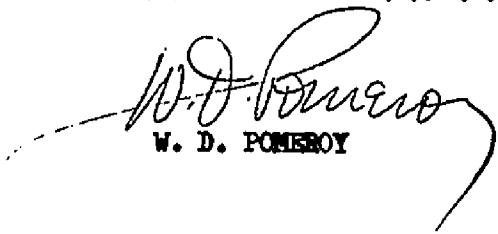

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SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1 Feb 1966. The 1st Amphibian Tractor Battalion continues in general support of the 3d Marine Division. One platoon from Company "B" is in direct support of the 9th Marines and one platoon from Company "B" is in direct support of the 3d Marines. A perimeter patrol is sent out a minimum of once every 24 hours on our eastern perimeter and will not be mentioned again unless a significant event occurs. The Battalion continues to provide approximately 120 lbs. of excess foodstuffs (garbage) for the village livestock of Phong Le Bao (1) (AT 995712) daily. Battalion medical personnel gave medical treatment to 55 villagers of the Sampan Village of Khue Trung (BT 036755). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer distributed 21 lbs. of candy, 141 lbs. of clothing.

2 Feb 1966. Three LVTE-1 Mine Clearance Vehicles in support of the 9th Marines, fired 6 linear line charges resulting in 8 secondary explosions, while in the process of clearing Hill 55 (AT 972621).

3 Feb 1966. Three LVTE-1 Mine Clearance Vehicles in support of the 9th Marines, fired 6 linear line charges resulting in 9 secondary explosions, while in the process of clearing Hill 55. They also completed an access route for LVTP-5s to Hill 55.

4 Feb 1966. At 1345, LCpls J. G. GALLEGOS and G. L. GOLDEN were WIA while on riparian patrol. Company "B" provided one platoon of Marines to act as a "Clutch Platoon" to support 1/9. Three LVTE-1s fired one linear line charge resulting in 3 secondary explosions, while in the process of clearing Hill 55 for the 9th Marines. Battalion Medical Personnel gave medical treatment to 65 villagers of the Sampan Village of Khue Trung (BT 036755). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer distributed 900 lbs. of bulgar wheat, 160 lbs. of clothing and 500 bars of soap.

5 Feb 1966. The Company "B" "Clutch Platoon" returned from 1/9 in order that a high priority LVT commitment could be made.

6 Feb 1966. Pvt R. E. MANTILL was WIA at 1730 while on riparian patrol. The 3 LVTE-1 Mine Clearance Vehicles in support of the 9th Marines reported firing 2 linear line charges resulting in 8 secondary explosions while in the process of clearing Hill 55.

7 Feb 1966. At 1520, LVTP-5 (H-16) hit a land mine at (AT 985625) resulting in the complete destruction of the vehicle and the WIA of Cpl F. L. BOYD and PFC L. COHILL. The 3 LVTE-1 Mine Clearance Vehicles in support of the 9th Marines reported firing 3 linear line charges resulting in 11 secondary explosions while in the process of clearing Hill 55. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 40 villagers of Cam Le Bao (BT 014718).

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While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs NCO distributed 250 bars of soap.

8 Feb 1966. The 3 LVTE-1s in support of the 9th Marines fired 2 linear line charges resulting in 3 secondary explosions while in the process of clearing Hill 55. The AN/PRS-1 (SID 150) located on post #5 on our eastern perimeter, detected movement on 3 different occasions during the night and upon illuminating the area, a VC was observed. On the first occasion, the VC fired 2 rounds S/A fire into our perimeter and the perimeter guard returned fire with negative results. Helicopters were used to resupply the 3 LVTE-1s on Hill 55 with 14 line charges and rockets. Commanding General's inspection of the Battalion began.

9 Feb 1966. Cpl R. B. HEWITT was WIA at 0055 while on riparian patrol. At 0830, PFC D. ELMENDORF was WIA while on riparian patrol. The 3 LVTE-1s in support of the 9th Marines reported firing 1 linear line charge resulting in 6 secondary explosions, while in the process of clearing Hill 55. The Battalion Medical Officer treated 53 villagers from the Sampan Village of Khme Trung (BT 036755). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer distributed 2 large boxes of toys, 10 lbs. of candy, 800 lbs. of bulgar wheat and 1500 bars of soap.

10 Feb 1966. The 3 LVTE-1s in support of the 9th Marines fired 3 linear line charges resulting in 10 secondary explosions, while in the process of clearing Hill 55.

