




1. GENERAL ENEMY SITUATION. The general level of enemy activity in I Corps Tactical Zone during the week ending 15 March was below that of the preceding week, with marked reductions in rounds of incoming received and harassing fire incidents as well as kidnappings and assassinations. Enemy activity was polarized in QUANG TRI and QUANG NGAI Provinces, with relatively little activity in THUA THIEN, QUANG NAM and QUANG TIN Provinces.

Throughout ICTZ the enemy continued to avoid major ground contacts while maintaining positions within striking distance of major population centers and friendly installations. Statements of PW's and reports of agents continued to indicate the enemy's intention to pursue a course of renewed offensive activity in his "Winter-Spring" campaign, with attacks expected to occur prior to the end of the month.


Counterintelligence-related and VCI activity declined appreciably in the I Corps area this past week. Significant declines were seen in reported sabotage as well as previously mentioned assassinations and kidnapping incidents. Although only two local sabotage incidents occurred, the enemy's interest in the DANANG-HUE railroad and the CUA VIET River continued to be manifested. VCI propaganda activities were concerned with discrediting imminent GVN elections, attempts to solicit popular support for VC policies, organization of anti-GVN demonstrations and petitions to GVN and ARVN personnel to return to the VC cause. Intense interest and activity against GVN pacification elements continues to be noted.

a. QUANG TRI (P). The tempo of enemy initiated activity in QUANG TRI (P) remained at or about the same level during the week of 9-15 March as that experienced during the preceding week of 2-8 March. However, emphasis shifted from the southern portion of the province to the B-5 FRONT area between the DMZ and doute 9 where several significant incidents were recorded.

Aerial observers, ground observation posts and electronic surveillance equipment continued to detect the presence of enemy forces in the eastern DMZ throughout the period. Sightings/incidents increased in number this week from 166 to 230 despite the fact that adverse weather conditions hampered reconnaissance of the demilitarized zone. Of these









230 sightings/incidents, 128 were recorded north of the BAN HAI River.

Allied installations and tactical units in the northeastern portion of the province were the recipients of additional enemy mortar and rocket attacks during the week, some of which emanated from firing positions within the DMZ. One such instance was a barrage of approximately fifteen mixed 122/140mm rockets fired at 1st AMTRAC Battalion positions at the CUA VIET Port Facility near the mouth of the CUA VIET River (YD 348 694) on 15 March. While there were no U.S. casualties, nevertheless, some of the rounds impacted in a village on the north side of the river (YD 338702), killing one Vietnamese civilian and wounding six others. During the same time frame, three additional rockets impacted at "OCEAN-VIEW" (YD 291751) between the mouth of the CUA VIET and the DMZ, but failed to produce any casualties or damage.


Simultaneously, a friendly patrol operating in the northeastern corner of the province observed the enemy firing positions approximately seven kilometers northeast of GIO LINH (YD 267762/YD 255782). The patrol moved to investigate and was engaged short of the rocket positions by an unknown size enemy force. A reaction platoon from the 1st AMTRAC Battalion reinforced the patrol. Ten NVA were killed and two PW's captured in the contact which failed to produce any friendly casualties.

While one of these two PW's was seriously wounded and could not be interrogated, the second prisoner initially identified his unit as the 2nd Battalion, 25th Regiment, a unit not currently held in III MAF order of battle listings. However, information gleaned from the PW plus documents captured at the scene of the contact raises the possibility that this individual may be a member of the 84th NVA Artillery Regiment, a unit presently held in the VINH LINH Special Zone of NVN.

The northeastern portion of the province was also the stage setting for a significant ground attack during the latter part of the reporting period. This particular encounter occurred five kilometers southeast of GIO LINH (YD 257715) at the ARVN B-2 Base where a company of the 2nd Battalion, 2nd ARVN Regiment was attacked by a platoon of enemy sappers during the early morning hours of 13 March. The unidentified sapper unit sustained only four confirmed KIA's while inflicting heavy casualties on the ARVN company. Inasmuch as elements of the 31st Group have recently been operating in this area, as evidenced by the capture of a PW from the 27th Independent Battalion, five kilometers southwest of GIO LINH (YD 172706) on 3 March, it is likely that elements of this major enemy force were involved in the attack on the ARVN position.

Probable elements of the 126th Naval Sapper Regiment were persistent in their efforts to interdict the vital CUA VIET River during the week. Task Force CLEARWATER patrol craft had several contacts with small groups of enemy, both in the water and along the banks of the river. One potential mining incident as preempted by the capture and subsequent neutralization of a 75 pound basket pressure type mine six kilometers northeast







of DONG HA on 10 March (YD 277657).

Elsewhere along the B-5 FRONT, elements of the 4th Marine Regiment continued to encounter light to moderate resistance from squad to company size enemy forces operating in the northwest quadrant of QUANG TRI (P) throughout the week. Snemy efforts in this region were highlighted on 13 March when M/3/4 Marines, in position 6.5 kilometers northwest of the ROCKPILE at LZ SIERRA (XD 945624), received a series of light mortar and rocket attacks, followed early the next morning by a determined ground attack conducted by an estimated enemy company. The enemy effected a slight penetration of the Marine perimeter which was quickly restored before the enemy launched a dawn counterattack. This second assault was repulsed and the attackers subsequently withdrew. Bad weather temporarily prohibited reinforcement and delayed resupply and evacuation of casualties. Fighting continued throughout the morning of lh March with a CH-46 helicopter crashing and burning when hit by grenade fire while lifting off from the Marine LZ. The enemy sustained 26 KIA's in this encounter while the Marines suffered moderate casualties.


Of particular significance with respect to this contact was the capture of a PW in the same general area (XD 946630) on the afternoon of L4 March. This PW identified his unit as the 1st Battalion, 246th NVA Regiment and stated that two companies of his battalion plus the 3rd Battalion were in the general area of capture while the 2nd Battalion was in the KHE SANH area. The capture of this prisoner thus confirms the presence of the 246th Regiment in northwestern QUANG TRI Province and marks the first contact with this major enemy force since elements of the regiment were engaged in the KHE SANH area (XD 8637) on 27 June 1968.

Noteworthy in the western extremities of the province was the 9 March discovery by a 3rd Marine Division reconnaissance team of a battalion size bunker complex along the Laotian border near the LAO BAO Pass (XD 712394). The complex, which appeared to have been used during the past two months, consisted of 60 bunkers with adjoining hootches. A weapons cache was discovered within the complex, the details of which are set forth in paragraph 2.s. of this report.

South of KHE SANH, Route 926 (616) remained the subject of continuing interest in QUANG TRI (P) during the reporting period. Throughout the week Marine reconnaissance teams manning observation posts overlooking this key enemy LOC continued to report considerable vehicular traffic including both trucks and tracked vehicles. Whereas the majority of traffic on Route 926 during the preceding week was reported to have been moving in a westerly direction, vehicular traffic this past week was reported moving both east and west. However, most recent reports indicate that loaded vehicles are moving eastward in apparent contradiction of earlier reports. Meaningful interpretation of these reports hinges upon debriefing of the reconnaissance teams involved.







Of significance with respect to Operation DEWEY CANYON was the capture of a PW five kilometers south of FSB ERSKINE (YD 225043) by A/1/9 Marines during a light engagement on 13 March. Initial interrogation of this prisoner revealed that he was a member of the C-25 Company, 18th Battalion, 6th NVA Regiment. The PW stated that the mission of his unit was to guard a road in the area of capture - - probably Route 922 - - and that the 16th and 17th Battalions were in the A LUOI area. Correlation of the information provided by this PW with III MAF order of battle listings tends to indicate that the PW is more likely a member of the 9th NVA Regiment rather than the 6th NVA Regiment.

The week of 9-15 March produced additional intelligence information indicating NVA/VC plans for future offensive activity in the QUANG TRI City area in conjunction with the second and third phases of the post-TET offensive. Two PW's, recently captured in separate incidents north and south of QUANG TRI City, both indicated that the QUANG TRI provincial capital was targeted for future attacks. However, no specific dates for the commencement of these attacks were given.

b. THUA THIEN (P). The tempo of enemy initiated activity in THUA THIEN (P) remained relatively unchanged during the past week as most major enemy combat units avoided ground engagements with ARVN/FWMAF. Contacts were scattered and desultory while the enemy relied on light harassing mortar and rocket attacks to maintain a token degree of pressure of friendly forces.

The majority of attacks by fire were of low intensity and ranged from HUE south to the PHU LOC area. The THUA THIEN provincial capital received two light rocket attacks on 10 and 15 March, totaling approximately 10 rounds of incoming 122mm rocket fire. However, casualties as a result of these two attacks were light while property damage was negligible.

The only significant ground engagement in THUA THIEN (P) during the week occurred east of the A SHAU Valley along Route 547 on 13 March when elements of C/1/602nd Airborne Infantry made contact with an estimated enemy company upon being heli-landed at LZ VEGHEL (YD 550035), 29 kilometers couthwest of HUE. The enemy force was dug in and bad weather





at the time of contact precluded reinforcements. However, both sides sustained only light casualties as a result of the encounter.

Of significance with respect to this engagement is the fact that documents taken off the enemy bodies identified the enemy unit in contact as the 11th Company, 816th Battalion, 9th NVA Regiment. Information provided by these documents also tends to support the testimony of a PW captured nine kilometers southeast of FSB ERSKINE by A/1/9 Marines on 13 March (see paragraph 1.a of this report) who stated that the 16th and 17th Battalions of his unit, also believed to be the 9th NVA Regiment, are in the vicinity of the A SHAU Valley.

One major sabotage incident was recorded in THUA THIEN (P) during the week when enemy frogmen employed an estimated 50-100 pound explosive charge to destroy a bridge on the DANANG-HUE railroad, six kilometers southeast of PHU BAI (YD 926103). Estimated time of repair of the bridge is three weeks.

on 12 March, elements of 2/327th Airborne Infantry captured a PW approximately six kilometers south of PHU BAI (YD 922102). The PW, on a rice gathering mission, was identified as a member of the K-4 Battalion, 5th NVA Regiment, thus confirming the continued presence of this unit in its normal operating area. Statements by the PW that morale in his unit is low due to lack of supplies tends to reinforce other similar reports that the 5th NVA Regiment is currently suffering shortages of supplies and low morale.

c. QUANG NAM (P). For the second consecutive week, attention in QUANG NAM Province was again focused on the AN HOA area where enemy forces continued to exert moderate pressure against the AN HOA Combat Base.

Throughout the week, this key installation and its environs continued to receive frequent attacks by fire consisting of light to moderate amounts of incoming rockets and mortar rounds. In addition, several ground probes were reported in the area.

Noteworthy were the enemy's efforts of 10 March when AN HOA Combat Base sustained two attacks by fire during an eight hour period consisting of 26 rounds of 122mm rockets and 42 rounds of 82mm mortar fire. The mortar attack was followed by a light ground probe in which five enemy briefly penetrated the perimeter. Several vehicles were damaged and at least two structures destroyed by incoming fires while friendly forces suffered light to moderate casualties.

Marine combat units operating in close proximity to AN HOA found themselves engaged in frequent contacts during the week on all land quadrants surrounding the Combat Base. Identification of the enemy force exerting pressure against the AN HOA area was revealed on 7 March when elements of I/3/26 Marines captured a PW three kilometers north-



east of AN HCA (AT 851480) from the 60th Battalion, 1st VC Regiment, 2nd NVA Division, thus marking the first appearance of elements of this major enemy unit in the current offensive.

Elsewhere in the southern DANANG TAOR, ground contacts were sporadic and small-scale in nature and were widely scattered in normal areas of previous engagements. Elements of the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade killed several enemy while conducting search and clear operations in their TAOR in the HOI AN area.

of significance with respect to ROK Marine operations this past week was the 11 March capture of a PW seven kilometers northwest of HCI AN (BT 103629) who was identified as a member of the 1st Battalion, 21st Regiment, 2nd NVA Division. The FW stated that his battalion arrived on GO NOI Island on 1 March and was preparing to attack a U.S. position two or three kilometers north of his place of capture on 15 March. The prisoner further stated that the 2nd and 3rd Battalions of the 21st Regiment were still located in a jungle base area five to six day's walk west of GO NCI Island. From the information provided by this PW, it is believed that the target of attack for his unit was the 2/1 Marine's command post (9T 078655).

Further to the north, in the immediate DANANG area, a probable rocket attack on DANANG East or the city of DANANG itself was preempted on 14 March when a CAP unit captured sixteen 122mm rockets in a cave 2.5 kilometers south of MARBLE Mountain (BT 074685).

Of significance during the same time frame was the capture of three PW's by G/2/1 Marines, 4.5 kilometers southwest of MARBLE Mountain (BT 042678), all of whom were identified as members of the 1st Battalion, 36th NVA Regiment. The place of capture of these three FW's is north of the normal operating area of the 36th Regiment, thus suggesting the possibility of reconnaissance or staging in preparation for an attack on the DANANG area.

Noteworthy during the past week was the fact that although prisoners were taken from several enemy units in QUANG NAM (P), no contacts were recorded with either the 31st or 141st NVA Regiments, thus suggesting that both units, having been badly hurt in the late February attacks in the HIEU DUC area, may have withdrawn from contact.

For a special report on the results of interrogation of the Executive Officer of the 141st NVA Regiment, captured on 23 February, see Annex D of this report.

d. QUANG TIN (P). No significant ground action was recorded in QUANG TIN (P) during the week of 9-15 March. Enemy activity was at a very low level as pressure on the TIEN PHUOC Special Forces/CIDG Camp subsided during the period.

e. QUANG NGAI (P). The week of 9-15 March has witnessed an appreciable rise in the level of activity in QUANG NGAI Province following a period of comparative quiet during the preceding week.

The majority of ground action during this reporting period has been concentrated in an area just west of DUC PHO City where elements of the 11th Light Infantry Brigade were engaged in almost daily contacts throughout the week. The AMERICAL infantrymen were subjected to several light mortar attacks as well as frequent RPG/SA/AW assaults. Attacks by fire in the DUC PHO area were highlighted on 10 March when three 140mm rockets impacted in a hamlet in the northeastern outskirts of DUC PHO City (BS 809381) during daylight hours, wounding several personnel and destroying 41 homes.

A prisoner of war captured four kilometers west of DUC PHO City (BS 773370) on 10 March by B/3/1 Infantry identified his unit as 2nd Battalion, 2nd VC Regiment, 3rd NVA Division, thus confirming the presence of elements of this major enemy force in the DUC PHO area. Contacts by AMERICAL elements with this enemy unit probably preempted a major attack on DUC PHO City.


Several small-scale ground attacks were reported in the southeastern portion of the province during the week. These attacks were highlighted by a company size ground attack against an RF/PF security force guarding a bridge one kilometer north of MO DUC (BS 726555) on 10 March which resulted in 17 RF/PF's killed or wounded and 20% damage to the bridge.

One significant attack on a GVN population center occurred seven kilometers southeast of QUANG NGAI City (BS 692677) on 13 March when an unknown size enemy force conducted a combination mortar and ground attack on the CAO DAI and TIN CANH Refugee Camps. The enemy entered the two camps, killing or wounding five persons, kidnapping eight young civilian males and burning 24 houses in an action which lasted nearly two hours. The following day a Regional Force Company captured a PW in the general area of the two refugee camps (BS 697687) who identified his unit as the 38th Company, 9th Battalion, 22nd NVA Regiment. The prisoner acknowledged that his unit had been responsible for the attack on the two refugee camps the preceding night.

A similar type incident occurred at LE THUY (H) (BS 694975), 14 kilometers northeast of BINH SON, when an estimated enemy company conducted a ground attack against the hamlet during the early morning hours of 10 March. The enemy terrorized the residents for a two hour period, killing or wounding 20 persons and burning six houses and a church. Villagers subsequently reported that elements of the 95th Sapper Company were responsible for the attack.

Elsewhere in QUANG NGAI (P) this past week, QUANG NGAI City continued to experience isolated sapper incidents. One such instance occurred on 9 March when an estimated three-man sapper force detonated







an unknown type explosive device in a residential area. This incident was preceded by two rounds of incoming 82mm mortar fire which impacted in a civilian housing area. A total of eight civilians were killed or wounded in these two attacks.

f. ANALYSIS OF THE ENEMY SITUATION. The general tempo of enemy activity is expected to continue in ICTZ, with controlled but constant pressure. This is a departure from the "start-stop" pattern of recent weeks and may be not only a prelude to a renewal of offensive efforts but an attempt to gauge allied reaction. The gradual but steady increase in enemy activity along the DMZ is probably a controlled effort to relieve pressure on his vital logistic complex in southwestern QUANG TRI and the A SHAU Valley.


With all evidence continuing to indicate a renewed enemy offensive effort prior to the end of this month, the threat of coordinated attacks must be considered high during the coming week, with continued attacks by fire, limited sapper attacks and ground probes as their prelude. Although the enemy, already suffering from manpower shortages and low morale, suffered heavy losses in the late February attacks and major reverses as a result of allied spoiling operations, there is no indication that enemy commanders have abandoned their determination to attack or that they have lost hope of victory.

- 2. ENEMY OPERATIONS DURING THE PERIOD. Enemy initiated incidents decreased in comparison to the previous week. Incidents consisted of 13 ground attacks, nine ambushes, 24 attacks by fire, 202 incidents of harassing fire, 95 mining and booby trap incidents, three assassination incidents, six espionage incidents, six kidnapping incidents, 16 propaganda incidents, three sabotage incidents, one incident of hamlet harassment, and 222 AA fire incidents.

Reconnaissance.

There were 39 long range reconnaissance patrols deployed throughout ICTZ which reported 92 sightings and two contacts totaling 617 enemy moving in no discernible pattern. The contacts resulted in 19 enemy KIA, two structures destroyed and one secondary explosion.

s. Captured Enemy Caches.

- (1) The following significant enemy caches were captured by friendly forces in ICTZ during the reporting period:
- (a) 09 Mar: A 3rd Marine Division reconnaissance team found a weapons cache in a bunker complex 14 kilometers west of KHE SANH (XD 712394) near the Laotian border in the western extremities of QUANG TRI Province. The cache consisted of 68 AK-47 rifles, two M-16 rifles and one M-60 machinegun. The bunker complex in which the cache was discovered consisted of 60 bunkers with joining hootches. No additional information is available.



(2) Weather Outlook for Period 16-22 March 1969.

General: The surge which has affected RVN the past few days has moved southward and has begun to dissipate. The subtropical ridge is re-intensifying over Southeast Asia so that improving conditions are expected over northern RVN early in the week. The next surge is expected by mid-week with increasing cloudiness as far south as 14 degrees north. Little change is expected in the late week.





ICTZ Forecast: Cloudy with ceilings at 2,000 feet along the coast and 1,000 to 1,500 feet in the mountains after morning stratus and fog has cleared. Decreasing cloudiness early in the week with increasing cloudiness by mid-week. South of 16 degrees north, partly cloudly with decreasing cloudiness early in the week with increased cloudiness in mid-week. Precipitation: less than 0.5 inches. Surf: 1-3 feet.

- 5. CAPABILITIES AND VUINERABILITIES. Based upon a continuing evaluation of the enemy situation, and the present disposition of enemy forces within the ICTZ, the enemy courses of action in probable order of adoption are considered to be:
- a. Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare, to include ambushes, interdiction of LOC's, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and non-toxic chemical munitions. In conjunction with this effort continue attacks by fire on vital areas and key installations, and conduct limited, light to moderate ground attacks on isolated units and outposts, CIDG Camps, and District Headquarters with forces locally available.
- b. Expand present operations within the ICTZ by adopting the following courses of action in one or more of the following geographical locations/areas:
- (1) Attack installations in northern and eastern QUANG TRI (P) with up to five infantry regiment equivalents supported by one to two artillery regiments and possible armor units.
- (2) Attack QUANG TRI City with up to two to three infantry battalions, one sapper battalion, supported by one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (3) Conduct limited attacks in the HUE/PHU BAI area with elements of two to three regiments, supported by one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (4) Attack installations within the DANANG TAOR with up to six infantry regiments, supported by two rocket regiments and one sapper battalion.
- (5) Attack the TAM KY-CHU LAI Combat Base Complex with a division (-) equivalent, reinforced by one sapper battalion.
- (6) Attack QUANG NGAI City and outposts in southern QUANG NGAI (P) with one division equivalent, supported by one sapper regiment and one mortar/rocket battalion.





- c. Defend in present positions just north of the central and eastern portion of the DMZ with up to five infantry regiment equivalents, supported by one to two artillery regiments and possible armor units.
- d. Defend elsewhere in ICTZ (south of Route 9), including VC/NVA base areas with forces locally available.
- e. Withdraw into the mountains and forested areas of western I Corps and/or LAOS and North Vietnam.
- f. Reinforce the forces presently in ICTZ with two to three divisions from NVN and one division equivalent from IAOS.
- g. Employ SSM's from NVN and/or border areas; employ limited air and/or naval forces from NVN or surrounding areas; employ possible armor units from the area immediately north of the DMZ and/or border areas.

h. Vulnerabilities.

- (1) Enemy forces, LOC's and surface installations are vulnerable to air, artillery and naval gunfire attacks.
- (2) Recent tactical defeats on the battlefield, sickness, hunger, shortage of ammunition and medical supplies, and austere living conditions have increased his vulnerability to psychological warfare operations.



ARREX B (SIGNIFICANT INFORMATION DERIVED FROM INTERPOSATION REPORTS, AGENT REPORTS, AND CAPTURED DOCUMENTS) TO III MAF PERINTREP 11-69.

1. QUANG TRI (F)

A. On 25Febo9 documents were found which belonged to a cadre of the 4th Co, 9th Bn, 24oth Regt MR4 (7th ITT PW RPT 263-68 dtd 300cto8 and CDEC Bul 3rd MRDIV DTC dtd 1Maros RPT #2/o9/78). The documents described preparation that had been made for an attack on a U.S. installation located at "HIGH POINT 1088" possibly FSB NTVILLE, which was to take place on 24Febo9. On 24Febo9, FSB NTVILLE was attacked by an unknown sized enemy force which resulted in 36 NVA killed. On 260ct68 a PW was captured who stated he was a member of the 4th Co, unk Bn, unk Regt. It is believed this PW was a member of the 4th Co, 9th Bn, 24oth Regt. In the list of personalities given by the FW was a PO of the 4th Co which matched the name of the author of the document mentioned above.

