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



- 1. Enemy contacts in December 1967 continued at essentially the same high level reached during November. NVA contacts, consisting of either fire fights, mortar duels or AO sightings, occurred eleven times within and just above the northern part of this Battalion's AO.
- a. In the southern part of the AO, twelve incidents of VC contact/perimeter probes occurred.
- 2. Support of DYEMARKER continued. For StrongPoint A-1, manned by 1st Bn, 2d ARVN Regt, this consisted of weekly resupply trips by LVT's taking class I, III, V material from the north bank of the Cua Viet up to Hill 23 and Hill 31. Some LVT's sustained damage enroute due to mining activity.
- a. Support of Base Area C-1 involved much greater participation by this Battalion. Tactically, 1st AmTrac Bn elements were committed on five occasions to reinforce infantry units at C-1. Logistically, there were daily assignments of Marines and LVT to fill, carry and emplace sandbags. On 31 Dec, all twenty-six bunkers at C-1 were "functionally completed". By this is meant that the roofs of all of the bunkers had been completed in accordance with design criteria and that large quantities of sand had been banked up all around the sides of each bunker. Work continues on all the sides, terracing them with more sandbags.
- 3. Co "A", 1st AmTrac Bn conducted a S/D operation south of the AO on 6 Dec with elements of the 1st ARVN Regt. HAS Co and elements of Co "B" held a similar operation on 22 Dec with elements of 1st ARVN Regt. On 25 Dec, A Co and the Bn Command Group joined C Co (Rein), 1st Bn, 3d Mar in a reconnaisance in force from C-1 to a line one kilometer above the AO. This recon found no enemy but swept area in which BLT 3/1 had made contact 21-22 Dec while it was ashore in Operation FORTRESS RIDGE (SLF Bravo).
- 4. Enemy artillery hit Cua Viet Port Facility on 11 and 16 Dec.
- 5. During the month, one or more visits to this Bn were made by COMUSMACV, CG, III MAF, Dep CG, III MAF, CG, 3d Mar Div and ADC, 3d Mar Div.

LIST OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

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Co "A" while on sweep of northern AO vic (YD 301739) had one LVTP-5 (A-22) detonate AT mine on portside. Number one roadwheel and 25 blocks of track destroyed. One WIA non MedEvac.

Co "A" (-) and one plat of F/2/h while sweeping area in vic (YD 297737-290753) received sporadic SAF and 82 HM mortar fire. Returned fire with SAF and 60 MM mortar. Called in artillery from LVTH-6 battery and general support from naval gun fire. Continued sweep of area. One friendly KTA, 11 WTA (nine MedEvac). One NVA KTA (P).

Co "A" (-) while on sweep of northern AO had one LVTP-5 (A-25) hit unknown type pressure detonated mine in vic (YD 294752). Mine blew off #7,8,9 road-wheel assemblies, and ruptured the hull. Two WIA non MedEvac.

H&S Co L/P in vic (YD 349694) observed five to six people at (YD 346690). Called 81 MM mortar fire. L/P adjusted, unable to observe results.

lst AmTrac Bn perimeter defense sentries detected possible movement of 2 - 3 men since nightfall. L/Ps received some small arms in their general direction. SAF could possibly have been PFs in neighboring unit location. Fired 81 MM illum and HE, fired M-79 and small arms at possible targets. Increased perimeter security by going on red alert.

At 032322H Co "B", 1st AmTrac Bn spotted movement 10 yards to front of wire. Fired small arms and illumination. Negative results. Will check at first light.

At 032325H Co "A", lst AmTrac Bn heard movement to their front in their sector of Bn defense perimeter. Files small arms and illum. Negative results.

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FMS Co L/P spotted three figures moving toward Bn defensive wire. Took them under fire with small arms and illuminated. Negative results. Will search at first light.

H&S Co and Co "B" checked perimeter after previous night's activity. Found wire cut in several places. Also found two bloody handerchiefs and branches laid on ground pointing toward perimeter.

One squad of F/2/4 reinforced by Scout Sniper Team conducted day light patrol at (YD 296745). Scout Sniper Team moved forward to observe and was brought under heavy volume of SAF and AWF wounding one Scout Sniper in eye. Returned fire and withdrew leaving behind one PRC-25, one Scout Sniper rifle, Remington 700, set of binoculars, one helmet and liner. One WIA emergency MedEvac.

Three LVTP-5 Co "A" while on supply run to A-1 received six rounds of artillery. Negative casualties.

