

1. 소 개 : 승통 15-1호 작전은 월남 다낭시 남방 20 마일 지역에 위치한 배리어 아이랜드 북부 지역에서 실시된 한국 해병대 및 미 해군 해병 합동 상륙 작전이다. 본 작전은 1965년 10월 9일 한국 해병 부대가 월남에 도착한 이래 처음 실시된 상륙 작전이며 \*한미 합동 상륙 작전이었으나 미 해병 특수 상륙군은 1969년 9월 7일 남부 상륙 지역에 상륙 하였으며, 5일후인 1969년 9월 12일에는 한국 해병대 제 2연대 상륙단이 북부 상륙 지역에 독립적으로 상륙 하였다. 1950년 9월에 실시된 인천 상륙 작전때 한미 해병대는 상륙 보급 작전을 합동으로 실시한 사실이 있으며, 본 작전은 한국 해병대가 광범한 독립적인 상륙 작전으로써 의미가 있다. 해병 제 2연단 단장 이동호 준장은 참모장 조광수 대령을 북부 상륙군의 제 2연대 상륙 단장으로 임명 하였으며 1969년 8월 25일부터 계획에 의거 착수 하였음.
2. 목표 선정 : 배리어 아이랜드는 1969년에 미해병 특수 상륙군에 의하여 2호에 걸쳐 상륙 작전이 실시된 지역이며, 상기 작전은 1969년 5월 5일부터 19일 까지 실시된 대서팅 특별 작전과 1969년 6월 27일 부터 7월 6일 까지 실시된 볼드 퍼스 트 작전이다. 이 두 작전에서는 180명의 적을 사살 하고 부이씨 하부 조직을 와해 시켰다. 상륙군이 상륙 목표 지역에서 철수 할때 마다 적은 역시 점령하고 부이씨 하부 조직은 그 지역으로 귀환해 왔음. 송쿠야다이 강은 주요 관통로였으며, 따라서 배리어 아이랜드는 활발한 부이씨 하부조직 지역이었음. 이 섬은 쑤남섬과 쑤틴섬 경계선에 위치 하고 있다 (도표 1.2참조) 미 해병 제 3상륙군 정부는 목표 분석을 실시 하였으며, 주요 적 부대 위치는 도표 3에 표시 되어 있다. 분석 결과는 부이씨 하부조직 구역과 적정 효과를 나타내고 있다. 1969년 5월 31일 HBS 보고에 의하면 목표 지역에는 약 20,000명의 주민이 살고 있었다. 그러나 1969년 5월 이후 8,500명의 주민이 이 지역으로 부터 타 지역에 정착 했다. 5월 중에도 많은 피난민이 이지역을 떠났다. 1969년 8월말 주민수는 4,000에서 8,000명으로 추산 되었다. 약 377명의 부이

씨 하부 조직이 추가적으로 확인된 296 명과 더불어 이지역에서 활동 하여 온 것으로 판단 되었다. 목포 분서의 결론은 목포 지역내의 모든 연락이 수년간 부이씨 통제 하에 있었음을 언급 하고 있다. 320 명의 병력을 갖은 1 개 지방군 대대와 1 개 지방군 중대가 목포 지역에서 활동 하여 온 것으로 판단 되었으며, 개리타 병력은 추가적으로 확인된 295 명과 더불어 524 명으로 판단 되었다. 이 지역은 방파. 동굴 및 기타 특성 시설로 가득찬 것으로 압력져 있다. 정보에서는 목포 지역을 개발 하여 전부 통제 지역 으로 돌려 부이씨 하부 조직을 포함한 적을 섬멸 할수 있음을 건의 하였다.

3. 합가 병력 : 북부 상륙군은 2.3 및 5 대대로 구성된 한국 해병 계 2 연대 상륙단이며 총 병력은 약 1,4 00 명이다. 남부 상륙군은 약 2,000 명의 병력으로 구성된 대대 상륙단 1/26 과 265 중형 헬리콥터 전대로 구성된 SLF ALFA 이며 양개 상륙군은 이오기마르 ( LPH -2), 웨스턴호 ( LSD -27), 로보니알호 ( LSD -18) 웨시테노 카운티호 ( LST -1166) 및 워시버호 ( LKA -108) 로 구성된 ARG ALFA 의 기원을 밝는다.