(G-2 CMT: It is felt that elements of the 246th Regt are operating in the western portion of "UANG TRI (P) and participated in the 24Febo9 attack on FSB "EVILLE. III MAF OOB Listing does not carry a 9th Bn, 246th Regt or an AKA of 9th Bn for the Bns of the 246th Regt. The last known contact with elements of the 246th Regt was on 27Juno8 vicinity (YD 8637).

2. THUA THIEN (P) No significant reports.

3. DU NG NAM (P)

A. FW Vo VAN, Sgt, 3rd Co, 60th Bn, 1st Regt who was captured on 7Mar69 in the vicinity (AT 851480), (Interr RPT 01-03-09 (RC) NSA Hospital stated that the mission of his unit was to attack allied forces in the vicinity of (AT 840485) and that a future mission whould be to engage allied forces in DAI LOC (D) in connection with the Winter/Spring offensive; plans were to draw allied forces into the mountains and then attack the cities. Source further stated that the 60th Bn has been operating in the LOC THANH area vicinity (AT 850505) since 10Febo9 and the 60th Bn's base area was located vicinity (AT 850505). Before this the 60th Bn was located vicinity (ZC 201150) for approximately four months. Source also stated that the morale was fair to good and that victory will soon come for the NVA.

(G-2 CMT: This is the first PV report that has indicated that the 1st VC Regt is operating in the AN HOA area. However, the 1st VC Regt has recently been reported to the south and east of AN HOA by other intelligence sources. All information reported (F-3).)

B. An agent report dated 8Mar69 (525 MI GP RFT, 1/C/CX/0015/69) described the following attack plan for OUA'G NAM Province.

- (1) The 141st Suicide Bn and the T.89 Bn will assemble vicinity (BT 010691, (AT 990684), (BT 030723), infiltrate CAM LE (V) (BT 014716) to attack HOA VANG and DANANG.
- (2) The 144th En, 31st Regt, supported by IF units will assemble vicinity DAI LA Pass (AT 942752) pass through HOA THANH (V) (AT 950775) and then to DAMANG.
- (3) Two Bns of 141st Regt in PHO NAM Mountains (AT 858852) and KIM LIEN Mountains (AT 916861) will attack DANANG through AN KHE (AT 990760).
- (4) The V.25 Bn, located vicinity XUYEN AN (BT 159533) supported by VC units in HOI AN, will attack HOI AN and suburbs.
- (5) The 2nd and 3rd Bns of the 36th Regt plus the R.20 Bn, located vicinity (BT 134502) and (BT 015517), will attack DIEN BAN and DUY XUYEN (BT 070520) District Headquarters.
 - (6) Other unit locations given:
- (a) Unit of 141/308th Regt in the northern DONG LAN Mountains, DAI LOC (D)
 - (b) Unit of 36/308th Regt located vicinity (2C 151450)
- (c) Unit of 31st Regt deployed from LA CHUA (AT 960008) to LE SON (AT 960008) to LE SON (AT 960049).
- (7) Main targets in southern attack are CAU LAU Bridge (BT 092553) and BA REN Bridge (BT 102512).

(G-2 CMT: The northern portion of the attack plan is similar to that described by the XO of 141st Regt, captured 25Febo9 (see III MAF PERINTREP 10-69 dtd 11Mar69 and Annex D of this PIR). Agent Report dated 3Mar69 (C-2) reported V.25 and R.20 Bns vicinity (BT 135515). A PW from V.25 captured 8Mar69 vicinity (BT 003597) stated his Bn planned to attack DANANG between 14 and 26 March. The 144th Bn, 31st Regt is unknown (F-6). All other information reported (F-3).)

ANNEX C (COUNTERINTELLIGENCE) TO III MAF PERINTREP 11-69

- 1. GENERAL. The intensity of reported counterintelligencerelated activity continued to decline during the previous week with the more significant activity taking place in Quang Nam and Quang Ngai Provinces. Captured documents and interrogations of prisoners reveal that the current period is intended to be one of continued intensive activity throughout the ICTZ. A recently captured VC assessment of their own accomplishments during the year 1968 stated that one of the greatest deficiencies had been the failure to improve military proselyting and political struggle activities. The large number of directives which have been captured giving detailed directions for intensifying those aspects of the VC effort further attest to the importance which the VC place on political/proselyting activities. In that light, the continued failure of the VC to generate any significant anti-GVN demonstrations or defections from the GVN cause must be viewed as a reflection both of their decreased capabilities and of their absence of nonular support. Reports continue to be received of VC targeting of pacification assets. telligence collection operations reported in Quang Tri and Quang Ngai over the past weeks undoubtedly provide intelligence for sapper and terror attacks against refugee and resettlement camps. PF posts, and CAP units, each of which provides essential pacification contributions. This trend call be expected to continue.
- 2. ESPIONAGE. Low level espionage activity continued at a reduced level during the period. Reported instances in Guang Tri (F) and Thua Thien (F) primarily consisted of reconnaissance of US/GVN posts by military personnel in civilian clothes and of VC cadre debriefing travelers about the situation in GVN areas. Targets of VC reconnaissance activity reported during the week included Hai Phu (YD356475), Trieu Huong (YD520275), and Trieu Trach (YD337637) villages in Guang Tri Province and Phong Dien District Headquarters (YD335557) in Thua Thien Province.
- 3. SABORAGE. During the period, only two instances of sabotage were reported. An unknown number of VC damaged the Dac Day Bridge at (BS728555) in Quang Ngai Province on 9 March 1969. On 15 March 1969, an unknown number of VC blew up the northern end of a railroad bridge at (YD927103) in Phu Loc (D). Repairs will require an estimated 3 weeks.

- 4. POLITICAL AND PROPAGANDA. Reported Viet Cong political and propaganda activity decreased slightly during the period. Significant activity included preparations for demonstrations to be held in major cities and stepped up propaganda attacks on the GVN village and humlet elections. (See Appendix 1 for listing of Peoples Liberation Committees).
- a. A report from Quang Tri (P) states that the VC are planning to incite country-wide demonstrations during the month of March for the release of Venerable Thich Thien Miss, a Buddhist monk who was recently arrested for aiding the Viet Cong. In the and Quang Tri (C), GVN popular and regional forces will be called upon to support the demonstrations and sapper attacks will be initiated. The Viet Cong have long attempted to revive the seemingly dormant militant Buddhist movement and utilize it for their purposes. These efforts, however, have been without any recent success. ful that the Vo will be able to generate any mass support for the proposed demonstrations in the northern provinces of ICTM, particularly in view of the weakened state of the VCT organization thathe cities of Hue and Quang Tri. Possibly related to the above is another report which states that the VC plan to infiltrate their political cadre into Danang disguised as Buddhist monks in order to penetrate dissident. religious factions and initiate a political struggle movement in conjunction with and support of future attacks on the city.
- b. A number of documents captured recently in the vicinity of (BT190553) relate that the VC plan to initiate an intensive political struggle and military proselyting campaign in Hol An (C) during which servicemen, laborers, Buddhists, students, and youths will be called upon to support VC demands for the withdrawal of BS troops and the establishment of a coalition government. One document stated that the struggle would be initiated between 13 and 17 March and would be coordinated with military operations.
- c. Viet Cong propaganda themes remained basically unchanged during the week, although some changes in emphasis were noted. The principal theme continued to be that the VC were winning great victories both on the battlefield and in Paris and would soon be victorious. One VC propagandist in Quang Tri Province went so far as to state that North and South Vistnam would be united by June. (He failed to mention in what year.) An increasing amount of attention is being paid by the VC to the GVN village and hamlet elections currently being held throughout the Corps area. Reaction

to the elections ranged from attempts to discredit them to threats to decapitate anyone who participated. One report from Quang Tin Province also stated that the VC will attempt to exploit the elections by promoting VC cadre as candidates. A similar plan was reported from Quang Tri Province several weeks ago, but there are no other indications that this represents any high level or widespread VC policy.

- d. A VC notice picked up after a recent sapper attack on Quang Ngai City reflects VC intentions in that city. The document stated that GVN agencies would be disbanded and the city administration placed under control of the City or Peoples Liberation Committee. All official records, firearms, military equipment, and intelligence documents were to be turned in immediately to the Liberation Committee, public and private property was to be protected, and public and private agencies were to continue to operate. During the occupation of Hue in 1968, People's Liberation Committees were also established and utilized as civil administration agencies.
- 5. TERROR. The level of VC terrorist activity remained high in Quang Nam (P) and Quang Ngai (P), but dropped to below normal in the rest of the Corps. Populated areas and refugee settlements continued to be special targets for VC terrorism. (See Appendix 2 for listing of terrorist incidents.)
- 6. MISCELLANEOUS. VC food and tax collection continued during the period with most reported instances again occurring in the two northern provinces. Additional information has been received on VC tax rates during the period. The troop support tax rate in a village in Quang Tin Province was reported to be from 2,000\$VN to 5,000\$VN, depending on the family income. Interrogation reports from Quang Ngai (P) stated that VC tax rates were from 40% to 50% of the crop or cash income of each family. As areas solidly under VC control continue to shrink, the tax rates in VC controlled areas can be expected to rise and consequently further decrease their popular support.

VCI CASE STUDY TT-1

Subject: Viet Cong (VC) District People's Revolutionary Committee (PRC)
Phu Vang District, Thua Thien Province

- 1. The following information has been extracted from a CAS source document. This information, collected during August 1968, provides an insight into a typical infrastructure operation at the District level.
- 2. The Viet Cong (VC) Phu Vang District People's Revolutionary Committee (PRC) has nine subordinate sections and is responsible for the district's Local Force Unit and village PRC's. (See Tab A). Its chief functions are to execute all orders of the Current Affairs Section of the Special Zonal Party Committee and of the Special Zonal PRC, to command all subordinate organizations in the district, and to report the results of its operations and the general situation to the Current Affairs Section of the Special Zonal Party Committee.
- 3. The VC Phu Vang District PRC's primary duties are: to set up armed groups to consolidate other organizations at hamlet and village level; to set up armed groups to guard the PRC area and to defend "liberated" areas; to motivate the people into increasing production, developing husbandry, economizing in order to be able to pay taxes and participating in transportation; and to force the people to persuade their dependents or relatives who work for the GVN or who are in the Army of the Republic of Vietnam to return to the VC and thus avoid more bloodshed, shorten the war, and "save" the country. The district PRC's secondary duties include motivating and agitating the people to struggle politically against the GVN in a legal manner, thus creating problems for the GVN. Armed groups are to build up the infrastructure, enlarge "secure" areas, fight against all enemy operations, and defend the "liberated" areas.
- 4. The Economy Section commands all hamlet and village economy sections, collects taxes from the people in the form of money and rice, caches all rice collected from the hamlets and villages, distributes rice among various district organizations, and transports items to the Economy Section of the Special Zonal Party Committee.
- 5. The Security Section executes all orders from the Special Zonal Party Committee's Security Section, reports all activities and local security situations in Phu Vang District, and commands village security sections. The section investigates and classifies the people of the district, makes recommendations for arrest, assassination or reformation, issues pass cards, and controls the movement of people in the district. It is expected to know all other forces in nearby areas.

- 6. The Health Section commands all village health sections, distributes medical supplies, and treats all skin diseases and minor infections of both the people and the VC.
- 7. The Farmer's Association commands all farmer's associations in the villages, prepares plans for land distribution, and motivates the farmers into increasing production and raising domestic animals. It also confiscates the lands of people who have moved to GVN areas or work for the GVN, and redistributes these lands to the remaining people.
- 8. The Momen's Section participates in propaganda activities, urges the people to pay troop-support taxes, and takes care of wounded soldiers.
- 9. The Local Force Unit commands all armed groups, guards and defends VC areas, maintains security in "liberated" areas, digs trenches, and sets up mine fields. It also motivates the people into participating in medical evacuation and the transportation of weapons and ammunition.
- 10. The Phu Vang District PRC leaders, such as chairman, vice-chairman, secretary, section chiefs, and armed unit commanders, receive a monthly salary of VN\$830 (US\$6.95 at the official exchange rate of VN\$118 to US\$1.00). Members of village and hamlet organizations receive no salary. The PRC has no fixed schedule of daily work hours and PRC members work as many hours as the situation requires. An administrative rules prevents anyone from taking leave.

TAB A - Line and Block diagram



ANNEX D (RESULTS OF INTERROGATION OF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF THE 141ST NVA REGIMENT) TO III MAF PERINTREP 11-69.

- 1. On 25 February 1969, at the height of the NVA/VC post-ThT offensive, L/3/7 captured an enemy PW in the vicinity of HILL 22 (AT 957667). Upon interrogation it was determined that the prisoner was Senior Captain Nguyen Thanh LONG, the executive officer of the Lilst NVA Regiment. In a series of interrogations conducted both by U.S. and RVN interrogators, Captain LONG has provided a wealth of information concerning enemy order of battle, tactics, logistic support and most important of all, an excellent insight into the viewpoint of the more senior NVA officers who are charged with the mission of carrying out the war on the regimental level in QUANG NAM (P).
- a. Post-TET Offensive. It was apparent from the information elicited from Captain LANG that the offensive thrust which the 31st and 141st NVA Regiments conducted during the period of 23-26 February 1969 had been long planned and carefully coordinated. The unit which was charged with carrying out this mission was the Western Command, Front Four which had the aforementioned 31st and 141st Regiments as its principal subordinate elements. The commanding officer of the 31st Regiment was the overall commander and was double-hatted as CO of Western Command. A month prior to the actual commencement of the offensive a meeting was held by Front Four at which the principal staff members of these two regiments were present.
- b. Plan of Attack. The lan of attack which was eventually decided upon was indeed ambitious. The 31st and 141st Regiments which were then located in the mountainous areas to the west of DANANG were to move in an easterly direction to forward assembly areas within striking distance of HILL 327. The 31st, a bob-tailed two battalion regiment, was to move its maneuver elements up to HOA LOC (AT 905735). At the same time, the 25th Sapper Company was to cross the TUY LOAN River and maximizing the use of covert movement and small infiltration groups was to scale HILL 327 and reassemble in the vicinity of (AT 946745). This position was in proximity to a position which Captain LONG identified as an outpost of the First Marine Division CP.

Once this sapper company was thus emplaced, the 31st Regiment was to move out of the HOA LOC area and, attacking in a northeasterly direction, was to cross the river, pass through the road junction known as HOA LOC Three Corners (AT 912743), continue the attack through DAI LA Pass and then descend upon the First Marine Division CP.

While the 31st was carrying out this mission, the 141st Regiment, operating in close coordination with the 31st, was to be divided into two attacking elements. The first element was to be commanded by Senior Captain LONG. This force included the 3rd Battalion, lulst Regiment reinforced by a company from 2/141, a section of 12.7 AA guns, a section






of 82mm mortars, a radio/wire section and an additional sapper company. Their mission was to seize the TUY LOAN Bridge. Once the bridge had been seized Captain LONG intended to attack the artillery position which he identified as being located at (AT 938747). H Battery, 3rd Battalion, 11th Marines is located in this general vicinity (AT 921737). In addition LONG also intended to attack a unit which he identified as a Marine engineer unit immediately to the north of the TUY LOAN River which we believe to have been "C" Company, 7th Engineers (AT 949709).

The mission of the second element of the Lilst Regiment was not as clear in Captain LONG's mind. This force was commanded by Major HAO, the regimental political officer and included the 1st Battalion, Lilst NVA Regiment and the balance of 2/lil not already assigned to the first element. As Captain LONG explained it, the mission of the second element was to exploit the bridgehead over the TUY LOAN which the first element was to seize. This was to be in one of two ways. Major HAO was to either move northwest, join the 31st Regiment in the vicinity of DAI LA Pass, cross the mountains at that location and then, in coordination with the 31st, descend upon DANANG itself; alternatively, the second element's attack plan, if HILL 327 appeared to have been secured or at least neutralized, called for an attack N/NE immediately upon crossing the TUY LOAN Bridge and directed at DANANG with I Corps Headquarters as its principal objective.

Which of these two alternatives Major HAO would have opted for is unknown as the 141st never got the opportunity to carry out this attack. Throughout the period 23-26 February elements of the First Marine Division fought a series of pitched battles with both the 31st and 141st but the battles all took place south of the TUY LOAN River. These units experienced little battlefield success in their overt movement against our forces. The enemy's units that relied on covert means of crossing the TUY LOAN and infiltrating the HILL 327 area, however, experienced a substantial measure of success as the attacks on the 26th Marines CP, the outpost positions on HILL 327, and in the vicinity of the First Marine Division CP clearly attest.

c. Order of Battle. Senior Captain LONG provided a substantial amount of information concerning enemy order of battle in QUANG NAM Province. He verified the fact the forces subordinate to Front Four consisted of the 31st, 36th and Lilst Regiments plus the 2nd NVA Division. It was of particular interest to us that he made no mention of the 38th NVA Regiment although he specifically mentioned several of the subordinate battalions of this unit. From this interrogation, added to the information we have been gathering for some time, it is probable that the 38th NVA Regiment is a task organized headquarters which is formed in response to the requirements of a specific mission. Special intelligence would support this view as would the statement of the executive officer of the reconnaissance company of Front Four who, upon





being captured in August, stated that the 38th was formed out of Front Four assets for one-time missions.

Captain LONG also noted that the 368B Rocket Regiment no longer exists as a separate regimental entity. Instead, there are three independent rocket battalions which have been assigned to the three subordinate elements of Front Four, the northern, central and southern wings. He made no mention of the second rocket regiment which we have carried but not seen in many months, the 68B. We feel it is probable that this unit and its assets have been amalgamated into the above cited independent rocket battalions. However, there is no hard evidence to confirm or deny this hypothesis. The northern wing of Front Four which has geographic responsibility for the area lying between HILL 327 and the HAI VAN Pass, is composed of the HAI VAN Engineer Battalion and the V-12 Rocket Battalion. No mention is made by LONG of the T-87 Sapper Battalion as a third element in this area.


We have no record of a V-12 Rocket Battalion. However, we are aware that the enemy has demonstrated a rocket firing capability from north of the NAM O. We estimate that this rocket capability represents a part of the assets of the 368B Rocket Regiment, and consider the V-12 Rocket Battalion to be an AKA for one of the three battalions of the 368B.

The second element of Front Four is the central wing and has the geographic responsibility for that area lying to the west of a line drawn from HTLL 327 S/SW to the SONG YEN. The forces assigned to this wing are the 31st and 141st Regiments plus a battalion of the 368B Rocket Artillery Regiment. This wing is commanded by the CO of the 31st Regiment who is double-hatted as CO of the central wing. To further confuse the issue, this central wing is sometimes referred to as the Western Command.

The third element of Front Four is the southern wing which has responsibility for that area lying east of the SONG YEN to the South China Sea. The forces assigned to this wing, according to Captain LONG, are the 36th Regiment and the Q.91 Battalion (AKA 3d Sapper Battalion).

Captain LONG also noted that the 2d NVA Division was not assigned to any of these wings but was considered the reserve force for the entire Military Region 5. However, due to the fact that the 36th Regiment was "lacking in real strength" MR-5 had reinforced the southern wing with the 21st NVA Regiment.

No mention was made of the 1st VC or the 3d NVA Regiments by Captain LONG. Considering the locations where we have held these units during the past few months it is quite understandable that he would have little knowledge of the operation of these units.




d <u>Infiltration</u>. Captain LONG provided a wealth of detailed information concerning his unit's infiltration into South Vietnam. Information elicited from this PW makes it clear that the enemy's personnel infiltration system has achieved a relatively high degree of sophistication.

Prior to the unit's departure from NVN, training for infiltration was integrated into the unit's regular regimental training schedule. When the light NVA Regiment was ready for southward movement, Captain LONG reports that his unit was moved by truck the entire distance from NVN to Base Area 611. Only upon reaching the A SHAU did the light shift to shank's mare. Captain LONG also reported that there was no need to resupply his unit during the infiltration movement as sufficien quantities of food were carried with them on the trucks. No mention is made of shuttling of trucks as has been reported in the past. In the case of the light it appears that the same truck serials took them all the way. It is evident from this description that the interdiction of the Laotian road system at this time (February 1968) could not have been a serious problem or mention of the fact that by-passing of heavily interdicted areas would have been made.

Whether or not the method of infiltrating the lilst was the exception or the rule we could not determine from our interrogation sessions. It is possible that the movement of the lilst was unique as the lilst was scheduled to be a reinforcing unit in the battle for HUE during TET '68. Fortunately for the health of this unit, it arrived too late to participate in the battle and after having traversed #547 in an easterly direction within 15 miles of HUE they turned around and walked back to the A SHAU Valley, then south on #548 and east on #614 to A YIN and then to the eastern lowlands of QUANG NAM.

e. Communications. Captain LONG discussed the communications system used in his regiment. From the information he provided, it is quite clear that their communications system is well organized and established on a formal basis similar to any conventional military force. The principal means of tactical communications employed on the battlefield is the K-63 radio. This radio has a seven to eight kilometer range. There are four of them in each battalion and the four radios are used to support the battalion tactical net with one radio at battalion level and the other three with the rifle companies. In addition to the K-63, the U_1 lst has a second radio described as a 15 watt radio capable of contacting either HANOI or FRONT 4. Each battalion has two cryptographers assigned. They carry the frequencies and call signs for all units with them. Normally, the names of mountains, rivers and cities are used as call signs for units. The fact that the enemy uses radio intercept was touched upon by Captain LONG. He noted that each unit has two personnel who speak English to monitor our radio traffic. However, Captain LONG felt that their successes as a result of using intercepts were minimal.



This was largely ascribed by him to the fact that the English language trained personnel had been taught English in NVN and not very well at that. For this reason, they were unable to read much of what we were saying.


