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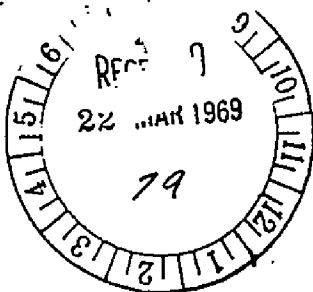

PART II

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

During the month of February 1969, the 1st Engineer Battalion remained committed to combat engineer support missions while simultaneously completing 88 Division and Battalion Work Orders and other engineer projects and maintaining assigned mine detection and clearing sweeps.

Combat engineer companies, reinforced by elements of Headquarters and Service Company and Engineer Support Company provided close combat engineer support to Operations TAYLOR COMMON and LINN RIVER. In addition, this battalion provided close combat engineer support for two unnamed operations.

During the reporting period, 1,704,100 meters of road in the 1st Marine

Division TAOR were swept for mines. Mine sweeps of roads resulted in 35 mines/boobytraps being located and destroyed. In addition to daily mine detection and clearing sweeps, 24 rough rider convoys were supported by combat engineers of this battalion. Also, seven special sweeps were conducted during the reporting period.

Company "A" provided close combat engineer support to the 1st Marine Regiment on a land clearing operation commencing on 6 January 1969 and terminating on 7 February 1969 along the east side of the Song Vinh Dien River from BT042650 to BT058628 in a strip 1,300 meters in width. Over 3,000,000 square meters of terrain were cleared of vegetation. Five dozers, including one Eimco, three TD-18's, and one TD-15, were employed for the purpose of improving the visual surveillance of the area. The engineers also destroyed 71 enemy bunkers, 17 tunnels, 1,600 meters of trenchline, and over 20,000 pounds of rice. A total of 820 equipment hours and 5,555 manhours were expended during the operation. Company "A" sustained four minor casualties on this operation. Company "A" also deployed engineers in one unnamed operation.

During the month of February 1969, Company "A" maintained six daily mine detection and clearing sweeps in the 1st Marine Regiment TAOR. Company "A" was heavily committed to bunker construction and cantonment repairs within the 1st Marine Division TAOR, specified by Division Work Orders.

Company "B" continued to provide combat engineer support to the 5th Marine Regiment on Operation TAYLOR COMMON. Company "B" also continued bunker construction and cantonment improvements for the 5th Marines and the 2d Battalion, 11th Marines at the An Hoa Combat Base. Two daily mine detection and clearing sweeps were maintained by Company "B".

Company "C" provided close combat engineer support for elements of the 7th Marines on Operation LINN RIVER, which commenced on 27 January 1969 and terminated on 7 February 1969. During the course of the operation, engineers cleared an area of 200 meters on either side of Liberty Road, from AT966578 to AT957578 on the south side of the road, and from AT966584 to AT944583 on the north side of the road. In addition, engineers located and destroyed 2,600 pounds of rice and corn, 145 meters of trenchline, 13 bunkers, 16 spider holes, two tunnels, and assorted items of ordnance. Combat engineers of this company were also deployed in one unnamed operation.

Six daily mine detection and clearing sweeps were continued by Company "C" during the reporting period. This company also provided general support, in the form of construction and cantonment repairs, for units of the 1st Marine Division.

2. Intelligence

a. Road and Bridge Reconnaissance. During the month of February 1969, procedures whereby mine sweep teams submit daily reports of road, bridge, and culvert conditions for routes being maintained were continued.

b. Weather. During the month of February 1969, the weather was characterized by relatively clear skies with an abnormally light amount of rain. There was a total of one inch of rain during the reporting period, while temperatures ranged from a high of 96° to a low of 63°.

c. Mine Warfare. A reward of 200 \$VN was paid to a Vietnamese civilian for one ChiCom grenade.

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3. Training

a. A total of 268 Marines attended Demolitions, Land Mine Warfare, and Viet Cong Boobytrap School. 7. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

b. TET envelopes were distributed to all the families of Son Thuy I. Collections made within the 1st Engineer Battalion amounted to 251 \$VN per household.

c. On 11 February 1969, the Battalion Commander led a small group of Marines from this battalion who were invited to a party signifying the coming of TET in Son Thuy I.

d. During the month of February 1969, a total of 81 Vietnamese received medical assistance through MedCap. In addition, eight civilians were treated for dental problems.