F/2/4 attempted to recover Sniper's gear that was lost in action in morning (040930H). Was brought under enemy fire by approx 35 NVA. The enemy was in fortified positions using semi and automatic weapons. Took enemy under fire, called in arty mission from LVTH-6. Fired 199 rounds. Reaction time for arty was seven mimites, excellent coverage of target. After mission, F/2/4 swept area. Negative results. Used AO to direct fire mission. He spotted one NVA KIA (C).

Co "A" lst Amfrac Bn dispatched two LVTP-5 with one plat infantry to C-4 for reaction force. LVT A-38 had power failure while crossing CUA VIET River. Naval Support Activity sent boat to assist but was unable to retrieve vehicle before it shipped water and sank. Position marked by bouy.





UDT coming from Dong Ha to attach cable. Vehicle believed to be retrievable. Equipment that went down with vehicle was one .45 cal pistol, six M-14 rifles and one .30 cal machine gun.

AO adjusted artillery on two bunkers in which NVA had fled vic (YD 3017h6). Four rounds impacted on bunker.

Operator of TD-18 dozing just south of Bn perimeter vic (YD 349692) received 6-8 rounds sniper fire from vic (YD-347688). Sent two LVTP-5 with squad to pull TD-18 in and cover route.

Platoon of 30 Vietnamese of Junk Fleet departed their CP with USN advisor to sweep from area near Pho Hoi to 1st AmTrac Bn lines in attempt to find snipers. Secured at 2300. Negative results.

F/2/h patrol at (YD 315725) saw five individuals at (YD 316726). Proceeded to check them for identification. Individuals ran. Fired warning shot. Three individuals apprehended, two individuals escaped. Detainees interrogated by 7th ITT and forwarded to Dong Ha.

F/2/4 observed four individuals at outer perimeter wire vic (YD 317727). Apprehended individuals. Interrogated by 7th ITT and forwarded to Dong Ha.

MS Co perimeter post spotted three people moving toward perimeter wire at (YD 352660). Fired nine M-79 rds. Observed one person fall as people broke and ran.


Co "A" with 16 LVTs departed CP to support 4th Bn, 1st ARVN Regt south of AO.

CO, H/2/1, XO and S-h of 2d Bn, 1st Mar paid liaison visit to Bn CP and to C-h to coordinate for possible relief of F/2/h.

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Co "A" while in support of 4th Bn, 1st ARVN Regt had one LVT (A-14) detonate grenade booby trap. Also found three other booby traps in area. Negative damage to LVT. Booby trap disarmed by ARVN personnel.

F/2/h patrol received enemy sniper fire while in day ambush position. Returned fire. Shot one NVA. Four men went to check suspected dead NVA. Came upon body and enemy detonated grenade resulting in two friendly WIA (MedEvac).

CG, III MAF and CG, 3d Mar Div visited Bn CP.

F/2/4 ambush vic (YD 293743) received 10 rds of 60 MM and 82 MM mortars from vic (YD 296749). Fired 28 rds of artillery. Reaction time 10 min. Negative surveillance.

F/2/4 ambush observed one squad NVA.
Engaged enemy with SAF, called artillery mission from LVTH-6s. Reaction time 10 minutes. Excellent coverage, negative surveillance.

F/2/h patrol/ambush vic (YD 297747) received 12 rounds of 82 MM morters from vic (YD 288755). Called artillery mission from LVTH-6s. Reaction time 10 minutes. Fired 12 rounds. Negative surveillance.

F/2/h ambush vic (YD 2977h6) received incoming illumination from vic (YD-286755). Called arty mission from LVTH-6s. Fired 18 rounds, reaction time seven minutes. Illumination ceased. Negative surveillance.

F/2/h patrol vic (YD 297747) observed suspected enemy position at (YD 293-75h). Called artillery mission to LVTH-6. Twelve rounds to cover friendly movement. Reaction time 15 minutes. Excellent effect. One short round. Friendly movement successfully effected. Negative friendly casualties.

7 December 1967

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
F/2/h patrol at (YD 297747) observed five NVA troops. Engaged enemy with SAF. One NVA hit in chest with SAF, NVA fell limp. Called artillery mission to LVTH-6s. Fired two rds WP, eight rds HE. Negative surveillance, excellent coverage. Reaction time seven minutes. One NVA KIA (P).