Captain LONG affirmed the fact that the NVA is aware of our ability to read their traffic. He emphasized that only the highest priority information was passed by radio, and the majority of the traffic continues to be handled by messenger.

f. Tactics. Captain LONG discussed the tactics taught and employed by the 141st NVA Regiment. They were without exception the tactics employed by all conventionally organized forces with the same doctrine as we teach concerning interval, how to cross an open area or secure the banks of a river, how to establish an ambush, how to extricate one's self from an ambush, etc. LONG also noted that General WESTMORELAND's manual concerning the tactics to be used by U.S. troops in SVN had been translated into Vietnamese and was used in their training.

There were areas of special interest noted by him which were of special interest to us. One of these areas was selection of routes of withdrawal and methods of reforming units after an attack. Captain LONG noted that his personnel had learned quickly from harsh experience that prearranged routes of withdrawal, particularly those that maximized speed rather than security, turned into death traks because invariably the Americans delivered devastating fires on every conceivable route of withdrawal. In response to this problem the tactic which the likest employed when forced to withdraw was to scatter their troops throughout the villages in the immediate area of the attack and have the troops mingle with the villagers. Later, when the Americans had left, guides would be sent to the villages to lead these small units back to the CP.

g. Captain LONG's General Attitude and Viewpoint on the War. This PW is a veteran of 20 years of service with the Viet Minh and North Vietnamese Armies. He attended OCS in China in 1951 and was a platoon commander at DIEN BIEN PHU. With the exception of a two year stint at the SON TAY Artillery Academy, LONG had continuously served with the 141st degiment since 1953. Since infiltrating into South Vietnam in February of 1963 he had not participated in a great deal of heavy fighting but had been involved in the battle fought at THJONG DUC in September and October of 1968.

Captain LONG noted that 50% of the senior officers had been with the light Regiment since DIEN BIEN Phy. Concerning the strength of the Light, he gave varying figures. However, the ones which appear to be the most reliable were that the light's infiltration strength was 2,400 men, their strength prior to the present battle was 1,600 with an effective strength of 1,100. The three infantry battalions of the regiment were assessed at a strength of 250, 233 and 240 respectively, each battalion having three rifle companies and a weapons company. LONG affirmed that






his unit had received losses from air, artillery, ground combat and malaria, however, he did not appear to be worried about his losses. He understood that a new draft of personnel was to arrive in late February to make their losses good. Whether this was wishful thinking employed by Captain LONG's superiors or actual fact, we have no way of knowing. However, considering the infiltration figures we have had reported by other sources, there is no reason to believe that the reinforcements would not arrive as scheduled.

It was interesting to note Captain LONG's basic attitudes towards how the war was going. Regardless of past losses there appeared to be not the slightest doubt in his mind that the NVN would eventually win. He expressed what appeared to be sincere regret that as a PW he would now be denied the opportunity to participate in the "big battle" which will eventually be fought and won by the NVA: Captain LONG did not consider the general condition and combat efficiency of the 141st to be any problem whatsoever. When asked whether he had considered the possibility of the lilst withdrawing further to the west he dismissed the idea as absurd because "there was no possible reason for such a move." Captain LONG's outlook here is not unreasonable considering what is known about the 141st. This unit has not been engaged since THUONG DUC in early October. Other than the privations of living in the mountainous area west of THUCNG DUC and the problem of malaria, there would be no particular reason for this unit to feel other than fully combat ready. No food or ammunition shortage appeared to have been experienced by the List according to Captain LONG's report.

Captain LONG was very politically aware and well-informed on the subject of the international scene. He not only commented on the Russo-Czechoslovak problem but also such relatively recent developments as the present Berlin confrontation.



1. GENERAL ENEMY SITUATION. There was a marked increase in enemy activity in I Corps Tactical Zone throughout the week of 16-22 March. With the exception of the first week of the NVA/VC post-TET offensive (22-28 February) it was the highest level of enemy activity experienced during the past few months.


Ground attacks of company size or larger rose to nine as compared to one the previous week. The number of assaults by fire increased to 33 during the week which ended 22 March, compared with 24 the previous week. Incoming was more than double last week's total and similarly, enemy casualties rose to 1,540 from the previous week's 966.

Viet Cong terrorism increased significantly during the past week while other counterintelligence-related activity remained at a low level. The majority of terrorist incidents consisted of attacks on populated areas. A moderate increase in VC water sapper activity was also noted. Propaganda themes remained essentially unchanged with most propaganda fforts being devoted to urging the people to increase production and make contributions of food and labor to the VC. While captured documents and agent reports continue to state that the VC will increase their military proselyting activity and attempt to foment demonstrations in favor of an immediate peace, little of this type activity has been reported.

a. QUANG TRI (P). While the week of 16-22 March produced a noticeable increase in the tempo of the enemy's efforts in the three southern provinces which comprise the Military Region 5 area of I Corps Tactical Zone, the general enemy situation in QUANG TRI (P) experienced relatively little change from the preceding period. Within the province itself, the B-5 FRONT area was the center of attention for the second consecutive week while activity in the southern portion of the province subsided as the 9th Marines terminated their highly successful DEWEY CANYON operation.

MAZ sightings/incidents decreased sharply during the period, dropping from 230 to 140, with a corresponding decrease in the average number of daily sightings/incidents from 33 to 20. Of the 230 sightings/incidents this week, 61 were north of the BEN HAI River.

Unlike the past two reporting periods during which the enemy violated the DMZ on several occasions by shelling allied installations and tactical units in the northeastern portion of the province, this week there





was only one confirmed firing incident emanating from within the demilitarized zone. However, this particular incident occurred in the extreme western reaches of the DMZ where the enemy directed 12 rounds of 82mm mortar fire against L/3/4 Marines, 10 kilometers north northwest of the ROCKPILE (XD 944654) on 22 March.

Further interrogation of a PW captured in the northeastern extremities of QUANG TRI (P) (YD 259805) on 15 March (paragraph l.a, III MAF PIR 11-69 refers) and initially identified as a member of the 2nd Battalion, 25th Regiment, reveals that his regiment is also known as the 2nd Artillery Regiment. The prisoner stated that he has heard that the regimental headquarters is located 50 kilometers west of the VINH LINH Special Zone. He further indicated that the 2nd Battalion began operations south of the BEN HAI River on 10 March with the mission of shelling allied installations. His unit, armed with eighteen 60mm mortars, was to return to an undisclosed base area in the northern portion of the DMZ upon completion of its mission. An 82nd Artillery Regiment is currently carried in order of battle listings as subordinate to the 351st Artillery Division in NVN.

Enemy sappers, most likely elements of the 126th Naval Sapper Regiment, remained active along the CUA VIET River this past week. River patrol craft continued to encounter small groups of enemy along the banks of the river as well as some harassing small arms fire. One mining incident occurred on 20 March when an ICM-8 proceeding down the river from DONG HA experienced a small underwater detonation approximically two kilometers northeast of the DONG HA Bridge (YD 252623). The excision failed to produce any damage or casualties. Investigation for evidence of command detonation was unable to be effected due to friendly artillery impacting in the area. However, this particular locale has produced no less than four recent minings or attempted minings, the latest of which occurred on 23 February when a patrol boat detonated a large watermine.

The northeastern quadrant of QUANG TRI (P) was again the stage setting for significant ground action this week as the enemy conducted two additional attacks against friendly tactical units following last week's 13 March platoon size sapper attack against an ARVN outpost southeast of GIO LINH.

The most significant of these two incidents was a company size sapper attack conducted against a CAP unit compound in a hamlet of DONG XUAN Village, two kilometers north of DONG HA (YD 231632) during the early morning hours of 16 March. The enemy followed a CAP night patrol to the hamlet and initiated the attack by breaching the perimeter and overrunning the compound. Several bunkers and buildings including the village chief's home were blown up with satchel charges, grenades and bangalore torpedoes. This short-lived but intense foray resulted in heavy friendly casualties including the village chief and two hamlet



chiefs, all three of whom were killed in the attack. The enemy unit, which withdrew to the northwest, was not identified.

Of lesser intensity was a combination mortar and two-pronged sapper attack launched against a PF platoon in night defensive positions (YD 313690), two kilometers west of the CUA VIET Port Facility on 20 March. During the encounter, conducted by an estimated platoon size enemy force, the enemy effected a brief penetration of the PF perimeter. However, the attack produced only light casualties on both sides.

Friendly forces operating in the central region of the B-5 FRONT met with little serious opposition this past week as enemy efforts in this area were limited mainly to light and scattered attacks by fire. Most of these attacks were directed at vehicular traffic operating on Route 9 between DONG HA and VANDEGRIFT Combat Base. In the CON THIEN-CAM IO-ROCKPILE complex, ground action was scattered and desultory, with a two platoon size enemy force being the largest unit contacted.

Northwest of KHE SANH, however, enemy activity increased as elements of the 4th Marines met with moderate to heavy resistance upon attempting to reopen FSB ARGONNE (XD 676573) during the latter part of the week. During the fighting to secure this fire support base in close proximity to the IAOTIAN border which has been closed for several months, no less than 10 helicopters sustained hits from enemy ground fire with one aircraft being downed. Although the fire support base was subsequently secured, friendly forces continued to receive frequent but light mortar attacks throughout the remainder of the week. Although there was no positive identification of the enemy unit in contact, elements of the 246th NVA Regiment were most probably involved.

To the south of the KHE SANH-IANG VEI complex in the area of Route 926 (616), only light contact was encountered this week by friendly forces participating in Operation MAINE CRAG, which include elements of the 3rd Marines, ARVN Forces, and elements of the 1st Brigade, 5th Mechanized Division. Of interest concerning this area were continued reports of enemy vehicular traffic along this road. As but one example, elements of G/2/3 Marines observed two 6X6 trucks travelling northeast along the route on 18 March, approximately 19.5 kilometers south of KHE SANH (XD 881229). One vehicle was subsequently engaged and destroyed. The trucks were reported to have been carrying rockets and small arms ammunition.

Of particular interest were two PW's captured in a bunker along Route 926 (616) (XD 897229) by H/2/3 Marines on 21 March. Both prisoners stated that they were members of a 19th Construction Company which has the mission of building bunkers and road repair. One of the PW's further revealed that his company is subordinate to a 4th Battalion, 330th Regiment, a unit not held in III MAF 00B listings. However, NVA order of battle carries a 330th Division, believed to be a training and garrison unit. Interrogation of these two PW's is continuing.



Elsewhere in QUANG TRI Province, remaining elements of the 9th Marines in the DEWEY CANYON AO continued to meet with light enemy resistance as they prepared to close out this major operation. This resistance took the form of light amounts of incoming artillery and mortar fire as well as some RPG and small arms fire. Operation DEWEY CANYON was officially terminated at 181800H March. The final enemy casualty figure for this highly successful two month operation which commenced on 21 January was assessed at 1,355 KIA's.

b. THUA THIEN (P). Enemy activity remained generally at a reduced level in THUA THIEN (P) during the week of 16-22 March although an increase in attacks by fire was noted during the latter part of the week.

Ground action within the province was sporadic throughout the week with the majority of contacts occurring along Route 547 in the vicinity of FSB VEGHEL (YD 550035). Elements of the 1Clst Airborne Division (AM) participating in Operation MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER encountered light enemy resistance in this area from probable elements of the 9th NVA Regiment as they continued their efforts to eliminate the enemy's use of the A SHAU Valley for logistic and personnel throughput.

Friendly installations astride Route 1 from HUE to PHU LOC continued to be favorite targets for enemy mortar and rocket attacks during the reporting period. Light casualties and materiel damage were sustained at Camp EAGLE on 16 March when 10 rounds of 122mm rocket fire impacted at the headquarters of the lolst Airborne Division (AM). Further to the south during the latter part of the week, both PHU BAI and PHU LOC District Headquarters received incoming rocket/mortar fire on 22 March. Light materiel damage resulted from thirteen 122mm rockets fired at the former installation, while 70 rounds of incoming 60/82mm mortar fire received at the latter installation during daylight hours resulted in one individual (J.S.) wounded.

Of particular significance in THUA THIEN (P) this past week has been the capture of no less than five prisoners of war from the 5th NVA Regiment, all of whom were taken in a cordon operation five kilometers south of PHU BAI (YD 9010) by ARVN Forces and elements of the 101st Airborne Division (AM). Two of these PW's were identified as members of the 5th NVA Regiment's reconnaissance company while a third PW revealed he was a member of the K-32 Artillery Battalion, also subordinate to the 5th Regiment. Information gleaned from the two members of the reconnaissance company indicate that they were conducting a recon of allied installations in the PHU BAI area in preparation for an attack to be conducted by elements of the 5th Regiment during the period 1-10 April. Included among a list provided by these two PW's of several targets for this alleged forthcoming attack are the PHU BAI Airfield and FSB ANZIO (YD 932071). All three of the aforementioned PW's indicated that elements of the K-32 Artillery Battalion would shell HUE City and other installations in the HUE-PHU BAI area with 122mm rockets during the specified period of 1-10 April.



c. QUANG NAM (P). Although there was a slight increase in enemy activity in northern I Corps this past week, this fact was overshadowed by a marked increase in the enemy's efforts in QUANG NAM as well as QUANG TIN and QUANG NGAI Provinces throughout the latter part of the reporting period.

The early part of the week in QUANG NAM (P), however, produced only light ground action, with the majority of contacts during this three day period being concentrated in the AN HOA and HOI AN areas.


Elements of 3/26 Marines had several sporadic encounters in the former area of operations and the AN HOA Combat Base was subjected to additional rocket and mortar attacks. Noteworthy was a 16 round barrage of 122mm rockets and 82mm mortar rounds directed at the DUC DUC District Headquarters (AT 886476) on 17 March which killed 10 civilians and wounded 26 others in the adjacent THANH MY Refugee Camp.

In the latter area, elements of the 2nd ROK Marine Brigade killed several enemy in night ambushes and search and clear missions while a CAP unit confirmed the presence of the 2nd Battalion, 36th NVA Regiment when they captured a PW during a meeting engagement with an NVA platoon 10 kilometers west northwest of HOI AN (BT 054609) on 17 March.

The most significant ground contact during the early part of the week occurred on 18 March when Combined Action Platoon 2-4-2 engaged a large enemy force 2.5 kilometers west of HOI AN (BT 120570). An aerial observer reported sighting 43 enemy bodies in the action that continued throughout the afternoon and into the night. A sweep of the area the following morning revealed 16 houses destroyed but no enemy bodies. However, civilians in the area reported there were over 100 enemy KIA's and WIA's and revealed that the local populace had been forced to carry wounded enemy troops west during the night. The local DICCC reported that agents had confirmed 19 enemy KIA and 13 enemy WIA.

Five kilometers north northwest of DIEN BAN on 16 March, two significant terrorist incidents occurred in THANH QUIT Hamlet (BT 041623). In the first of these incidents two terrorists riding a motorcycle threw a grenade at a civilian truck which missed the vehicle and detonated in a market place. The second incident occurred 200 meters to the south of the first (BT 041621) when a terrorist threw a grenade at a bus taking civilians to a polling place. These two indiscriminate acts of terror resulted in two civilians killed and 41 civilians, one ARVN and one PF soldier wounded.

Enemy initiated activity increased significantly in QUANG NAM (P) during the middle of the week when forces subordinate to MILITARY REGION 5 conducted a series of attacks by fire interspersed with ground attacks throughout the eastern portion of the province. In the early morning hours of Wednesday, 19 March, light rocket and/or mortar attacks were launched against DANANG City, Force Logistics Command, HIEU DUC, DIEN





BAN, LIBERTY Bridge (AT 935533), and LZ BALDY (BT 133453).


Northeast of AN HCA near the LIBERTY Bridge (AT 921527), the command post of 1/5 Marines received a combination mortar and heavy ground attack from an unknown enemy force employing 82mm mortars, rockets, and RPG's. The Marines sustained moderate casualties while the attacking enemy force suffered 72 confirmed KIA's. One PW was taken in this action who was identified as a member of a sapper unit organic to the headquarters of the 2nd NVA Division. It is believed that this sapper element was task organized with the 1st VC Regiment and that the 1st VC Regiment was the principal unit involved in the attack.

During the same time frame, elements of the 51st ARVN Regiment, reinforced by ARVN Armored Cavalry Assault Troops, engaged elements of the 36th NVA Regiment in heavy contact in two locations along Route 1 between DIEN BAN and the CAU DO Bridge (BT 006677/BT 053605), with these contacts continuing sporadically until late on the afternoon of 19 March. ARVN Forces inflicted 64 KIA on the 2nd and 3rd Battalions of the frequently encountered and often decimated 36th Regiment, positively identified by no less than eight PW's who were taken in these engagements.

Southeast of DIEN BAN, both the new and the old CAU LAU Bridges (BT 092552/BT 082557) received combination mortar and ground attacks from estimated company size enemy forces in conjunction with enemy efforts elsewhere in the province on 19 March. Also, the DUY XUYEN District Headquarters (BT 066515) received a 75 round barrage of mixed 82mm mortar and B-40 rocket fire followed by a company size ground attack. In the HIEU DUC area, at least three company size ground attacks were directed against Regional Force units and two CH-46 helicopters were shot down two kilometers west of HIEU DUC District Headquarters (AT 865 703) while conducting medevac missions for G/2/7 Marines.

Enemy activity remained at a light to moderate level in QUANG NAM (P) during the balance of the week as the FRONT 4 command continued to exert limited pressure against ARVN/FWMAF throughout the DANANG TAOR. The AN HOA Combat Base received additional attacks by fire on an almost daily basis while other friendly installations including DANANG Air Base, 1st Marine Division CP, MARBLE Mountain Air Facility, Camp TIEN SHA, NSA Hospital and Mobile Construction Battalion-12 all received light amounts of incoming mortar and/or rocket fire.

Noteworthy was a sharp increase during the latter part of the week in the enemy's efforts to ambush river traffic on the SONG CUA DAI southeast of HOI AN. Friendly "SWIFT" boats as well as junks of Coastal Group LL reported several instances of receiving RPG and/or SA/AW fire from enemy firing positions along the river banks. Enemy activity along this key waterway was highlighted on 19 March when a patrol craft transiting the river five kilometers southeast of HOI AN (BT 195555) sustained two direct 75mm recoilless rifle hits which set off stored ammunition in the main cabin and resulted in heavy damage to the vessel.





Enemy swimmer activity was also reported along the eastern sector of the river during the week, thus suggesting the possibility of mining attempts on the part of water sapper units in the area.

In the immediate DANANG area, evidence of the enemy's intentions to carry out future sapper activity within the city was revealed on 19 March when National Police elements confiscated a small cache of weapons, ammunition and demolitions in a private residence on GIA LONG street. The following night a Vietnamese vehicle was blown up by a grenade while parked in front of the National Police Station.


d. QUANG TIN (P). The general enemy situation in QUANG TIN (P) during the week of 16-22 March was not unlike that experienced in QUANG Province. Activity was at a low level during the early part of the week but increased markedly on 19 March in consonance with the sharp rise in the tempo of the enemy's efforts throughout the Military Region 5 area of I Corps.

While there was no noteworthy ground action in the province during the early part of the week, nevertheless, of particular significance was the 15 March discovery by A/3/21st Infantry of 40 enemy graves three kilometers northeast of TIEN PHUOC (BT 137157). The graves contained a total of 152 NVA bodies estimated to have been two to four days old. Friendly artillery, air strikes and small arms fire were responsible for the deaths of these NVA soldiers, most likely elements of the 3rd NVA Regiment, 2nd NVA Division.

On 19 March, enemy activity increased significantly in QUANG TIN (P) as widespread attacks by fire as well as some ground attacks were recorded throughout the province. Installations receiving incoming mortar and/or rocket fire included TAM KY City, CHU LAI Air Base, LZ ROSS (BT 027342), LZ BAYONET (BT 555015), and LY TIN. Twenty houses were burned in the village of VINH GIANG (BT 240305), ten kilometers north of TAM KY City while a ground attack was conducted against TU HIEP Refugee Camp (BT 300225), one kilometer west of TAM KY City.

Sixteen kilometers northwest of TIEN PHUCC at IZ WEST (AT 990250), a significant ground probe was initiated against the headquarters of 4/31st Infantry. In this action a prisoner was taken who was identified as a member of the 3rd (AKA 31st) Regiment, 2nd NVA Division, thus confirming the continued presence of this major enemy force in the highlands of central QUANG TIN.

Elsewhere in the province during the early morning hours of 19 March, an RF compound six kilometers southeast of TAM KY City (BT 3h0177) was overrun and temporarily occupied by an estimated two NVA platoons, killing and mutilating 12 RF soldiers in the process. However, a reaction force consisting of two CAP units and PF elements subsequently repulsed the enemy force and retook the compound, resulting in 17 NVA KIA.

Following this flurry of enemy activity, ground action subsided in QUANG TIN, becoming sporadic and localized in the piedmont and lowland areas. Most of the contacts during the remainder of the week were small-scale in nature and were concentrated in the TAM KY and TIEN PHUOC areas.

One exception was a 21 March attack by an unknown size enemy force employing mortar, AW and .50 caliber fire against two companies of 2/1 Infantry, five kilometers east southeast of TIEN PHUCC (BT 165123). This intense engagement resulted in moderate friendly casualties while enemy losses were listed as two NVA KIA.

On the other hand, the enemy continued to conduct frequent attacks by fire against static installations, outposts and ground units in the eastern portion of the province. The CHU IAI Air Base was a particular target of these light attacks by fire, most probably executed by elements of the 78th Local Force Artillery Battalion.

One such attack occurred during the late evening hours of 20 March when approximately five rockets impacted on the CHU LAI beach. While this attack failed to produce any casualties or damage, considerable materiel damage occurred the following morning when an undetermined number of rockets destroyed six A-4 aircraft and caused considerable damage to twelve other A-4 aircraft, as well as destroying or damaging miscellaneous other flight line equipment. Seventeen friendly personnel were wounded in the attack.

e. QUANG NGAI (P). The general pattern of enemy initiated activity in QUANG NGAI Province during the week of 16-22 March was similar in all respects to the pattern observed in QUANG TIN Province.

Following a three day period during the early part of the week in which there was no significant ground action noted, the tempo of the enemy's efforts rose sharply during the middle of the reporting period commensurate with a corrsponding rise in the level of the enemy's efforts elsewhere in the Military Region 5 area.

