT 202233) on 12 January, engaged an unknown size enemy force and killed 31 VC. During the night of 9-10 January, the enemy launched a series of mortar and S/A attacks against CAPS I-2, I-3, and K-3; enemy casualties are unknown. The HAU DUC OP's (ET 0705), manned by RF and PF forces, continued to receive mortar, RR and limited ground attacks on 9, 10 and 11 January.

e. QUANG NGAI (P). Enemy activity consisted of limited attacks against RD teams, harassment of isolated outposts and interdiction of LOC's. At (BS 341888) on 8 January, overlooking the TRA BONG SF Camp, a CIDG patrol discovered a sand table model of the camp, complete with detailed descriptions of defensive measures and fields of fire. A major enemy attack against this camp is considered highly probable.

f. ANALYSIS OF THE ENEMY SITUATION IN ICTZ. An analysis of current intelligence indicates that the enemy threat to KHE SANH continues, screened by a strong counter reconnaissance effort. The CON THIEN - GIO LINH complex and QUANG TRI City remain probable targets for enemy attacks of multi-battalion size upon initiation of the TRI THIEN-HUE, Winter-Spring Campaign. Throughout the ICTZ, a strong effort to interdict main routes of friendly movement is anticipated, particularly in the TRI THIEN Region, as the enemy continues in his attempt to sever the northern provinces from SVN. The enemy is expected to continue limited

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attacks against CAP units and friendly installations in the PHU LOC area, while preparing for major offensive action against the HUE - PHU BAI complex. Although the enemy suffered severe losses at the initiation of the MR-5 Winter-Spring Campaign in the QUE SON Valley, QUANG NAM - QUANG TIN border area, the 2d NVA Division is expected to renew offensive action following its recent period of disengagement and refurbishing. Provincial jails, CAP units and District HQ's, such as DAI LOC, TAM KY, and QUANG NGAI City, remain the most probable targets in central and southern I Corps. Heavy weapons attacks against vital areas remain highly probable as does a continuation of unconventional warfare.

2. ENEMY OPERATIONS DURING THE PERIOD. Enemy initiated incidents decreased when compared to the previous week. Incidents consisted of three attacks, one ambush, 26 assaults by fire, 99 harassing fire, 47 mines/booby traps, four assassinations, one kidnapping, 12 propaganda, nine sabotage, and 141 AA fire.

d. New Enemy Weapon. Additional information received on the 82mm mortar time shell (reference III MAF PERINTREP 52-67 and 1-68):

(1) Preparation of mortar: same as firing impact fuze shell.

(2) Preparation of ammunition: Open the metallic case. Take the shell out. Open the box and select the appropriate tube of corrosive solution. Insert the tube of corrosive solution into the detonator. Place the shell vertically and screw out the detonator cap. Insert the tube in the detonator (insert the sharp end first). Screw in the detonator cap until it breaks the tube of corrosive solution.

Safety Precautions: If the corrosive solution tube is inserted but the shell is not supposed to be fired, remove the cap and let the solution leak out; then clean the inside with a cloth. (The time between the insertion of the tube and removal of the cap should not exceed 20 minutes). Remove the detonator and destroy it. The shell should be sent to the rear area. If the detonator cannot be removed, the shell should be laid aside and then destroyed later. After each combat mission, all time fuze shells should be checked to make sure that no corrosive solution tubes remain inserted. In case they are, the above safety precautions are to be taken.

r. Reconnaissance.

(1) QUANG TRI (P). There were 103 ground reconnaissance patrols deployed throughout QUANG TRI (P) during the reporting period, which reported sighting 162 enemy. In the KHE SANH/SCOTLAND area, 37 reconnaissance elements sighted 11 enemy, while four patrols from the LANG VEI SF Camp reported sighting an NVA company on 12 January and two NVA squads on 13 January, south and west of LANG VEI. In the DONG HA/KENTUCKY area, 62

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reconnaissance patrols reported sightings totaling 29 enemy. Total enemy sightings were significantly reduced from the 291 enemy reported during the preceding period. SLAR missions flown over the eastern BEN HAI River continue to indicate enemy traffic along both banks and on the river itself during the night and early morning hours.

(2) THUA THIEN (P). There were 55 ground reconnaissance patrols deployed generally to the west of Route #1 and around the PHU BAI TAOR which reported sightings totaling 100 enemy. This is a moderate reduction from the 193 enemy reported last week. Aerial photography of A SHAU Valley indicates the valley road to be passable and continuously used by 1½ and 2 ton trucks. At 0700 on 10 January, patrol FANCY DAN/2-A-2 called an artillery mission on (YD 465255) resulting in 37 secondary explosions.

(3) QUANG NAM (P). Along the western boundary of the DANANG TAOR, 15 reconnaissance patrols reported sighting 251 VC, while along the southern boundary of the TAOR, 32 reconnaissance patrols reported sightings totaling 777 enemy. On 7 January at 1750, PEARL CHEST/C-3-2 observed 167 VC moving northeast on a trail. A fire mission was called resulting in 24 VC KIA. IR missions have revealed the continuing presence of a significant number of enemy troops in the area bounded by (AT 9656, 9856, 9654, 9054).

(4) QUANG TIN (P). There were no sightings reported by THUONG DUC and KHAM DUC SF Camps, the ROK Marines and the Americal Division in their respective areas.

(5) QUANG NGAI (P). There were negative sightings reported by the TRA BONG and MINH LONG SF Camps. The HA THANH Camp reported sighting two VC squads while the GIA VUC Camp reported sighting one VC squad.

- j. Weather. From the 7th to the 11th of January, skies were cloudy with a moderate northeasterly flow aloft causing low ceilings from 500-1000feet, with occasional periods of higher ceiling of 3000-5000 feet.

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Visibility was generally unrestricted with short periods of reduced visibility. On the 12th, a decrease in winds aloft caused skies to clear, ceiling to lift and visibility to become unrestricted with brief periods of reduced visibility caused by early morning fog and haze. On the 13th, skies again became cloudy with occasional light rain which reduced visibility. Air operations were moderately hampered during this period. The following are weekly averages for the areas indicated:

5. CAPABILITES AND VULNERABILITIES. See III MAF PERINTREP 28-67. Based upon a continuing evaluation of the enemy situation, the four primary enemy courses of action in the most probable order of adoption are considered to be:

a. Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare to include small scale attacks and ambushes, interdiction of LOC's, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, and the use of mines and booby traps.


b. Attack selected key installations with medium and/or heavy mortars, artillery, and rockets.


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# THUA THIEN ORDER OF BATTLE




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# QUANG NAM ORDER OF BATTLE




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# QUANG TIN ORDER OF BATTLE




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# QUANG NGAI ORDER OF BATTLE



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ANNEX B (SIGNIFICANT INFORMATION DERIVED FROM INTERROGATION REPORTS, AGENT REPORTS AND CAPTURED DOCUMENTS) TO III MAF PERINTREP 2-68.

1. QUANG TRI

a. An unidentified agent as noted in 3d MARDIV INTSUM #3-68, reported that the 90th Regt of the 312th NVA Div commenced to move south through (YD 084754). At BARTAT (H) (YD 084754) they headed west to LAOS, reportedly to avoid Marines in KHE SANH and along National Route #9. They entered SVN for the second time south of KHE SANH, traveling northeast to BA LONG (H) (YD 158403) in BA LONG (D), QUANG TRI (P), and continued Northeast, traveling along "MIENFAY", which the VC call "Road to the West", beginning at QUANG TRI (P). Elephants were reportedly used to carry heavy weapons. The 90th Regt is composed of three U/I battalions with 600 men located between (YD 231464) and (YD 190458). The remaining 400 men infiltrated south into THUA THIEN (P). The 90th Regt CO is reportedly NGUYEN VU.