Co "A" LVTs while on resupply run to A-l in support of Operation DYEMRKER, discovered one AT mine vic (YD 328703) which was exposed by rains. Delivered to ARVN at A-l for destruction.

F/2/h swept area of enemy contact of 171000H. Saturated area with arty before moving out. Sweep force discovered 11 freshly made fighting holes with fresh camouflage and overhead covers made of wood. Fresh bare foot prints around position and one fresh bloodstain. Found two small bags of rice (individual ration) one cloth headgear, one NVA entrenching tool, one enemy U.S. medical gear used by enemy, one enemy AT mine.

F/2/4 patrol observed two individuals vic (YD 317724). Proceeded: to contact individuals to check for identification. Individuals fled sector and escaped in spite of threatening SAF.

Bn Scouts vic (YD 328700) while moving to night ambush stopped elderly Vietnamese male and questioned him as to VC activity. Man pointed in westerly direction and indicated that there were three VC in that direction. Patrol came upon three males sitting around a fire. Set patrol in position to observe. Seven male Vietnamese came to fire at same time. One broke out what appeared to be a map. Patrol illuminated and Vietnamese started to disperse. Patrol took them under fire with SAF resulting in one VC KIA (C), four VC WIA (three MedEvac). Investigation revealed KIA had no ID card. WIA had ID cards. No weapons found at site. Male with map and three others escaped.


One Vietnamese not MedEvaced was detained for interrogation by 7th ITT along with Chief of Ha Loc Hamlet who came out to scene.

A/O Smitty Charlie controlled airstrikes at (YD 2957h9). Three flights (six planes) with napalm, snake-eyes and air to ground rockets, excellent coverage of target.

F/2/4 vic (YD 313722) received two incoming rounds of 82 MM mortars, landing 450 meters short of wire. Determined direction of tube from C-4 as 5200 mils.

F/2/4 patrol vic (YD 302736) in process of uncovering a freshly planted AT mine received approximately 15 rounds 82 MM mortars from vic (YD 294-754). Returned fire of 18 rounds 4.2 mortars located at C-4. Negative surveillance. Incoming ceased. Marked position of mine, will retrieve later.

Platoon of F/2/4 swept area vic (YD-295752) struck earlier by airstrikes. Found six covered fighting holes and 24 to 26 one man fighting holes, collapsed by bombs, one first aid kit empty, one binocular case USFC type, one binocular case cover, unk origin, one can serum Albumin, was empty, one air way tube broken, one round cover made of reed, camouflaged, freshly made, one round cover, 60 MM HE, composition B lot MAM-AlO-410-66 empty cannisters, one unknown object appearing to be night sighting device for 60 MM, two mines, green Chinese manufacture 4-10-20-3A866Y, 40 ft single strand blue comm wire, one helmet U.S. complete belonging to friendly WIA, one machine gun magazine with shrapnel damage, two boxes, blue and appearing to be used for 60 MM fuses.





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F/2/h found one shallow enemy hole freshly dug vic (YD 306733); searched area, negative results.

Patrol from Junk Fleet swept area from Junk Fleet Base to AmTrac Bn perimeter wire. Ended sweep approximately 092300H. Negative results.

One Platoon of Co "A" with seven LVTP-5 while loading ARVN troops on LVTs at Strong Point A-1 received approximately 10 rounds of 82 MM mortars. Returned fire with 60 MM mortars from A-1, results unknown. Four USMC WIA (MedEvac), one KIA.

Two squads of F/2/4 on day ambush patrol vic (YD 296735) received heavy sniper fire from vic (YD 286738) direction 5400 mils. Returned fire with SAF, M-79 and LAW. Sending two squads reinforced to sweep area. Friendly KIA 1, 3 WIA (MedEvac). Eight NVA KIA (C), two NVA KIA (P).


Four individuals w/weapons were spotted vic (YD 307720) moving along C-4 wire. Appeared to be carrying heavy loads on back. Were taken under fire by F/2/4 with SAF. One dropped, others fled into treeline. Checked area. Negative results. Alerted ISA north bank Cua Viet for infiltrators.

F/2/4 unit sighted enemy of undetermined size, some NVA dressed exactly like USAC personnel. Some NVA dressed in NVA uniforms. Some had helmets and some had flak jackets. Engaged enemy with SAF. At least 20-25 NVA still active. Enemy remained in area, determined not to break contact. Sent 50 Marines rein elements from Co "B" lst AmTrac Bn to F/2/4, to assist sweep of area.