Almost without exception, LZ's throughout the eastern lowlands region of the province were hit with incoming mortar and/or rocket fire on the morning of 19 March. In addition, the QUANG NGAI City Airfield sustained a light rocket attack while friendly forces at MO DUC and DUC PHO City were subjected to small attacks by fire. Twenty-eight civilians were killed or wounded when 10 rounds of 82mm mortar fire hit SON PHU Hamlet, three kilometrs northeast of QUANG NGAI City (BS 667750). Several other outposts, bridge security elements, night defensive positions and installations were recipients of small amounts of incoming as well.

Ground attacks were reported at LZ AMY, 13 kilometers west of LONG BINH (BS 474526), the NUI SUA Refugee Camp, two kilometers north of QIANG NGAI City (BS 633749) where 80% of the camp was damaged, and MO

DUC where 12 houses were destroyed and 22 civilian and military personnel were killed or wounded.

The most serious ground attack occurred at the THO LAC Refugee Camp on the outskirts of DUC PHO City (BS 805377), however, where an estimated enemy platoon infiltrated the camp and detonated numerous satchel charges, bangalore torpedoes and shaped charges. Thirty-four civilians and five PF's were killed or wounded, 100 homes were destroyed or 50% damaged and 103 families left homeless.

Of particular significance during the 19 March time frame was the capture of two PW's nine kilometers south southwest of QUANG NGAI City (BS 614647) who were identified as members of the 3rd Battalion, 2nd VC Regiment, 3rd NVA Division. The two PW's indicated that their battalion had the mission of attacking installations in the NGHIA HANH area including NGHIA HANH District Headquarters (BS 617642). The capture of these two PW's, in conjunction with information that elements of the 22nd NVA Regiment are located in close proximity to the QUANG NGAI provincial capital once again, indicates an increased threat to this area.

By the week's end, enemy activity in QUANG NGAI Province had dropped to levels experienced at the beginning of the reporting period.

- f. ANALYSIS OF THE ENEMY SITUATION. With four weeks having transpired since the inception of the NVA/VC post-TET offensive, the general thrust and direction of the enemy's activities is becoming apparent. We estimate that his efforts of the past month and the new efforts he intends to make in the coming weeks is a carefully calculated but very measured intensification of his war effort. Its purpose is to continue to attrite ARVN/FWMAF with special attention to U.S. units. He intends to increase war weariness in America through higher weekly casualty tolls while at the same time accomplishing this by means which will be unlikely to provoke serious escalation on the part of ARVN/FWMAF. The type of attack which may be expected in the coming weeks will be similar to those experienced during the past month - attacks by fire directed at military installations and sapper and ground probes against similar targets.
- 2. ENEMY OPERATIONS DURING THE PERIOD. Enemy initiated incidents increased in comparison to the previous week. Incidents consisted of 3h ground attacks, two ambushes, 33 attacks by fire, h2h incidents of harassing fire, 97 mining and booby trap incidents, two assassination incidents, two espionage incidents, five kidnapping incidents, five propaganda incidents, three sabotage incidents, five incidents of hamlet harassment, and 290 AA fire incidents.

- d. New Enemy Weapons and Equipment.
- (1) Enemy Use of Pressure-Electric Mine Fuse. USARV Mine Warfare Notes of February 1969 cite increasing RVN-wide use by the enemy of a pressure-electric mine fuse, making probing for mines with metallic probes such as a bayonet hazardous.

The type of pressure-electric mine fuse referred to, frequently called a "slap-stick", is essentially two flat pieces of wood eight to sixteen inches long which have metal contacts or exposed wires on the inner or facing sides. The contact is closed by the pressure of vehicles or personnel passing over the device.

A variation of the device is the use of boards which are approximately one inch thick at the ends and are hollowed out to approximately three-eighths of an inch thick at the center. The metal contacts are placed in the hollowed out portion and are closed by pressure on the boards.


Another variation is the use of a section of bamboo approximately one inch in diameter. The side walls are carved out until two flat strips opposing one another remain connected by the joint at each end. The bare wires or contacts are placed on the inside of the strips so that contact is made by pressure on the device.

The hazard to a prober using a metallic probe lies in the possibility that the probe may close the contact if inserted between the upper and lower portions of the fuse. On 25 August 1968, a member of a mine sweep team of Company "C", 31st Engineer Battalion (CBT) detonated this type pressure-electric fuse while probing for a mine north of PHAN THIET in the vicinity of (AN 856234) in II CTZ, causing serious injury to himself and another man.

This type pressure-electric fuse has been encountered on Route 1 in I Corps Tactical Zone from the PHU LOC area (ZD 006035) of THUA THIEN Province to the NAM 0 area (AT 926843) northwest of DANANG in QUANG NAM Province. The device has also been identified in use on Route 1 in MO DUC District of QUANG NGAT Province between MO DUC and DUC PHO City (BS 764476-BS755349).

Elsewhere in RVN, this type fuse has been routinely found in the area around PHAN THIET (AN 830087) in II CTZ and encountered throughout the Central Highlands. In III Corps, the device has been encountered throughout the Corps Tactical Zone while in IV CTZ, the fuse has been encountered near CAN THO (WS 840108).

Commanders should be aware of this type of fuse and the inherent dangers it poses to personnel probing for mines with the use of metallic



objects such as a bayonet. Sketches of this pressure-electric mine fuse will be published in a later edition of this PIR (reference USARV Mine Warfare Notes of February 1969, and USARV message 181150Z March 1969).

(2) For a special report on a new type SOVIET-made limpet mine, see ANNEX D to this PIR.





r. Reconnaissance. There were 74 long range reconnaissance patrols deployed throughout ICTZ which reported 77 sightings and ten contacts totaling 553 enemy moving in no discernible pattern. The contacts resulted in 19 enemy KIA, one PW, four structures destroyed and one secondary explosion.

s. Captured Enemy Caches.


- (1) The following significant enemy caches were captured by friendly forces in ICTZ during the reporting period:
- (a) 16 Mar: I/3/h Marines captured a weapons and ordnance cache eight kilometers north northwest of the ROCKPILE (XD 943633) in QUANG TRI Province. Contents of the cache included 301X82mm mortar rounds, 100 mixed 61/82mm mortar fuses (50 ea), one AP mine, 100 pounds of TNT, 100 blasting caps, one pair of binoculars, 23 CHICOM grenades, one 9mm pistol w/magazine and 50 rounds of ammunition, 21X60mm mortar rounds, six boxes of 60mm mortar primers, two CHICOM claymores, 18 shotgun shells, three feet of demo cord, one level bubble, 29 ponchos,





10 packs, one entrenching tool, two U.S. and three NVA helmets, 13 pairs of sandals, two pairs of sneakers, two saws, 81 picks, 2,200XAK-47 rounds, 12 canteens, 12 cooking pots, and miscellaneous cleaning gear, medical supplies and personal gear, three cases of .30 caliber ammo, 650 pounds of rice, one AK-47 magazine, canned food and 100 feet of comm wire. The cache was found in a bunker complex consisting of approximately 50 bunkers (3'X4'X6'). The bunker complex had been recently abandoned. A mortar site was also found in the area. No further details are available.

- (b) 20 Mar: M/3/4 Marines captured a munitions, ordnance and rice cache eight kilometers north northwest of the ROCKPILE (XD 943634) in QUANG TRI Province. The cache consisted of 100 pounds of TNT, one AK-47 magazine, 62X82mm mortar fuses, 18 cans of increments, three AT mines, 52X82mm mortar rounds, 127X60mm mortar rounds and 100 pounds of rice. The cache was found in a bunker complex consisting of 50 A-frame bunkers. No further details are available.
- (c) 20 Mar: M/3/4 Marines captured an ordnance and munitions cache eight kilometers north northwest of the AOCKPILE (XD 944634) in QJANG TRI Province. The cache consisted of 109X82mm mortar rounds, five cans of increments, nine cans of fuses, 10X60mm mortar rounds and 700 pounds of rice. The cache was found in a complex of 10 bunkers. Nearby seven enemy graves, one week old, were found, each containing one NVA body. Also found in the immediate area was an aid station (6'X8'X8'). No further details are available.
- (d) 20 Mar: H/2/9 Marines captured an ordnance, munitions and equipment cache two kilometers south of the ROCKPILE (XD 979540) in QUANG TRI Province. The cache consisted of 120 pounds of TNT, three fully loaded NG magazines, one AK-47, 18 cans of increments, 10X82mm mortar charges, 3,000 rounds of small arms ammo, two DT-10 mines, five blasting caps, 52X82mm mortar rounds, 127X60mm mortar rounds, 25 CHICOM grenades, one NVA hlemet, one knife, three picks, 11 entrenching tools, one pack, 16 pairs of trousers, 17 shirts, 20 pairs of drawers, 14 pairs of sandals, two pairs of new sneakers, 17 green shirts, nine mosquito nets, 200 rounds of .50 caliber ammo, 100 pounds of rice, 25 pounds of salt, one bottle of penicillin (NVA type), four bottles of aspirin, and one RPG tail assembly. The cache was found in false bottoms of an undisclosed number and type of bunkers. Also found in the area were numerous fighting holes and footprints which appeared less than 24 hours old. No further information available.
- (e) 16 Mar: D/2/327th Airborne Infantry, 101st Airborne Division (AM) captured a rice and ammunition cache lh kilometers east of PHU LCC (AU 803005) in THUA THIEN Province. The cache consisted of 2,700 pounds of paddy rice, 200 rounds of linked .30 caliber ammo, one CHICOM grenade and two empty 50 gallon drums. The cache was found in the coastal lowlands, buried under several inches of dirt in an area which was covered with light vegetation. The contents of the cache were stored in






three waterproof 55 gallon drums and three waterproof 25 gallon drums. A fish carved out of wood was placed on the ground over the location of each barrel of rice. The barrels were buried approximately five to ten meters apart. The rice was in good condition, was edible and appeared to have been in place one to two weeks. The rice was locally grown.

- (f) 17 Mar: D/1/506th Airborne Infantry, 101st Airborne Division (AM) captured an ordnance, ammunition and medicine cache 25 kilometers southwest of HUE (YD 560082) in THUA THIEN Province. The cache consisted of 16,000 blasting caps, four U.S. rifle grenades, 100X75mm recoilless rifle rounds, 5,000X.50 caliber rounds (40 cases), 6,000XAK-47 rounds (20 cases), 3,000XSKS rounds (15 cases), 27,000X9mm rounds (12 cases), 25X82mm mortar rounds, 50X60mm mortar rounds, 25 RPG rounds, 12 M-72 IAAW rounds, 20 ten-gallon cans of cotton, 20 ten-gallon cans of gauze, 15 cases of intravennous fluid with 10 pint-size bottles per case, 25 assorted medical instruments, 40,000X2 ounce bottles of penicillin (40 cases), 30 five-gallon cans of sulphur and 50-75 pounds of miscellaneous bandages and wrappings. The cache was found in an underclosed number of bunkers on a hillside. The ammunition was usable; however, the medical supplies were old and deteriorated. The cache appeared to have been established approximately six months. The area showed signs of recent activity. Two NVA bodies, each approximately six months old, were also found in the area. No further details available.
- (g) 18 Mar: 3/3 ARVN captured a munitions cache 10 kilometers south of FSB VEGHEL (YC 579938) in THUA THIEN Province. The cache consisted of 105 B-40 rockets, six claymore mines and 258 mixed 60/82mm mortar rounds. All of the ammunition was new. Also, one recently killed body and five old graves were found in the same area. No further details available.
- (h) 15 Mar: B/1/1 Cavalry, 196th LIB captured 10,000 pounds of rice nine kilometers west of TAM KY City (BT 213238) in QUANG TIN Province. The rice was found in open terrain in a rice paddy area and was stored in cement crocks. The rice, of South Vietnamese origin, further appeared to be in good condition and edible. The cache appeared to have been established approximately four months.



- d. Enemy Casualties/Losses. Ratio of enemy losses to friendly forces in ICTZ increased in comparison to the previous week. There were 1,540 KIA, 19 NVA FW's, and 21 VC FW's. Weapons captured increased in comparison to the previous week, totaling 422 individual and 53 crewserved weapons.

(2) Weather Outlook for Period 23-29 March 1969.

General: Southerly low level winds will persist over northern RVN until about 25 March. Predominantly scattered conditions will dominate most of RVN during the first part of the week. A weak surge is expected on 25 Mar bringing deteriorating conditions to RVN north of 15 degree north for two to three days. Gradually improving conditions will occur after 27 March.

ICTZ Forecast: Scattered cloudiness with ceilings at 2,500 feet occasionally broken over the mountains after noon. Patchy broken stratus clouds with ceilings at 500 feet with visibilities from one-half to two miles in fog will occur during morning. After 25 March,





ceiling of 1,000-1,500 feet will set in north of 15 degrees north, followed by decreasing cloudiness on 27 March. Precipitation: less than 0.5 inches. Surf: one to three feet except for period 25-27 March which will be two to four feet.

- j. Significant Agent, Interrogation, Document Reports. Annex B.
- k. Enemy Weaknesses. Recently there have been reports of dissension between NVA/VC Main Force and Local Force units in THUA THIEN Province over food supply, assignment of VC commanders and employment of VC units. According to a fairly reliable agent, the following complaints were discussed at a recent (date unknown) meeting held in the mountainous area of PHU LOC District between the THUA THIEN Party Committee and other communist cadre and troops:
- (1) Local Force units are required to carry any surplus food which they collect to Main Force units in the mountains; however, if the Local Force units suffer food shortages, they go hungry while the Main Force units continue to receive food from the mountains.
- (2) Commanders assigned to Local Force and guerrilla units are selected from Main Force units and they are too harsh. Most of the Local Forces have homes and relatives in the plains and are under suspicion. They are followed and controlled very closely to prevent defection.
- (3) The Local Forces are required to fight as advance elements for Main Force units operating in the plains, but the Local Forces have not been equipped with modern weapons and equipment. When Local Forces are defeated or have missed an assignment, the chiefs of cells, teams, squads and platoon leaders are unjustly replaced.

The food issue was reportedly resolved by arriving at the solution that when a Local Force unit has problems collecting food from the population, food supplies will be sent from the mountains.


While it has been established that local food problems exist in the PHU LOC (D) area, this is the first report of dissension between MF and LF units over these matters. (Reference COMNAVFORV Intsum 62-69).

The possibility of a growing animosity and corresponding divisiveness between Main Force and Local Force enemy units may exist elsewhere in I Corps Tactical Zone as well. During Operation MEADE RIVER in QUANG NAM Province, for example, NVA prisoners reported that as the cordon was drawn tighter by ARVN/FWMAF, their units were deserted by VC personnel. Commanders should be aware of this enemy weakness and exploit such situations when appropriate.

4. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE. Annex C.



- 5. CAPABILITIES AND VUINERABILITIES. Based upon a continuing evaluation of the enemy situation, and the present disposition of enemy forces within the ICTZ, the enemy courses of action in probable order of adoption are considered to be:
- a. Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare, to include ambushes, interdiction of LCC's, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and non-toxic chemical munitions. In conjunction with this effort continue attacks by fire on vital areas and key installations, and conduct limited, light to moderate ground attacks on isolated units and outposts, CIDG Camps, and District Headquarters with forces locally available.
- b. Expand present operations within the ICTZ by adopting the following courses of action in one or more of the following geographical locations/areas:
- (1) Attack installations in northern and eastern QUANG TRI (P) with up to five infantry regiment equivalents supported by one to two artillery regiments and possible armor units.
- (2) Attack QUANG TRI City with up to two to three infantry battalions, one sapper battalion, supported by one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (3) Conduct limited attacks in the HUE/PHU BAI area with elements of two to three regiments, supported by one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (4) Attack installations within the DANANG TAOR with up to six infantry regiments, supported by two rocket regiments and one sapper battalion.
- (5) Attack the TAM KY-CHU LAI Combat Base Complex with a division (-) equivalent, reinforced by one sapper battalion.
- (6) Attack QUANG NGAI City and outposts in southern QUANG NGAI (P) with one division equivalent, supported by one sapper regiment and one mortar/rocket battalion.
- c. Defend in present positions just north of the central and eastern portion of the DMZ with up to five infantry regiment equivalents, supported by one to two artillery regiments and possible armor units.
- d. Defend elsewhere in ICTZ (south of Route 9), including VC/NVA base areas with forces locally available.
- e. Withdraw into the mountains and forested areas of western I Corps and/or IAOS and North Vietnam.





- f. Reinforce the forces presently in ICTZ with two to three divisions from NVN and one division equivalent from LACS.
- g. Employ SSM's from NVN and/or border areas; employ limited air and/or naval forces from NVN or surrounding areas; employ possible armor units from the area immediately north of the IMZ and/or border areas.

h. Vulnerabilities.

- (1) Enemy forces, LOC's and surface installations are vulnerable to air, artillery and naval gunfire attacks.
- (2) Recent tactical defeats on the battlefield, sickness, hunger, shortage of ammunition and medical supplies, and austere living conditions have increased his vulnerability to psychological warfare operations.

ANNEX B (SIGNIFICANT INFORMATION DERIVED FROM INTERROGATION REPORTS, AGENT REPORTS, AND CAPTURED DOCUMENTS) TO III MAF PERINTREP 12-69.

1. QUANG TRI (P).

A. PW Hoang Van U, Cpl, of the 2nd Co, 1st Bn, 246th Regt, captured on llMar69 in the vicinity of (XD 9463) (17th ITT PW Rpt 19-69 dtd 15052hZ Mar69 and 7th ITT Spot PW Rpt 20-69 dtd 141510Z Mar69) during an attack on his position, stated that his unit's mission was to attack U.S. positions. U further stated that his Bn's AO is within a two kilometer radius of a hill (XD 938268) and that his Bn's base area is in the vicinity of (XD 9362). The PW also revealed that the Bn consists of four infantry Co's with a total of 160 men. The morale of the unit, according to the PW, is high because food and ammunition are plentiful. However, the PW also stated that the men of the unit were afraid of fighting Americans. LEN for the 2nd Co, 1st Bn is 93978 OK and a AKA for the 246th Regt is F-4. The weapons reported for the Bn include 2X81mm mortars, 8Xunk type mortars, eight medium MG's, 52 AK-47's, 24 CKC's, and LXB-40's. Reported personalities: 246th Regt Cmdr-Maj Hoang Viet LONG; 1st Bn Cmdr-SrCapt Mac Thinh DANG; 1st Co Cmdr-2ndLt PHOMG; 2nd Co Cmdr-lstLt Le Ban NHAC; 3rd Co Cmdr-lstLt VAN; 4th Co Cmdr-lstLt THE.

(G-2 CMT: This is the first report of all personalities, the LEN, and the AKA stated within the report (F-6). A move of the 246th in 00B listings has been made to relocate the 246th Regt from unlocated NVN to a location of (XD 9365).)

2. THUA THIEN (P). No significant reports.

3. QUANG NAM (P).

A. Further interrogation of FW Pham TRINH, who was captured on 8 March 1969 in the vicinity of (BT 035710) (CO USAAG ICTZ DANANG, MSG 150800Z Mar69, Msg CG, 1ST Mar Div 121346Z Mar69) stated he was the Bn Operations officer, has now revealed that his rank is MSgt and his position is platoon leader of the 3rd Plt, 4th Co, V-25 Bn, 2nd VC District DANANG. Source also stated the VC Districts DANANG are numbered from west to east 2, 1, 3 by the GVN and 1, 2, 3, by the VC/NVA and that the Q.91 is a code number for the 2nd VC District. Forces subordinate to the 2nd VC District are the V.25 Bn, the D.3 Bn, and the T.89 Bn. The area of operations of these units ic central DANANG and the area south of the city. Source stated that the 1st VC District DANANG encompasses the area of DANANG west of (BT 034798) and north of the railroad tracks. It extends north and west as far as HAI VAN Pass. Source has no knowledge of forces subordinate to this District. The 3rd VC District DANANG is that part of the city east of the HAN River. Source only knows that the D.1 Bn (AKA R.20 Bn) is subordinate to this District. These VC Districts are directly subordinate to FRONT-4. Source further stated the

38th Regt was disbanded in April 1963. The Regimental personnel were assigned to FRONT μ .

(G-2 CMT: Information reported by the PW agrees with other information reported by previous PW's concerning the VC Districts in and around DANANG City. The R.20 Bn has been reported by other PW reports as being subordinate to the 3rd VC District. Previous PW reports have also indicated that the 3° th Regt has been dissolved. All information reported (F-3).)

- 4. QUANG TIN (P). No significant reports.
- 5. QUANG NGAI (P). No significant reports.

ANNEX C (COUNTERINTELLIGENCE) TO III MAF PERINTREP 12-69

- 1. GENERAL. Viet Cong terrorism increased significantly during the reporting period, while most other counter-intelligence-related activity remained at a low level. The majority of terrorist incidents involved ground attacks or attacks by fire on populated areas. Extensive loss of life and property damage resulted from these attacks. The principal reason for the attacks is thought to be, to force refugees to return to VC controlled areas and demonstrate to the people that the GVN can not provide security for them. Captured documents and interrogation reports consistantly point to the depopulation of VC controlled areas as a major problem for the VC. Activity continued to be concentrated in the southern three provinces of ICTZ.
- 2. ESPIONAGE. The level of reported VC espionage and reconnaissance activity was very low during the period. Reports were received, however, of reconnaissance activity in the area west of Quang Tri City, in the vicinity of (YD 9307) in Thua Thien Province, Tam Ky City (BT 3222) and Chu Lai.
- 3. SABOTAGE. The period was marked by a resurgence of VC/NVA water sapper activity. Agent reports stated that water sapper units are to confine their activity to the periods during the dark phases of the moon.
- a. On 20 March 1969 an LCM detonated an underwater mine on the Cua Viet River at (YD 252623). No casualties or damage resulted.
- b. On 21 March 1969 a river patrol boat on the Cua Dai River at (BT 193558) observed a large explosion from a command detonated mine off its starboard side. No casualties or damage resulted.
- c. VC frogmen blew up a railroad bridge on 15 March 1969 at (YD 917096).
- d. The CK-2 Water Sapper Company reportedly received the mission of destroying the I Corps Bridge by the end of March.
- 4. POLITICAL AND PROPAGANDA. Viet Cong political and propaganda activity decreased to the lowest level since October 1968. Quang Ngai Province was the only area where any significant activity was noted. Agent reports and captured

documents, however, continue to report that the VC have been directed to increase troop proselyting activities and propaganda directed against the GVN pacification program. Reported propaganda themes during the period were aimed at countering the Chieu Hoi program, urging the people to return to VC controlled areas and increase production and contributions to aid the VC.

a. Quang Nam. The VC Central Office of South Vietnam (COSVN) recently instructed subordinates to prepare for an intensive military proselyting campaign because COSVN officials estimated that a major political upheavel would occur within the Republic of Vietnam Armed Forces in the near future. Tactics to be employed during the campaign will include: forcing soldier's families to urge their husbands and sons to join the struggle and demand peace, increasing agent penetrations of weak RVN military command structure; recruiting high-ranking RVN military cadre to support the VC cause; and initiating a pacifist movement among U. S. servicemen to reduce the effectiveness of the U. S. Armed Forces.

b. Quang Ngai.