(G-2 Cmt: The 90th Regt is carried in the NVA OOB as subordinate to the 324B Division (F-5). The 312th NVA Division was reported in the DMZ about 1966, however, this is the first report of elements of the division south of the DMZ, and of VU as CO of the 90th Regt (F-6).)

b. PW's NGUYEN VAN DIEN, (NGUYEN VEON ZIEENR) (aka DI (ZIV)), NGUYEN VINH (NGUYEN VINH) (aka KHOAT (KHOATS)) and NGUYEN DUC THUY (NGUYEN DUNCS THUYV) (1st ARVN Division INTER Rpt 87-67) of the C.11 Co., K.16 Battalion (aka 416th Battalion) who were captured 26 December 1967 vic (YD 490562), stated that the K.16 Battalion was composed of the C.11, C.12, and C.13 Infantry Co.'s and the C.15 Combat Support Co. Total strength of the battalion is 400. It operates in the vic of THAM KHE (H) (YD 540525) and MY THUY (YD 490563), and has a rear area in the HAI LANG forward mountain region (YD 3237). DIEN stated the strength of the C.11 Co. was 100 personnel with the following armament: one 60MM Mortar, one LMG, three AR's (RPD), three B-40's, and an unknown number of SKS and AK's. The company mission was anti-sweep operations and destruction of rural development pacification teams. Reported personalities are: Battalion CO - Capt A (AS), XO/C of S-Jr Capt QUY (QYS), PO-Capt DUC (DUCV); C.11 Co. Cmdr- 1st Lt NOI (NOI), XO-2d Lt TIN (TIN), PO-1st Lt KHANG (KHANG).

(G-2 Cmt: Information given is consistent with current OOB holdings (F-2).)

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c. PW NGUYEN VAN TAM (NGUYEN VEAN TAM) (1st ARVN Division INTER Rpt 84-67) reported the location of an internal assault sapper training post in the DONG MONG Mountain Region, TRIEU PHONG (D), vic (YD 0944). The installation consists of 15 houses/classrooms, each serving one internal assault cell. This post is occupied by 60 students who train for one month on the following: assembly, disassembly, and use of the Colt 12 pistol (NFI) and Thompson submachine gun; use of grenades and explosives; policies of the NLF; and the "invasion of the American Imperialists and their henchmen". Additionally, support by the communist countries for the revolution's political and military victories, procedures for disguising and surrendering as a CHIEU HOI, mission after rallying, and policies of the CHIEU HOI program are taught. NAM THANH (NAM THANHL), the district training committeeman, instructed classes. The plans and mission of the rallier's cell were to disrupt the CHIEU HOI program by mining, sabotage, assassination of key personnel within the various CHIEU HOI centers, instill fear in all would-be ralliers, cause confusion within the center itself, and create distrust between ARVN and US Forces. Subject was a member of a three man A-2 cell. Reported personalities are: General Commander-TU TRAN (TUN TRANL); Training Cadre - NAM THANH (NAM THANHL); Cell Leader - CU (CUN).

(G-2 Cmt: First report of all information and cadre (F-6). However, with the CHIEU HOI Program resulting in many ralliers from VC/NVA forces it is highly probable that a unit with the reported mission, has been established to counter the government program.)

d. Further interrogation of PW NGUYEN VAN DIEN (NGUYEN VEAN ZIEENR) (aka DI (ZIV)) (1st ARVN Division INTER Rpt 87-67A) C.11 Co., K.16 Battalion (aka 416th Bn) captured on 26 Dec 67 vic (YD 490562), revealed that about a month prior to capture he spoke with four or five members of the K.14, K.8 and K.200 Bn's in the vic of HAI VINH (YD 425527). Subject also revealed that although the K.16 Bn would make location changes during daylight hours when it was cloudy or raining, they restricted most of their movement to the hours of darkness.

(G-2 Cmt: Information given is consistent with previous reports (F-2).)

e. Further interrogation of PW TRAN QUOC THIN (TRAANL QOOC THINL) (aka NGUYEN LANG (NGUYEN LANG)) (1st ARVN Division INTER Rpt 74-67A), (initial report 74-67, 3 Dec 67), in the vic of (YD 418467) revealed the following additional personalities not mentioned during previous interrogations: 1st Co. Cmdr - 1st Lt DAN (ZAANS), XO - 2d Lt BUU (BUUJUX), PO - 1st Lt HOA (HOAS), APO - 2d Lt THE (THEES); 2d Co. Cmdr - 1st Lt HAHN (HANHV), XO - 2d Lt BINH (BINHS), PO - 1st Lt

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KAH (KHAR), APO - 2d Lt LE (LEEV); 3d Co. Cmdr - 1st Lt TANH (TANHS).

(G-2 Cmt: First report of all personalities (F-6) with the exception of Co. Cmdr DAN (F-2). Personalities of the 3d Co. as reported in the initial interrogation report remain consistent in this report with the exception of the Co. Cmdr, whom subject changes from MINH (MINH) to TANH (TANHS).)

## 2. THUA THIEN

a. PW HO VIET NGAI (1st ARVN Division INTER RPT 1-68) of the 3d Co, 810th Bn who rallied on 31 Dec 67 at HT-17 Base, states his unit is based at (YD 6311). Defector NGAI gives the strength for his unit as 400 and the LBN as K.10. PW states that the unit moved to HUONG TRA Mountain so that K.10 could be a reserve unit for the 6th Worksite (Regt). Reported personalities are: CO - NGU, XO - BY, PO - BANG.

(G-2 Cmt: The location given for the 810th Bn confirms current OOB holdings (F-2). This is the first report of the mission of the 810th Bn being a reserve unit for the 6th Regt. However, due to its location in close proximity to the 6th Regt, this is evaluated (F-3). This is the first report of all personalities (F-6).)

## 3. QUANG NAM

a. An NVA PW, captured on 2 or 3 Jan at an unknown place and reported by AMCAL ISUM DTG 041730JAN68, stated he was a member of the 17th Mortar Co., 31st Regt. PW said his company consisted of 44 men and that the company had four 82MM Mortars. PW stated the Co. Cmdr was NGUYEN DUC QUY. PW further stated his company had previously been located in the vic of (AT 900395).

(G-2 Cmt: First report on Cmdr of 17 Mortar Co., 31st Regt (F-6). This is the known operating area for elements of the 31st Regt).

## 4. QUANG NGAI

PW NGUYEN VAN PHUONG (I Corps Spot Report), from the 406B Co., captured on 2 Jan 68, stated that while in NVN he received his training as a member of the 120th Bn, 2d Regt. The regiment was composed of four battalions designated 120th, 130th, 314th and 319th, each having a strength of 700. Source stated the 130th Bn commenced infiltration into SVN in April, and six days later the 120th Bn followed. The 319th rested for one month, then followed the 120th

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Bn. Subject does not know when, or if, the 314th Bn infiltrated. The 120th Bn then commenced movement to the SONG RE Area of QUANG NGAI (P). PHUONG and three other members were assigned to the 406B Co. The 406B Co. remained in the area for about one month then moved to BINH KY (V), BINH SON (D). On 252400 Dec 67, the company moved to the vic of (BS 612865) and rested there for one day prior to returning to NGHIA HANH (D) Hq that night. Source stated that the 406B Co is composed of four platoons designated 1, 2, 3, and 4. The company has a strength of 150 men and possesses the following weapons: four flame throwers, three B-40's, four BAR's, three MG's, two DKZ 57/75 MM and one 60 MM Mortar. Individual weapons consist of AK-47's, SKS, and carbines. Subject stated that he saw soldiers who were members of units designated 506A and 506B, which were reconnaissance units directly subordinate to MR-5. At the time, the soldiers were detailed to pick up rice for their units. Source stated that he has heard of a unit designated 406A but has no further information concerning this unit. Reported personalities: Co. Cmr - Lt DU, PO - Lt NGUYEN HUY QUANG.

(G-2 Cmt: A check of the NVA OOB reveals nothing on a 2d Regt composed of the battalions mentioned by subject (F-6). Subject's statement of his unit's preparation for the attack on NGHIA HANH District Hq is possibly true (F-3). (The attack mentioned by PHUONG took place on 2 Jan 68). First report on a 406B Co in QUANG NGAI (P); however, a 406th Sapper Co. has been reported several times, the first being in Nov 66 and the most recent in May 67 (F-6). First report on all personalities (F-6).)

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## ANNEX C (COUNTERINTELLIGENCE) TO III MAF PERINTREP NO. 2-68

1. GENERAL. A significant change occurred in the pattern of VC activities of a counterintelligence interest during this reporting period. Propaganda and terrorist activity increased sharply in Quang Nam (P) and Thua Thien (P) respectively, while incidents of sabotage declined below that of the preceding week. Items of interest include a report that approximately 84 civilians, led by a confirmed VC, staged a demonstration in Danang City protesting U.S. bombing; a report that six civilians were killed and 22 civilians wounded when the bus in which they were riding detonated an unknown type explosive device; and a report that teenage "Suicide" youth cells are operating in Danang City.

2. ESPIONAGE. There were no reports of VC espionage activity during the reporting period.

3. SABOTAGE. The following acts of sabotage were reported:

4. POLITICAL. There were no reports of VC political activity during the reporting period.

5. PROPAGANDA.

QUANG TRI. A 26 December report from the 15th Counterintelligence Team revealed that an estimated VC platoon set up a public address system on the outskirts of a hamlet in the vicinity of (YD 339674), and utilized it to broadcast anti-US/GVN propaganda to inhabitants. Local PFs in Ha Tay (H) (YD 340680) took the VC under fire causing the enemy to withdraw from the area.