4. 기휘권 관계 : 작전 기휘권 관계는 도포 4 에 드시 되어 있다.

미 해병 1 사단 작전 통제 하에 들어감. 265 중형 헬리콥터 편대는 이오기미호에 계속 머물렀으며 76.4 OTG 의 작전 통제하에 들어감.

69년 9월 20일 - 30일 RLT -2는 SLF ALFA 및 RLT -2 전 작전 지역에서 작전을 계속.

6. 작전 경과 : 한국 해병대 3 대대는 69년 9월 5일 0900 시 서부 배리어 아이랜드 지역에 1개 중대를 헬리콥터로 2개 중대를 LVTP5로 상륙 시킴으로서 D일 이전 작전을 개시 하였으며, 서부 배리어 동으로 함쇄 및 거부 작전을 실시 하였음. 저항 없이 상륙한 각 중대는 투무우용 기항장 서쪽을 따라 위치화 차단 진지를 점령하기 위하여 신속히 이동 을 개시 하였음. 1969년 9월 10일 3 대대는 항공 폭격에 의하여 사살된 적시체 1구를 발견 하였으며, 우군 피해는 없이 미간의 10명 을 억류 하였으며 부이씨 하부조직 2명을 구축 하였음. 1969년 9월 11일 3 대대는 차단 진지를 점령 하였음. 이 이전 작전을 통하여 저항은 없기 하였음.

1969년 9월 7일 SLF ALFA 는 2개 중대를 투무우용기항 장 근처에 헬리콥터로 0840 시에 상륙을 시켰으며 0700 시에 2개 중대를 녹색 해안에 상륙을 시켰음. 기상은 강우로 인하여 불항 하였으나 시일이 지남에 따라 호조를 보였음. 상륙시 저항은 없었으며 각 중대는 함쇄 작전을 개시 하였음. 차단 진지는 1969년 9월 11일 D - 1 일 까지 확보 하도록 되어 있었음. 9월 8일 LVTP-5 1 대 는 개보급 임무 수행 중 지뢰로 인하여 파괴 되었음. 9월 8일 24 00 시 까지 적사살 8명, 적부상 1명, 미간의 억류 49명 미간의 귀순자 2명을 체포 하는 기쁜 점진 상태를 유지 하였음.

ARG 함선에 탑재 되어야 했음. 1969년 9월 9일 한국 해병 5 대대는 해병 여단 각전 지역으로 부터 이오지마로 까지 헬리콥터 이동을 실시 하였으며 2 대대는 해병 제 2 여단 본부 해안으로 부터 상륙 주점으로 웨스트론호 (LSD -27), 로로니알호 (LSD -18) 및 워시턴스 카운티 (LST -1166) 로 이동 하였음. 함상 훈련, 하선망 훈련 및 해상 선회 훈련이 1969년 9월 10일부터 11일 까지 한국 해병대 전원에게 실시 되었음. 훈련은 순조롭게 진행 되었으며, 한국 해병대는 훌륭히 모든 훈련을 실시 하였음.

1969년 9월 10일 2400 시 까지 전 지역에 걸쳐 집적은 경미 하였으며, 69년 9월 10일 1430 시 3명의 미 해병이 전사 하고 3명이 부상한 단 1건의 접적이 있었음.

9월 11일 대대 상륙단 1/26 의 A, B, 및 C 중대는 한국 해병대 및 미해병대 간의 전투 지경선 남방 500 미터 지점에 연하여 차단 진지를 점령 하였으며 중대는 적이 도착하는 것을 방지 하기 위하여 투투우웅 기강 강 남쪽에 위치 하였음.

한국 해병대 3 대대 및 SLF 부대가 차단 진지를 점령한후 전단 투하 및 방송이 1969년 9월 11일 배리어 아미텐트 북부 지역에 전단 투하 및 방송을 실시 하였음.