8. Psychological Operations. On 20 February 1969, the civil affairs section sponsored an operation through which an H. E. team provided by 1st Marine Division Psyops, showed movies to approximately 75 villagers of Son Thuy I. The villagers were treated to cartoons, a documentary, and a propaganda film.

9. Religious Affairs. Three Sunday Catholic masses and three Sunday Protestant Divine services were held at the 1st Engineer Battalion Memorial Chapel during the month of February 1969 at 0915 and 1030 respectively.

14. Commander's Analysis. The area 200 meters on either side of the road was not completely cleared because of two specific problems. First of all many areas could not be reached by tractor because of poor trafficability due to muddy terrain. Secondly some areas notably those at coordinates 945503 and 935504 were not completely cleared because of the large amount of barbed wire at these positions. The wire was part of abandoned CAP positions.

15. Recommendations. It is strongly recommended that to perform complete land clearing operations a defoliate be used. After the defoliate, the land would have to be burned. This recommended for two (2) specific reasons. First of all the government would get down enormously on the cost of such an operation. Secondly, personnel used on this type of operation could be employed on other projects. Land clearing in such a large area can not be effectively done by tractors and demo teams for one simple reason. This is that the job will never be complete due to the rapid rate of growth of vegetation in this area combined with the long period of time taken by tractors and demo teams in effective clearing operations.

8. Intelligence: The enemy was believed to be a company in strength with defensive positions and supply caches throughout the area. The bunkers discovered were primarily family type bunkers of extraordinary quality and craftsmanship, reinforced with bamboo and barb wire stakes and built under or in close proximity to a living area. Spider holes and tunnels were found intermittently throughout the area with no set pattern in their positioning, although some tunnels were found leading to the S. Vinh Dien River but did not open into the river. Exits were found at the end of the tunnel where the enemy could find a route of entrance and exit in this area. A number of pieces of intelligence information were found, emphatically depicting that the

enemy was in this area. An ammunition box was uncovered under a house foundation, containing a Viet Cong Flag, and NVA gas mask, a note book and papers believed to be of some S-2 value. Enemy uniforms, both V. C. and NVA, were found periodically throughout the operation. With these uniforms, rice, either polished or hard shell, was found in quantities of twenty-five to fifty pound bags.

A trench line was found along the banks of the S. Vinh Dien River from coordinates 045640 to coordinates 056636. This trench line appeared to be constructed approximately eight to fourteen months ago due to the thick vegetation covering.

Particular attention should be paid to the fact that an estimated 10% to 15% of the dud ordnance found had been stripped of its explosive material. This may account for some of the mine and booby traps incidents that have occurred throughout this T.A.O.R.

9. Mission:

- (a) Provide combat engineer support to infantry units as required.
- (b) Destroy all vegetation, field fortifications and living areas, excluding cultivated gardens, within a 1200 meter wide strip along the northeast side of the Vinh Dien River and throughout the Tu Cau and Ngan Trung areas with tractors and demolitions.

10. Concept of Operation: Engineers acted in direct support of "C" Company, 1st Battalion, 1st Marines. Infantry units were to provide tactical security for the engineers involved in the operation. The clearing of this area should partially eliminate the possibility of booby trapping and aid in the denying of this terrain for future enemy use.

11. Execution: On January 5 1969 with two infantry platoons, the engineers departed from Tu Cau Bridge to begin their land clearing operations. The infantry patrolled two to three hundred meters in front of the tractors, while a squad of infantry was positioned near the tractors for close fire support. The demo teams followed in trace of the tractors to clear. It was decided that both infantry and demo teams working with the tractors would remain behind the tractors for safety purposes. Night defensive tactics included extensive patrolling and listening posts. To augment the night defensive positions, supporting fires to include 105mm and 81mm mortars were fired on likely avenues of approach and plotted for on-call fires. Harassing and Interdicting fires were continuous throughout the night. One platoon minus of tanks provided security at night. During daylight hours, they patrolled with the infantry in areas where it was felt that the enemy could undermine our mission. Contact was made during two of these patrols resulting in two enemy killed. One major concept was adhered to closely. Platoon patrol bases were moved every other day with the tractors constructing four to five foot high burns in a

three hundred and sixty degree perimeter. This would provide protection from enemy sniper fire and also offer a defensive position which could be used in case of ground attack. Tractors were also used to construct mortar and tank positions. At night the tractors were stationed approximately forty meters apart and in areas which offered some sort of camouflage. Resupply in the field was accomplished through the utilization of a platoon of LVT's. Accompanying the LVT's to our position was a platoon minus of tanks. One major lesson learned in the area of land clearing revolves around the fact that continuous patrolling must be done in the area previously cleared. Four casualties resulted from booby traps and sniper fire, while making a water run through an area earlier cleared. Two tanks were damaged when following a certain route to Tu Cau Road, by hitting a mine of about sixty pounds. Four engineers suffered minor concussions from secondary explosions. Bamboo tree lines offered an interesting challenge. It was found that the conventional bangalore torpedo was the least desirable method of felling bamboo because of the amount of shrapnel thrown by the torpedoes and the poor effect of the blast on the bamboo. Forty pound cratering charges placed approximately five to six feet above ground level did an outstanding job, destroying an eight foot wide growth of bamboo.