Two platoons Co "B" 1st AmTrac Bn, two platoons F/2/4 maintained night position at (YD 305734) and (YD 308732).

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
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A/O Smitty Charlie observed 4-5 freshly constructed bunkers vic (YD 281761) and one boat vic (YD 281769) with fresh trail leading to south. Ran one flight fixed wing A/C, destroyed one bunker. Called NGF, destroyed two more. Observed more bunkers in area. Will return with more fixed wing. TPQ at (YD 283760).

Two plats F/2/h and two plats Co "B" lst AmTrac Bn with two LVTH-6s and two LVTE-ls in direct support commenced sweep of area bounded by (YD 300730, 293742, 298747 and 310725).

Two LVTH-6 and one LVTE-1 with four LVTP-5 joined F/2/4 at 110630H. F/2/4 consisting of two plat F Co and two plat B Co, 1st AmTrac Bn had been in night ambush following contact 10 Dec. Deployed three plats on north south line and fourth plat at base forming inverted "L". At 110800H observed 40 NVA moving south vic (YD 295745) who were uniformly dressed in ponchos with rifles and packs under ponchos. Prepared to sweep from north to south to take his rear. Observed 11 NVA 70 meters north of (YD 297746) digging mortar position. Fired arty at them. Observed 11 NVA fall, position was neutralized. Prepared to sweep north and saw 15 NVA to west, partially behind sand dune. Called LVTH-6 up for direct fire. Five more NVA probed F/2/4 from south. LVTs attacked from east to west (YD 301739) w/howitzer, .50 cal MG, and AVF. Penetrated enemy north south route. Enemy fired approx 10 RPG rds, hitting one LVTH-6 on bow with one. No penetration, rocket glanced off top. LVTH-6 neutralized enemy fire and linked up with F/2/4; three maneuver plat of F/2/4 started sweep to the south and immediately met frontal fire to the south from approx 16 NVA. Exchanged SA and AVF for 30 minutes.

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


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Enemy also attacked from north (20) NVA, from northwest (8 NVA) using aimed rifle fire. Attack was repulsed. F/2/4 observed approx 20 NVA to the north. Two LVTH-6 maneuvered to engage them. Arty also called on them. Enemy neutralized. F/2/4 received approximately 18 rds of 60 MM mortar fire from the south. Fired counter battery arty and 4.2 mortar plus direct fire LVTH-6; received approximately 20 rds 60 MM mortar fire from the north. Engaged possible 82 MM mortar with arty, enemy made fresh attacks on F/2/L who by now had established a perimeter vic (YD 300740) with all four platoons and all tracked vehicles. 55 NVA came from north, 12 NVA from northwest, 20 NVA from south. Attacks were made simultaneously. Laid on heavy friendly arty north to interdict enemy reinforcements. Enemy mortar fire from north subsided. but continued sporadically until disengagement. Enemy infantry attacks were repulsed by heavy AVF from our dug in positions. Approx 20 NVA observed to north of F/2/4. Took under combined arms fire and SA/AWF. Approx eight NVA attacked from east same time. Stopped them with MG. Received six rounds 60 MM mortars from new position 90 meters north. Saw NVA crew and supporting infantry face to face since NVA were on exposed dune. Killed many with MG and SAF, plus LVTH-6 direct fire. Enemy activity ceased but some sniper fire continued. On order F/2/4 withdrew w/casualties to C-4, covering withdrawal with NGF and arty plus LVTH-6 direct fire. Plat leader 2d Plat Co "B" 1st AmTrac Bn discovered heavily used north-south trail running through (YD 282761-297727). Trail lined with comm wire waist high tied to trees as a guide. Many storage bins along trail dug into dunes. Hinged tops planted with grass, flowers etc. No time to check contents of them. Some NVA had flak jackets and helmets (USMC).