QUANG NAM. A 3 January report from an intelligence source disclosed that on the night of 26 December, two VC propaganda leaflets, designed to influence American military personnel to defect to the VC, were found in Hoa Long (V) (BT 065734), Hoa Vang (D). One of the leaflets titled "Colored American Servicemen", was specifically targeted toward Negro personnel encouraging them to oppose being sent to Vietnam. The second leaflet, designed for wider appeal, was titled "U.S. Servicemen" with the same theme.

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An information report, dated 4 January, related that a number of propaganda leaflets were found in Dien Pho (H), Ky Chanh (V) on 20 December. The leaflets, targeted against U.S. Military personnel, were designed to reduce morale and incite dissention. One of the leaflets was titled, "U.S. Colored Armymen", further pointing out the fact that VC propaganda activities are being increasingly directed toward Negro personnel.

A report, dated 4 January, indicated that a propaganda leaflet was found by a member of the RF Company at Hieu Duc (D) Headquarters after an attack which took place on 3 January. The leaflet was written in Vietnamese and directed towards Regional and Popular Forces residing in Quang Nam (P), urging them to desert and join the National Liberation Front.

A 6 January report from an intelligence source related that a number of propaganda leaflets, titled "Who is Your Enemy" and addressed to "Afro-Americans", were distributed throughout the city of Danang. The leaflets urged Negro servicemen to refuse to fight in Vietnam and demand to be sent home to participate in the "Afro-American struggle" in the U.S.A. The leaflets also appealed to Negro servicemen with the following statement: "Cross over to the South Vietnam National Front for Liberation and they would be helped to return home as was Claude McClure RA 14703075, the Negro Sergeant who was released not long ago".

An 8 January report revealed that approximately 84 civilians, mostly women, staged a demonstration in downtown Danang City. The demonstration, led by a confirmed VC, was held in protest of U.S. bombing and aid in Vietnam. National police immediately arrested the VC leader and dispersed the demonstrators.

A 9 January report from an intelligence source indicated that on the night of 26 December, three types of propaganda leaflets written in English, urging American servicemen to cease fighting, were found at Tan Thanh (H) (BT 180590), and Hoi An City (BT 145575). One of the leaflets titled "To All U.S. Officers and Men" contained the following statements: "Do not listen to President Johnson. Fight for your return to your families. Let South Vietnam settle its own affairs, Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year".

An 11 January report from an intelligence source related that approximately 200 civilians from Cam Hai, Than Minh, and Thanh Thuy Villages went to Lai Nghi (H) (BT 102882) and staged a demonstration requesting that the Americans stop the bombing, firing of artillery, and use of defoliation chemicals against their villages.

A 12 January report based on a captured enemy document revealed that the Chief of the Propaganda and Indoctrination Section, Que Son (D), was informing his subordinate village officials that the tactics used by the Americal Division adversely affected the morale of the population, and that these tactics must be countered by an intensified propaganda program directed at village inhabitants.

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QUANG TIN. A 10 January report from an intelligence source indicated that a propaganda leaflet was found in Ly Tin District. The leaflet, titled "Do Act in the Sense of Conscience and Humanity", went on to ask the Americans to stop the dirty war of aggression during Tet because, they, (the VC) had done so during our Christmas Holiday.

6. MISCELLANEOUS.

QUANG TRI. A 31 December report from the 15th Counterintelligence Team disclosed that approximately six VC guerrillas entered Lang Ha (H) (YD 317689) and kidnapped one civilian whom they suspected of being a GVN agent.

THUA THIEN. On 5 January, a civilian bus detonated an unknown type explosive device while traveling on Highway One in the vicinity of (AT 891953). Although the vehicle was 50% destroyed, there were no casualties as a result of the explosion.

An 8 January report from I Corps related that an unknown number of VC entered Vinh Hu (H) (ZD 005120) and assassinated one civilian. The reason for the killing is unknown.

A 9 January report from the 1st Infantry Division revealed that two civilians riding their bicycles in the vicinity of (ZD 170011) were killed by an unknown number of VC, who then stole their bicycles.

On 9 January, a civilian bus detonated an unknown type explosive device while traveling on Highway One in the vicinity of (AT 924927). Six civilians were killed, and 22 civilians were wounded as a result of the explosion.

QUANG NAM. A captured enemy document provided the basis for a 3 January report which disclosed that an unidentified enemy unit located at the Tuy Loan Road-Junction in Danang City, has the mission of organizing local teenagers into "Suicide" youth cells, and "Brave Killer of Americans" cells. Six three-man cells were to be organized no later than 30 November 1967.

A 4 January report from the 1st Marine Division revealed that elements of "G" Company, 2d Battalion, 7th Marines while patrolling in the vicinity of (AT 926840) observed an unmanned raft floating down the river towards NamO Bridge. Pulling the raft ashore, the patrol discovered eight one gallon cans of explosives, six bamboo sections filled with TNT, and two blasting caps with communication wire attached. The raft was destroyed by EOD elements.

A 10 January report from an intelligence source indicated that an estimated 100 civilians from Thanh Minh and Than Thuy villages staged a demonstration at Thanh Quit Outpost (BT 045620) requesting that friendly artillery fire on their villages be stopped. The villagers brought five bodies to the outpost to reinforce their demands.

A report, dated 10 January, related that approximately 100 civilians from Vinh Ha and Vinh Xuan Villages went to Lai Nghi (H) (BT 100383) where they staged a demonstration requesting that artillery fire on their villages be stopped. Elements from Dien Ban Special Sector dispersed the crowd.

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QUANG TIN. A 7 January report from the Americal Division related that elements of "B" Company, 3d Battalion, 21st Regiment while on patrol in the vicinity of (BT 045302) found the body of a Vietnamese civilian shot in the back and in the head. The civilian's hands were tied behind his back. The reason for the killing is undetermined.



1. GENERAL ENEMY SITUATION. Enemy attacks by fire increased during the reporting period, directed mainly against friendly support installations, including: CA LU, Camp CARROLL, CUA VIET and PHU BAI. Enemy ground activity increased significantly in the TRI THIEN Region, notably north of DONG HA and in the HUE/PHU BAI areas. Heavy contacts in the DONG HA area have demonstrated an apparent change in the enemy's attempts to avoid contact. Elements of the 101st Abn Division continued to meet heavy enemy resistance in the HUE area, inflicting heavy casualties on the 90th Regiment. Elsewhere in I Corps, scattered ground incidents were reported throughout the southern portion of the Corps area. An increase in enemy reconnaissance efforts against DANANG occurred. Five PW's stated that their unit's mission had been to destroy the MONKEY Mountain Radar Facility on the night of 3 May and that three of their members were still at large. Numerous rice caches and sightings of enemy movement, along with strong APD read-outs east of THUONG DUC and in ELEPHANT Valley, indicate that the enemy has continued his efforts to replenish food as well as equipment and personnel. The enemy continued his attempts to interdict friendly LOC's along Highway 1 and the CUA VIET River and conduct limited ground attacks on friendly installations and outposts. The enemy was successful in overrunning a PF outpost near QUANG NGAI City.

a. QUANG TRI (P). Enemy activity increased significantly during the period, principally in northeastern QUANG TRI (P). The enemy increased his efforts to interdict the CUA VIET River, utilizing mines and attacks by fire. On 020845H, the CUA VIET River was closed because of mines along the river bank. The mined area was cleared and the river was opened at 030800H. Also on 3 May, the CUA VIET Port Facility received 25 rounds of artillery. Heavy enemy resistance was reported northeast of DONG HA throughout the week. On 29 April, the 2d ARVN Regiment contacted an estimated two NVA battalions five kilometers north of DONG HA along Route 1. Task Force ROBIE was committed and contact broke, resulting in 104 NVA KIA, 13 IW, three CSW and two PW's captured. PW's stated their units were elements of the 52d Regiment, 320th Division. On 1 May, at 0900H,