1969년 9월 12일 D 일 5 대대의 L 시는 0800 시며, 2 대대가 적쇄해안에 상륙 하는 H 시는 0928 지임. 상륙은 거함 없이 실시 되었으며 모든 중대는 진지를 확보 하였음. 5 대대는 북부 상륙 지역 서쪽방에 대한 차단 진지를 신속히 이동 하였음. 2 대대는 5대대 차단 진지방향이 서쪽으로 이동 하면서 방쇄 및 거부 작전을 실시 하였음.

D + 1 일 3 대대는 여단 각전 지역으로 헬리콥터 이동을 실시 하였음.

1969년 9월 14일 2400 시 D+ 2 일 중보시 한국 해병대전과는 적나살 74 명 부이씨 학부조각 19 명. 민간인 억류 535 명 이었음.

7. 작전 결과 : 도표 6은 1969년 9월 2일부터 19일 7가지의 기간중 작전 통계를 보여주고 있음. 작전 기간을 통하여 민간인 통계문제는 하시 존재 하였음. 작전 지역이 항개 성을 포함하고 있기 때문에 과 성에 별개의 민간인 수용소를 설치 하여야 하였음. 성장은 각각의 민간인 수용소 설치 문제, 군수 문제, 경비 및 장비 문제에 책임이 지워 있었음. 캄보디아 민간인 수용소는 한국 해병연대 북부 도서에 위치 하고 있었으므로 작전 지역으로부터 민간인을 후송 하기 위한 수용소 주장을 1군단장을 통하여 32월남 하전 돌격단에 요청 되었음. 월남 정부 관리와의 협동 및 협조는 작전 계획을 실시하는데 중요한 요소가 되었음

도표 6을 검토 해보면 작전은 의미 있는 결과를 보태 하였음이 분명함. 부이씨 카부조직은 포란 되었으며, 지역은 자유 우방군 통제 하에 놓이게 되었음. 승룡 15-1 조직전은 철저히 계획되고 용납이 준비 되고 적극적으로 실시 된 한미 협동 상륙 작전 이었으며, 공동의 적에 대한 새로운 성공적인 자유 우방군의 결실 이었음.



## OPERATION DEFIANT STAND

1. BACKGROUND - Operation Defiant Stand was a combined U.S. Navy, Marine Corps/Republic of Korea Marine Corps operation conducted on the northern portion of Barrier Island, located some twenty miles south of Danang, Vietnam. It was the first amphibious operation conducted by ROKMC units since arriving in Vietnam, 9 October 1965. Although it was a combined operation, the United States Special Landing Force landed on 7 September 1969, in their own southern landing area and 5 days later on 12 September 1969, ROKMC RL2-2 landed in an independent ROKMC amphibious landing in the northern landing area. This marked the first independent amphibious landing the ROKMC has ever conducted. Not since the landing at Inchon, Korea in September 1950, had U.S. and ROK Marines operated together in an amphibious assault landing. The Commanding General of the Second ROKMC Brigade, Brigadier General LEE, DONG HO, selected his Chief of Staff, Colonel KOH, KWANG SOO, to be Commanding Officer of the northern landing force, RL2-2, and planning began on 25 August 1969.

2. SELECTION OF TARGET - Barrier Island was the area of two earlier amphibious operations by the Special Landing Force in 1969. These were Operation Daring Rebel, 5-19 May 1969, and Operation Hold Pursuit from 27 June 1969 to 6 July 1969. These two operations netted some 180 VC/NVA killed and the Viet Cong Infrastructure was disrupted. Each time the Landing Force departed the Amphibious Objective Area, the enemy reoccupied the area and VCI personnel returned. The Song Cua Dia River is an important infiltration route and consequently Barrier Island is an active VCI area. The island is located in southeastern Quang Nam and

northeastern Quang Tin Provinces. See figures 1 & 2 for the location on the coast of the Republic of Vietnam.