11 Feb 1966. Helicopters resupplied the LVTE-1s on Hill 55 with 2 linear line charges. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 85 villagers from Cam Le Bao (BT 014718). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs NCO distributed 6 cans of food supplement, 2 boxes of candy, 100 lbs. of clothing and 48 boxes of bubble bath.

12 Feb 1966. The 3 LVTE-1s on Hill 55 were resupplied by Helicopter with 8 linear line charges and 5 rockets.

13 Feb 1966. The 3 LVTE-1s on Hill 55 in support of the 9th Marines fired 3 linear line charges resulting in 12 secondary explosions while in the process of clearing Hill 55.

14 Feb 1966. At 1050, LVTP-5 (B-12) hit a land mine at (AT 896824) resulting in the complete destruction of the LVT and 3 LVT WIA, Sgt D. E. ROGERS, Cpl A. M. MILLETTE and PFC C. R. SUTTON. Infantry personnel aboard suffered 6 KIAs, including 1 ARVN. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 80 villagers of the Sampan Village of Khme Trung (BT 036755). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs NCO distributed 2 boxes of candy and 1,000 bars of soap. Commanding General's inspection of the Battalion was completed.

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15 Feb 1966. The 3 LVTE-1s in support of the 9th Marines fired 5 linear line charges resulting in 29 secondary explosions while in the process of clearing Hill 55.

16 Feb 1966. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 90 villagers of Cam Le Bac (BT 014718).

17 Feb 1966. At 1750, Sgt A. R. CHILDS and Cpl J. J. FERRA were WIA while on riparian patrol. The 3 LVTE-1s in support of the 9th Marines fired 2 linear line charges resulting in 5 secondary explosions. Helicopters resupplied the LVTE-1s on Hill 55 with 2 linear line charges and 2 rockets. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 63 villagers from the Sampan Village of Khue Trung (BT 036755). While medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs WCO distributed 3 boxes of candy, 600 lbs. of bulgar wheat and 1,000 bars of soap.

18 Feb 1966. The 3 LVTE-1s in support of the 9th Marines reported back to the CP upon completion of the mine clearing operation on Hill 55. While on this operation, they fired a total of 32 linear line charges resulting in 98 secondary explosions. At 2015, the 1st (Prov) Armd Amphibian Platoon (Rein) returned to this CP from Operation "Double Eagle". The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 67 villagers from Cam Le Bac (BT 014718). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer, assisted by the Battalion Interpreter, made liaison with the Village Chief for the purpose of establishing a list of "Key Persons" in that area. 1,000 bars of soap were also distributed.

20 Feb 1966. Two LVTE-1 Mine Clearance Vehicles departed for 3/9 at Marble Mountain.

21 Feb 1966. The 2 LVTE-1s in support of 3/9 at Marble Mountain returned to the CP area reporting the firing of 1 linear line charge resulting in 2 secondary explosions. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 70 villagers of the Sampan Village of Khue Trung (BT 036755). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs Officer distributed 3 boxes of candy, 1 box soap, 1 box toys, 36 boxes bubble bath and 1,000 bars of soap.

22 Feb 1966. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 65 villagers of Cam Le Bac (BT 014718). While the medical treatment was being given, a Battalion Civil Affairs team from the LVTE-1 Platoon, distributed 300 lbs. of wheat and rice, 10 lbs. of candy, 1 box of toys and 200 bars of soap.

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24 Feb 1966. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 65 villagers from the Sampan village of Khue Trung (BT 036755). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs NCO distributed 800 lbs. of rice, 15 boxes of candy and 1,250 bars of soap.

25 Feb 1966. The Battalion S-4 submitted a letter requesting additional cantonment for Company "A", 1st AMTrac Battalion. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 80 villagers of Cam Le Bac (BT 014718). While the medical treatment was being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs NCO distributed 300 lbs. of rice and 500 bars of soap.

27 Feb 1966. One LVTP-5 Command and 10 LVTP-5s returned to this CP from the SLF with BLT 2/3.

28 Feb 1966. The Battalion Medical Officer gave medical treatment to 90 villagers of the Sampan Village of Khue Trung (BT 036755). Division Dental personnel gave dental treatment to 8 villagers. While the medical and dental treatments were being given, the Battalion Civil Affairs NCO distributed 4 boxes of candy, 4 bags of rice and 1,000 bars of soap.

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c. Detection.

(1) Target detection is influenced by type of terrain, weather conditions, soil compaction and background noises.

(2) Operator proficiency is a prerequisite to efficient detection and with practice a good operator can correctly read contacts through minimum background noise.

