

NARRATIVE SUMMARY

1. During the period covered by this report, the command has been employed in support of U.S. and Allied Forces in the Danang and Chu Lai TAOR's.

a. In the Danang area, for administrative simplicity and man power conservation, all personnel are assigned to H&S Company and in Chu Lai, all personnel are assigned to "D" Company.

b. There has been a substantial self-improvement program developed in both areas toward improvement of the efficiency of the Command, and the general appearance of the Cantonments. This has not progressed as desired due to the shortage of materials and personnel.

c. The operation of two separate semi-permanent hospital facilities at Danang and Chu Lai respectively, the operation of a separate Collecting and Clearing platoon in support of Operation "DeSoto", the demand for maintaining readiness for deployment of additional detachments, and the demand for providing replacements within the First Marine Division have caused a serious strain on the personnel resources of this Command.

d. The Civil Affairs program is progressing in both TAOR's.