The III MAF G-2 conducted a target analysis and the key enemy elements are depicted on figure 3. The analysis included a section on VCI and the effect of pacification. According to the 31 May 1969 HES Report, the target area had a population of approximately 20,000. Since May 1969, however, approximately 8500 people from this area have resettled elsewhere. Also during May, many refugees departed the area. The population at the end of August 1969 was estimated to be between 4000 and 8000. Approximately 377 VCI were estimated to have been operating in the area with an additional 296 identified. The conclusion to the target analysis stated that nearly all the villages within the target area had been under VC control for years. One Local Force Battalion and one Local Force Company with a total strength of 320 had been identified as operating in the target area. Guerrilla strength had been estimated to be 534 with an additional 295 identified. The area was known to be filled with bunkers, fortifications and tunnels. The G-2 recommended that the target area be exploited so the land area could be returned to GVN control and enemy forces, including VCI, could be destroyed.

3. FORCES INVOLVED - The Northern Landing Force was the ROKMC RL2-2 comprised of the 2nd, 3rd and 5th Battalions. The total ROKMC forces numbered approximately 1400. The Southern Landing Force was Special Landing Force ALFA consisting of BLT 1/26 and HMM 265 with a total of 2000 U.S. Marines. Both landing forces were supported by ARG ALFA consisting of the USS IWO JIMA (LPH-2), USS WHETSTONE (LSD-27), USS COLONIAL (LSD-18), USS WASHTENAW

COUNTY (LST-1166) and the USS WASHBURN (LKA-108).

4. COMMAND RELATIONSHIPS - The operation command relationships were as depicted on figure 4.

5. SEQUENCE OF EVENTS - Refer to Figure 5 for specifics.

6. NARRATIVE OF OPERATION - The ROKMC 3rd Battalion commenced pre-D-Day operations (D-7) at 050900H Sep 69, landing one company by helicopter and two companies by LVTP-5's in western Barrier Island and commenced search and clear operations from west to east. The landing was not opposed and the companies began moving rapidly to the east to reach blocking positions along the west bank of the Truong Giang River. By 10 September 1969, the 3rd Battalion had found one dead VC body killed by air, detained 10 VC and apprehended 2 VCI's without any friendly casualties. On 11 September 1969, the 3rd Battalion was in position in their assigned blocking positions. Resistance had been light throughout the pre-D-Day operation.

On 7 September 1969, SIF ALFA landed 2 companies by helicopter near the Truong Giang River and 2 companies over Green beach with H-Hour being 0700 and L-Hour 0840. The weather was poor with rain but improved as the day progressed. The landing was unopposed and the companies began search and clear operations. Their assigned blocking positions were to be attained by 11 September 1969, or D-1. On 8 September, one LVTP-5 was destroyed when it ran over a mine while on a resupply mission. By 2400, 8 September, contact remained light resulting in only 8 enemy KIA, one WIA, 49 detainees and 2 civilian defectors.

While operations continued ashore, the other 2 battalions of ROKMC

RLT-2 had to be embarked aboard ARG ALFA shipping. On 9 September 1969, the 5th Battalion was heli-lifted from their ROKMC 2nd Brigade area of operations, to the USS IWO JIMA (LPH-2) and the 2nd Battalion was moved by LCM's from the beach near the ROKMC 2nd Brigade CP to the USS WHEYSTONE (LSD-27), the USS COLONIAL (LSD-18), and the USS WASHTENAW COUNTY (LST-1166). Shipboard drills, wet net training and a turn away rehearsal were conducted for all ROKMC personnel embarked during 10-11 September 1969. The drills went smoothly and the ROKMC units executed all requirements in excellent fashion.

By 102400H Sep 69, enemy contact had remained light in all areas except for one contact at 101430H Sep 69, in which three U.S. Marines were killed and three others wounded.

On 11 September, BLT 1/26 Companies A, F, and C were in assigned blocking positions 500 meters south of the ROKMC RLT-2/BLT 1/26 boundary and D Company was positioned near the southern river of the Truong Giang River to prevent individuals from using the crossing.

After both the ROKMC 3rd Battalion and the SLF units were in blocking positions, a leaflet drop and an "Early Word" broadcast were made over the northern landing area of Barrier Island on 11 September 1969, from the Truong Giang River east to the South China Sea, and north of BLT 1/26 blocking positions.