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elements of 2/4 Marines received heavy enemy artillery fire three kilometers northeast of DONG HA (YD 255639). H/2/4 sighted an undetermined number of NVA heading toward B/1/3 and engaged them with organic weapons. At 1700H, B/1/3, H/2/4 and F/2/4 were in heavy contact with an estimated enemy battalion, employing SA/AW, mortars, recoilless rifles and artillery. G/2/4 reinforced, and at 1700H, the NVA counter-attacked against friendly positions in DAI DO Village. Elements of 2/4 started to sweep north and the enemy force broke contact. At 1730H, the enemy launched a second counterattack and the Marines pulled back to DAI DO Village. The second counterattack was repulsed and the enemy resorted to probing attacks on three sides of the friendly positions. The Marines succeeded in inflicting 356 NVA KIA, and captured 35 weapons. Enemy units contacted are believed to have been elements of the 320th Division. Also on 1 May, 3/9 Marines came under a ground attack from an unknown size enemy force, vicinity (YD 205625). At 1610H, the enemy fired 47 mortar and 40 artillery rounds. The contact terminated at 1700H. Enemy casualties for this engagement were 41 KIA. There were four PW's captured that stated their units were elements of the 52d Regiment, 320th Division. On 3 May, D/3/21 Infantry received small arms fire, mortars and artillery from NVA soldiers in prepared positions. A and C Companies also came in contact. All three companies received a counterattack which was repulsed. Enemy casualties were 67 KIA and two PW's. The prisoners identified their unit as the 8th Battalion, 64th Regiment, 320th Division.

b. THUA THIEN (P). Enemy activity remained at a high level, especially in the HUE and PHU BAI areas. On 1 May, A/2/17 Cavalry made contact with an estimated platoon, six kilometers west of QUANG DIEN (YD 623328). The enemy fled and while in pursuit, the cavalry unit made contact with an estimated enemy reinforced company in bunkers. Reinforced by Company B and supported by air strikes, artillery and a light fire team, A and B Companies assaulted and overran the enemy position, killing 82 NVA and capturing 13 IW and nine CSW. Also on 1 May, a PF platoon made contact with an estimated enemy battalion, five kilometers west of HUE (YD 693232). Companies A and C, 1/505 Abn, were committed as a reaction force. A PW, captured by the PF unit, said that there were two enemy battalions in the area. They are believed to have been the 7th and 9th Battalions, 29th Regiment, 325C Division. Friendly units succeeded in inflicting 121 enemy KIA, while capturing 26 individual weapons and apprehending six detainees. Continuous sightings and contacts with enemy forces in close proximity to HUE, indicate that the city remains a major target for offensive operations. In A SHAU Valley, and along Route 547, units in Operation DELAWARE continued to meet light enemy resistance, while destroying enemy ammunition, weapons, vehicles and mis-

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cellaneous supplies. On 30 May, two kilometers northwest of A LOUI (YD 362012), elements of 1/8 Cavalry found an enemy weapons cache, containing 75 road wheels, an undetermined number of pads for tank tracks, 675 rounds of 57mm recoilless rifle ammunition and 16 rounds of 122mm artillery ammunition. On the same day, a previously destroyed PT 76 tank was found at (YC 392969). Documents found at the site identified the 3d Armored Battalion of the 203d Regiment. On 1 May, the 2/3 ARVN Battalion found 10 cases of TNT, five boxes of 50 caliber ammunition and four tons of assorted ammunition at (YC 447909). Also on 1 May, 2/3 found another ammunition cache in a bunker, nine kilometers southeast of A LUOI (YC 449937). Equipment captured included 3,000 rounds of 50 caliber ammunition, two 55 gallon drums of gasoline and two miles of communication wire. The discovery of a tank, tank parts and ammunition, along with previous reports, indicate the enemy may attempt to employ armor in a future offensive in THUA THIEN Province. On 28 April, in the most significant contact of the reporting period, four rifle companies from the 2d Brigade, 101st Abn Division responded to intelligence information and encircled PHOUC YEN Village (YD 6827), northwest of HUE, where an NVA battalion was reportedly entrenched. In four days of heavy fighting, the Airborne Forces killed 269 NVA, taking 105 PW's and capturing 103 weapons. ARVN Black Panther Company, also engaged in the contact, accounted for 102 enemy KIA. Initial interrogation of PW's indicated that the unit in contact was the 8th Battalion, 90th Regiment, 324th Division. The PW's further stated the Battalion CO, XO and three company commanders were KIA and that the battalion was ineffective. The mission of the unit had been to occupy the rural areas northwest and west of HUE.

c. QUANG NAM (P). Enemy activity decreased somewhat during the period. Enemy incidents continued to be concentrated in the southern portion of the DANANG TAOR. He also continued his attempts to harass friendly installations, outposts and to interdict Highway 1. Numerous enemy caches were discovered during the period. On 30 April, D/1/7 captured approximately 2,000 lbs of rice at (AT 949631). On 1 May, B/1/7 found 4,000 lbs of rice at (AT 949638). The enemy continued to avoid large scale contacts, placing his efforts in replenishing supplies for a future offensive. A movement of the 2d NVA Division or other significant enemy forces, capable of posing a major ground threat to the DANANG TAOR, was not detected. Terrorist activity was again noted in DANANG. On 28 April, an unknown number of VC, utilizing an unknown type and size explosive device, killed a National Policeman and destroyed 40 percent of his home. There were several significant ground incidents reported during the week. On 2 May, a 150 man force, from the THOUNG DUC Special Forces

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Camp, contacted a force of enemy reported as being far larger than their own. Gunships were dispatched from I Corps. Two NVA PW's, captured during the first hour of the contact, gave the following information: The enemy unit in contact was the 24th Battalion, 2d NVA Division. The 24th Battalion is a rear service element of the Division Headquarters. On 3 May, 11 kilometers west of HOI AN, the 25th ROK Company, supported by artillery, contacted an unknown number of enemy. The contact resulted in 38 VC KIA, capturing seven IW and two CSW. On 29 April, vicinity (AT 954354), the 1st Recon Team, 1st Marine Division, called in artillery on 117 VC. The artillery fire accounted for 31 VC KIA. Throughout the rest of the province, friendly units accounted for 82 enemy KIA, 11 IW, 37 hand grenades and miscellaneous small arms ammunition captured.

d. QUANG TIN (P). Enemy ground activity and attacks by fire decreased in QUANG TIN (P) during the reporting period, as the enemy continued to avoid large scale contacts. On 28 April, vicinity (BT 168286) and (BT 178281), B/1/1 Cavalry found and destroyed 2,300 lbs of rice. The enemy caches found, in comparison with last week, have decreased. On 1 May, 1/46 Infantry engaged an unknown size enemy force, vicinity (BT 133 075). The friendly forces, supported by gunships, attacked the enemy positions. Contact was broken at 1130 hours. The contact resulted in 27 enemy KIA and seven IW captured. On 28 April, the 85th PF Platoon, in night defensive positions, was attacked by an unknown size enemy force. The friendly unit was supported by artillery fire from the Americal Division. There were two PF's wounded; enemy casualties are unknown. On 2 May, elements of the 931st RF Company, vicinity (BT 305 090), contacted an unknown size enemy force, resulting in 12 VC KIA and two IW captured.

e. QUANG NGAI (P). Enemy activity decreased significantly as the enemy resorted to terrorism during the reporting period. On 1 May, vicinity (BS 585730), an unknown number of VC entered PHU AN Hamlet 2 and HAI BAC Hamlet of TU THUAN (V) and abducted 56 youths, both male and female, forcing each to take along a ten day supply of rice. Enemy forces concentrated their attacks in the DUC PHO TAOR, while enemy activity decreased in the southern portion of the CHU LAI TAOR. The enemy's use of mines and harassing fire also decreased. On 28 April, vicinity (BS 767468), a platoon of the 937th RF Company, in a night defensive position, received a probing attack from an estimated VC battalion, believed to be elements of the 48th MF Battalion and Local Force companies. The enemy succeeded in overrunning a portion of the RF Compound before a reaction force could repulse the attack, inflicting a reported 20 KIA on the enemy. On 1 May, vicinity (BS 672465), C/3/1 found and destroyed an enemy base camp consisting of 30 to 40 huts and adjoining tunnels.

