

# PART II

# NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 1st Engineer Battalion, minus "B" Company (-)(Rein), was in general support of the 1st Marine Division in the 1st Marine Division TAOR. Combat Engineer Companies, reinforced by elements of Headquarters and Service Company, and Support Company, were moderately committed to combat support missions during this period while simultaneously accomplishing various types of construction and maintaining their respective mine sweeps of roads. This Battalion (-) supported Operations: YAZCO, PIKE and numerous small unit search and destroy operations and rough rider convoys. During the month of August 1967, 2,638,100 meters of road were swept for mines in the 1st Marine Division TAOR. "B" Company (-)(Rein) was in direct support of the 5th Marine Regiment accomplishing numerous work projects in their TAOR as well as close combat engineer support of Operation COCHISE and company sized search and destroy operations.

# 3. Training

d. Search and Destroy Operation "A" Company provided a squad (-) to support "E" and "G" Companies of 2nd Battalion, 5th Marines on a search and destroy operation.



# 5. Water Supply

a. During the month of August 1967, the 1st Engineer Battalion operated 11 water points, which produced a total of 7,605,400 gallons of potable water and 1,240,500 gallons of shower water.

## 6. Other Construction

- a. During this period, units of the Battalion completed the following Division orginated work orders:


# 8. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

- a. Fabricated and installed five 55 gallon drumushowers for hamlet of Hoa Phu.
- b. Conducted twice weekly MED-CAPS for hamlet of Hoa Phu. 479 villagers were treated, 6 were hospitalized. A Vietnamese interperter/nurse, Tran Thi Kuan, was hired 19 August 1967 and a large increase of female patients requesting medical aid was noted as a result of her efforts.
- c. Two boxes of clothing procured from members of the 1st Engineer Battalion were distributed to the villagers.
- d. Provided hamlet of Hoa Phu with three sets of swings, two teeter-toters, five teacher's desks, five blackboards, lumber and paint for the school.
- e. Held planning conference with District Chief and Village Chief concerning the establishment of a clinic in the village of Hoa Phu. It was decided that the clinic would be built and that the District Chief would staff it with two Vietnamese nurses and the 1st Engineer Battalion would provide one Corpsman. On 30 August 1967, construction of the clinic was started. Three cabinets and one desk were completed for the clinic.
- f. Submitted a request for 400 school kits and miscellaneous school supplies. Request was approved by G-5.

## 9. Religious Affairs

- a. Catholic and Protestant services were held at the battalion chapel on Sundays at 0830 for Catholics and 1000 for Protestants.
- b. Catholic weekday and sunday services for the month of August 1967 totaled 31. Catholic services were held for other units by the chaplain. These numbered 12.
- c. Bible study discussion is held every Monday night for the Protestant men of this battalion.
- d. The physical improvement of the chapel continued with the painting of the building.
- e. The dedication of the bell in honor of the enlisted men of the battalion took place on Sunday, 13 August 1967.
- f. Memorial services were held for six men of the battalion.