On D-Day, 12 September 1969, L-Hour for the 5th Battalion was 0800 and H-Hour over Red Beach for the 2nd Battalion was at 0928. The landing was executed without opposition and all companies consolidated their positions. The 5th Battalion moved quickly to their blocking positions

SECRET

in the western portion of the northern landing area. The 2nd Battalion began search and clear operations moving from the coast west towards the blocking positions of the 5th Battalion.

On D+1, the 3rd Battalion was heli-lifted back to their former area of operations. At the end of D+2 or at 2400, 14 September 1969, the results for the operation for the ROKMC RLT-2 were: 74 enemy KIA, 19 VCI or civilian defectors, 32 innocent civilians and 503 civilian detainees.

The operation continued as planned through 19 September 1969 and on this date, SLF ALFA backloaded aboard assigned shipping and Operation Defiant Stand was terminated at 191700H Sep 1969. Results for the operation are shown in figure 6.

After SLF ALFA departed and the Amphibious Objective Area was dissolved, ROKMC RLT-2 requested their area of operations be expanded to include the AO vacated by BLT 1/26. The request was approved and RLT-2 units plan to operate in the expanded AO until 30 September 1969.

7. RESULTS OF OPERATION - Figure 6 shows the statistics for the operation from 2-19 September 1969. Throughout the operation the problem of control of civilians was always present. Since the area of operations covered portions of two provinces, a separate Combined Holding and Interrogation Center (CHIC) had to be established for each province. The Province Chiefs were responsible for the establishment, logistics, security and maintenance of their particular province CHIC. The Quang Nam CHIC was located on an island north of the ROKMC RLT-2 area of operations. Consequently the RVN River Assault Group 32 (RAG-32) was requested, through CG, I Corps, to provide boat transportation for the civilians cleared from the area.

Cooperation and coordination with NVN officials became an important element in the operational planning execution.

By examination of figure 6, it is apparent that the operation produced meaningful results. The Viet Cong Infrastructure (VCI) was again disrupted and the area was placed under FVMAF control.

Operation Defiant Stand was a thoroughly planned, well prepared, and aggressively executed combined ROKMC/USMC amphibious operation. It was another successful FVMAF effort against a common enemy.




2. Tactical aspect of terrain  
 a. Climate and weather study

(1) Climatic brief: During the past half of september all of southeast Asia remains under the influence of the southwest monsoon. Traces of the northeast monsoon begin to appear late in the month but generally affect the area north of 16N latitude in North Vietnam and Laos. September marks the beginning of the autumn transition season; the period when neither monsoonal flow is predominant. This transition period usually lasts from mid september to mid october.

September is the month of maximum typhoon activity in the western Pacific, curves to the northwest in the vicinity of the Philippines, and recurves northeastward Japan. One storm in six continues west ward across the Philippines to the south China sea and toward the coast of north Vietnam. The probability of a typhoon forming or moving in to the south China sea is two every three years, and incidence of tropical storm is three every two years.

(2) Climatological weather  
 CLOUDS: There will be a significant increase in clouds amount along the northeast coast with an increase of ceilings under 5,000 feet. However partly cloudy conditions will continue to prevail with ceiling s between 2,000 and 4,000 feet. 3/10 or less sky coverage can be expected on an average of the days during the month.

PRECIPITATION: Mean precipitation amount will be six to nine inches along the coast, the majority of which will fall in showers and thunder showers. Precipitation will be observed on an average of 15 days during the month and there will be seven thunder storm days.

**WIND:** During the first part of the month prevailing direction will be southwest. In the later part of the month northeast monsoonal flow will predominate with wind directions of northeast or east. There will be a slight decrease in wind speeds from those experienced in August with an average of 5 to 15 knots. Gusts to 30 knots or higher will be observed in thunder showers. The land and sea breeze will continue unabated throughout the month.

**TEMPERATURES:** The temperatures will be slightly less than August with daily maximum of 85 to 90 and minimums of 74 to 78. Relative humidity will remain in 80 to 90 % ranges.