(3) The best periods of detection are during the hours 2300-0600. Contacts have been picked up tracked and correctly identified at distances up to 40 meters from the seismometer. These target contacts were verified by visual identification.

(a) Targets identified have been VC on four occasions, dogs, cats and scorpions on others.

(b) Men have been identified as crawling, walking and running.

(4) Operators have received formal schooling and intensive on the job training. Lectures type instruction does not accomplish the requisite sound identification necessary to classify a contact by type or to be able to read through background noise.

d. Future Developments.

(1) At this time an experimental schematic board is being constructed in an attempt to couple a visual flashing light system in concert with the present sound source.

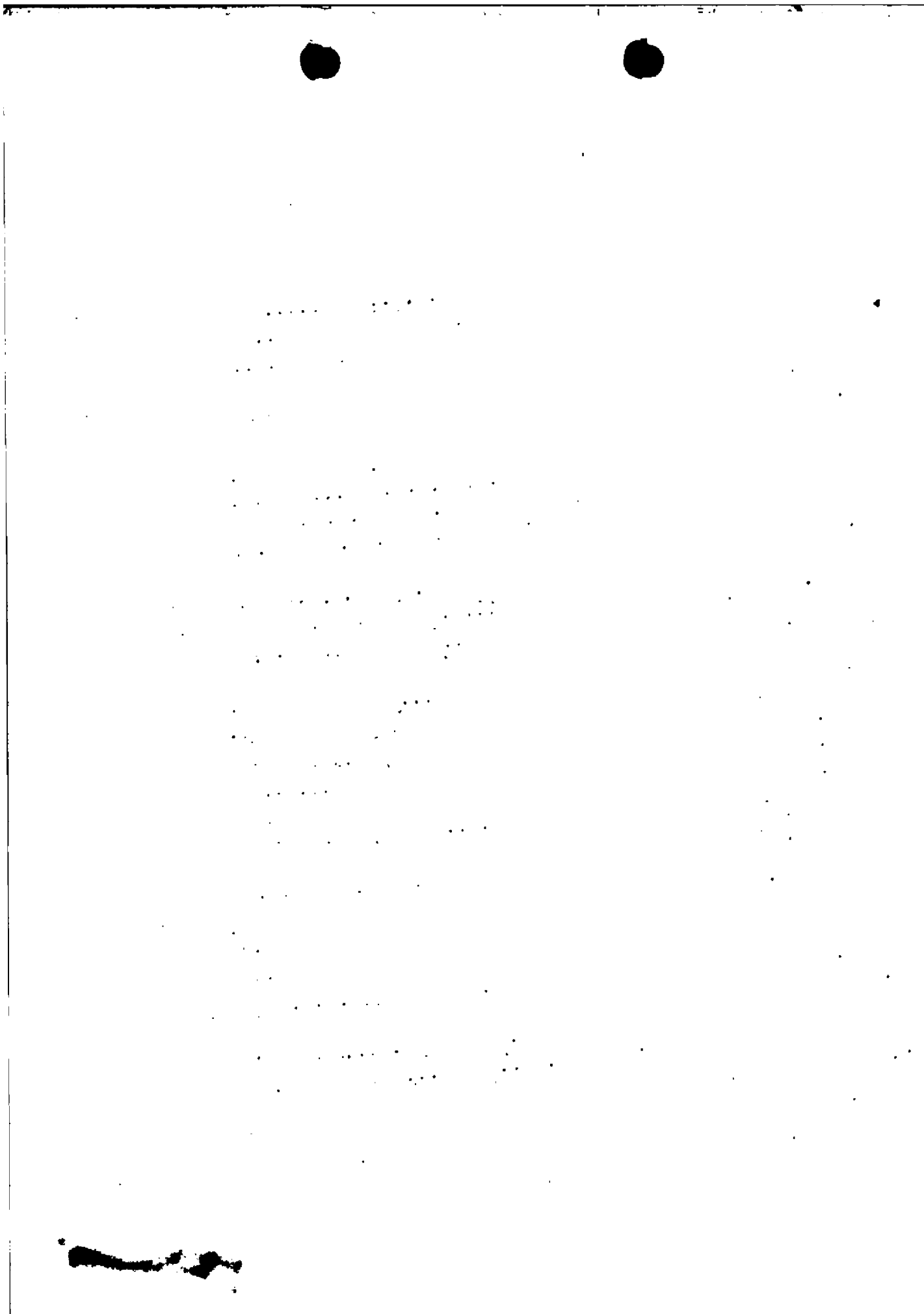