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f. ANALYSIS OF THE ENEMY SITUATION IN ICTZ. Enemy activity is expected to continue in northeastern QUANG TRI Province, as elements of three regiments, subordinate to the 320th Division, attempt to isolate DONG HA Combat Base by interdicting LOC's leading to it. Agent reports during April indicated QUANG TRI City as the target for attacks. Although enemy activity has been at a low level in the immediate area, enemy forces, equivalent to one division, are within twelve hours of the city. Continued isolated small unit contacts and attacks by fire are within the capabilities afforded NVA units in the KHE SANH area. There are no indications of a major effort by NVA forces in the immediate future, although elements of the 304th Division continue to be located west and southwest of KHE SANH, adjacent to the Laotian Border. In THUA THIEN (P), enemy units in the close vicinity of HUE have again conducted limited ground actions and attacks by rocket and mortar. Considering their recent reverses, most notably the loss of one battalion or battalion equivalent, the 8th Battalion, 90th Regiment, food shortages and the friendly control of A SHAU Valley and Route 547, it is unlikely that the known forces in the vicinity will escalate the present action into a major offensive; however, the threat of a swift move against HUE by enemy units within 24 to 48 hours reinforcing distance cannot be discounted. In QUANG NAM (P), the enemy retains the capability of launching major rocket attacks and limited ground sapper attacks anywhere in the DANANG TAOR. Since 27 April 1968, five separate reconnaissance teams have been detected in the DANANG City area; these include members of the V25 Battalion, R20 Battalion, 402d Sapper Battalion and the QUANG NAM Special Sector Committee. The presence of these units indicates a significant enemy interest in friendly installations in the DANANG area, including: Marble Mountain Air Facility, FLC installations, MONKEY Mountain Radar Facility and DANANG Air Base. The enemy forces currently in the GO NOI Island area and in the vicinity south of HOI AN continue to pose a major threat of rocket/mortar and ground attacks to DAI LOC, DIEN BAN, DUY XUYEN, HOI AN and PWMAF positions in the area. In QUANG NGAI (P), enemy activity will probably be limited to harassing attacks by fire and battalion size attacks unless they are reinforced by NVA or other Main Force units. There are no indications of such reinforcements at this time. In QUANG NGAI (P), the enemy capability to launch sustained major activities has been reduced by the destruction or capture of numerous rice and salt caches during the last month. Indications are that enemy recruitment and replacement programs have been low and somewhat ineffective. The enemy appears to be capable of conducting limited battalion size operations and attacks by fire, and will probably continue to resupply within base areas.

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2. ENEMY OPERATIONS DURING THE PERIOD. Enemy initiated incidents decreased compared to the previous week. Incidents consisted of 10 assaults by fire, 134 harassing fire, 51 booby traps and mines, one sabotage and 253 AA fire.

r. Reconnaissance

(1) QUANG TRI (P). In the DONG HA area, there were 98 long range patrols, which reported three contacts and one sighting, totaling 17 NVA moving in no discernable pattern. SAF resulted in one NVA KIA. In the KHE SANH area, 10 patrols reported two findings, two contacts, and two sightings, totaling 66 NVA moving in no discernable pattern. Findings included 400 hand grenades, 16 cases of small arms ammo, four sandbags of SA ammo, one box of shotgun ammo, two mines, 50 60mm rounds, 150 pounds TMT, one sandbag of .50 caliber ammo, one sandbag of blasting caps, one sandbag of mortar fuzes and 20 RPG rounds. Contacts resulted in one NVA KIA. On 29 April, APD Mode One returns revealed moderate to heavy readings in areas bounded by (YD 2835, 2939, 3236, 3535, 3832, 2835). On 1 May, APD Mode One returns revealed heavy readings vicinity (YD 1138, 1139, 1838, 2037, 2437, 4929, 1935).

(2) THUA THIEN (P). In the PHU BAI TAOR, there were 56 long range patrols, which reported seven contacts and four sightings totaling 92 enemy moving generally south to west. Artillery and SAF resulted in 19 enemy KIA. Operation SAMURAI V reported 37 elements deployed, totaling three contacts. Contacts resulted in one enemy KIA and one IW captured. On 3 May, APD Mode One returns revealed moderate to heavy readings in areas bounded by (YD 4006), (ZC 0592) and (YC 7492).

(3) QUANG NAM (P). In the western DANANG TAOR, there

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were 45 patrols, which reported 25 sightings, totaling 267 enemy moving generally north to south. SAF and artillery resulted in 69 enemy KIA and one IW captured. In the southern DANANG TAOR, 35 patrols reported 41 sightings, totaling 998 enemy moving generally north to south. Artillery, air strikes and SAF resulted in 141 enemy KIA, one KBA, 11 structures, one bunker, 100 feet of trenchline destroyed and three bunkers damaged. On 1 May, APD Mode One returns revealed moderate to heavy readings in areas bounded by (ZC 0962-0968) and (AT 8962-8968).

(4) QUANG TIN (P). There were 13 long range patrols deployed by Americal, ROKMC and Special Forces units, which reported negative results.

(5) QUANG NGAI (P). There were seven long range patrols throughout the province, which reported one contact with an unknown number of enemy. The contact resulted in one VC KIA and one IW captured.

5. CAPABILITIES AND VULNERABILITIES. See III MAF PERINTREP 15-68. Based upon a continuing evaluation of the enemy situation, the most probable enemy courses of action in probable order of adoption are considered to be:

a. Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare, to include small scale attacks and ambushes, interdiction of LOC's, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and the use of non-toxic chemical munitions.

b. Attack by fire vital areas and key installations, and/or provide direct support to ground units, with medium and/or heavy mortars, artillery and rockets.

c. Attack the DANANG Combat Base with up to one division, one infantry regiment, one rocket regiment, one probable rocket regiment (-), three separate battalions, one sapper battalion and one probable sapper battalion.

d. Attack QUANG TRI City with up to nine battalions.

e. Attack isolated units and outposts with up to one reinforced regiment.

f. Attack the HUE-PHU BAI area with four regiments, three separate battalions, two sapper battalions, and two probable separate battalions.

g. Attack the KHE SANH area with up to elements of two divisions.

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
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### QUANG TRI ORDER OF BATTLE




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### THUA THIEN ORDER OF BATTLE




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# QUANG NAM ORDER OF BATTLE



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
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# QUANG TIN ORDER OF BATTLE




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# QUANG NGAI ORDER OF BATTLE

1. QUANG TRI (P)

a. PW BUI VAN BINH (AKA NGUYEN HUU TUONG), PFC, FO, 23d Co, 24th Arty Bn, 304th Div, who was captured on 8Apr68 vicinity (XD 795383) (MACTN-HUB, 78-68), stated that the 24th Arty Bn consists of the 21st, 22d, and 23d Btry's, as well as an unidentified Trans Co, with a total strength of 500 men and 22-105mm howitzers. The unit also has about 2,000 rounds in reserve at the present time. The 23d Btry, with a strength of 150, is armed with eight 105mm howitzers. The 21st Arty Btry is located vic (XD 715315), the 22d Arty Btry is located vic (XD 728355), and the 23d Arty Btry is located vic (XD 740410). The 24th Arty Bn CP and the 304th Div CP are located vic (XD 720290) with an attached guard unit of 150 men. Two unidentified Bns of the 325th Div are located vicinity (XD 8036). Nightly, at about 2100 hours, a 20 truck convoy transports rice along Hwy 9 from vicinity (XD 700382) to vicinity (XD 729365), and the empty trucks return to LAOS. Reported personalities are: 23d Btry Cmdr - JrCapt Le Van THIEN, Asst's - 1stLt Nguyen Hon LANG and 2dLt CHUONG, PO - JrCapt Nguyen Hun BAO, APO - 1stLt Do Van HAO.

(G-2 comment: First report of all information (F-6).)

b. PW NGUYEN VAN HI, Pvt, 7th Co, 5th Bn, 2d Regt, 304th Div, who was captured on 12Apr68 vicinity LANG VEI Outpost, QUANG TRI Province (MACTN-HUB 81-68), stated that the 5th Bn consists of the 6th, 7th, 8th and 10th Co's, with a total strength of 500 men. The 7th Co consists of 105 men, with 35 men in the 2d Plt. The 10th Co is the firepower Co and is armed with eight-82mm Mortars, six-K.57 MG's and 12-B.41's. Reported LBN for the 17th Co in NVN was 136750K. The reported AKA for the 7th Co in NVN was K-7. Subject was drafted in THANH HOA Province, and infiltrated south through LAOS with about a 500 man unit aboard trucks. The trucks dropped the personnel near the SVN-LAOS border, and from there, the infiltration group continued on foot. The subject stated that the 2d Co area of operation was vic of LANG VEI. Subject's Co lost about 50 men in a B-52 strike. Reported personalities are: 2d Regt CO - LtCol LE QUANG PHE; 5th Bn CO - Sub Capt MINH, PO - SubCapt SAN, 7th Co Cmdr - 1stLt MUI.