- (1) On 7 March, three VC provincial cadre met in Van Tich (H) (BS 614402) to discuss the intensification of their political struggle campaign, increased troop proselyting, collection of overdue rice taxes, expansion of farm production, and establishment of economic stability within their organization. As a part of the plan, farm production centers will be established at Cay Mit (BS 760260) and Nuoc Bo (BS 770230). To aid the VC economy the VC also plan to forcibly resist any effort by the GVN to pacify that area.
- (2) The VC of Quang Ngai Provincial Committee recently organized a "Partisan Section". The Partisan Section is manned by ARVN deserters and is tasked to disseminate propaganda, assist in military proselyting and participate in forward operations (NFI). A similar section has also been placed under the control of the Quang Ngai City Committee. (See Appendix 1 for up-dating of People's Liberation Committees)
- 5. TERROR. The number of VC terrorist incidents increased sharply during the period. The majority of the incidents consisted of either ground attacks or attacks by fire on populated areas. Over 80 civilians were killed, 250 wounded and 400 structures destroyed during the week as a result of these attacks. From captured documents and interrogation

reports it is evident that the principal reason for these attacks is to force refugees to return to VC controlled areas. The discovery of a sizeable arms cache in Danang on 19 March 1969 may have forstalled more extensive VC terror activity in the City. (For a list of terrorist incidents see Appendix 2).

- 6. MISCELLANEOUS. Viet Cong tax collection, purchase of food and recruitment of civilian laborers continued at a reduced rate during the period. This activity was primarily confined to the three southern provinces of ICTZ.
- a. An agent report dated 13 March 1969 stated that the VC were forcing the people of Dien Ban District in Quang Nam Province to work as laborers.
- b. During a meeting held on 5 March 1969 at (BT 760570), VC cadre were informed that during the period from 5 to 15 March every village should recruit from 30 to 50 laborers between the ages of 16 and 45. VC guerrilla units were also ordered to infiltrate GVN controlled areas and kidnap youths to be used as laborers.
- c. On 16 March 1969 the VC took 120 kilos of rice, one pig and one buffalo from Thanh Boi (H) Thien Phouc (D) (BT 095157).

ANNEX D (SPECIAL REPORT ON NEW TYPE SOVIET-MADE LIMPET MINE) TO III MAF PERINTREP 12-69.

- 1. GENERAL. This report, reproduced from COMUSMACV (NAVFORV) Report 6 037 0054 69 dated 25 February 1969 and disseminated for general information purposes, provides capture and descriptive data of a new type SOVIET-made limpet mine presently being employed by the enemy in attacks against U.S. FWMAF and GVN shipping in the rivers and coastal harbors of South Vietnam.
- 2. CAPTURE DATA. On 16 February 1969, the body of a dead enemy swimmer was sighted in VUNG RO Bay in II CTZ vicinity (CQ 031024). Attached to the swimmer by means of a line was a semi-buoyant satchel charge which the swimmer probably had intended to use in mining one of the ammunition ships in the harbor. Army and TUY HOA Air Force Base EOD personnel responded to the call for assistance in deactivating the mine. Examination of the satchel charge revealed an unidentified, round, limpet type mine attached to one side of the charge (see APPENDIX 1). The charge itself was discovered to consist of 80-100 pounds of CHICOM plastique and 200 gram blocks of TNT. The 200 gram blocks of TNT were found to be sensitized by non-electric blasting caps. The limpet mine was intended as the booster and means of attachment for the main charge.

3. LIMPET MINE DESCRIPTION.

- a. Designation: BPM-2 limpet mine.
- b. Place and Date of Manufacture: SOVIET UNION, 1962.
- c. Dimensions and Weight: Overall diameter-10 inches; thickness (maximum)-4.5 inches; explosive weight-six pounds, 10 ounces; total weight-ll pounds, 10 ounces.
- d. Overall Description: The SOVIET BPM-2 limpet mine consists of a hemispherical aluminum case, painted haze gray, into opposite sides of which are inserted two metal fatigue detonator pencils and one metal fatigue detonator activated anti-removal trigger (see APPENDICES 2 and 3). A wire carrying handle is attached to the receptacles which hold the two detonators. On the circumference of the flat underside of the mine, in a stamped groove, are four arcs of eleven individual horseshoe magnets each. A seven-inch (diameter) access plate is held in place in the center of the underside by eight nonferrous metal screws. In the center of this access plate there is a small, black rubber bulb which maintains the water-tight integrity of the mine when the anti-removal trigger is extended above the surface (see APPENDICES 4 and 5).
- e. Charge Type: Cast tritonal covered on top and bottom by a one inch layer of TNT pellets; weight-6 pounds, 10 ounces.

- f. Initiating Devices: The initiating devices for this mine consist of two side-by-side metal fatigue detonator pencils (see APPENDICES 6 and 7). This type of initiator operates on a material density principle. When the safety ring is pulled, the firing pin spring forces the firing pin toward the detonator inserted into the opposite end of the device. The firing pin is prevented from impinging on the detonator by a tungsten wire which passes through a soft metal (lead) delay tab. Depending upon the thickness of this tab and the ambient temeprature, the wire takes a predetermined time to cut through the tab. The firing pin, no longer restrained, is driven into the detonator exploding the mine. The sapper is guided in his choice of tabs by means of six color codes which are correlated to a chart that tabulates delay times available based on the ambient temperature of the water where the mine will be used. Depending upon the tab selected and the water temperature, settings of a minimum of five minutes to a maximum of 832 hours are possible. APPEN-DIX 11 is a translation of the SOVIET chart used to assist the sapper in selection of the proper color metal tab to be used in the metal fatigue detonator pencil. The color code on the metal tab used with the two main detonators was white. Referring to APPENDIX 11 and using 27 degrees Centigrade as the sea water temperature in VUNG RO Bay on 16 February 1969, these detonators would have initiated the main charge in approximately six hours after the arming pins were pulled by the sapper. The color code on the single firing device used to booby trap the mine is yellow. No data is available for this color code, but tests indicate it would arm in 30 minutes if employed in 27 degrees Centigrade sea water.
- g. Anti-Removal Trigger; The anti-removal trigger is made up of a modified metal fatigue detonator pencil (as discussed in subparagraph f) and a spring-tensioned plunger-yoke assembly mounted in a metal cylindrical tube in the center of the mine (see APPENDIX 8). One end of the detonator pencil is slotted (see APPENDIX 9) to allow the spring-tensioned yoke assembly to fit over it at right angles (see APPENDIX 10). When the mine is attached to its target, the yoke assembly is pushed into the slotted end of the detonator pencil thereby preventing the firing pin from making contact with the detonator cap when the device is armed. After the modified detonator pencil has armed, removal of the mine from the target allows the plunger-yoke assembly to rise under spring-tension, causing release of the firing pin into the detonator. The yoke assembly must travel a full 3/8th's of an inch upward from its locked position in order for the firing pin to be released.
- h. Countermeasures: Removal of this mine from a ship's hull, once the anti-withdrawal device has armed, requires that the center mounted, spring-tensioned plunger-yoke assembly be prevented from moving from its fully depressed position. It is believed that once the two main detonators have been removed from the mine, the anti-removal device may be defeated in either one of two ways: (1) a thin (not to exceed 1/8th of an inch) bevelled edge piece of sheet steel, preferably with some sort of handles installed, may be slid between the flat underside of the mine



and the ship's hull permitting the mine to be withdrawn with minimum movement of the anti-removal trigger, or (2) the hull plate on which the mine is fastened may be cut out. Regardless of the method utilized, the anti-removal trigger must not be allowed to move more than 1/4th of an inch from its fully depressed position.

- 4. COMMENT: The last confirmed presence of limpet type mines in South Vietnam occurred in March 1968 when a ten pound Soviet or East European-made limpet mine was captured during a sweep of the NHA TRANG area by elements of the 30th ROK Regiment (COMUSMACV (NAVFORV) DOD IR 6 028 3594 68 of March 1968 refers).
- a. A Hoi Chanh, LTJG Nguyen Truong SINH, who rallied 11 January 1969, stated that two hundred water sapper and UDT personnel were trained for one month in the use of limpet type mines by Cuban instructors in HAIPHONG, North Vietnam and are presently located in the KHE SANH (XD 846382), NHA BE (CS 930805), and CA MAU (WR 165144) areas. According to SINH these UDT personnel infiltrated South Vietnam by means of the HO CHI MINH Trail as a group and, upon reaching I CTZ, split up into four separate units. Despite SINH's statement, NAVFORV intelligence files have no firm holdings on enemy UDT groups in the Delta area. Additionally, interrogation of prisoners taken from the K-93 Underwater Sapper Unit, which operated in the CAM RANH Bay area as late as August 1968, and the K-92 Sapper Unit which, though reported to be understrength at present, is targetted against NHA TRANG, indicates that enemy UDT units located in the coastal harbors also have received training in the employment of limpet mines.
- b. The circumstances under which the VUNG RO Bay BPM-2 limpet mine was found indicate that predominantly VC water sapper units are apparently somewhat reluctant to utilize this small mine by itself due to their much demonstrated predilection for large explosive charges in their watermines; however, North Vietnamese UDT units show little reluctance to using this mine as was most recently evidenced in the 21 February 1969 mining of CTF CLEARWATER assets at their night mooring positions near the mouth of the CUA VIET River (YD 342698) (refer to paragraph 1,a., III MAF PIR 8-69). In this mining, three separate underwater explosions resulted in one LCM-6 sweep boat being sunk and three LCM-8 logistic craft sustaining moderate hull damage. During an EOD search for the body of a crewman lost in the first detonation which hit the LCM-6 sweep boat, a SOVIET-made limpet mine similar in all respects to the VUNG RO Bay mine was found on the river bottom beside the mined LCM-6. Thus it can be reasonably concluded that limpet mines were utilized in all three minings. However, it must be anticipated that the enemy currently possesses UDT units on the CUA VIET, in the coastal harbors, and possibly in the MEKONG Delta that have supplies of limpet mines and will increase their attempts to use these mines either individually or as part of a larger charge against Allied shipping throughout the waterways of the Republic of Vietnam.






TOP VIEW OF LIMPET MINE








BOTTOM VESS OF LIMPET KINE SHOWING EAGRETS AND ASTI-REBOVAL PRICGER










FLUNGER-YÖKE ASSEMBLY



1. CENERAL ENEMY SITUATION. The governit let all of enemy activity throughout I Corps Tactical Zone during the past week was substantially lower than that experienced in recent weeks. The majority of significant items of intelligence interest came from the two northern provinces and these took the form of significant sized caches and a handful of PW's from new or seldom contacted units.

The total number of enemy initiated grand incidents was only 313 for the week, the lowest number recorded since the first week in February. In the critical categories of large and small scale grand attacks as well as assaults by fire, the poster of such incidents was markedly down.

This same trend was noted in other cross of enemy activity. For the first time in six weeks the amount of over incoming experienced was below 1,000 rounds, and the 765 rounds and during the period more closely approximated the pre-407 nucley then the post-TET levels of same activity. Enemy KEA's felt in a like number with the total of 936 for the week being the lowest number resident since mid-February.

The level of VC/VCI activity or counterintelligence interest also declined considerably during the requiring period, particularly in the southern three provinces where terrorises and Vo population control measures have been intensive over the period and the activity was down from province the rest activity was down from province the period of the land of the VC capabianty to exclusion in the more manifestated of UCT?

Energy applorage and intelligence of itelligence deligible activities continue to be the subject of frequent reports from the northern provinces. Much of this activity appears to be targeted against in teams and other pacification assets.

a. QUANG TRI (P). Unlike the providing seven days in which Quant TRI (P) was the most active area in the T Corps Tactical Zone, the past week of 10 March-5 April has withesend a noticeable decrease in ground action throughout the northernmost province of MVN.

The B-5 FRONT area, having produced the most significant activity within QUANG TRI (P) for the past three consecutive reporting periods, was relatively quiet this week.

DMZ sightings/incidents dropped from 175 to 159 during the period with a corresponding decrease in the average number of daily sightings/incidents from 25 to 23. Thirty-seven sightings/incidents were recorded north of the BEN HAI River. The majority of sightings were by means of radar acquisition and visual observation and involved the movement of squad to platoon size enemy units.

One significant incident occurred in the western reaches of the DMZ on h April when a forward observer adjusted an artillery fire mission on an estimated platoon size enemy force moving just south of the BEN HAI River (YD 908675), 8.5 kilometers north of FSB RUSSELL. Friendly artillery fire resulted in one large and ten small secondary explosions as well as the destruction of one truck and 15 confirmed enemy KIA's.

Random incidents of harassing mortar/rocket fire emanating from within the demilitarized some continued to be reported by ARVN/FWMAF operating in the northern pertions of the province. Two such incidents were
recorded in the GIO LINH area this week. In the first of these incidents,
approximately 11 rounds of 32mm mortar fire impacted in a minefield at
A-2 Base (YD 2127111) on 30 March. The enemy fired from a position
approximately three kilometers west northwest (YD 185750) of the friendly
barrier installation. However, the attack failed to produce any friendly
casualties or damage. The second incident occurred on 2 April when a
3rd Marine Tank Battalion patrol operating 2.5 kilometers west northwest
of GIO LINH (YD 190710) received seven rounds of mixed 60/81mm mortar
fire from enemy firing positions one kilometer to the northwest of the
tank patrol's location (YD 186752). This attack also failed to produce
any friendly casualties or damage. Counterbattery fire directed on the
enemy firing positions in both incidents resulted in the silencing of
the enemy mortars.

One noteworthy ground engagement occurred in the CON THIEN-GIO LINH area on 1 April when 1/2 ARVN contacted an estimated platoon size enemy force three kilometers southwest of A-3 Base (155702), killing eight of the enemy. Although there was no identification of the enemy unit encountered, it most likely involved elements of the 31st Group as this is their normal operating area. Subsequent to the engagement, the ARVN found a significant munitions cache in a tunnel in the same vicinity. For further details of this cache, see paragraph 2.s. of this PIR.

Of particular interest with respect to enemy order of battle in the CON THIEN-GIO LINH was the readout of a document captured in an ARVN contact six kilometers west of GIO LINH (YD 155735) on 23 March (paragraph 1.a., PIR 13-69 refers). The document suggests that elements of the 270th NVA Regiment may be operating south of the DMZ. An LBN shown

on the document is that associated with the 4th Company, 4th Battalion, 270th Regiment. This battalion was last identified south of the BEN HAI River by a PW captured on 26 August 1968 (YD 170690) in the same general area. At the present time, III MAF 00B carries the 270th Regiment north of GIO LINH (YD 1782) in the VINH LINH Special Zone. Additional evidence will be required to confirm that elements of the 270th have moved south of the DMZ.

Ground fighting along the central DMZ FRONT was at a low level this week following last week's major contacts with elements of the 27th NVA Regiment. Enemy efforts in this region were limited to a few scattered etc. ks by fire against friendly tactical units. As but one example, an illery position of L/h/12 Marines, located five kilometers north northast of CAM LO (YD 136646), received 18 rounds of lhOmm rocket fire on hapril. However, the attack failed to produce any friendly casualties or damage.

Operation MONTANA MAULER terminated seven kilometers northeast of the RCCKPILE (YD 0363) on 3 April. This 12-day operation involving elements of the 1st Brigade, 5th Infantry Division (MECH) and elements of the 2nd ARVN Regiment resulted in 271 enemy KIA's as well as the capture of 23 individual and six crew-served weapons. While the majority of enemy casualties in this operation were assessed against the 27th NVA Regiment, a few casualties were also believed to have been inflicted on elements of the 31st Group.

To the west of the IAOTIAN salient, elements of Task Force REMAGEN, 2/3 Marines and the 2nd ARVN Regiment continued to meet with light enemy resistance during the week in the MAINE CRAG AO.

In addition to a few sporadic ground contacts with probable rear carrice elements along Route 616, friendly forces participating in this operation were subjected to several attacks by fire during the period. Although most of these attacks were light in nature and involved only small amounts of incoming, three barrages totaling in excess of 100 rounds of 82mm mortar fire were directed against B/1/61st Infantry (MECH) and C/1/77th Armor while operating along the IAOTIAN border, ten kilometers south of IANG VEI (XD 770263) on 31 March. These attacks, launched from enemy firing postiions in IAOS (XD 760270/760255/760227), produced only light friendly casualties however. One other attack by fire emanating from IAOS (XD 734254) was recorded on 5 April when 12 rounds of unknown caliber artillery impacted 500 meters outside the perimeter of 1/3 Marines CP in the vicinity of LZ SAIGON (XD 821281). These attacks marked the first such incidents of enemy incoming fire received from IAOS since the termination of the DEWEY CANYON operation.

Noteworthy was a company size ground attack conducted against E/2/3 Marines in night defensive positions at LZ BROWN (830232), 19 kilometers south of KHE SANH on 4 April. The enemy, employing RPG's, 60mm mortars

and SA/AW fire, attacked the Marines in squad size waves from two directions. Sixteen NVA soldiers were killed in this intense two hour engagement in which the Marines sustained only light casualties.

Further interrogation of two PW's captured in a bunker along Route 616 (XD 897229) by H/2/3 Marines on 21 March and initially identified as members of a 19th Construction Company, 4th Battalion, 330th Regiment (paragraph l.a., PIR 12-69 refers) has now revealed that their company is actually subordinate to the 75th Engineer Battalion, 559th Transportation Group. According to the PW's, the mission of their value to repair and protect that part of Route 926/616 from KO BOC (% 705259). located eight kilometers west of the SVN border in LAOS to C I (XD 901 230) -- the point immediately above the SE PON River where Reale 616 turns sharply northward. Of particular interest was the testimony of one of the two Pwis who stated that between 12 and 16 March he wheerved as many as seven trucks per night transporting rice into the MAINE GRAG area via Route 616. During this time some of the trucks were hit by tactical air strikes. This information relates to that previously obtained from 3rd Marine Division reconnaissance elements in late February and early March who reported vehicular traffic on this road. The information is also related to the large caches of rice uncovered by the 3rd Marines in areas in the vicinity of Route 616.

Friendly forces operating in this remote region of southwestern QUANG TRI (P) continued to add to the sizeable stockpile of food and ordnance already uncovered in this operation by the additional discoveries this week of significant caches in the MAINE CRAG AO. For further details concerning these caches, refer to paragraph 2.s. of this report.

As an incidental but related item, it should be pointed out that a cache of 1,000 tons of rice initially reported in III MAF PIR 13-69 has been reassessed and as of the close of this reporting period, the total now aggregates 356 tons.

Elsewhere in QUANG TRI (P), one noteworthy ground engagement in the southeast quadrant of the province occurred on 2 April when 2/1 ARVN made a brief but sharp contact with an unknown size enemy force while conducting a search and clear operation in Base Area 101 (YD 369382), 15 kilometers south southeast of QUANG TRI City. Seventeen enemy were killed in the engagement without friendly losses. Although the enemy unit in contact was not identified, elements of the 814th Battalion, 7th FRONT were believed to have been involved.

b. THUA THIEN (P). No changes were noted in the general enemy situation in THUA THIEN (P) during the week of 30 March-5 April. Enemy activity was at a low level throughout the province for the duration of the reporting period as major enemy tactical units subordinate to MRTTH avoided decisive engagements with friendly forces.

The majority of ground action was again concentrated in the western reaches of the province and was incident to the on-going MASSACHUSETTS STELLER operation. Elements of the lolst Airborne Division (AM) continued to make light contact with the enemy in this major operation now in its fifth week. However, these contacts were friendly initiated for the most part and involved no greater than platoon size enemy units. One such encounter occurred 10.5 kilometers southwest of FSB VEGHEL (YC 498 %) on 31 March when D/1/502nd Airborne Infantry engaged an estimated many platoon in a brief contact which saw the friendly company inflict he KIA's on the enemy while sustaining only three WIA's.

Thile failing to encounter any serious ground opposition, elements of the 101st were successful in uncovering additional enemy caches during the week in the MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER AO (see paragraph 2.s. of this PIR for further details). In addition, elements of the 2/327th Airborne Infantry, operating in the southern reaches of the A SHAU Valley, discovered two Russian 2½ ton trucks two kilometers south of the abandoned A SHAU Special Forces Camp (YC 503814) on 3 April. Both vehicles appeared to be in operating condition with the exception of missing tires on one and the radiator and battery stripped from the other.

Operation MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER produced significant enemy order of battle intelligence on 1 April when D/1/506th Airborne Infantry captured a prisoner of war from the 816th Battalion, 9th NVA Regiment in the immediate vicinity of FSB VEGHEL (YD 548030). The capture of this PW, together with documents taken from the body of an enemy soldier killed in a contact at this fire support base on 13 March (paragraph 1.b., PIR 11-69 refers), confirms that at least one battalion of this major enemy force has returned to and is presently operating along the western extremities of Route 5h7 in the central A SHAU Valley area.

c. CUANG NAM (P). For the second consecutive week, a reduction was noted in the tempo of the enemy's efforts in QUANG NAM (P). Activity throughout the province was at the lowest level since mid-March as most major enemy forces subordinate to FRONT h avoided contact with ARVN/FWMAF.