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
Two LVTH-6 giving direct fire support fired 13h rds HE and WP and 3,600 rds .50 cal. Mortar detachment 1/12 at C-4 fired 282 rds 4.2" mortars. Four LVTH-6 operating at Cua Viet in indirect fire support shot 280 rds. NGF fired 231 rds general support. Very careful checks of report made among all unit leaders to verify bodies shattered by 105 MM howitzer direct hits plus M-79 and NGF plus rifle fire confirms 54 NVA KIA (C) and 37 NVA KIA (P). One company 1st Bn 2d ARVN Regt moved into blocking position from YD 290730 to 300720 approx 111330H. They rec'd some enemy SAF and 60 Mi mortar fire from vic (YD 293737). They swept area and killed two NVA confirmed and ten probable. (Not included my total). They had one WIA not included my total. ARVN Company departed for A-1 approx 111630H. Co "A", 1st AmTrac Bn had moved up towards F/2/4 commencing 111415H on a line starting at C-4 and passing through a line from YD 295735 to YD 302736. They covered F/2/4 withdrawal, then withdrew on order leaving rein plat at YD 305730 in night ambush position. G/S arty from Centipede. Number of rds fired unknown. MedEvacs flown into C-4 under low ceiling very courageous as was conduct CO. F/2/4 under two days contact. Digging in sand plus wind and rain caused most men armed with M16Al to jam by end of action, as were some M-LL. Of 20 friendly WIA, seven MedEvac, 13 non MedEvac.

The Cua Viet Port Facility received four rounds of 130 MM artillery inside CP. Called counter battery fire on known artillery positions. Negative casualties or damage.

The Cua Viet Port Facility received eight rounds of 130 MM arty. One rd in river, seven rds inside perimeter. Counter battery fire called on known enemy arty positions. Negative casualties or damage.

The Cua Viet Port Facility received four rds of 130 MM arty. Three rds inside perimeter, one round on north bank of river in ISA area. Counter battery NGF fired on suspected arty position. One WIA non MedEvac.

One alleged VC probed lines of detachment 3d Shore Party Bn on north bank of Cua Viet River. Probe was at end of wire manned by ARVN plat sharing position. VC reportedly threw two grenades. ARVN fired SAF and M-79. One ARVN WIA (non MedEvac).

F/2/4 patrol vic (YD 298737) retrieved body of their KIA of 101005H. Body not maimed. All gear including rifle, helmet, canteen and ammo in area recovered.

Three LVT Co "A" while in route to A-I StrongPoint had one LVTP-5 (A-23) hit AT mine vic (YD 29h719). Four road-wheels, torsion arms and support rollers blown off, 20 blocks of track destroyed. Dispatched three LVTP-5 to assist mined LVT. Continued resupply mission to A-1. Mined LVTP-5 towed to Bn CP. Estimate two T-41 type AT mines laid one atop other caused detonation.

ARVN units located at StrongPoint A-1 spotted two squads of NVA vic (YD 293-757). Artillery mission fired by ARVN and LVTH-6. NVA were headed north. Results unknown.

Received message from G-3 forward that Composite Artillery Bn at Gio Linh spotted about 25 NVA carrying what appeared to be a mortar, heading in a southeasterly direction along beach. AC scanned area with negative sighting. ARVN units located at StrongPoint A-1 spotted two NVA heading south in vic (YD 293754) carrying object about the size of a mortar tube or rocket round. Artillery was called and fired by LVTH-6s, negative surveillance.



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1st AmTrac Bn received two arty attacks mixed with rockets at CP location. First attack consisted of 90 or more rounds of 100 MM (identified by fuse) and unidentified round thought to be rockets (fuses all to be forwarded to G-2). OP tower this CP unable to sense muzzle flashes. F/2/4 sensed by sound and called 105 MM arty and 4.2 mortars on (YD 296744). Called for counter battery fire by 12th Marines on known arty position north of the Ben Hai River. Second attack consisted of 50 or more rds of same cal weapons. Called 105 MM mission on (YD 296744). Called counter battery fire from 12th Marines on known arty position north of the Ben Hai River. Friendly equipment destroyed: seven tropical hats, two water trailers, one 30 KM generator from NSA. minor damage to three LVTs. Moderate damage to 10 tropical huts. There was a total of five KIA, 11 WIA MedEvac. 20 non MedEvac.




Ass't Div Commander visited Bn CP and C-h.

Platoon patrol C/l/3 vic (YD 305736) observed four NVA moving to southeast. Took them under fire. They moved to northwest. Patrol came under fire by AK-47 from bunker complex to north. Returned fire with SA, M-79. Called in 81 MM and 4.2 mortars on bunkers. LVTH-6s fired 105 MM with delayed fuses. One KIA, one WIA non MedEvac. Marked target, HULE gun ship (BlackCat) made strafing runs, also picked up the one KIA. Platoon attacked north and received ANF. More 81 MM and 4.2 mortars and 105 MM arty fired on bunkers while advance elements temporarily withdrew to let arty sweep target. Then platoon attacked to northeast to envelop enemy position and received flanking fire from the northeast.