(G-2 comment: First report of all information (F-6). Based on reported location of capture, dates, and composition of the Bn, it is highly probable that the FW belongs to the 7th Co, 5th Bn, 24th Regt, 304th Div.)

c. PW LE XUAN VAN, 16th Co, 52d Regt, 320th Div, who was captured on 29Mar68, vic VINH QUANG THUONG (V) (Coordinates not available), GIO LINH District (I Corps CIC, Nr 231-68), stated that the 320th Division consists of the 48th, 52d and 64th Regts. The 52d Regt consists of the 4th, 5th and 6th Bn's with a total strength of 2300. Each of the Bn's

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of the 52d Regt has a reported strength of about 600 men. The support elements of the 52d Regt consist of: The 13th Recon Co, 14th AA Co (12.7mm), 15th Mort Co, 16th 82mm RG Co, an unk 17th Co, 18th Signal Co, 19th Engr Co, and the 20th Med Co. The source heard that the 48th Regt and the 320th Division Hq are located in CAM LO District, QUANG TRI (P). The 52d Regt was to operate in GIO LINH (D), while the 48th and 64th Regt were to operate vic CAM LO. While in GIO LINH (D), subject reported meeting four men from the 270th Regt who stated they were en route to HUE City. Reported personalities are: 320th Div CO - Col SUNG LAM, PO - Col LUY TUAN KHANG; 52d Regt CO - Maj TRAN PHU VI, PO - MAJ TRAN PHONG; 16th Co Cmdr - 2dLt HOANG VAN HOI, XO - 2dLt QUACH DUY XA, PO - 1stLt NGUYEN TIEN DUNG, APO - MSgt HA VAN BA.

(G-2 comment: First report of 16th Co personalities (F-6). Div and Regt personalities are generally consistent with current OOB holdings (F-3). Regimental and division locations, as well as support elements' designations, are in agreement with other intelligence reports (F-3).)

d. PW PHAN THANH BINH, MSgt, 1stCo, 5th Bn, BACH DANG Regt, 320th Div, who was captured on 24Apr68 vic (YD 134713) (7th ITT, 101-68, Nr 241833Z), stated that he was a member of a nine man recon squad sent to reconnoiter artillery fire damage, OP's and configuration of wire around CON THIEN. According to the PW the mission of the 5th Battalion was to have been an attack on CON THIEN on the night of 28April. The reported base area of the 5th Bn is vicinity (YD 103878), and its area of operation is around CON THIEN. The 320th Div is reportedly deployed between KHE SANH and GIO LINH. An unidentified Bn is to conduct an attack on DOC SOI (date unknown, coordinates not available). The 324th Div is in the vicinity of HUE City preparing for attack. Subject added that there was a concentration of 105mm and 182mm artillery in the vicinity of VINH THUY (Hill 74) (YD 108849) to (YD 118844) on the forward slope. The reported LBN for the 1st Co, HA TINH Provincial Forces is 31108 KT. PW also states that he has heard of a new type of artillery round, used primarily for the destruction of perimeter wire barriers. Reported personalities are: 5th Bn CO - Capt TIEN; 1st Co Cmdr - 1stLt CU, XO - 2dLt LIEU, PO - TUYET.

(G-2 comment: First report of the AKA "BACH DANG Regt", the reported anti-defensive wire shell, 182mm Arty, all personalities, the deployment of the 320th Div as far west as KHE SANH, the preparation of the 324th Div for another attack on HUE, the location of massed artillery vicinity Hill 74 and the reported LBN (F-6). It is possible that the referenced BACH DANG Regt is the 52d Regt of the 320th Div.)

e. PW NGUYEN VAN THANH, Asst Plt Ldr, 1st Co, 7th Bn, 3d Regt, 304th Division, who was captured on 9Apr68 (XD 8139) (MACTN-HUB, 80-68), stated that the 304th Division consists of three Infantry Regts (U.1, U.2, U.3), and Hq Regt (U.4). The 1st (AKA U.1, E.1) Regt consists of Bn's T.1, T.2 and T.3, located vicinity KHE SANH. The 2nd (AKA U.2, E.2) Regt consists of Bn's T.4, T.5 and T.6, located vic KHE SANH and HUONG HOA. The 3d (AKA U.3, E.3) Regt consists of

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Bn's T.7, T.8, and T.9 located northwest of LANG VEI (XD 7639). The 304th Div Hq consists of special units and a Guard Co, located vic (XD 7141). The 7th Bn of the 3d Regt, 304th Div (with a strength of 350) consists of three infantry, one support and one rear service companies located vic of (XD 780415). The 304th Div left THANH HOA Province in early Nov 67 and arrived in LAOS, west of KHE SANH, on or about 20Feb68. The 1st Regt moved across the border in early March to reinforce the 325th Division. In mid-March the other two Regts and the Div Hq moved across the XE PON River and located vic of HUONG HOA (D). Reported personalities are: Div CO - Col DUNG, C of S - JrCol HOP, FGPO - Col DAN.

(G-2 comment: First report of all personalities, reported locations, the Bn designations, and a 4th Regt comprised of support elements (F-6). Information on infiltration, and that pertaining to the 7th Bn, is generally consistent with current OOB holdings (F-3). It is probable that subject is a member of the 66th Regt, 304th Div.)

f. PW PHAN THAN BINH, MSgt, DPOC - 24Apr68 vic (YD 134713) (7th ITT, 101A-68 #260207X) stated that he was from the 1st Plt, 15th Co, 27th Independent Regt. 27th Regt LBN is 31582 XB. The Regt is composed of the 2nd and 3d Bns, and Companies 14, 15, 18 and 19. Each Bn consists of three infantry Co's as well as a mortar/MG Co. The PW thinks each company has a strength of about 120 men. The 14th Co is a Medical Co, the 15th Co is Recon, 18th Co is Logistics and the 19th Co is Engineer. The 15th Co has three platoons with about 30 men each. The Regt, whose base area is vic (XD 989922), is reportedly independent and receives orders from HANOI. The Bn area of operations is QUANG TRI Province from CON THIEN to the coast. The Regt has a rendezvous point vic (XD 991682). The subject's reported mission was to recon the CON THIEN area (perimeter), in preparation for attack on 28Apr68. The 15th Co mission was to provide recon support for the 2nd and 3d Bn's. The 2nd Bn has the mission of attacking CON THIEN after a heavy artillery barrage. The barrage is to be followed by an infantry attack from all four sides. Reported personalities are: Regt C of S - Capt TIEM; 15th Co Cmdr - 1stLt CU, XO - 2ndLt LIEU, PO - TUYET.

(G-2 comment: First report of all personalities, reported composition and deployment of the 27th Regt (F-6). According to the interrogator, PW lied extensively during the initial interrogation concerning parent organization and composition. It is still possible the PW is either lying to some extent or holding back information. III MAF concurs with the interrogator in that information gained should be used with caution.)

g. Composite report of information furnished by PW's NGUYEN CAU HUYEN, 10th Plt, 7th Co, 4th Bn, BAO VE THU DO Regt; XUI VAN THIEN, 16th Plt, 8th Co, 4th Bn, BAO VE THU DO Regt; PHAM QUOC LONG, 11th Plt, 7th Co, 4th Bn, 4002nd Regt (AKA 7th GRP, K.18); and LE VAN HY, 10th Plt, 7th Co, 4th Bn, BAO VE THU DO Regt, who were captured on 25Apr68 vic (YD 365422) (191st MI Det, 191-77-68, #2501052). PW's

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stated that they infiltrated with Group D 4002 (entire Regt). The reported destination was BAC DO and the regimental AKA is "Defend the Capital". This is reportedly an independent Regt that defended HANOI. The Regt is said to be composed of the 2nd, 4th and 6th Bn's. The 6th Bn left NVN during Jan68, the 4th on 9Feb68, and the 2nd on 11Feb68. The units arrived in LAOS in mid-March 68, entered SVN in the vicinity of National Route #9, and arrived at an undesignated station in the QUANG TRI jungle about 22Apr68. There, all the weapons were collected and turned in, and the cadre was changed (down to Platoon Leader level). On the 23d of April the 5th and 6th Co's went on a rice collecting mission in HAI LAM (V), HAI LANG (D). The 7th and 8th Companies were sent to pick up weapons and ammo in QUANG HA (CNA). After leaving NVN subject did not see the other two Bn's; however, he was told they were in the same area in SVN. Reported LBN's in NVN were 55.115 KP and 5508 KG. The 6th Bn strength is about 600, with 130 men per company. Subjects stated that the infiltration group was to furnish replacements for 82nd Group or Division, or the 7th Front; reinforce an unidentified unit to attack Hwy #1 in May.

