

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

At 0800 1 April 1971 an advance party of the 1st Engineer Battalion (-) composed of the Commanding Officer, three (03) Marine officers and three (03) Marine enlisted personnel departed RVN, by government air, with the Battalion colors enroute to CONUS.

At 0800 1 April 1971 the remainder of the 1st Engineer Battalion (-) personnel and all equipment departed RVN enroute to CONUS, embarked on the U.S.S. DULUTH (LPD-6). Fourteen (14) Marine Officers, sixty-three (63) Marine enlisted and one (01) Navy enlisted personnel were embarked. Capt. T. J. DUMONT was Commanding Officer of Troops for embarked personnel.


The advanced party arrived in CONUS and established the 1st Engineer Battalion (-) Command Post at Camp Pendleton, California, on 3 April 1971.

Throughout this period COMPANY "A" (REIN), 1st Engineer Battalion continued to furnish close combat and general engineer support to the 1st Marine Division and other III MAF units. This support consisted of mine detection and clearance sweeps, construction of combat defensive fortifications and fire support base improvements and destruction. An average of fifteen (15) combat engineers were employed in demolition teams rendering close combat support to the 1st Marine Regiment on Platoon and on Company size operations. Four Engineer Road Sweep Teams conducted sweeps over 23 KM of road daily. The counter mine program was further enhanced by the application of the Voluntary Information Program, a total of 113 ordnance items were recovered and a total of 26,790 Piasters were paid out for the return of this ordnance.

The Land Mine Warfare School continued to train personnel of the 1st Marine Division by furnishing Mobile Contact Teams and conducting the five day formal course to selected personnel of the 1st Marine Division. A total of 258 personnel received instruction by the Mobile Contact Training Teams. A total of 39 students graduated from the formal five day course conducted by the Land Mine Warfare School.

On 8 April 1971, (15) Combat Engineers were helicopter lifted to Hill 425 for the destruction of this position. The task was completed on 11 April 1971.

During the period 8 April to 12 April, 1 Officer and 12 enlisted Combat Engineers from the 2nd Platoon furnished close combat support to the 1st Marine Regiment on a special operation in the southern TAOR.

On 13 April 1971 the 1st Platoon returned to the Company CP as the 1st Bn, 1st Marines started their standdown phase in preparation for the return to CONUS. The 1st Platoon has been in direct combat support of the 1st Bn, 1st Marine Regiment for the past 6 years while in Vietnam.

General engineer support was provided as evidenced by completion of 11 Division Work Orders and the production of 2,965,000 gallons of potable water during this period.

Throughout this period Company A (REIN), 1st Engineer Battalion continued to furnish close combat and general engineer support to the Third Marine Amphibious Brigade. This support consisted of mine detection and fire support base improvements and destruction. An average of (15) combat engineers were employed in demolition teams rendering close combat support to the 1st Marine Regiment on platoon and company size operations. A total of 10,000 meters of road way were swept daily by this unit during the reporting period with negative results. The Land Mine Warfare School continued to train personnel of the Third Marine Amphibious Brigade by furnishing mobile contact teams and conducting a formal five day course of instruction to selected personnel of the Third Marine Amphibious Brigade. A total of (160) personnel received instruction by the mobile contact training team, and a total of (33) students graduated from the formal five day course.

On 15 April 1971, Company A (REIN) reverted to administrative and operational control of Headquarters Company, Third Marine Amphibious Brigade.

On 21 April 1971, a combined reconnaissance team consisting of personnel from this unit, 1st Recon Bn and 3rd Bn, 1st Marines and 1st Shore Party Bn reconnoitered the positions on Dong Den and OP Reno and a plan for the destruction of these positions was agreed upon by all parties concerned.

On 23 April 1971, (13) pieces of Engineer Equipment and (8) personnel from this unit sailed aboard amphibious fleet shipping for CONUS to join the 1st Engineer Battalion at Camp Pendleton, California.

On 24 April 1971, (8) combat engineers and one Case 450 Tractor with operator were helicopter lifted into Dong Den for destruction of this position.

On 25 April 1971, (10) combat engineers and one Case 450 Tractor with operator were helicopter lifted into OP Reno for the destruction of this position.

On 25 April 1971, a reconnaissance was conducted by this unit of Camp 14 and plans submitted to the MAB Engineer for the destruction of this camp.

On 28 April 1971, a reconnaissance of Hill 327 was conducted by this unit and plans submitted to the MAB Engineer for the destruction of positions on this hill.

On 29 April 1971, destruction of Dong Den completed.

On 30 April 1971, destruction of OP Reno completed.

On 30 April 1971, destruction of selected positions on Hill 327 commenced.

On 30 April 1971, the 1st Engineer Battalion Land Mine Warfare School ceased operations and was turned over to the 196th Infantry Brigade, United States Army after (6) years of operation.

General Engineer support was provided as evidenced by completion of (7) MAB work orders and the production of (2,110,000) gallons of potable water.