13. Administration Matters:

1. A resupply point was positioned at Tu Cau Bridge. All supplies needed by both engineers and infantry were staged at this position. All supplies were delivered to this position by both supporting engineers and infantry companies. On an appointed day, LVT's were dispatched to Tu Cau Bridge where they picked up the supplies requested the previous day by both the engineers and the infantry.

2. Maintenance was performed by a qualified mechanic who remained in the field. When required equipment was taken to the rear at Tu Cau Bridge.

3. Casualties were treated immediately in the field by attached Navy personnel and med vacs expedited when required.

14. Special Equipment and Techniques: The equipment on Woodpecker IV consisted of one Eimco, three T.D. 18's and one T.D. 15. Each tractor has different capabilities and were employed in such a manner as to receive maximum output from each one. When in the field the tractors were at a minimum of 30 to 40 meters apart so to decrease the possibility of casualties if the tractors should hit a mine or booby trap. The Eimco is best employed in thick bamboo growths or dense tree lines. Bamboo is best destroyed by digging it up from the roots which the Eimco is powerful enough to do. The T.D. 18, a slow moving but powerful tractor was employed in areas where the bamboo was not quite so thick. The T.D. 15 is a small tractor only powerful enough to work an house

foundation and trench lines. A watch is a necessity on land clearing operations, it is an expedient means for dislodging bogged tractors.

15. Commanders Analysis: During the entire operation, coordination and cooperation was excellent. Because of this vital factor, Woodpecker IV was a complete success. Over 3,000,000 square meters of terrain was completely leveled; Enemy positions and caches were destroyed and routes of entrance and exit into the area made easily observable. Because of the better visual surveillance, booty trapping this area will be much more difficult and hazardous for the enemy.

16. Recommendations:

1. That support personnel are given three to four days notice prior to the beginning of a land clearing operation. This time would be used to properly P.M. and replace worn parts taken to the field.
2. Extra gear for tractors - 12 and gauge hose, oil and fuel filters, 10, 30 and 90 weight oil, air filters and assorted nuts and bolts should be present in the field for the immediate use of the mechanic.
3. Supply should be an everyday function to eliminate the down on tractors for parts.
4. Coordination with the appropriate S-5 should be made five to ten days in advance to eliminate problems arising from the Civilians in the area where the tractors are going to work.

Event Testing of Landing and Clearing Devices

Discussion During the reporting period, testing was terminated on the CHOP and Helicopter Landing Zone Clearing Device. Deployment and raising from a helicopter proved fruitless in all such attempts. The one device which was hand operated was successfully raised and cleared an area 30 feet in diameter in heavy brush.

2. Status of Major Programs

Program

Discussion Land clearing operations in support of V/1 commenced on 6 January 1967 along the east side of the Cong Vinh Bien river from 2704200 to 2705000 in a strip 1,500 meters wide. To date the engineer commitment includes one mine tractor, one 12-15, one 12-15 and one squad of combat engineers. During the reporting period the following progress was made:

- 550,000 square meters of land cleared.
- 33 bunkers and eight tunnels destroyed.
- 2,200 pounds of rice destroyed.
- 14 boobytraps, one 175mm A.A. round, 15 105mm A.A. rounds, 200 rounds of 5.56mm ammunition, one pair of M1A binoculars, five M1A watches, 10 M1A magazines, and three mines destroyed.

No engineer casualties occurred during the reporting period.

Program Mine Detection and Clearing Sweeps

Discussion Thirteen mine sweep teams swept an approximate total of 374,200 meters of road in the 1st Marine Division TADA during the reporting period. In addition to regular road sweeps, seven rough rider sweeps to an area received combat support and two special sweeps were conducted. The following ordnance was located and neutralized during the reporting period: three boobytraps, one 155mm round, one 15 pound val mine, two M1A rounds, and one mine of unknown size.