(G-2 comment: First report of all information (F-6). It is possible that the reported replacements are for elements of the 9th, 812th or 5th Regt's, or for any unit currently operating vicinity of the HAI LANG National Forest Area, coastal plains and/or the TRIEU PHONG Coastal Plains.).

h. Rallier PHAM HONG THANH, who rallied on 15Apr68, vic (YD 467466) (MACTN-HUE, 76-68), from the Rear Service Section of the 9th Front, stated that the 9th Front consists of the K.8 Bn, K.14 Bn, 10th Sapper Unit, C2 and C22 Transportation Groups and a C.33 Sapper Co (located vic (YD 2537)). The K.8, K.14, and one company of the K.18 Bn are currently operating in the lowlands of TRIEU PHONG and HAI LANG Districts. A K.6 Bn is operating in HAI KINH (V), HAI LANG (D). The Rear Service Section of the 9th Front, is located vic (YD 2933). The VC/NVA forces were to collect rice during the period 13-23Apr68. All the units of the 9th Front are to furnish transportation for the collected rice. Reported personalities are: Rear Service Section of the 9th Front, Section Chief - Maj KHAM, Asst - Capt VU BAO, Asst, Capt LE DUONG; Quartermaster Subsection Leader - 1stLt TONG VIET VU.

(G-2 comment: First report of C2 and C22 Trans Co and a C.33 Sapper Co subordinate to the 9th Front (F-6). Personalities generally consistent with those previously reported for the 7th Front (F-3). It is possible that the 9th Front mentioned in the report is in fact the 7th Front.)

i. PW VU VAN NGUYEN, of the 8th Co, 5th Bn, 2nd Regt, 304th Div, who was captured on 29Apr68 vic (XD 828321) (3d ITT, ST 2-4-3-68 #291649Z and 7th ITT 103-68 #291620Z), stated that the 5th Bn consists of three companies: The 6th (AKA K6), the 7th (AKA K-7), and the 8th (AKA K-8). The 6th Company strength is normally 100, but has been reduced to 37. The Bn operating area is vicinity of (XD 850388) to vicinity of capture (XD 828321). Subject also stated that the force

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which attacked D/2/3, 1st Air Cav Div, was comprised of 15 men from each of the Co's of the 5th Bn, and also men from the K40 Recon Co. The PW indicated that his unit has suffered extensive casualties, and has not received replacements since arrival in SVN. The 1st and 3d Regts, 304th Div are resting at Station 30A, near the XE PON River. The 6th Bn of the 2nd Regt was reportedly operating in the vicinity of HUE, and the 4th Bn, at an unknown location, vicinity HUONG HOA (D). Subject remembers seeing two negro prisoners at LANG VEI (date unk). Reported personalities are: 2nd Regt CO - TAMK; 5th Bn CO - NGUYEN VAN NGUYEN, XO - NGUYEN TIN, PO - NGUYEN SAHF; 6th Co Cmdr - 2ndLt NGUYEN VAN BAI, XO - WO LINH, PO - NGUYEN VAN TRIEN.

(G-2 comment: First report of all information reported (F-6). It is probable that the 2nd Regt referenced in the report is the 24th Regt of the 304th Division.)

j. Notebook maintained by VA MANH HUNG, Cadre of the 5th Co, (Parent unit unspecified) captured vic (YD 268679) (CDEC, Bul 11,888 Batch No 04-3134-68), with entries dated 20Nov67-28Mar68, contained undated notes taken from a resolution passed by the Regt Party Committee. The resolution relates that the Regt had to penetrate DIEN HAU (CNA) in order to replace the 324.204Regt (sic). The Regt would operate independently in the northern area of QUANG TRI Province. Its mission is to annihilate an important part of FWMAF/RVNAF with emphasis placed on annihilation of DONG HA and BA LONG, and support local forces in the suppression to expand the people's war.

(G-2 comment: First report of all information (F-6). The reference 324.204 could be an indication that the 204th Arty Regt, (accepted in NVA OOB), which has been previously reported in the vicinity of the DMZ, may be operating in support of, or subordinate to the 324B Div.)

k. Rallier NGUYEN SY BO, of the K7 Bn, 320th (AKA 209th) Regt, who rallied 20Apr68 to 2/35 Inf Fire Base (YA 939915) (4th MI Det, 4th Inf Div, 437) stated that his Regt infiltrated south with the 141st Regt, and that the 141st Regt was dropped off vicinity of KHE SANH. Subject also stated that the 165th Regt was to join them there at an unknown date in the near future.

(G-2 comment: First report of all information (F-6). The reported 209th, 165th and 141st Regt's are accepted as subordinate to the 312th Div, (carried as confirmed in NVA OOB, and last known location - (WJ 8969), PHU YEN (D), THAI NGUYEN Province, MR VIET BAC (1965). Units referred to by rallier are possible replacements for the 304th Div, known to be operating in the vicinity of KHE SANH.)

## 2. THUA THIEN (P)

a. PW DANG XUAN QUYNH, 3d Co/K4C Bn, (Project Delta Inter Rpt, DTG 251345Z) infiltrated SVN in Nov 67 with the 9th Infil Gp, which

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consisted of 700 men. K4C Bn consists of the 1st, 2d, 3d Inf Co's and 5th Combat Support Co. Approximate strength of the Bn is 500. Bn Hq's and 5th Co are located on the upper slopes of DONG TRUOI Mountain, approximately two hours march from 3d Co. The 1st Co is located on the northern slope of the mountain, 3d Co on the eastern slope about 30 minutes walk from the summit, and the 2d Co in the CAU HAI/NUOC NGOC area vic (XC 1599). K4C's mission is to interdict and sabotage traffic on Route 1. Bn Co is Capt NGUYEN VAN TOT. The Bn has four 82mm mort. Each squad has one B.40 rocket launcher. His Co had two 12.7mm AA MG, but lost them. The Bn has one 15 watt radio. Subject died of shock from his wounds.

(G-2 comment: First report of personality (F-6). Other information consistent with current OOB holdings (F-2).

b. PW's THRUONG VAN PHO and CAU KHAC XUAN were captured at (ZD 095005) on 25 April 68 by PF's of PHU LOC (D) (1st ARVN INF DIV MSG 270230Z Apr68). PW's stated that on 24 Apr 68 the 2nd and 4th Co's, K4B Bn, were gathering rice at (ZC 103998, ZD 095005, ZC 097997). On 11Apr68, the K4B Bn received 100 replacements from NVN. The K4B Bn was to coordinate with sapper, recon and engineer units to attack BACH MA Special Sector and PHU LOC (D) Hq, during the holidays of 1, 7 and 19 May 68.

(G-2 Comment: Location of K4B Bn is the same as given by PW DANG XUAN QUYNH from the K4C Bn who was captured on 24Apr68 (F-2). Other information cannot be confirmed (F-6).)

3. QUANG NAM (P). No significant reports.

4. QUANG TIN (P). No significant reports.

5. QUANG NGAI (P)

a. Returnee HUYNH XUAN, Squad Leader of Recon Squad, 83d LF Bn (AKA 38th Bn) (AMERICAL INTSUM #121-68) stated that the Bn was equipped with two 82mm mortars, two 60mm mortars, and two 30 cal MG's. The MG's were not used because the Bn has no one with the necessary training to fire the guns. Source stated the Bn at present has 200 men and it is to coordinate with the 81st Bn and an unidentified Sapper Co of the 507 LF Bn for attacks on CAH DAI Refugee Camp and on ARVN outposts on 4 May 1968.

(G-2 comment: First report of all information (F-6).)

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ANNEX C (COUNTERINTELLIGENCE) TO III MAF PERINTREP NO. 18-68

1. GENERAL. During the reporting period, VC activity of a counterintelligence interest increased slightly over that of the preceding week. Items of interest include a report that 12 VC entered a village and abducted nine civilians; a report that two VC sappers, disguised as school-boys, are presently operating in the vicinity of Truong Le (H) in an attempt to collect information on the allied situation; and a report that VC terrorists operating in Hue City, are poisoning food in local cafes and restaurants in an effort to instill fear in the local populace.

2. ESPIONAGE.

QUANG TRI. A report dated 24 April, related that the VC Women's Executive Section of Hai Lang (D) has been tasked to deploy their low level agents in a network throughout the district to collect information on allied military activities and installations. The Cu Hoan (H) area of Hai Thien (V) has been a prime target of the female espionage agents during recent days.

A 24 April report from an intelligence source disclosed that the VC Quang Ha Town committee has ordered a number of its agents to compile extensive lists, revealing the names and addresses of GVN cadre and officials, and ARVN officers presently residing in the Dong Ha Town area. The enemy's agents have also been tasked to collect information on the ARVN and U.S. military installations in the area.