**SEA AND SWELL:** Both will continue to be southerly in direction with a height of less than 4 feet.

## (3) Special phenomena;

**WINDS OF LAOS:** These hot dry winds originate on the high plateaus of Laos and Annam Range and blow down the eastern slopes to the lowlands immediately adjacent to the water. They cause a rapid rise in temperature and extreme evaporation along their path. These winds occur primarily during southwest monsoon but can occur during the transitional season.

**CRACHIN:** The crachin is a period of wide spread fog and drizzle or light rain that affect coastal regions north of 12N latitude and is peculiar to the northwest monsoon. Ceilings are usually below 1500 feet and visibility less than two miles. Crachin conditions are rare during September but may occur on 1 or 2 days in the later part of the month.

## (5) Long range forecast for period 07 sept to 20 sept 1969

Sky conditions: Partly cloudy. Base of low clouds 2,000 to 4,000 feet.

Visibility: 5 to 10 miles.

Weather: Scattered showers and thunder showers, mostly during the afternoon and evening.

Wind : Southwesterly 5 to 15 knots except easterly 8 to 18 knots during the afternoon sea breeze. Gusts to 30 knots in thunder showers.

Temperatures: Max 88 Min 74

Sea and swell : Southerly 2 to 4 feet.

## b. Terrain

(1) General: The operational area consists of northern portion of Barrier island. It is bounded on the east by the south Chinassa, on west by the song Giang, on the north by the song Cua Dai, and on the south between BT 195470 to BT 248470.

It is generally a flat, sandy strip, highly cultivated both wet and dry crops are evident in this well populated area. Along bounding rivers there is a fringe of wet cultivation (rice) varying from 200m to 1,000m in width. A strip of wet cultivation also generally bisects the island from north to south varying from 200m to 1,000m in north also.

The southwestern quadrant with exception to the fringe of rice cultivation is generally covered by loose sand as is the north western corner.

The eastern third, the area of highest elevation (10-19m) is also generally sandy but stabilized by planted low trees (12 to 14 feet)

## (2) Observatiin and field of fire

Observation: From the ground observation will be generally limited by hedgerows and the flat terrain, however wide areas are open to view by elevating the observer to a minimum, this produces excellent observation.

Field of fire: Field of fire should be virtually unlimited except where observation is deterred due to the low flat terrain.

**Cover and concealment**

**Cover :** Cover is very limited due to the flat terrain. The paddy dikes and small sand dunes offer the only cover available.

**Concealment:** The hedgerows sheltering the cultivated areas, the only concealment worthy of mention inland. Beach dunes offer some concealment in the eastern areas.

**Obstacles**

**Wet crops:** The extensive wet crop areas predominately along the two bounding rivers and 3 km strip in the north central area prevent movement on the island over these wet areas. Movement of vehicles and personnel will be generally channeled N-S.

**Hedgerows:** Numerous hedgerows will offer some hinderance to movement by personnel and light vehicles.

**Sand :** Loose sand in the sandy area will hinder helicopter operations and slow vehicle movement.

**Streams:** There are several small streams, primarily in the northern portion of the operation area. The southern area has two small streams also. All streams are tidal and caution should be used when crossing.

**Artificial obstacles:** No anti vehicle ditches, wire or stakes are noted on aerial photography. However, due to reports on past operations in this area, there are probably numerous booby traps and mines throughout this area.

**Key terrain features:** Since this area consist of very low and flat terrain, critical terrain features are limited. However, there is a broken line line of large dunes parallel to and 500 meters inland from the beach generally 10 meters high with the highest point (19m) at BT 234489.

**Avenues of approach :** The flat terrain again offers no real limit to approach either ground or air. The bounding water areas will confine movement of forces generally N-S. An excellent approach is over the eastern beach which runs the entire length of the operation area. There are no apparent obstacles and the beach has a flat gradient (approx 1:60). This beach is slightly concave.

**Helicopter landing zone:** Helicopter operations are limited only by the loose sand in the west and northern fringe of wet crop area. Vegetation is generally low and offers no obstacles except the taller trees in the hedgerows and an area of planted trees in the eastern third of the AO.