The week of 30 March-5 April produced only one large-scale ground engagement with the enemy in QUANG NAM (P). That engagement took place in the southern DANANG TAOR on 30 March when the 37th and 39th ARVN Ranger Battalions contacted a battalion size enemy force five kilometers south southeast of HILL 55 (AT 985574). The ARVN Rangers inflicted 44 confirmed KIA's on this unit, identified by a PW as the D.7 Independent Battalion (formerly subordinate to the 38th NVA Regiment). As a matter of passing interest, since 25 March the area where this contact took place has been the scene of no less than four significant contacts in which elements of the 1st ARVN Ranger Group have assessed a total of some 342 confirmed KIA's against FRONT 4 forces including elements of the 36th and the 38th NVA Regiments.

It is significant to note that while recent contacts have been made with these units and also with the 31st and 11lst NVA Regiments, no necontacts have been made with either the 1st VC or the 21st NVA Regiment of the 2nd NVA Division. The former unit has been held in the triangle formed by QUE SON, HIEF DUC and NONG SON, with occasional forays into the ARIZONA since December. The latter unit has been held in the general vicinity of the ARIZONA area - CNG THU Slope since September 1968. However, it has been a subject of concern that ARVN/FWMAF operations are not contacting these units in their normal AO's. The like-lihood that these units of the 2nd NVA Division have withdrawn to the southwest is increasing as more time passes without it what a stact with these forces.

Elsewhere in the southern DANANG TAOR, ground a lien coing the week was widely scattered in areas of previous engagements. Therets of the 5th Marines had several light contacts with squad to platoon size enemy forces in the area north and east of AN HOA, with the Marine encountering sporadic enemy mortar fire. Further to the west during the latter part of the week, elements of 3/1 Marines killed a total of 73 enemy in a series of contacts between HILL 55 and DIEN BAN (BT 022602) during the period 3-5 April. And the ROK Marines continued to engage small groups of enemy throughout the reporting period in their normal AO in the HOI AN area.

On the other hand, enemy ground fire was successful in downing two friendly aircraft this past week. A CH-46 helicopter transporting a 1st Marine Division reconnaissance team was shot down by heavy AW fire in the ANTENNA Valley (AT 905377), ten kilometers southeast of AN HOA on 1 April. Both pilots were killed while nine members of the recon team were wounded and evacuated. Three days later in the same general area (AT 957426), a jet aircraft on a close air support mission took .30 caliber fire and crashed and burned, killing the pilot.

On 31 March, the 7th Marines, elements of the 51st ARVN Regiment and 3/26 Marines commenced Operation OKLAHOMA HILLS 26 kilometers southwest of DANANG (AT 798550) with the mission of destroying enemy forces, caches and installations in the HAPPY Valley-CHARLIE RIDGE area. While contact with the enemy has not as yet been heavy, prisoners from both the 31st and 111st NVA Regiments (AT 906636/AT 836635) were taken during the first week of this operation, thus fixing these two units in their normal AO's in the CHARLIE RIDGE-BA NA area.

The latter part of the week produced two signficant terrorist incidents in the immediate veinity of DANANG. In the first of these incidents which occurred on 4 April, ten civilians and PF's were killed while 31 others were wounded when a VC terrorist threw a satchel charge into the midst of an audience watching a talent show in BINH KY Village (BT 050698), eight kilometers south of the DANANG Air Base. The following night two Vietnamese civilians were killed and 17 others wounded in

DANANG EAST when a terrorist threw a plastic explosive charge into a group of people attending a meeting in AN THUCNG Village (BT 049762), 2.5 kilometers south of III MAF Headquarters.

The NAM O region northwest of DANANG was another area which experienced light enemy activity during the week. A possible sabotage attempt on the NAM O Bridge was preempted on 30 March when a platoon ambush killed five of eight enemy observed in two sampans in the vicinity of the bridge (AT 914834). The following night the 58th Transportation Company area (AT 945815) in the vicinity of Force Logistics Command received 20 rounds of mortar fire. An FLC ambush observed the enemy firing from a position two kilometers southwest of NAM O Bridge (AT 920820) and took the position under fire with unknown results.

Of more than passing interest in QUANG NAM (P) this past week is an NVA HOI CHANH sergeant who rallied to C/1/5 Marines 2.5 kilometers east of LIBERTY Bridge (AT 958533) on 30 March. Interrogation of this individual who is familiar with radio frequencies and procedures of high level commands has revealed that he is a member of the 1st Reconnaissance Battalion, FRONT 4. The HOI CHANH stated that his CO has been reconnoitering HILL 55 and other American positions since 23 March and that reconnaissance was to be completed by 2 April. He believes that these positions will be attacked two to three weeks after completion of reconnaissance. According to this rallier, units scheduled to conduct simultaneous attacks include the 36th NVA Regiment, the 91st Battalion of the 2nd District (AKA: 3rd Sapper Battalion), and a regimental equivalent consisting of battalions which were former subordinates of the disbanded 38th NVA Regiment.

Another matter of increasing intelligence interest in QUANG NAM (P) is the possibility that the 90th NVA Regiment has moved into the province. Additional evidence supporting this possibility manifested itself in the form of a second FW and a captured document, both of which are associated with the 90th Regiment. The FW, captured 7.5 kilometers northeast of AN HOA (AT 870524) by H/2/5 Marines on 31 March, has been identified as a member of the 7th Battalion, SONG HUONG Regiment. The document, captured seven kilometers north northwest of THUONG DUC Special Forces/CIDG Camp (ZC 125597) on 2 April, is in the form of an award certificate signed by the PO of the 90th Regiment.

At the present time, the information so far obtained from the aforementioned PW and the PW captured in the HOI AN area on 23 March (BT 158 543) (paragraph 1.c., PIR 13-69 refers) makes it clear only that these new prisoners give unit designations that can be related to the 90th Regiment, that included in their units are a number of men who had previously served with the 90th Regiment, and that at least one of the PW's is unusually knowledgeable about the history of the 90th Regiment. It is significant to note that the two PW's captured to date were not taken

as a result of major contacts with the enemy units, nor did either of the prisoners state that they were members of the 90th Regiment, but merely gave unit organizations that could be associated with the 90th.

It is currently estimated that these personnel identified in QUANG NAM (P) are members of several infiltration groups who were trained under the aegis of the 90th Regiment before being infiltrated into the province.

d. QUANG TIN (P). Enemy initiated activity was at a very low level in QUANG TIN (P) throughout the week of 30 March-5 April. Ground actical was negligible as major enemy forces remained withdrawn and out of contact with friendly tactical units in the piedmont and highland areas.

The only significant incident within the province occurred on 30 March when a CAP unit detained 100 VC suspects and captured 10 tons of rice during a sweep of a bunkered area eight kilometers west northwest of TAM KY City (BT 226254) on 30 March.

e. QUANG NGAI (P). A significant decrease was noted in the level of enemy activity in QUANG NGAI (P) during the week of 30 March-5 April following the previous week in which a light to moderate level of activity was maintained throughout the piecmont and eastern lowland areas of the province.

What few ground engagements there were during the period involved no greater than platoon size enemy forces and did not produce any significant results. The enemy's efforts were principally characterized by few random attacks by fire of low intensity. The QUANG NGAI Citadel-headquarters of the 2nd ARVN Division--continued to be a favorite target for small rocket/mortar attacks. Two light mortar attacks against this friendly installation were recorded during the early part of the week. However, these two attacks produced only light casualties and material damage.

Operation QUYET THANG 25, a 4th ARVN Regiment controlled combat sweep operation south of QUANG NGAI City terminated on 1 April. This highly successful 12 day operation which commenced on 20 March and involved elements of the 4th, 5th and 6th ARVN Regiments and 1/4 ACAT resulted in 592 enemy KIA and the capture of seven VC PW's as well as 68 individual and 10 crew-served weapons.

f. ANALYSIS OF THE ENEMY SITUATION. The tempo and intensity of enemy activity during the past week was not in keeping with that which has been experienced since the inception of the communist post-TET offensive. It is too early to tell whether this diminution of enemy activity is a momentary pause or a signal of the waning of the NVA/VC offensive. However, it has been noted that there is a reduction in the activities of both the 2nd and 3rd NVA Divisions and that it is probable that these

CONFIDENTIAL

units are intentionally avoiding contact with our forces. It is also significant that both large and small-scale enemy initiated attacks are markedly down. However, there continues to be a number of agent reports and prisoner interrogations indicating that there will be renewed offensive efforts by the enemy in the coming weeks.

The present intentions of the enemy are not clear. The possibilities of disengagement cannot be dismissed. However, in light of any clear evidence of a new direction the enemy intends to pursue, we maintain our estimate as outlined last week: that the enemy intends to maintain a level of offensive activity above that which characterized the pre-TET battlefield environment but without any major offensive efforts which might provoke escalation on the part of ARVN/FWMAF.

- 2. ENEMY OPERATIONS DURING THE PERIOD. Enemy initiated incidents decreased in comparison to the previous week. Incidents consisted of eight ground attacks, two ambushes, 13 attacks by fire, 183 incidents of harassing fire, 78 mining and booby trap incidents, one assassination incident, 11 espionage incidents, two kidnapping incidents, eight propaganda incidents, seven sabotage incidents, 135 AA fire incidents.

r. Reconnaissance. There were 66 long range reconnaissance patrols deployed throughout ICTZ which reported 47 sightings and 11 contacts totaling 339 enemy moving in no discernible pattern. The contacts resulted in 19 enemy KIA, one PW captured, three secondary explosions and three structures destroyed.

s. Captured Enemy Caches.

- (1) The following is a cumulative report of enemy food, ordnanc. and materiels captured by friendly forces participating in Operation MAINE CRAG as of 051800H April: 356 tons of rice, 7,000 pounds salt 7,500 pounds sugar, 100 tons lard, one ton powdered milk, 5,316 pounds TNT, 600 meters comm wire, one AT mine, 10 CHICOM grenades, 410 AM magazines, 11 claymores, 561 fuses, 50 small bundles of clothing, two rolls of plastic wrapping, 26 packs, 303 gas masks, 2,200 spiles, three drucks. 44X122mm rockets, 10,164X82mm mortar rounds, 910X60mm mortar rounds, 4,069 RPG rounds, eight 37mm rounds, 100X57mm RR rounds, 55X75mm RR rounds, 894,960 rounds small arms ammunition, 7,500%12.7mm rounds, 16% 82mm RR rounds, 384 individual weapons and 15 crew-served weapons. The initial estimates of the rice caches found in this operation (1,000 tons) were erroneous. These estimates, made under combat conditions, were based on a standard of 100 kilo bags. Later assessment revealed that a standard of 50 kilo bags was accurate. This factor, plus at least one incident of redundant reporting, resulted in a sizeable rice accounting error. The reassessment aggregates a total of 356 tons.
- (2) The following significant enemy caches were captured by friendly forces in ICTZ during the reporting period:
- (a) 30 Mar: C/1/77th Armor captured a weapons and ammunition cache 11 kilometers south of IANG VEI (XD 790255) in southwestern QUANG TRI (P) while participating in Operation MAINE CRAG. Contents of this cache included 1,120X82mm mortar rounds, 219X6Cmm mortar rounds, 3,500X12.7mm MG rounds, 86X75mm RR rounds, 20X37mm AA rounds, 1,500X7.62 mm rounds, 3,400XAK-47 rounds, two RPG rounds, one AK-50 rifle and 300 CHICOM gas masks. The cache was found in a complex of 25 huts. No further details are available.
- (b) 30 Mar: 1/2 ARVN captured an ordnance, food and equipment cache 11.5 kilometers northeast of the ROCKPILE (YD 055645) in northern QUANG TRI Province while participating in Operation LAM SON 271. Contents of the cache included one .50 caliber MG, two LMG's, three B-40 launchers (one CHICOM; two NVN), five AK-47 rifles, one .45 caliber pistol, three AT mines, 3,300 pounds rice, 15 cans meat (NFI), 200XB-40 rockets and miscellaneous medicine. No further details are available.
- (c) 02 Apr: 1/2 AdVN captured an ordnance and ammunition cache seven kilometers northwest of CAM LO (YD 075645) in northern QUANG TRI (P) while participating in Operation LAM SON 271. Contents of the

cache included 100X82mm mortar rounds and 60 stick grenades. No further details are available.

- (d) Oh Apr: 4/2 ARVN captured an ammunition cache three kilometers southwest of A-3 Base (YD 155702) in northern QUANG TRI Province. Contents of the cache included 100X82mm mortar rounds, 150X60mm mortar rounds and 10,000 rounds of 7.62mm ammunition. All ammunition was destroyed. The cache was captured incident to a contact in the same area in which the ARVN killed eight enemy. No further details are available.
- (e) 05 Apr: 3/2 ARVN captured an ordnance, ammunition and equipment cache ten kilometers south southeast of KHE SANH (XD 870313) in southwestern QUANG TRI (P) while participating in Operation MAINE CRAG. Contents of this cache included 50 AT mines, 81 claymore mines, 450XRPC-2 rounds, 250XRPG-7 rounds, 124X82mm RR rounds, 35X75mm 3R rounds, 400X82mm mortar rounds, 750X60mm nortar rounds, 1,600X.50 caliber MG rounds, 1,250 RFG charges, one AA MG sight, four MG tripods w/wheels and one 82mm RR cleaning rod. The cache was found in two bunkers measuring three meters by one meter by five meters, and was estimated to have been established for a period of two to three months. No further details are available.
- (f) 30 Mar: 3/3 ARVN captured an ammunition and equipment cache six kilometers north northwest of the abandoned A SHAU Special Forces Camp (YC 473890) in the A SHAU Valley in western THUA THIEN (P) while participating in Operation LAM SON 265. The cache consisted of one Russian truck (NFI) and 1,000 rounds of .50 caliber MG ammunition. No further details are available.
- (g) 01 Apr: B/1/506th Airborne Infantry captured an ordnance and ammunition cache three kilometers north of FSB VEGHEL (YD 557
 067) in western THUA THIEN (P) while participating in Operation MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER. Contents of the cache included 144X60mm mortar rounds,
 18X82mm mortar rounds, 10 cases C-4 explosive (1,000 pounds), six RPG-2
 rounds, 5,000 AK-57 rounds, and three large packages of detonators. The
 cache was found in three bunkers which had been partially destroyed by
 air strikes. The case of C-4 appeared to be of Russian origin. Also, a
 flussian packing list was found among the cache. No further details are
 available.
- (h) Ol Apr: Recon/1/502nd Airborne Infnatry captured a weapons and ammunition cache seven kilometers east of TA BAT (YC 193957) in western THUA THIEN (P) while participating in Operation MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER. Contents of the cache included 117X60mm mortar rounds, 266X82 mm mortar rounds, 407 RPG boosters, 791 RPG rounds, 8,000X.50 caliber MG rounds, four 8-inch claymore mines, four 12-inch claymore mines, 35 cases of mortar fuses, 768XAK-17 rounds, 12 bolt-action SKS rifles, three semi-automatic SKS rifles, one M-79 grenade launcher, four CHICOM 7.62 MG's, two French LMG's, two French 9mm SMG's and one U.S. M-2 carbine.

The cache was found in a hut with bunkers 10 feet by 15 feet. All of the materiel in the cache was found in the hut. The cache was old but usable. No further details are available.

- (i) 05 Apr: B/2/327th Airborne Infantry captured a weapons, ammunition and rice cache five kilometers southeast of the abandoned A SHAU Special Forces Camp (YC 541815) in western THUA THIEN (P) while participating in Operation MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER. Contents of the cache included one M-1 rifle, 120X60mm mortar rounds and 400 pounds of rice. The cache was estimated to have been in place two to three months but was in good condition. No further details are available.
- (f) 31 Mar: D/1/52nd Infantry, 196th LIB captured a rice cache seven kilometers south of HOI AN (BT 139505) in QUANG NAM (P). The cache consisted of hh,000 pounds of rice which was found in a series of hootches, tunnels and false bunker roofs which were located in open terrain. The rice was stored in crocks and was in good condition. No further details are available.
- (k) 29 Mar: D/4/31st Infantry, 196th LIB captured an ammunition cache seven kilometers southeast of HIEP DUC (AT 957197) in QUANG TIN (P). The cache consisted of 100 RPG rounds, 22,500 rounds of AK-47 ammunition and nine 60mm mortar rounds. The ammunition was found in an open pit which measured 6'X6'X6'. The pit was located in heavy undergrowth. Some of the RPG rounds were in crates which gave indications of Russian origin. Empty .50 caliber ammunition crates were also found near the pit. The put was situated just off a main trail. A detainee who led friendly troops to the cache stated that three weeks ago the cache was twice as large as that which was found. The length of time the cache had been established was unable to be determined.

(2) Weather Outlook for the Period 5-12 April 1969.

General: A strong surge in the northeast monsoon will affect northern HVN at the beginning of the period, and spread south and westward the following day. The surge is expected to have a dominant effect until the midweek with decreased cloudiness over northern HVN the remainder of the period.

ICTZ Forecast: Overcast with occasionally broken ceilings from 500-1,000 feet. Visibilities 1-3 miles in fog and drizzle. By 8 April, gradual improving conditions expected with 1,500 feet ceilings and 3-5 miles visibility in fog and haze. Early morning fog and stratus will have ceilings 500 feet and 3 mile visibility. Precipitation: less than 0.5 inch except 0.5-1.0 in the mountains. Surf: 3-5 feet, after the 8th surf will be 2-4 feet.

- 4. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE. Annex C.
- 5. CAPABILITIES AND VULNERABILITIES. Based upon a continuing evaluation of the enemy situation, and the present disposition of enemy forces within the ICTZ, the enemy courses of action in probable order of adoption are considered to be:
- a. Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare, to include ambushes, interdiction of LOC's, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and non-toxic chemical munitions. In conjunction with this effort continue attacks by fire on vital areas and key installations, and conduct limited, light to moderate ground attacks on isolated units and outposts, CIDG Camps, and District Headquarters with forces locally available.
- b. Expand present operations within the ICTZ by adopting the following courses of action in one or more of the following geographical locations/areas:
- (1) Attack installations in northern and eastern QUANG TRI (P) with up to five infantry regiment equivalents supported by one to two artillery regiments and possible armor units.
- (2) Attack QUANG TRI City with up to two to three infantry battalions, one sapper battalion, supported by one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (3) Conduct limited attacks in the HUE/PHU BAI area with elements of two to three regiments, supported by one mortar/rocket battalion.

- (4) Attack installations within the DANANG TACR with up to six infantry regiments, supported by two rocket regiments and one sapper battalion.
- (5) Attack the TAM KY-CHU LAI Combat Base Complex with a division (-) equivalent, reinforced by one sapper battalion.
- (6) Attack QUANG NGAI City and outposts in southern QUANG NGAI (P) with one division equivalent, supported by one sapper regiment and one mortar/rocket battalion.
- c. Defend in present positions just north of the central and eastern portion of the DMZ with up to five infantry regiment equivalents.
- d. Defend elsewhere in ICTZ (south of Route 9), including VC/NVA base areas with forces locally available.
- e. Withdraw into the mountains and forested areas of western I Corps and/or LAOS and North Vietnam.
- f. Reinforce the forces presently in ICTZ with two to three divisions from NVN and one division equivalent from LAOS.
- g. Employ SSM's from NVN and/or border areas; employ limited air and/or naval forces from NVN or surrounding areas; employ possible armor units from the area immediately north of the DMZ and/or border areas.

h. Vulnerabilities.

- (1) Enemy forces, LOC's and surface installations are vulnerable to air, artillery and naval gunfire attacks.
- (2) Recent tactical defeats on the battlefield, sickness, hunger, shortage of ammunition and medical supplies, and austere living conditions have increased his vulnerability to psychological warfare operations.



He further stated that his Co was discussing plans for attacking FSB VEGHEL on the night of lapr69.

(G-2 CMT: This Bn has been carried unlocated due to lack of information. A map captured on 29Mar69 gave the location of 816th Bn, 9th Regt as in the vicinity of (YD 5097). The subjects unit is possibly located in the vicinity of (YC 5097), as given on the map (F-3). Enemy units in this area may be planning to attack FSB VEGHEL (F-3).)

3. QUANG NAM (P).

A. Hoi Chanh, Van Cong HUNG, Sgt, 1st Recon En, 70A Section, Group 山, MR-5 who returned to FWMAF on 30Mar69 in the vicinity of (AT 958533) (13th ITT Rot Nr 02-04-69) provided the following organizational information: MR-5 (AKA T.15) consists of a Command Post Section, G-2 Intellgence Section, G-3 Political Section, G-4 Rear Service Section, and G-5 Information Section. Under T.15 is Group 44 which consists of 70A Staff Section, 70B Political Section, and 70C Rear Service Section. The 70A Staff Section has subordinate, the 36th Regt, 89th Regt, 31st Regt, 1st Recon Bn and District 2 DANANG City Unit. The 70B Political Section is composed of unknown political elements which support units of 70A. The 70C Rear Service Section is composed of the BAC HAI Bn, K-800, K-650 and K-625 Transportation Ens and other unknown supporting elements. Locations of other units reported by the source are: T.15 Forward Command Post (AT 986526) with a second Forward Command Post at (BT 027532), 1stBn and Command Post 36th Regt (AT 996552), 2nd and 3rd Bns of 36th Regt (BT 001 558), 1st Bn and Command Post 89th Regt (AT 980563), 91st Bn, District #2 DANANG City Unit (AT 950550), Command Post 91st En (ET 003558), Command Post 1st Recon Bn with a security Co of 70A Military cadre schools (AT 79h3), 2nd Co, 1st Recon Bn (BT 023522), 1st Co, 1st Recon Bn (AT 870530), K-800 Transportation Bn (BT 005552), K-625 Transportation Bn (BT 012520), K-650 Transportation Bn and 78th Hospital Bn, QUANG DA Province and BAC HAI Rear Service Bn (AT 9739), 13th Mortar Co, T.15 (BT 043549). Rice and ammunition caches and collection points are located vicinity (BT 0048/AT 9852/AT 9350). The present mission of the 1st Reconnaissance Bn is to make a reconnaissance of HILL 55 and an unknown outpost. These OP's have been under reconnaissance since 23Mar69 and HUNG believes the reconnaissance will be completed by 2Apr69. Normally a post is attacked two to three weeks after completion of reconnaissance.