A report dated 26 April, disclosed the primary objectives of VC espionage activity in Hai Lang (D). The order stressed the importance of obtaining any information relating to U.S./ARVN tactics utilized against the VC/NVA forces, so that proper countermeasures could be devised to aid in future enemy offensive operations in the area. Enemy agents were further instructed to compile lists containing the names and residences of high ranking GVN officials working in the public security, police, and intelligence agencies, courts, and political parties.

A 27 April report from the 525th MI Group indicated that on 25 April, several members of two VC Battalions reportedly deployed at Phuong Thuy (V) (YD 246462) and Thuong Phuoc (V) (YD 305487), coordinated with members of a local guerrilla company in an effort to obtain information on friendly forces presently deployed at Ai Tu Airbase. Information obtained would be used to aid enemy offensive operations planned for the near future.

THUA THIEN. A 26 April report from an intelligence source related that during mid-April, a detachment of the VC Municipal Special Operations Unit of Hue City moved to the plains area of Quang Dien (D) to serve as a base from which clandestine operations would be launched into

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Huong Tra (D), particularly the Bai Dau area (YD 768250). The detachment, which is divided into three squads, has the mission of obtaining a timely account of ARVN/U.S. military activities, particularly of a logistical nature. The first squad was reported to be operating at An Xuan (H) (YD 730330), and the second squad at My Xa (H) (YD 723313). The operating zone of the 3rd squad was not revealed.

A 30 April report from the 525th MI Group disclosed that the VC have recently trained a number of beautiful, english speaking, female cadre in politics and military transportation, and are now sending them into those areas occupied by FWMAF to collect information and demoralize the troops. They have been instructed to obtain odd jobs or open businesses where they might come into close contact with allied servicemen.

QUANG NAM. A report dated 20 April disclosed that during recent days, two members of a VC sapper cell operating in the vicinity of Trung Le (H), Hoi An (V), have disguised themselves as schoolboys in an effort to collect information on the GVN military bases in the immediate vicinity, particularly the 27th RD Team. The two agents have also been tasked to draw sketches of these base areas.

3. SABOTAGE. The following acts of sabotage were reported:

4. POLITICAL. There were no reports of VC political activity during the reporting period.

5. PROPAGANDA.

QUANG TRI. A 27 April report from the 525th MI Group revealed that a number of local cadre and a sapper cell presently operating in the vicinity of Xom Linh (H) (YD 326527), Nhon Bieu (V) went from house to house spreading propaganda and forcing each family to pay both a monetary and a rice tax for their support. Those refusing to aid the VC, were confronted with threats of being sent away for a reformation and indoctrination course.

A 29 April report from the 525th MI Group revealed that on 27 April, an unidentified enemy unit of approximately 450 men, had dispersed within the homes of the local inhabitants of Thang Huong (V) (YD 540843).

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It was reported that the enemy troops were spreading propaganda among the villagers telling them that Quang Tri (P) would be the scene of a great battle in the coming days; and if they have any relatives in Quang Tri (P), they should be warned to move south into Thua Thien (P).

A 29 April report from the 1st Air Cavalry Division disclosed that during the early morning hours of 29 April, elements of "B" Company, 2ndBn/12th Cavalry deployed at (YD 3842), heard an enemy propaganda broadcast from a public address system set up in the immediate vicinity. The enemy propagandists began by repeating the message "GI-Go Home" for approximately 45 minutes which was then followed by a continual questioning, "GI, why are you in Vietnam?" Friendly forces in the area appropriately answered with artillery fire, after which all broadcasting ceased.

QUANG TIN. A report dated 28 April, related that on 23 April, five VC District cadre and the VC self-administration section of Ky-An (V), Tam Ky (D), held a five day indoctrination course at Tinh Thuy (H) (BT 345296) for those persons, having relatives that work for the GVN. The VC forced each person attending the course, to sign a "guarantee paper" saying they would support the enemy's political struggle.

#### 6. MISCELLANEOUS.

QUANG TRI. A 25 April report from another U.S. intelligence agency indicated that on the night of 18 April, the VC cadre and local guerrilla unit of Cam Phong (H), Cam Lo (D), compelled a number of the local inhabitants between 15 and 45 years old to participate in a 10 day long "coolie mission" transporting weapons and supplies for the enemy. The destination of the transportation group was not revealed.

A 27 April report from the 525th MI Group related that elements of two unidentified NVA Battalions presently deployed in the Nhy Le Village area (YD 310480), forced the women of the village to dig trenches, and the men to transport supplies for them. It was further reported that the NVA have threatened to use the people of the village as human shields for protection during future attacks against U.S. troops stationed in Nhu Lee area.

THUA THIEN. A 23 April report from the 525th MI Group, disclosed that VC terrorist in Hue City are using the threat of death to friends and relatives captured during the Tet Offensive to gain support of the population. To increase the impact of their threats, the VC have poisoned food in local cafes and restaurants. The report indicated that one police official had died as a result of the poisoning. The report further revealed that the terrorist are attempting to levy taxes by threatening the destruction of churches and homes during a second

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offensive.

QUANG NAM. A 25 April report from I Corps indicated that during the early morning hours of 25 April, a grenade was thrown into the Phan's Coffee Shop located on Hung Vuong Street, Danang City, resulting in only slight damage to the coffee shop. The perpetrator of the incident was not identified.

A 25 April intelligence report disclosed that the VC of Danang City, are plotting to assassinate leaders of political parties and religious sects, in an attempt to undermine GVN authority by accusing the government of committing the terrorist acts. The enemy's objective is to create social unrest by inciting the masses to riot against the government. The same report related that the VC captured a number of prostitutes, when the girls left Danang City and returned to their native villages for the Tet holiday. The girls were forced to attend a military proselyting course after which they were released to operate in Danang City. Specific locations and identities were not revealed.

A 25 April report from another U.S. intelligence agency related that a staff member of the Primary Education Service in Danang City, was shot by an assassin while riding his motorcycle near his home. The official subsequently died as a result of the wound. The terrorist is still at large.

A 25 April report from the 1stBn, 525th MI Group, disclosed that the VC held an indoctrination course teaching low level female cadre the arts of military proselyting, in Phong Thu (H) (AT 979570), Dien Ban (D) during the later part of March 1968. After the course, the girls were sent to the GVN controlled areas, where they have the mission of motivating ARVN/Allied servicemen to desert and defect to the VC.

A 26 April report from the 1stBn, 525th MI Group related that on 23 April, a VC suicide platoon took an oath at An Son (H) (BS 562636) to liberate prisoners, assassinate allied cadre, and sabotage RVN and U.S. installations and offices within Quang Ngai City. Members of the platoon will disguise themselves as field police (green uniforms and black berets with silver emblems) to carry out their mission.

A report dated 27 April, indicated that a group of 12 VC from Thach Ban Camp, infiltrated the workers area of the An Hoa complex (AT 890476) and abducted nine civilians. The abductees were forced to accompany the VC as civilian laborers.

A 29 April report from I Corps disclosed that during the early morning hours of 28 April, a number of enemy terrorists detonated a satchel charge under the home of a National Police agent, located in the eastern portion of Danang City. The agent was killed and his house

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was 40 percent destroyed as a result of the explosion.

A 30 April report from I Corps disclosed that a civilian bus detonated a pressure type mine, while traveling on Highway #1 in the vicinity of (BT 177584). Six civilians were wounded and the bus was destroyed from the resulting explosion.

QUANG TIN. A 27 April report from an intelligence source revealed that the VC of Thang Binh (D) are organizing assassination cells, which will be sent to the densely populated areas of the district to coordinate with the local infrastructure in an effort to assassinate GVN cadre and officials. The assassins will be disguised as ARVN servicemen or civilians and armed with pistols and daggers to carry out their mission.

A report dated 28 April, indicated that on the night of 24 April, the VC cadre of Ky An (V), organized a meeting for approximately 300 villagers at Tam Phu (H) (BT 204235). The villagers were told that approximately 200 laborers must be mobilized by 26 April to support the VC on the battlefield for approximately 45 days.

QUANG NGAI. A 26 April report from the III Marine Amphibious Force indicated that on the night of 25 April, approximately 50 VC entered a refugee camp located in the vicinity of (BS 801395) and ordered the inhabitants to leave the camp and return to their native homes. Before leaving the terrorists destroyed 16 homes belonging to RVN officials, with C-4 explosive devices. The VC wore U.S. fatigues, and some were armed with M-16 rifles.

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