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Withdrew elements. Hit targets with more arty. Approx 1330H called for airstrikes via AO who was on station since 1230H. In interim, placed arty deeper to northwest to interdict enemy reinforcements. Put out yellow smoke to mark front lines. A0 confirmed had enemy in sight. First napalm strike made approx three zero minutes after smoking lines. Strike was made west to east right on target. Second run was southwest to northeast and hit friendly position. Both A/C dropped three napalms each. Eight WIA MedEvac. Called MedEvac helos. CO C/1/3 and three LVTP-5 went up to unit with another plat from C/1/3. Evacuated casualties. (CH-46 fired at by some AVF). Consdiidated position approx 1500H. Made sweep to east, then south to Base Area C-4 dropping off strongly reinforced squad as night ambush. Observed some enemy bunkers (estimated 12-14 total), they appeared to be empty. Did not take fire from them.

Deputy Commander III MAF and CG 3d Mar Div visited CP for dedication of 1st AmTrac Bn cantonment as "Camp KISTLER".


C/1/3 vic (YD 312721) on perimeter line observed ten indigenous personnel in treeline 200 meters south, who were observing C-4 position. Fired four rounds 60 MM HE with good coverage on target. The indigenous personnel flea to the south.

H&S Co bunker and listening post vic (YD 35056880) spotted one or two men moving near perimeter wire 100 meters away. Spotted men with zenon infrared searchlight. Fired six rounds small arms, two rounds M-79 at suspected movement. Checked area at first light, negative results.

C/1/3 plat while moving through area vic (YD 301741) checking bunkers in which NVA defended area 17 Dec received approx 70 rds of 60 MM mortars from coord (YD 295744). Fired 4.2 mortars, 81 MM and 105 MM counter battery. Patrol withdrew to south and incoming ceased. During search

found 15 bunkers, one NVA KIA (C), heavy bloodstains and blood soaked bandages, one NVA belt buckle, three black jungle boots and two entrenching tools badly burned. Bunkers were badly scorched by napalm and three were destroyed by search platoon. AO (American Beauty Charlie) spotted approx seven NVA moving north at (YD 279770) away from area in which C/1/3 patrol received 60 MM attack at 181255H. NVA carrying automatic weapons or mortar tube. NVA ran to fighting holes (YD-279770). Swift Boats fired 81 MM and .50 cal. Ran three flights napalm and snake eyes. Called arty mission from Centipede. AO credited airstrikes with five NVA KIA (P). Six bunkers destroyed and 100 meters of trench line caved in.



"B" Co, 1st AmTrac Bn perimeter bunker spotted man lying in front of lines. Illuminated and fired six rounds of SA. VC got up and ran into treeline in defilade 100 meters away.



lst ARVN Regt advisors arrived at CP to coordinate plans for operation south of Cua Viet.

HRS Co and Co "B" elements departed CP for S/D operation south of Cua Viet in connection with 1st ARVN Regt. (LAM SON 163)

Third Plat H&S Co in support of 1st AHVN Regt in vic (YD 364674) found two trip wires which led to punji pits rigged with explosives. One end of wire led to M-26 grenade. EOD blew in place.





While returning to CP from support of Lst ARVN Regt LVTP-5 (A-45) struck pressure detonated AT mine in vic (YD 375-665). Two roadwheels and torsion arms blown off, skirt torn. Fifteen blocks of track destroyed. Approx size of mine 20 lbs. Five minor WTA non Med-Evac.

Elements of H&S Co and Co "B" returned to CP from sweep of southern AO with 1st ARVN Regt. Having gathered 600, repeat 600 indigenous and turned them over to ARVN on link-up of whom 73 were classified VC(S). H&S Co had blown total of 20 punji pits and kicked in 25 more.

C-h vic (YD 313723) detected movement and digging noise at (YD 316723). Cleared with adjacent units for possible friendlies in area. Attempted PPS-6 and starlightscope search with negative results. Fired hand illumination with negative results. Area will be kept under surveillance and searched at first light.



Ambush positions have been skillfully prepared. One pair of binoculars was captured from an NVA during Nov. Ground attacks, supported by mortars and arty, continue to occur in ARVN area at A-1. The best estimate of enemy strength directly north of C-4 is one NVA Battalion, understrength, inside the DMZ, with recon elements deployed at and below Ha Loi Trung, reference (a).