Post mentioned by HUNG are to be attacked at the same time. Units to participate in the attack are the 36th Regt, 89th Regt, 91st Bn, and District \$2 DANANG City Unit. The returnee claims that the 36th and 89th Regts are made up of two infantry Bns with three infantry Co's and one possible weapons Bn with a sapper Co, a reconnaissance and an engineer Co. There are no companies directly subordinate to the Regts and specialist must be requested from T.15 if required. HUNG has been working with T.15 as a reconnaissance squad leader since June 1968.

(G-2 CMT: Hoi Chanh appears highly knowledgeable in the compostion of higher commands. All locations evaluated (F-3). This is the first report of the 89th Regt (F-6).)

B. PW Nguyen Van MINH, 4th Co, 7th Bn, SONG HUONG Regt, who was captured on 31Mar69 in the vicinity of (AT 870524) (13th IFI Rpt C1-04-69, stated that the present mission of his unit was to observed U.S. Forces in the area of (AT 874525) and to engage units of small size. PW further stated that his Company has been operating in the area of (AT 872518/AT 873526) since 18Mar69 and that the Co base area is located in the vicinity of (AT 872518). The PW also stated that the strength of his Co is 80 men and the Bn is 300 men. The PW revealed that the SONG HUONG Regt consisted of three Bns designated 7th, 8th and 9th. MINH stated that the SONG HUONG Regt is not a new Regt but was formerly located in HUE during "TET" 1968 returning to NVN during May(8 to rebuild. In Jan69 the regiment returned to SVN. The PW revealed that during 1968 SONG HUONG Regt was subordinate to the TRI THIEN HUE Military Zone, but since returning to SVN the Regt is subordinate to the QUANG DA Special Zone. He does not know if the entire regiment is in SVN. The PW stated the morale in his unit was high because 50% of the Regt had combat experience during "TET" 1968 in HUE. MINH also stated that he had heard of the 90th Regt while infiltrating into SVN. The source stated that the only LBN he has heard of was 320I. Personalities reported are: CO 4th Co-1stLt Nguyen Van MEN; XO-2ndLt Nguyen Van LIEN; PO-1stLt Nguyen Van PHU; CO 7th Bn-Capt Nguyen Quoc TRI; PO-Nguyen Van THU.

(G-2 CMT: The PW provides little hard information to help identify his unit. However, some information tends to agree with information held on the 90th Regt (AKA SONG HUONG Regt). A previous PW, PFC Nguyen Khac THINH, claimed to be from a 3rd Regt (AKA 90th Regt) and his remarks are similar to that of Nguyen Van MINH. It is probable that the PW's are from an infiltration replacement group which has been trained by and is staffed by personnel from the 90th. All information reported (F-3).)

- 4. QUANG TIN (P). No significant reports.
- 5. QUANG NGAI (P). No significant reports.

ANNEX C (COUNTERINTELLIGENCE) TO III MAF PERINTREP 14-69

- 1. GENERAL. The level of VC/VCI activity of counterintelligence interest declined considerably during the reporting period, particularly in the southern three provinces where terrorism and VC population control measures had been intensive over the past several months. Although terrorist activity was down from previous levels, two significant incidents occurred on 4 and 5 April in the immediate vicinity of Danang causing significant personnel casualties and demonstrating the VC capability to act even in the more secure areas of ICTZ. The relative absence of reported political and propaganda activity in the southern provinces may be indicative of a period of reorganization and preparation for new campaigns. Enemy espionage and intelligence collection activities continue to be the subject of frequent reports from the northern provinces. Much of this activity appears to be targeted against RD teams and other pacification assets.
- 2. ESPIONAGE. Espionage and reconnaissance activity remained high in Quang Tri and Thua Thien Provinces during the period. The majority of the reported incidents involved local guerrillasinquiring about the situation in hamlets or villages from local sympathizers, or reconnaissance of US and ARVN military positions by VC/NVA reconnaissance teams. Targets included various locations in Gio Linh (D), Camp Evans (YD 5333), Xuan Dien Loc (H) (YD 527272), Thuong An (V) (YD 604292) and Trach Huu (H) (YD 513343). Intelligence nets were also reported in Nhu Le (H) (YD 310477) and Gio Linh (D).
- 3. SAROTAGE. The only sabotage incident reported during the week occurred when a culvert on Highway #1 at YD 217708 was destroyed on 23 March 1969. Several reports were received, however, of VC plans to sabotage bridges and waterways. As in the past several weeks, many of these reported sabotage plans involved the use of frogmen and water sapper teams.
- 4. POLITICAL AND PROPAGANDA. Political and propaganda activity was extremely light during the period with Thua Thien Province the only area with a significant degree of activity reported. The most prevalent propaganda themes during the week were appeals to pay taxes and increase rice productions. In one location in Quang Nam Province, a group of VC/NVA coupled this plea with the promise that

"from this date forward the VC/NVA will start the fight which will lead to final victory over the Americans and ARVN forces." VC reaction to GVN elections continued to be manifested only in isolated incidents. (See Appendix 1 for Statistical Compilation of People's Liberation Commitees.)

- 5. TERROR. The level of terrorist activity dropped off sharply during the period. What little activity that was reported was confined primarily to the southern three provinces. A VC sapper unit is alleged to have completed training and has infiltrated into the area of Quang Tri City. The unit consists of four males and six females and is equipped with K54 pistols and explosive charges about the size of cigarette packages. Their mission is to assassinate province officials and military officers. Explosives disguised in cigarette packages and fitted with chemical delay fuses have previously been used by the VC in ICTZ. (See Appendix 2 for a listing of terrorist incidents.)
- 6. MISCELIANEOUS. Numerous reports continue to be received of VC collection and purchase of rice and other foodstuffs. This preoccupation with procurement of rice probably reflects serious shortages in some areas, particularly in Thua Thien Province.
- It has become increasingly apparent in recent months that the purchase of foodstuffs in GVM controlled areas is a major source of supply for the Wiet Cong in many areas of I Corps. A recently captured economic cadre of the Quang Da Special Zone provided detailed information on the methods used by the Viet Cong to procure rice. According to the prisoner, Commerce Cells were formed in each district under the guidance of district level cadre. The mission of the cells was to visit each village assigned to it. deliver propaganda lectures, and instruct traders in the methods of buying and transporting rice from GVN controlled areas and how to avoid capture by GVN security forces. The trader was assigned a predetermined area at which he was required to deliver the rice. The purchase and transportation of rice was usually carried out after 1800 hours because the GVN mobile security units and troops secured at 1800 hours. The prisoner stated that rice was easily purchased in this manner.
- b. On 24 March 1969, an undetermined number of VC entered Thanh An (H) (BT 122577) and forced each family to purchase a 46 kilogram bag of rice. The rice was to be

ready by 7 April when the VC promised to return and pay the people for it.

- c. On 24 March 1969, 15 VC cadre and guerrillas distributed 200\$VN to 300\$VN to families and VC agents in Nam Pho Can (H) (YD 963049) with which they were to purchase rice for the VC.
- d. At a recent meeting of Viet Cong cadre of Binh Vinh (V) (BT 975003), it was decided to allocate 100,000\$VN from village funds to bribe GVN officials to release two cadre from the village who had recently been captured. It was also decided to establish a regular fund for securing the relatives of captured villagers. One method for obtaining the funds was via organized gambling.
- e. A group of about 25 VC/NVA reportedly entered Khe Lom (H) (AT 919766) and Thach Nham (H) (AT 917715). After entering the hamlets, they separated into three man groups and went into homes and told the inhabitants that they should not reveal the location of rockets or weapons caches to the US/ARVN troops because they had been booby-trapped. The VC also told the people not to pick up anything which they found lying in the roads or paths. This probably represents an attempt by the VC to counter the VIP program.
- f. Jewelry has reportedly been sent from NVN to the k-4 and K-5 battalions located in the jungle area of Hai Lam (V) (YD 392470). The jewelry was to be distributed to local VC in Hai Lang (D) for sale to US troops. The money would be used to bribe ARVN and PF soldiers to allow the VC to infiltrate into allied bases.
- g. The VC mobilized 600 civilian laborers from Son Thuan (AT 7934) and Son Loi (AT 7930) villages in Hiep Duc (D). The laborers were to serve six months, beginning on 24 March 1969, and had the mission of transporting provisions from the Que Son mountainous area to Duy Xuyen, Dien Ban, and Dai Loc Districts.



1. GENERAL ENERY SITUATION. For the second straight week the tempo and intensity of enemy operations in I Corps Tactical Zone was at a low level. There were only 314 enemy initiated ground incidents last week, almost precisely the same number as the week before, and far below the 154 figure which represented the average for the five week period from the inception of the post-TET offensive through 29 March. Similarly, incoming reported was only 394 rounds last week as compared to 765 the week before and 1,471 for the five week average spanning the enemy's offensive. KIA's were roughly the same for this week—909—as compared to 936 for the previous week, but were well below the 1,355 average for the enemy's five week effort.

No new enemy units were identified within ICTZ and the only significant contacts occurred in the MAINE CRAG AO and in the southern DAMANG TAOR. There were some signs of increased enemy activity in IAOS adjacent to QUANG TRI and THUA THUEN Provinces but the overall thrust of the week was one of retrenchment, resting and refitting on the part of the enemy before a new cycle of operations may be commenced.

With the exception of a minor rise in propaganda, counterintelligence and VCI-related incidents decreased in all categories. While the decrease was general throughout ICTZ, it was most noticeable in the southern three provinces where infrastructure activity is normally most intensive. Propaganda themes were generally unchanged, except that increased mention was made of imminent U.S. troop withdrawals from SVN. Several reports indicate overt resistance to the VC by the civil populace which manifested themselves in refusal to pay taxes, to provide labor conscripts, or open ridicule of VC claims during propaganda meetings. Analysis of available information continues to confirm that two principal VC objectives are the disruption of the pacification effort and resettlement of refugees into VC-controlled areas in order to improve their logistical base. To date, they have failed in both these objectives. Further, agent reports and CHIEU HOI debriefings indicate the faith of the VC cadre in ultimate victory, always a principal strength of the movement, appears to have been shaken by pacification efforts and consistent military pressures. The continued hull in VCI activity however, could well represent an intensive period of reorganization and reindoctrination for future offensive actions, both military and political.

a. QUANG TRI (P). In QUANG TRI (P) and along the DMZ FRONT, encory activity at the beginning and throughout the middle of the week was very light. However, as the week grow to a close there was a significant rise in the tempo of the enemy's efforts.

Within the demilitarized zone itself, signtings/incidents of enemy activity increased noticeably this week from 159 to 136. There was also a corresponding increase from 37 to 59 in the number of sightings/incidents of activity recorded north of the MEN HAI River. The majority of sightings this week again manifested themselves in the form of movement of squad to platoon size enemy units. Several aerial observers reported receiving SA/AW fire while conducting reconnaissance missions over the IMZ. However, there were no aircraft shot down as a result of this ground fire.

There were additional reports of sporadic attacks by fire emanating from within the DMZ again this week. One such incident occurred on 8 April when elements of 1/2 ARVN, manning an outpost 4.5 kilometers east northeast of GIO LINH (YD 255744), received 20 rounds of 82mm mortar fire which failed to produce any friendly casualties or damage. Counterbattery fire was directed against the enemy firing position with unknown results. The following day three rounds of unknown caliber ordnance impacted at A-2 Base to the north of GIO LINH (YD 212744). However, the rounds landed outside the perimeter of the friendly barrier installation and did not produce any casualties or damage.

Along the B-5 FRONT, between the DMZ and Route 9, there were no new enemy units contacted by ARVN/FWMAF and engagements with the enemy were limited to exchanges of stand-off attacks by fire and a few small-scale ground contacts with squad to platoon size enemy units.

The majority of ground contacts above Route 9 were recorded northwest of CAM LO and in the northwestern reaches of the province. In the former region, the heaviest engagement occurred four kilometers northwest of CAM LO (YD 095624) on 9 April when a 3rd Marine Division reconnaissance team contacted a small force totaling 30-40 enemy. The Marines defended themselves well, killing 19 of the enemy while failing to sustain any casualties of their own. In a similar contact two days later, another reconnaissance team accounted for 14 confirmed KIA's when they engaged a group of 20 enemy, 10 kilometers northwest of CAM LO (YD 057 665). This recon team also acquitted themselves of any friendly casualties.

North of KHE SANH, elements of 2/4 Marines produced significant enemy order of battle intelligence while operating in the vicinity of the DMZ at the week's end. While on a sweep of an area 7.5 kilometers northwest of FSB NEVILLE on 12 April (XD 790640), E/2/4 Marines assaulted a small enemy force in caves, killing five of the enemy and taking three PW's. These three prisoners were subsequently identified as members of

the 1st Battalion, 246th NVA Regiment. One of these three PW's was initially identified as a first lieutenant company commander. However, this individual later changed his story as well as his name during further interrogation and it is now believed that he is a sergeant in the reconnaissance company subordinate to the 1st Battalion. It is anticipated that these three prisoners will be able to provide a substantial amount of information concerning the present organization, strength and mission of the 246th Regiment.

The MAINE CRAG AO in the southwest quadrant of QUANG TRI was another area of particular interest during the week. While enemy resistance in this operation heretofore has been generally light, it appears that the enemy is beginning to react more strongly to the continued presence of friendly forces in this area. Attesting to this fact were no less than five separate indirect fire attacks launched against ARVN/FWMAF positions during the week. Included in these attacks were an eight round barrage of 75mm howitzer fire directed against E/2/3 Marines in the vicinity of LZ TIGER (XD 837228) and a ten round barrage of 122mm rocket fire directed at 1/3 Marines CP at FSB SPARK (XD 875238).

Of special significance in the MAINE CRAG AO was the apparent increased presence of enemy ground forces in and around this region. As but one example, an aerial observer spotted an enemy force of 115 troops a few kilometers west of LZ SAIGON (XD 771271). The location of this enemy force was also the position from which the aforementioned rocket attack on FSB SPARK was initiated. Tactical air strikes were directed against this enemy contingent resulting in 22 confirmed KIA's and numerous secondary explosions.

The most noteworthy engagement in the MAINE CRAG AO during the period occurred at the week's end when 3/2 ARVN sustained an intensive ground attack at FSB TORCH (XD 905278) on 12 April. This attack, conducted by an unknown size enemy force employing mortars, RPG's and AW fire, resulted in at least 14 friendly KIA's and 27 WIA's as well as the damaging of two 105mm howitzers. The ARVN took one prisoner during this engagement who was subsequently identified as a member of the 10th Sapper Battalion, 7th FRONT. The capture of a member of this unit participating in a coordinated attack in the MAINE CRAG AO--a significant distance from its normal area of operations in Base Area 101 and the coastal lowlands to the southeast of QUANG TRI City--is of particular importance.

Related to the capture of this PW is a second prisoner taken 23 kilometers south of KHE SANH (XD 862150) in the MAINE CRAG AO on 3 April who was identified as a member of the K.8 Battalion, also subordinate to the 7th FRONT. Like that of the 10th Sapper Battalion, the K.8's normal AO is in and east of Base Area 101. This prisoner, obviously far from his normal operating area, reported the existence of two 700-ton rice caches located south of his place of capture (XD 852132/XD 847133).

While the size of these caches is questionable, their existence is in all probability valid considering the large number of rice caches which have already been uncovered in the MATRIX CRAG AC.

The appearance of these members of the 7th FRONT in western QUANG TRI indicates that the enemy, apparently surprised by ARVN/FWMAF operations in this area, may have been forced to shift some of his forces from eastern QUANG TRI to the MAINE CRAC AC in order to react to the threat which this operation represented. Furthermore, it would appear that the Route 616 area has, up until the inception of the MAINE CRAC operation, been a center of supply for logistic support of the enemy's forces in eastern QUANG TRI and THUA THIEN Provinces. The enemy's supply line into these two areas must have used portions of the BA LONG Valley as a natural route of ingress and egress.

In other developments in the MAINE CRAG operation this week, C/1/3 Marines discovered two destroyed enemy trucks while sweeping an area in the vicinity of A GIOI (XD 879226/XD 879229) on 6 April. Both vehicles contained various amounts of destroyed ammunition. The discoveries of these two vehicles can be related to the testimony of a PW captured in a bunker along Route 616 on 21 March (paragraph 1.a., PIR's 12-69 and 11-69 refer). This prisoner stated that between 12 and 16 March, he personally observed as many as seven trucks per night hauling rice and ammunition into the MAINE CRAG AO via Route 616, and further that some of these vehicles were hit by air strikes during this period.

b. THUA THIEN (P). The week of 6-12 April was another one in which the general enemy situation in THUA THIEN (P) remained relatively unchanged. Ground combat continued at a reduced level as major enemy forces within the province persisted in their avoidance of decisive engagements with ARVN/FWMAF.

In the western reaches of the province, the on-going Operation MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER continued to open up the eastern approaches of the A SHAU Valley. Elements of the 101st Airborne Division (AM) and ARVN Forces participating in this major operation reported a few light meeting engagements with small enemy forces, most likely elements of the 9th NVA Regiment. On the other hand, these friendly units were the recipients of several sporadic mortar attacks of low intensity in this area. One minor ground attack was recorded on 7 April when a small enemy force employing RPG's attacked A/1/502nd Airborne Infantry while in night defensive positions seven kilometers west southwest of FSB TENNESSEE (YC 192915). The attacking force was repulsed and a sweep of the area at first light revealed five enemy KIA's.

North of the MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER AO, one noteworthy engagement occurred on 11 April when 1/1 ARVN contacted an unknown size enemy force three kilometers west southwest of FSB DAVIS near the QUANG TRI-THUA

THIEN provincial boundary (YD 250305). The ARVN defended themselves well, killing 13 of the enemy while failing to sustain any casualties of their own. In addition to the taking of eight individual weapons, the ARVN also captured three 122mm rockets, six 122mm rocket launchers and a CHICOM field telephone. Shortly thereafter, the ARVN uncovered an enemy burial site in the same general area (YD 225315) consisting of 15 fresh graves estimated to be two to three days old. Each grave contained one body, apparently killed by artillery and small arms fire.

In eastern THUA THIEN (P), there were only two noteworthy ground engagements during the reporting period. The first of these incidents occurred six kilometers east of HUE (YD 810217) on 6 April when the 227th RF Company made a sharp contact with an unknown size enemy force during daylight hours. The RF's killed lh of the enemy in this astion while at the same time capturing 13 prisoners. These PW's were subsequently identified as members of the C.116 Local Force Company, a unit which normally operates in this particular area.

The second of these two noteworthy engagements took the form of a brief but intense encounter six kilometers southwest of HUE (YD 703185) on 11 April which developed into hand-to-hand combat between an estimated enemy platoon and an RD Team, a HUCNG TRA PF unit and CAP 3-4-3. Five enemy were killed in the contact while friendly forces sustained light casualties.

Also of significance in the vicinity of HUE are the number of grave sites which have been uncovered in PHU VANG District's coastal sand dunes area (YD 8624) east of the THUA THIEN provincial capital during the past week. Since 28 March, over 500 bodies, apparently dating back to the TET offensive of 1968, have been found in a series of lightly covered trenches in this general area. It is obvious that the large number of corpses found in these trenches had been executed by the VC during the battle for HUE and the subsequent withdrawal of enemy forces from this area.

Elsewhere in THUA THIEN (P), Recon/1/501st Airborne Infantry killed 15 enemy and captured one PW in a brief engagement with a 30-man enemy force nine kilometers south southeast of PHU BAI on 9 April (YD 895065). The prisoner was identified as a member of the finance section of the 5th NVA Regiment and indicated that he was on a rice gathering mission at the time of his capture. Several other prisoners have been captured recently in southern I Corps while on rice gathering missions and enemy operations in I Corps can be expected to interfere with or exploit the rice harvest in the coming weeks.

c. QUANG NAM (P). The week of 6-12 April has witnessed a substantial decrease in enemy initiated activity for the third consecutive week in QUANG NAM (P). Ground action throughout the province was at the lowest level experienced in the past several months as major enemy

tactical units avoided confrontations with friendly forces.

The southern DANANG TACR was comparatively quiet during this reporting period following last week's major contacts southeast of HILL 55 involving elements of the 1st ARVN Ranger Group and 3/1 Marines. The only noteworthy contact south of DANANG this week occurred six kilometers east of HILL 55 (ET 027606) where K/3/1 Marines accounted for 31 enemy KIA's in a two hour engagement with an unknown size enemy force.

The focus of attention in GMANG NAM (P) this past week has been centered on the on-going Operation CKLAHOMA HILLS, now in its third week in the CHARLIE RIDGE-HAPPY Valley area southwest of HIEU DUC. While contacts with the enemy have been relatively light to date, it is becoming increasingly apparent that those units which habitually operate in this area—the 31st and lilst NVA Regiments plus elements of the 368B Rocket Artillery Regiment—have been forced to displace either to remote locations to the west or into the coastal lowlands. Inasmuch as ARVN/FWMAF operations in the DANANG TAOR have not contacted these regiments, it is presently estimated that the enemy has either withdrawn to more remote sanctuaries in western QUANG NAM or has moved to the north of their former locations.

In addition to a conspicious absence of contact, further evidence supporting the fact that these units have withdrawn is to be found in the discoveries during the week of a series of no less than six extensive base camps of battalion and regimental size in the OKIAHOMA HILLS area north and northeast of THUCNG DUC. Attesting to the complexity and extensiveness of these base camps is the fact that one of the camps (AT 811637) covered an area with a radius of 300 meters and contained in excess of 200 huts. Among the outstanding features of this camp, believed to be the former CP of the 31st NVA Regiment, were two classroom buildings, each with log decks and a capacity for seating 20 men, two obstacle courses of single and double row concertina wire, a dispensary and a messhall. The camp also contained extensive bunkers, both under the huts and on the periphery, an extensive interlacing tunnel complex under the camp, and an extensive network of communications wire.