## c. Enemy situation

- (1) General. Barrier island has habitually been a domain for VC/NVA. Despite the numerous operations conducted by the 196th BDE and USMC (7th Regt) in all parts of the area, the enemy continues to use it as a forward staging area. All source of intelligence reveals that the complex includes training sites, dispensaries and logistical support networks. It is, traditionally, the close-in sanctuary from which mounts their forays, military and political against Hoi An city, and HIEU NHON district. Recently, several sharp, bitter contacts has been made with enemy forces occupying well fortified positions in this area.
- (2) Composition, disposition and strength. Base-d within the area of interest are approximately 250 organized enemy forces. V-25 battalion has not identified since May 1969. An estimated 200 local force VC and hamlet guerillas are in 16 hamlets of operation area. A thorough study of the enemy order of battle, see Tab 5 (Order of battle)
- (3) Enemy capabilities. The enemy in the area are expected to evade in the face of superior friendly forces. Local pockets of stiff resistance from well fortified complex of fighting holes, thickets and bunkers can be expected as the enemy attempt to cover his withdrawal or where enemy elements are cut off from avenues of escape.
- (4) Reinforcement capabilities. Force capable of reinforcing enemy unit in the area of operation are the 36 NVA regiment and Q-81 battalion. It is estimated that at least 10 hours would be required for the enemy to reinforce with above enemy units.

1. Location : The beach extends from BT 220565 to BT508149
2. Length : 52 Km. This beach, slightly concave, is a barrier island 200m to 6Km wide.
3. Width : 70 to 160m at low water and 35 to 90m at high water.
4. Gradient : 1:25 to 1:50 for the low water to high water zone.  
1:15 for the high water zone.
5. Approach : The nearshore bottom slopes moderate to flat shoreward of the 5m (18ft) depth contour. The 11m (36ft) depth contour lies 600m to 3km off the high water line. The offshore approach is partly obstructed by an island 14m off the center of the beach; by shoals and rocks 5m to 10m off the northwest end of the beach; and by wrecks 1 1/2 nm off the northwest end of the beach and 2 1/2 nm off the southeast end of the beach. The nearshore approach is partly obstructed by rocks 220m and a wreck 1km off the southeast end of the beach. Shoals with a minimum depth of 1, 8m are located 1 to 2nm (1, 5 to 3km) off the southeast end of the beach. The nearshore approach is flanked to the northwest by the shifting sandbars off the river mouth ( Song Cua Dai) and on the southeast by the reef-fringed point. The bottom is sand. Anchorage in 14 to 18m (48 to 60ft) depth is found 1 1/2 nm northeast and northwest end of the beach. The bottom is unknown. Another anchorage in 5 to 7m (18 to 24ft) depth is located 5nm southeast of the southeast end of the beach, here the bottom is sand.
6. Surf and Tide : Surf of 1m (4ft) or greater can be expected to occur as follows;  
 55 percent of the time in winter, 22 percent of the time is spring, 5 percent of the time in summer, 34 percent of the time in fall.  
 Tidal range is 1, 5m (4, 5ft).

7. Material and Firmness : The sand is firm in wet areas and soft where dry.
8. Exits : Exits is crosscountry or laterally on the northern part of the beach to trails running between the villages. A small bridge is reported at BT170495 and is the only connection from this Barrier island to the mainland. The southern half of this Barrier beach is less than 1km wide and exit is laterally along the beach by a trail. The TRUONG GIANG River separates the Barrier beach from the mainland. Route QL-1 parallels the entire length of the beach and is 5 to 10km inland.
9. Terrain immediately behind beach.
- The beach is backed by dunes partly covered in places by brush and trees. There are several villages and ricefield areas. The TRUONG GIANG River lies from 1 to 6km behind the beaches. On the west side of this river there is an extensive low land area dissected by many rivers and streams. This area is largely covered with ricefields. Route QL-1 and the inoperative coastal railroad are about 10km inland from the beach.
10. Critical Features.
- The entire beach is backed by the TRUONG GIANG River which is another major obstacle for penetration inland after the initial landing. The southern half of the Barrier island is less than 1km wide and would severely bottleneck any landing forces. The northern half of the beach is good for localized landings.
11. Evaluation: Proposed landing beach used by RLT is considered favorable for amphibious landings.