A large number of documents were captured in these base camps and have been forwarded to the 1st Marine Division where they are presently being exploited. Pending receipt of more detailed information of the contents of all the base camps, it is presently believed that Operation OKIAHOMA HILLS has uncovered the base camps of the 103rd Battalion, 31st Regiment, the 2nd Battalion, 141st Regiment and either the 2nd or 3rd Battalions of the 368B Artillery Regiment plus the regimental CP's of both the 31st and 141st Regiments and a FRONT 4 rear services dispensary.

Elsewhere in QUANG NAM (P), the only significant enemy ground action during the week involved the downing of an OV-10A spotter aircraft from MAG-16, ten kilometers west northwest of HOI AN (BT 053610) on 8 pril, and the downing of a CH-46 halicopter, also from MAG-16, seven kilometers north northwest of AN HOA (AT 825520) on 11 April. The two pilots of the spotter aircraft were rescued, while the crew of the CH-46 perished in the crash of the aircraft.

While the tempo of enemy activity was at a substantially reduced level in the province, additional intelligence reports were received during the week which suggested that a renewed offensive effort on the part of forces subordinate to FRONT I in QUANG NAM will occur soon.

As but a few examples, a lieutenant PW in charge of bringing infiltration groups into QUANG NAM who was taken in Operation CASS PARK (TC 667612) on 5 April stated he understood the "3rd offensive" was to commence in April and would be targeted against DAI LOC, DIEN BAN and DUY XUYEN. Another prisoner, this one from the 31st Regiment who was captured on 1 April (AT 906636), stated that the "Phase III" attack plan would go into effect sometime in April at which time the 31st and 141st Regiments would attack the HIEU DUC-TUY LOAN-HILL 327-DANANG area complex.

A VC Province Committee report obtained by the DANANG PHUNG HOANG Committee reveals enemy plans for a "Spring-Summer 1969 Campaign". According to the report, this campaign is divided into three phases, the first two of which cover the respective periods from 22 February-10 March '69 and 15 March-20 April '69. During these two phases the NVA/VC will launch attacks against widely dispersed ARVN/FWMAF installations and refugee camps in order to force the people back to VC control. The report further indicates that the third phase of the offensive will begin 20 April and will last until 18 May '69.

d. - e. QUANG TIN/QUANG NGAI (P's). Enemy initiated activity was at an extremely low level in both QUANG TIN and QUANG NGAI Provinces during the week of 6-12 April. There were no significant ground engagements noted in either province as major enemy forces remained withdrawn and out of contact with friendly tactical units.

The only noteworthy contact occurred ten kilometers northwest of THON HAI (BT 205302) in QUANG TIN on 11 April when elements of an RF company and an RD team engaged an unknown size enemy force while on a clearing mission. The friendly force killed 19 of the enemy and captured eight PW's while failing to sustain any casualties. There was no immediate identification of the captured prisoners.

The extent of the enemy's efforts in both provinces during the period consisted primarily of continued harassment of hamlets and refugee camps by local forces, particularly in QUANG NGAI. As but one

instance, on 7 April an estimated VC squad entered the village of PHO HIEP (BS 863314), nine kilometers southeast of DUC PHO, and threw approximately ten satchel charges. Three civilians were wounded and ten houses destroyed in the incident,

f. ANALYSIS OF THE ENEMY SITUATION. It is estimated that the most probable course of action which the enemy will pursue during the coming week will be to continue to maintain his operations at a relatively low level of intensity. It is becoming increasingly evident that the cycle of his renewed offensive operations which started on 23 February has run its course. Quite typical of his operations in the past, it can be expected that he will now take a moment's respite before renewing any significant offensive effort. An increased number of small unit contacts can be expected as the enemy contests control of the rice harvest. This harvest will start almost immediately in QUANG NGAI and a few weeks later in the northern provinces.

In QUANG NAM, there have been increasing reports of renewed enemy activity on the short term outlook for the next week. However, it is anticipated that there will not be substantial increases in enemy initiated activity in the face of the present high tempo of U.S. and ARVN operations both in the lowlands and in the OKLAHCMA HILLS AO.

- 2. ENEMY OPERATIONS DURING REPORTING PERIOD. Enemy initiated incidents remained at almost precisely the same level as experienced during the previous week of 30 March-5 April. Incidents consisted of three ground attacks, two ambushes, six attacks by fire, 169 incidents of harassing fire, 107 mining and booby trap incidents, one incident of assassination, 11 espionage incidents, two kidnapping incidents, eight propaganda incidents, five sabotage incidents and 193 AA fire incidents.

- (1) Enemy Use of Delay Fuse Mortar Ammunition. A document captured 12 kilometers southwest of TAM KY City (BT 217140) in QUANG TIN (P) by A/2/1 Infantry on 3 April and dated 13 January 1969 states: in the immediate future, 82mm mortar units will use delay fuse ammunition. Delay fuse ammunition should be used only in attacks by fire against enemy strong points, depots, airfields, and rear base areas. Delay fuse ammunition will not be used for attacks by fire which will be followed by infantry assaults.

h. Air Defense. As fire incidents increased in comparison to the previous week. There were a total of 193 incidents with 54 aircraft receiving a total of 100 hits.

r. Reconnaissance. There were 73 long range reconnaissance patrols deployed throughout ICTZ which reported 46 sightings and 14 contacts totaling 429 enemy moving in no discernible pattern. The contacts resulted in 53 enemy KIA.

s. Captured Enemy Caches.

- (1) The following significant enemy caches were captured by friendly forces in ICTZ during the reporting period:
- (a) 05 Apr: F/2/4 Marines found a rice and ammunition cache seven kilometers north of FSB NEVILLE (XD 826641) in northwestern QUANG TRI Province. The cache consisted of 192 rounds of 82mm mortar ammunition, one box of .50 caliber ammunition and 150 pounds of rice. The cache was found in ten A-frame bunkers. Two .50 caliber MG positions were also found in the area. No further details are available.
- (b) 08 Apr: 3/2 ARVN found an ammunition cache 20 kilometers southeast of KHE SANH (XD 912233) in the MAINE CRAG AO in southwestern QUANG TRI Province while participating in Operation LAM SON 271. The cache consisted of 246 B-40 rockets. No further details are available.
- (c) 10 Apr: E/2/4 Marines found an ordnance and equipment cache eight kilometers northwest of FSB NEVILLE (XD 788642) in north-western QUANG TRI Province. The cache consisted of 37 German bolt action rifles (NFI), three cross bows, four CHICOM claymores, four swords, 50 CHICOM grenades, 13 B-40 rockets, 1,000 CHICOM .50 caliber rounds, 50 assorted entrenching tools and farm tools, 1,500 rounds of

9mm pistol ammunition, 20 assorted fases, ten mortar increments, four 82mm mortar rounds, one CHICOM 60mm mortar round and one box of assorted drugs. No further details are available.

- (d) 07 Apr: B/2/50lst Airborne Infantry found an ammunition cache seven kilometers east of the abandonded A SHAU Special Forces/CIDG Camp (YC 564841) in western THUA THIEN Province while participating in Operation MASSACHUSETTS STRIKER. The cache consisted of 158 rounds of 82mm mortar ammunition (HE), 12 rounds of 82mm mortar ammunition (illumination) and one 60mm mortar round. The cache was found in two lean-to structures measuring approximately ten feet square. The area appeared to have been recently used. No further details are available.
- (e) 07 Apr: B/3/187th Airborne Infantry found an ordnance and equipment cache 27 kilometers west of HUE (YD 489191) in Base Area lll in THUA THIEN Province. The cache consisted of 66 RPG-7 rounds, 59x82mm mortar rounds, 12 AK magazines, four 82mm cannisters, four boxes of 82mm mortar fuses, one case of RPG boosters, three CHICOM claymores, four PPS-43 SMG magazines, and one case of 7.62mm ammunition. The cache was found in a series of five bunkers measuring 8'x5'x4' with five inches of overhead cover. No further details are available.
- (f) ll Apr: Recon/1/21st Infantry found a rice cache nine kilometers south of MO DUC (BS 732458) in QUANG NGAI Province. The cache consisted of eight tons of rice. No further details are available.

General: Only a minor change in daily weather patterns is expected during the outlook period with no monsoon surges or large-scale general effects. Fair to partly cloudy with some morning stratus and fog throughout the period, with a slight increase in convective activity anticipated by midweek.

- 4. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE. Annex C.
- 5. CAPABILITIES AND VULNERABILITIES. Based upon a continuing evaluation of the enemy situation, and the present disposition of enemy forces within the ICTZ, the enemy courses of action in probable order of adoption are considered to be:
- a. Conduct unconventional and psychological warfare, to include ambushes, interdiction of LOC's, terrorism, sabotage, propaganda activities, the use of mines and booby traps, and non-toxic chemical munitions. In conjunction with this effort continue attacks by fire on vital areas and key installations, and conduct limited, light to moderate ground attacks on isolated units and outposts, CIDG Camps, and District Headquarters with forces locally available.

- b. Expand present operations within the ICTZ by adopting the following courses of action in one or more of the following geographical locations/areas:
- (1) Attack installations in northern and eastern QUANG TRI (P) with up to five infantry regiment equivalents, supported by three artillery regiments and possible armor units.
- (2) Attack QUANG TRI City with up to two to three infantry battalions, one sapper battalion, and one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (3) Conduct limited attacks in the HUE/PHU BAI area with elements of three to four infantry regiments, supported by one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (4) Attack installations within the DANANG TAOR with up to six infantry regiments, supported by two rocket regiments and one sapper battalion.
- (5) Attack the TAM KY-CHU IAI Combat Base Complex with a division (-) equivalent, reinforced by one sapper battalion and one mortar/rocket battalion.
- (6) Attack QUANG NGAI City and outposts in southern QUANG NGAI (P) with one division equivalent, supported by one sapper regiment and one mortar/rocket battalion.
- c. Defend in present positions just north of the central and eastern portion of the DMZ with up to five infantry regiment equivalents.
- d. Defend elsewhere in ICTZ (south of Route 9), including VC/NVA base areas with forces locally available.
- e. Withdraw into the mountains and forested areas of western I Corps and/or LAOS and North Vietnam.
- f. Reinforce the forces presently in ICTZ with two to three divisions from NVN and one division equivalent from LAOS.
- g. Employ SSM's from NVN and/or border areas; employ limited air and/or naval forces from NVN or surrounding areas; employ possible armor units from the area immediately north of the LMZ and/or border areas.

h. Vulnerabilities.

(1) Enemy forces, LOC's and surface installations are vulnerable to air, artillery and naval gunfire attacks.

(2) Recent tactical defeats on the battlefield, sickness, hunger, shortage of ammunition and medical supplies, and austere living conditions have increased his vulnerability to psychological warfare operations.

A. PW'S PFC Nguyen BON and CPL Nguyen Van SON who previously stated that they were with the 4th Bn, 330th Regt (see PLC13-69) now state that their unit is the 19th Construction Co, 75th Engr Bn, 559th Transportation Group. They were captured on 21,500H Mar at (XD 897229) approximately one kilometer from the Laotian border (Interrogation Rpt XXIV Corps 39-69 of 2 April 1969). They stated that their Co's strength was 72 men. They said their 1st and 2nd platoons were based in the vicinity of (XD 751262) and the 3rd platoon in the vicinity of (XD 873250). The 19th Construction Co's mission is to build and repair roads in the vicinity of their base areas. The 19th Co was formed from the 16th Construction Co in December 1968. PW SON said their morale was low but PW BON reported their morale as being high. The LBN for the 19th Co was 72484 KT. The following personalities were reported: CC 4th Bn, 330th Regt - Nguyen Van DUNG, XC - Phan Van THIEM; Commander 19th Co - Tguyen Van CHUNG, PC - Phan SAU.

(G-2 COMPENT: The 330th Regt is believed to be a training/infiltration unit, possibly subordinate to the 330th Training Division in NVN. This is the first report of the 75th Engineer Bn (F-3).)

2. THUA THIEN (P). No significant reports.



PW Duong Van CO, WO, 18th Co, 31st Regt, who was captured on 1 April 1969 in the vicinity of (BT 906636) (CG 1st MARDIV 080935Z Apr69) gave the following attack plan: elements of the central wing are to attack HOA VANG (D) and DAI LOC (D), while elements from the 141st Regt are to attack THUONG DUC, TUY LOAN, GO CA and Hill 10. The 8th Bn, 31st Regt is to attack DAI LA Pass, Hill 327 (AT 884746). The D.9 Bn is to attack HOA LOC (AT 900743). The 575 Arty Regt will fire rockets on DANANG and 1st MARDIV. The attacks are to take place during April. No slecific dates given.

(G-2 COMMENT: The 575 Arty Regt is an AKA for the 3698 Arty Regt. The 18th Co, 31st Regt is a Signal Co. The plan given is almost identical to the 23 February attack plan given by the XU, 121st Regt and must be viewed in that light. CO may be providing a historical rather than a future attack plan. All information reported by PW (F-4).



B. PW'S Tran Minh XUAN, MSGT, Tran A MSGT, captured on 4 April 69 in the vicinity of (BS 765598) (2d ARVN PW Rpt 051200Z Apr69) stated they were from the Planning and Labor Section, Rear Base of 3rd NVA Division. Their admitted mission was to purchase rice and food, and to collect laborers in the villages of MO DUC (D). Both PW's state they had been in the LON hountain area vicinity of (BS 695490) and one states the Planning and Labor Section had moved from BA NHA (V) in the vicinity of (BS 432435) on 31MAR69.

(G-2 COM ENT: These PW'S were captured with WO Nguyen HOA (see Para 5.A). Analyzing the statements of the three PW's, coupled with recent agent reports, IR and SLaR, it appears that some portion of the rear base activities of the 3rd Division are now located on either side of the SONG RE near (BS 3543). The PW's mission of food and labor collection in the MO DUC area follows a pattern long used by the 3rd Division. All information reported (F-3).)







ARREX C (CCUNTERINTELLIGENCE) TO III MAF PERINTRE 15-09

- 1. GENERAL. With the exception of a small rise in propaganda, Viet Cong activity of counterintelligence interest generally declined during the period. It is highly possible that VC forces, military and political, are presently engaged in a period of reorganization and reindoctrination. Reindoctrination appears to be particularly critical to the Viet Cong at the present time in view of the numerous reports of sagging morale, "longing for peace" and loss of faith in final victory which has been reported among cadre and troops alike. Although few reports have been received during the period of taxation and food purchases by the Viet Cong. an increase in this activity is expected in the near future, considering reports of food shortages among VC/NVA units and the upcoming rice harvest. An increase in the number of abductions may also be anticipated in view of captured documents which call for stepped-up recruitment of youths (14 years of age and over) and females from GVN controlled areas. rropaganda themes remained relatively constant except for increased mention of imminent U.S. troop withdrawals from South Vietnam.
- a. wang Tri. Quang Tri (P) reports that the situation was almost tranquil during the week with only scattered reports of propaganda and proselyting activity. No significant reaction has been noted to the relocation of refugees to their former homes in the northern districts of the province. There were no reports of terrorism or sabotage.
- b. Thus Thien. Viet Cong efforts in Thus Thien (P) continued to concentrate on the rebuilding of their infrastructure and the resupply of military units. Low level intelligence collection, propagands, and a moderate level of terrorist activity were recorded. Reports indicate that the Viet Cong have been unable to rebuild commo-lisison routes in the province, thereby causing considerable difficulties for them. A total of 423 bodies have been found in mass graves in Phu Vang (D) to date. Most of these people are believed to have been civilians executed by the VC when they occupied Hue during the 1968 Tet offensive.
- c. Quang Nam. There was a general lull in activity in the province during the reporting period, although reports indicate that the Viet Cong are currently regrouping in preparation for a renewed offensive. The interrogation of a recently captured PW indicates that a principal objective of the renewed attack will be the destruction





of the GVN rural pacification program and the resettlement of refugees back to VC controlled areas where identification cards will be issued. The VC believe this will strengthen their position when a coalition government is formed as a result of the Paris talks.

- d. Quang Tin. The number of counterintelligence-related incidents decreased in Quang Tin Province as the pacification program continues to progress in most areas of the province. The continued success of the pacification program will further compound the task of the Viet Cong to rebuild both their infrastructure and military units after the heavy losses suffered in the past months.
- e. Quang Ngai. The decrease in Viet Cong activity was particularly noticeable in Quang Ngai (P), the scene of some of the most intense VC/VCI activity during the past several months. Reports were received, however, of VC plans to foment demonstrations against the GVN and in favor of immediate peace. In the past, such activities have been singularly unsuccessful.
- LS PIONAGE. Reported reconnaissance and espionage activity decreased slightly during the period. As in the past, most of the activity was confined to the two northern provinces, although VC/NVA reconnaissance efforts were reported from Quang Nam (P). Of particular interest in Quang Tri and Thua Thien Provinces are frequent reports of VC guerrilla units stopping people on the road or entering their homes to ask about the situation in the area. This sort of activity is seldom reported in the southern provinces and may reflect the failure of the VC infrastructure and recon units in the northern provinces to conduct normal intelligence collection activities. In Quang Tri (P), information was reportedly collected on Ha Thuong (H) (YD 175752), Kim Dau (H) (YD 228632), Hai Le (V) (YD 324492), and Linh An (H) (YD 369606). In Thua Thien (P), the Phu Bai area was again a prime Viet Cong reconnaissance target. Two VC intelligence-reconnaissance teams were reportedly operating in Quang Nam (P) collecting information on the Ba Ren Post (BT 102510) and the area east of the Yen Ne River (AT 9766).




- 4. POLITICAL AND PROPAGANDA. Viet Cong political and propaganda activity remained at a relatively low level during the week. Propaganda themes continued to urge the people to support the Viet Cong and struggle for peace. Somewhat more emphasis, however, appears to have been put on the theme that the US would soon be withdrawing from South Vietnam because of anti-war feelings in America and Viet Cong victories. Also of interest is a report from Quang Ngai (P) that the long dormant Alliance of National Democratic and Peace Forces was to be revived. Of specific interest was a large number of Peoples Liberation Committees, previously unreported, which were reported through GVN Phung Hoang channels. See Appendix 1 for a listing of new PLC's and a statistical compilation of all PLC's in ICTZ. Some of the more significant reports received during the week included:
- a. On 6 April 1969, a Viet Cong company and an armed pro aganda group operated in an area from Su Lo Thuong (YD 845235) to An Luu (YD 820245). The group dispersed into five man teams and entered homes in the area to collect information and disseminate propaganda. After the VC left the area, 50% of the people reportedly left their homes to take refuge with the GVN.
- b. During a study session held in Phong Son (V) (YD 549261) from 18 to 20 March, it was decided that the time had come to send low level cadre and guerrillas back into the lowland areas of Thua Thien Province. Plans were also made to intensify propaganda in efforts to increase popular support for the VC.
- c. On 2 April, anti-GVN leaflets were found in the area of the Danang Boys Elementary School.
- d. A recent female rallier from a VC cultural drama team which has operated in Dien Pan (D), Quang Nam (P), reported that the team had encountered many difficulties in carrying out its propaganda tasks because of shortages of leaflets and the inexperience of the team members. She also reported that villagers of Dien Pan (D) were skeptical and often derisive of Viet Cong propaganda due to their knowledge of heavy Viet Cong casualties in their area it was her orinion that NVA soldiers were indifferent to VC propaganda and had low morale.
- e. A PW from the 18th MVA Regiment stated that enemy plans in Quang Mgai (F) call for intensive training of all








of the people to win their support. The people will then be formed into military-like units known as "Political Attack Support Units". Similar reports have been previously received.

- f. On the night of 30 March, the VC held a meeting in Duc An (H) (BS 508923) and told the people they must help the VC fight the Americans and ARVN in order to save the country. They were called upon to join the local NLF associations which would then be banded together to participate in the fighting and demonstrations. Popular disapproval of the plan was voiced when a number of the people stated that they would never join the VC, even if threatened with death.
- g. A GVN agent reported that the VC of Quang Ngai (P) are now in the process of reactivating the Alliance of National Democratic and Peace Forces in that area. The VC plan to select personnel regarded highly by the populace and who will represent people from all walks of life (religious, political, military, labor, civilian and intellectual groups). A committee will then be formed with offices located in Pu Luong (V) (BS 680630). Quang Ngai (C) and its neighboring areas will be the committee's area of responsibility and base for extending its influence over the people.
- TERROR. Terrorist incidents continued to decrease during the period with the most significant decreases noted in the southern three provinces, normally the locale for the more intensive terrorist activity. A detailed account of an instance in which VC troops entered a hamlet in Quang Ngai (?) has been received. This incident is considered fairly typical of many such incidents which have occurred in the southern province of ICTA over the past several months. According to residents, a VC force entered the refugee hamlets of Phu Binh (BS 612652) and Nghia Loc (BS 580654) at about 2300 hours on 6 April 1969. After assembling the residents in a nearby area, they told the people that the Americans would be leaving South Vietnam shortly and would be unable to supply them food. The people were instructed to return to their former homes in VC-controlled areas. If the deeple refused to return to their homes, the VC threatened to return in ten days and burn their homes. While the meeting was in progress, other VC destroyed the homes and personal property of many of the people. Four residents were also


abducted by the VC before they left. Refugees from both hamlets stated that they did not like the VC and wanted to remain in their refugee hamlets, but pleaded for a security force to protect them. One hamlet leader complained that the people would be forced to follow and support whomever could protect them. (See Appendix 2 for a listing of terrorist incidents).



- 3. In order to lend credibility to the present reporting procedures of VC Liberation Committees, committees in which personalities have been identified will be noted by an asterisk (*). Comments on the present status or relating to the elimination of members of these committees will follow in parentheses. Liberation Committees which have been neutralized will be appropriately noted and carried on the list twice, after which they will be deleted. Addressees possessing further information on the strength, personalities, effectiveness, neutralization, etc., of Liberation Committees are requested to forward such data to this Headquarters (Attn: G-2/CI).
